PREFACE

Our Ancestor Captain Arther (Arthur) Scot (1752-1838)

This is a brief history about how we found Arther and Frances (Ker) Scot were the parents of John Scott (1777-1846).

The genealogy book, "The Descendants of John Scott from 1777" was published 1965/6 by Colonel Walter Throckmorton Scott, U. S. Army Retired, born October 24, 1894, at Burlington, Kansas.

In the 1790 census of Surry County, North Carolina, there were 5 Scott families who could have been the parents of John Scott (1777-1846), namely:

Arthur Scott (1132) 1 male Head, 4 males under 16, 3 females. Benjamin Scott (1125) 1 male Head, 2 males under 16, 4 females. Daniel Scott (1127) 2 males over 16 including Head, 3 males under 16, 4 females. James Scott (1127) 1 male Head, 3 males under 16, 4 females. Jesse Scott (1128) 1 male Head, 7 females.

Records indicate they all came from Virginia during or after the Revolutionary War. They might be brothers. Our research proved that Arther Scott was the father of John Scott (1777-1846).

I employed professional genealogists to help me in my research, namely:

Mrs. Mary Kegley, Jr., 440 W. Fulton St., Wytheville, Virginia, 24382. Mrs. Ruth Paine, 212 Goddard Ave., Maryville, Tennessee, 37801.

With my thanks, I am indebted to each of them for their professional help. Much of their results are in Arther Scott's family record.

The General Services Administration, National Archives and Records Service, Washington, D.C., 20408, gave me a few photocopies of Revolutionary War records, including Arthur Scott (1752-1838) and Daniel Scott (1759-1824). I am sure they are brothers. The others need more research before I place them in our lineage.

I am not able to find the burial place of Arther Scott, nor of his first wife, Frances, or his second wife, Elizabeth.

I am indebted to Arthur H. Kerr, 3628 Market Street, Kalamazoo, Michigan, 47001, for his help in finding the names and birth dates of Frances Kerr Scott's children from The Kerr Family Association as given it by the clanswoman, Frances Kerr Scott herself.

I have not been able to find proof of the marriages of Arther Scott's three daughters and two of his sons, James and Arthur. It is possible the sons were killed during the 1812 War in Tennessee.

WILEY AND ALMEDA (HINSHAW) REECE

828

Niley Reece was born in what is now Yadkin utny March 28, 1814, the son of Jesse and rgaret (Hadley) Reece. We know little of his ly life, save that he grew to manhood on his her's farm near what is now Boonville. He have some education, enough to write his ne, at least. "WILEY RECE" he haltingly lled it on a surviving document bearing his nature.

In May 26, 1838, Wiley and his brother-in-James Johnson took out a bond at the ry County courthouse, pledging them-res in the sum of \$500 that there was no son why Wiley might not be joined in mare with Almeda Hinshaw. She had been n in what is now Yadkin County February 1819, the daughter of Benjamin and Ruth rter) Hinshaw.

Juring their early married life Wiley and eda lived on land owned by Jesse Reece. a later date they purchased a small farm r Nebo in Fall Creek Township where they d the remainder of their lives. They were nbers of Mount Pleasant Methodist Church, and descendants tell us that Wiley was a fierce Democrat.

Wiley and Almeda (Hinshaw) Reece were the parents of eleven children. Lewis D. Reece (1839-1866) married Mary Malinda Strickland and died in Yadkin County. Mary Elizabeth Reece (1843-?) married James J. Hobson and died in Gentry County, Missouri. Louisa Reece (1844-1907) married Isaac Williams (1843-1904) and died in Scotland County, North Carolina. Sabra Reece (1846-1877) was the first wife of Elan J. Adams, a Yadkin County Baptist preacher. Ruth (1847-1899) never married but made her home with her parents. Benjamin Franklin Reece (1849-1929) married Lucy Jane Hair (Haire) (1854-1903) and lived in Knobs Township. Lucy C. Reece (1851-?) was the second wife of Elan J. Adams. John W. Reece (1854-1926) married Jennie Overby (1859-1947) and kept store in East Bend. Edward Houston Reece (1856-1926) married Julia Wishon (1858-1936) and died in Scotland County, North Carolina. Francis Marion Reece (1859-1925) went to Henry County, Indiana, in 1876 where he married Louella Bales (1865-1942) and lived until his death. Margaret Hasseltine Reece (1862-1932) married Rev. Caleb Monroe Warden (1859-1934), a Methodist minister, and died in Yadkinville.

Wiley Reece died January 22, 1888, at his home in Fall Creek Township. Afterwards Almeda made her home with her daughter Margaret, where she died December 19, 1898. Wiley and Almeda lie buried with her parents in the Mount Pleasant Methodist Cemetery.

He received a Degree in Law from the University of North Carolina in 1887. He is listed as being a lawyer in Yadkinville in 1904. Man married Mary S. Robertson. They had five children; James Thaddeus, Stella, Joel Manly, John Dillard and Sallie. He was a Democrat and a leader in the area of education. He was a member of the Yadkinville Baptist Church serving as a deacon and a Sunday School teacher. He died April 14, 1925. Mary died February 19, 1948.

But I'd rather see the big trees that's a-growin' up to home, An' watch the stars a-twinklin' in the blue an' loft dome;



D.M. and Mary Robertson Reece.


JAMES THADDEUS REECE 830

James Thaddeus Reece was born in Yadkinville, North Carolina, February 28, 1889, the oldest child of Darette Manly Reece and Mary S. Robertson Reece. Thad had two brothers, Joe and John and two sisters, Sallie and Stella. Sallie and Joe died with childhood diseases.

Thad lived in Yadkinville all of his life. He was educated at the Yadkinville Norman School and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill receiving an A.B. degree in 1912 and a degree in law in 1916. During the school year 1912-1913 he was principal of the Normal School. The next year he taught in East Bend, North Carolina. Here he met a young lady, Nina Dalton Davis. She was a student in his class. Thad and Nina did not declare their affection until commencement time of that year. Thad did not return, he went back to school at the University of North Carolina. He served as superintendent of the Yadkin County Schools from July 1917 — April 1929 and from 1931-1939. He was principal of the Lewisville High School in Forsyth County 1929-1931.

In 1935 the citizens of Yadkin County approved bonds of \$140,000 for the consolidation of the small two-teacher schools. The State Board of Education approved of this venture but there was real doubt if it would pass. Yadkin County was a Republican county; the schools were operated by a Democratic state government. There was tension at times. Thad was an active Democrat. However, he believed that quality education for all of the children of Yadkin County was of greater importance than any political party. He used his time and effort in the days before the vote traveling almost to the door of each family in Yadkin County explaining the need of the bond.

Through the years Thad had a very limited law practice. He gave this his full attention in July, 1939, until his death June 1, 1961.

Thad was a member of the Yadkinville Bapt Church. He served as a deacon and as a nday School teacher (1928-1961). He also, ved as moderator of the Yadkin Baptist sociation from 1933-1949.


Mr. J. T. (as he was sometimes called) was rember of the Yadkin Masonic Lodge 162 48 years. He served twice as Master — 20-22 and 1927-30. He was a charter memof the Board of Trustees of the Lula Conrad ats Memorial Hospital. He served as judge the Yadkin County court. He held many ices in professional and civic organizations. Vina Dalton Davis Reece was the ninth child Samuel Dalton Davis (1851-1897) and Austa Elvira Hauser (1857-1948). Nina and ad were married at her home in the East ind community June 30, 1920. Two children re born to the couple — a daughter, Mary justa born February 1, 1925, and a son, nes Manly — the oldest — lived for ten days and then died. Mary Augusta married Dennis Walter Hockaday August 12, 1948.

Nina was educated in the East Bend School. She attended Oxford Seminary for Women in Oxford, North Carolina, and the State Normal School for girls at Greensboro, North Carolina. She taught school at Chestnut Ridge in the East Bend Township.

Nina came to Yadkinville as a bride. She soon became active in church and community affairs. She served as president of the Woman's Missionary Union of the Yadkinville Baptist Church; and second President of the Yadkinville Woman's Club and held various offices in civic and denominational groups.

Nina died March 21, 1976. She was buried on her birthday.

Joel Wilson Reece, son of Joel Daret Reece, before his marriage built a nice two story house on a hill overlooking the Yadkin river about four miles north of Boonville, N.C. He occupied the house along with his aged father, his housekeeper and her husband. On June 14, 1899, Joel married Annie Watkins of Clemmons, N.C., and brought his bride home to a farm of a good number acres.

Joel was educated at Boonville and at Moravian Falls Academy, Wilkes County, N.C. Annie was educated at Salem College, Forsyth County, N.C.

To this union three children were born: Naomi and Glenn died in infancy, the third child, Thad Marshall, was born January 19, 1907. Since it was about four miles to the nearest school, his mother taught him at home until he was nine years old. He entered the third grade at Boonville School, and after graduation furthered his education at the University of Chapel Hill, N.C. where he received a B.A. degree in Journalism in 1928. He worked as a government employee, farmer and land appraiser until his retirement.

Thad married Anita Hobson, daughter of Avis Bonson and Alice Hobson on February-25, 1933. Anita is a graduate of Boonville High School, UNCG, Greensboro, N.C. with a B.S degree in Home Economics, class of 1931. She taught for 37 years, mostly at Boonville High School. During that period she served as president (1958-60) of the N.C. Home Economics Division of the N.C. Vocational Association. She is a member of Delta Kappa Gamma, national teacher honorary society, and is a member of the DAR (Daughters of American Revolution) being a great, great granddaughter of Col. James Martin, an officer in the Revolutiony Army and a brother to Alexander Martin, twice governor of North Carolina.

Thad and Anita Reece have one son. Joe Wilson Reece, born March 1, 1935. Following his graduation from Boonville High School he entered N.C. State University at Raleigh and in 1957 was awarded a Bachelor's degree in nuclear engineering with honors. He received his Master's degree in applied mathematics from the same school in 1961, and at commencement exercises was named the outstanding engineering faculty member. He earned the doctorate in fluid mechanics from the University of Florida in 1963. Dr. Reece is a member of Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Eta Segma, Sigma Pi Sigma, Tau Beta Pi, Theta Tau, and Scabbard and Blade. As an undergraduate, he was a member of the Order of St. Patrick, engineering leadership society.

Dr. Reece is a Professor of Mechanical Engineering at Auburn University, Auburn, Alabama. During his tenure at Auburn Dr. Reece has served as President of the Southeastern Section of the American Society for Engineering Education and on the society's national Power Committee. He is a full member of ASME and has been elected to Sigma Xi, Pi Tau Sigma and the Alabama Academy of Science. In 1976-78 he served the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission as Deputy Director of

to his reward after a slight illness of a few days. He was born February 4, 1832. For sixty-five years he was a consistent member of Boonville Baptist Church. On April 16, 1870, he was elected church trustee and ordained deacon May 7, 1870. These positions of trust he held until death. "Uncle Deck" was widely known for his genial happy disposition which made him a friend of all who knew him. He truly loved the house of God and his place was never vacant when possible for him to fill it."

On December 30, 1852, Joel Daret married Sarah Delaney Caudle. She died March 22, 1899. The first three children born to this union died in early childhood: Nely C., born September 29, 1853, died April 13, 1859; Samuel C., born May 16, 1855, died October 7, 1862; Aaron S. born January 3, 1857, died April 24, 1859; Cornelia Saphronia, born August 6, 1860, died November 10, 1920; Daret Mann, born June 12, 1862, died April 14, 1928; Marylindy, born July 18, 1864, died June 4, 1904; Joel Wilson, born September 24, 1868, died December 6, 1942; Lucy Jane, born March 7, 1870, died November 18, 1959. Most of these family members are buried in the Boonville Cemetery.

Joel Daret Reece was appointed by Governor Vance as a captain of the Home Guard of North Boonville District during the Civil War.

Other information I have of this lineage follows: Saphronia married Nathan Dobbins. Their children are:

Lucy, born February 10, 1894, died April 19, 1909;

James Thalmadge, born February 11, 1888, died May 12, 1972. He earned his doctorate in Chemistry at the University, Chapel Hill, North Carolina and taught chemistry there for 42 years. He married Lila Shore of Yadkinville, North Carolina. To them were born two children, a daughter, Christine, who married Robert W. Taylor, retired commander of the Navy and they live in Chula Vista, California; A son, James Thalmadge, Jr., like his father earned his doctorate in chemistry at the University, Chapel Hill, North Carolina and is now employed by R. J. Reynolds Company in Winston-Salem in the Research Department. He is married to Jaqueleene Bowen. She teaches at Salem Academy, Winston-Salem, North Carolina and earned a master's degree from the University at Chapel Hill. Their children are James, a Phi Betta Kappa graduate of University at Chapel Hill and is presently working toward a doctorate in physics at the University of Wisconsin. The second son Steven is a second year student at the University, Chapel Hill.

Marylindy daughter of Joel Daret married Cleve Dobbins and lived in Surry county.

Daret Mann, a prominent lawyer, and Joel Wilson, sons of Joel Daret Reece are written about in separate chapters in this book.

The youngest member of the Joel Daret Reece's family, Lucy married Joe Henry Watkins from Clemmons, North Carolina, a brother to Annie, Joel Wilson's Reece's wife. Joe Henry was a school teacher in Grayson County, Virginia. He and Lucy had two sons, Claude and Henry. After Joe Henry died his widow moved to Chapel Hill, North Carolina,

William Franklin Reece of Jonesville, born in Howell School Community on January 13, 1859, son of John J. Reece and Sarah H. Cockerham, was one of five children. Will married Mary Lee Everidge (May 27, 1875 — April 24, 1955) on Sept. 21, 1893.

Mr. and Mrs. Reece were two of the eight founders of the Jonesville Baptist Church. At a meeting on Sunday afternoon, Oct. 12, 1902, in the Old Barker Store Building at 4:00 P.M., with six other people, the church was declared officially organized by Rev. Charles H. Utley.

John Edgar Reece was born April 16, 1896, in Jonesville, N.C., the son of William Franklin Reece and Mary Lee Everidge. He was one of eight children: (1) Mary Elizabeth (Wright), (2) John Edgar, (3) Hattie Mae (Feimster), (4) Myrtle B. (Mayberry), (5) Clyde M. (Shugart), (6) Sally A. (Blackburn), (7) William F. (Annie Newsome), (8) Lola G. (Hudspeth).

Edgar married Clyde Holcomb (February 3, 1898) of Jonesville on January 22, 1920. She was the daughter of James Monroe and Martha Long Holcomb. To Edgar and Clyde were born two children: Errol Kemp and Mark Holcomb (See James Monroe Holcomb Resume).

Educated in the Jonesville Schools, Edgar was a general partner in Reece and Baker, an automobile service company in Elkin and Jonesville. The newly wedded couple will make Dobson their future home, where Mr. Reece, with true pluck and earnest application, has built up an enviable practice in his chosen profession. This charming couple begin life with splendid prospects, and we bespeak for them pence, pleasure and prosperity.
