Name: Franklin Daniel Boone Harding, called "Boone" by clients, Frank by family

Date of Birth: June 29, 1904, Yadkinville, NC

Date of Death: January 31, 1978 Hoots Hospital, Yadkinville, NC, following gall bladder surgery

Married: on April 10, 1931, at Hillsville, VA to Laura M. Bowman

Education: Graduated from Yadkinville High School at age 16

B. A. Degree, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill on June 10, 1925 with Degree in Law, 1928, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill

Employment: Principal, Courtney High School 1926-1927; taught at Spray, NC 1927-1928; practiced law from 1929-1978; Attorney for Town of Yadkinville, and Yadkin County; District Attorney

Elected: Mayor, Town of Yadkinville 1935, 1947, 1959, 1967, 1969

North Carolina House of Representatives, 1949-1950, 1961-1964; State Senator, 1965-1966

Religion: Yadkinville United Methodist Church, Yadkinville, NC; taught Sunday School class

Other Organizations: Member of Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina, Grand Master, Yadkin Masonic Lodge, 1938; president of the Yadkin County Bar Association, 1967; president of the 23rd Judicial Bar, 1969; Air Raid Warden with Civil Defense during World War II; volunteer fireman

Hobbies: raising registered redbone 'coon hounds; hunting raccoon, rabbit; hunting deer at Lake Waccamaw and at "Devotion," the Reynolds family estate; a "gentleman farmer" in the Yadkin River bottom land near Huntsville where he raised cattle, corn, wheat and soybeans.

Other Activities: Instrumental in getting Lula Conrad Hoots Hospital established, served on the first board of trustees for the Hospital from 1948-1960; he was instrumental in organizing the 1950 Yadkin County Centennial Celebration; and he assisted Anderson Miller in establishing a tobacco market in Yadkin County in the mid 1960s.
