ARTICLES OF FAITH

Aricle I. Of God and the Holy Trinity.

We believe in only the one true and living God, who rules all things after Fis own will; and that He, who created all things, is infinite in power, wisdom, knowledge and goodness, eternal immor-

tal, invisible ind unchangeable; and that this God has revealed Himself in His word under the character of Father, and that these three are one; and that there are three that bear witness in earth—the water, the spirit and the blood, and that these three agree in one.

Article II Of Holy Scriptures

We believe that the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the written word of God, and are a sufficient rule of faith and practice; that they are given by inspiration of God, and are profitable for reproof, for correction, and for instruction; in righteousness; and that they contain all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women.

Article III. Of the Atonement.

We believe that Christ died and made a complete atonement for all who ever does now, or ever will believe on His name, and that all who are finally saved were given to Christ in covenant of the Father before the world was, that they should show forth his praise.

Article IV. Of Foreknowledge, Election and Predestination.

We believe that (all) of whom God did foreknow He did also predestinate to conform to the image of His Son; that God elected according to His foreknowledge, through sanctification of the Spirit unto obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ, all who are finally saved, to an inheritance incorruptable and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in Heaven for all true Saints; and that none come to Christ only those whom He loved with an everlasting love and in due time calls to everlasting Glory.

Article V. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

Article VI. We believe in man's impotency to recover hmself from the fallen state he is in by his own free will and ability.

Article VII. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Christ.

Article VIII. We believe that God's elect will be called, converted, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

Article IX. We believe the saints shall perserve in grace and never finally fall away.

Article X. We believe that baptism and the Lord's supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ and that true believers are the only proper subject of the ordinances, and that the true mode of baptism is by immersion.

Article XI. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgment.

Article XII. We believe the punishment of the wicked will be eternal and the joys of the righteous everlasting.

Article XIII. We believe that no minister has the right to ad-

minister the ordinances only such as are regularly called and have come under the imposition of the hands of the Presbytery.

RULES OF DECORUM

- I. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- II. The moderator and clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- III. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise from his seat and address the moderator.
- IV. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by any except the moderator, until he is done speaking.
- V. He shall strictly adhere to the subject, and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make remarks on his slips, failing or imperfections, but shall fairly state the case and matter, as near as he can, so as to convey his idea.
- VI. No person shall abruptly break off, or absent himself from the Association without leave from it.
- VII. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one subject, without liberty obtained from the Association.
- VIII. No members of the Association shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same nor of whispering in time of a public speech.
- IX. No members of the Association shall address another in any appellation other than that of Brother.
- X. The moderator shall not interrupt any member in his speech nor prohibit him from speaking 'till he gives light on the subject except he break the rules of this decorum.
- XI. The names of the several members of the Association shall be enrolled by the clerk and called over as the Association thinks proper.
- XII. The moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as other members, provided the chair be filled.
- XIII. Any member who shall willfully and knowingly break any of these rules shall be reproven by the Association as it may think proper.

CIRCULAR LETTER

Being appointed to Write the circular letter to be attached to the minutes of our next association, it is with a keen sense of my weakness that I now proceed to conform to the arrangement. And I don't think of a more fitting subject than the admonition of John the Apostle to the seven churches. We understand that he was on the Isle of Patmos away from his native land for the word of

God, we could hardly imagine a more lonely condition, however he says I was in the spirit on the Lords day, and heard, what we feel was wonderful things, saying write to the seven churches in Asia, and we notice that he seems to address them in a way very tender, however he was frank to call their attention to some things that he cid not approve of and advised them in a beautiful manner to repent in order that the candle stick would not have to be removed.

I remember that the subject of order has been discussed a great deal among our churches and some difference in really what was discipline and gospel order. But we feel glad that our churches so far as I know are agreed and satisfied with our articles of faith constitution and rules of decorum, and we hope that our ministers and churches will continue to labor and strive in that spirit of love and tenderness for the general welfare and peace of our association together with our correspondence. It is our aim to show every courtesy possible to our correspondents and visitors when they come among us. We notice that the apostle first wrote to the church at Ephesis and referred to their labor and patients but what he was not pleased with, they had left their first love so we would encourage the churches to attend and show their devotion and interest to the grand cause for which we stand.
