The Obituary

A Time to Be Born - Cladys Martin Jackson, the first child born to the union of the late Henry Harrison Martin and the late Mary Lou Joyce Martin was born on February 26, 1913 in Mercer County, WV.

A Time to Grow – She received her education in the Stokes and Forsyth County School Systems. Cladys received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Education at West Virginia State. At an early age, she accepted Christ as her personal savior. Her spiritual training began at Pleasant Union Baptist Church in Winston- Salem, NC. After relocating to Steelton, PA, Cladys joined the First Baptist Church of Steelton, where she served faithfully as an usher. She relocated to Detroit, MI and joined Messiah Baptist Church and continued her passion as an usher. Cladys returned to NC and attended Chestnut Ridge Progress Primitive Baptist Church. She later became a member of Exodus Progressive Primitive Baptist Church in Pilot Mountain, NC where she served as president of the Women's Auxiliary until her health began to decline. She was the editor of the NC/VA State PB Convention Newsletter.

A Time to Work - Cladys taught at Big Creek Elementary School. The remainder of her career, she was employed by the Federal Government.

A Time to Love - Cladys will be remembered for her love for God and her dedication as a volunteer. She volunteered many years for the American Red Cross in Detroit, MI and Winston Salem, NC.

Cladys was also a volunteer for Old-Salem and the Forsyth Medical Center. She was a member of the Fraternal Order of the Elks Lodge where she was Past Grand DTR Ruler. Cladys was an energetic and faithful member until her health would not allow her to remain active.

A Time to Die – On Thursday, March 1, 2012 at the Kate B. Reynolds Hospice Home of Winston-Salem, NC, Cladys entered into eternal rest at the age of 99 years.

A Time to Mourn – In addition to her parents, Cladys was preceded in death by her husband Robert E. Jackson; her sister Overa Moore Cooper; brothers, Roy Junior Martin and Basil Dillard Martin, Sr.; and a stepdaughter, Ethel M. Hodo. She leaves to celebrate her life, a loving and devoted daughter, Belva Juanita Montgomery of Winston-Salem, NC; sister-in-law, Mary Ethel Martin of Westfield, NC; god granddaughter, Donnetta Lyons of Charlotte, NC; and one godson Basil Dillard Martin Jr. of Harrisburg, PA; loving nieces and nephews; great nieces and nephews; and a host of relatives and friends.
