



Long Range Planning presents the following motion:

In order to alleviate the existing parking shortage and in anticipation of the need for additional parking due to growth in our congregation, we propose that a new asphalt parking lot be constructed on a portion of the vacant lot located south of the church and south of Westfield Road. 

ARTICLE V- CHURCH OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers

The officers of the church shall be, when elected, a pastor, and other vocational leadership pastoral staff as needed, deacons, trustees directors, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, assistant treasurer, librarian, organist, pianist, minister of music, minister of education, and such other officers as shall be required for the work of the church in any of its departments or organizations. All of the officers of this church shall be elected annually by the church, except the Pastor and paid staff workers, and those whose term of office is governed by the "By-Laws". All must be members in good standing unless it is necessary to employ a non-member as choir director, pianist-organist, custodian or secretary.

Section 2 Election and Duties

A. Pastor.

<u>Call:</u> Whenever a vacancy occurs, a pastor shall be called by the church to serve until that relationship is dissolved at the request of either the pastor or the church. In either case, at least thirty days notice shall be given of termination of the relationship, unless otherwise mutually agreed with both pastor and the church seeking to follow the Will of God and the Leadership of the Holy Spirit.

The call of the pastor shall take place at a **Sunday** meeting especially set for that purpose, of which at least one week's notice has been given the membership (likely at a Sunday Worship Service). The election shall be upon the recommendation of a special pulpit committee the Pastoral Search Committee, made of the members from existing committee members of the Staff Relations Committee, Deacons, Missions Committee, Golden Years Committee, Finance Committee, Worship Committee, and the Sunday School Director or a teacher appointed by the church and shall not exceed the number of seven (7). Each committee will decide from committee members who will represent their committee. If the Sunday School Director declines, then an appointment of a Sunday School teacher will be made. This committee -to-seek shall seek out and nominate as pastor a minister of the Gospel, whose Christian character and qualifications fit him for the office of pastor of this church according to I Timothy 3:1-7. The committee shall bring only one name at a time for consideration of the church, and no nomination shall be made except that of the committee. Election shall be by ballot with an affirmative vote of 3/4 (75%) of those church members present and voting, necessary for a call. Should the one recommended by the committee fails to receive a 75% vote, the committee will be instructed to seek out another minister, and the meeting shall be adjourned without debate.

The pastor may be removed from office by majority ballot vote of church members present at a Sunday morning called business meeting, provided the meeting is called by a majority vote of the Deacons, and provided notice of intention to vote for such removal

shall have been given publicly at least one (1) week prior to voting. The pastor shall not serve as moderator over a meeting called for the purpose of voting to remove him.

Duties: The pastor shall have in his charge the welfare and oversight of the church; he shall be an exofficio member of all organizations, departments and committees; he may call a special meeting of the deacons and any committee according to the procedures set forth in the By-Laws; he shall conduct religious services on stated and special occasions, administer the ordinances, minister to the membership of the church and community, and perform other duties that usually pertain to the office; he shall have special charge of the pulpit ministry of the church and shall, in cooperation with the deacons, provide for pulpit supply when he is absent, on church approval, and arrange for workers to assist in revival meetings and other special services. The pastor shall preside at all meetings of the church except as otherwise provided in the By-Laws. He shall be the administrative head of the church and shall arrange and approve all absences and vacations of all church employees.

The pastor shall preach the truth as he may derive it from the Word of God, as his sole authority, and as one who has to give an account as the chief executive officer of the church; to preserve order and decorum at all meetings of the church; to secure to every member, without partiality, the exercise of his privileges; to give his views of the law of Christ as bearing on cases of discipline as may occur; faithfully to use that influence which justly arises from the character of his office. He shall visit the members of the church for his purposes of spiritual instruction, admonition and comfort; faithfully to warn and reprove those who backslide; to visit the sick; to embrace every opportunity to speak to the unsaved.

The pastor shall fulfill the injunction to "Sstudy to Sshow thyself approved unto God, a workman that needed not be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of Truth." II Timothy, 2:15

Other Pastoral Staff: Duties of other pastoral staff are to be determined by the Staff Relations Committee. The Staff Relations Committee will also serve as the search committee for other pastoral staff. Should a dismissal be necessary during employment of other pastoral staff, the same procedure will be followed as for dismissal of the pastor.

B. Deacons

Number, and terms of service: There shall be at least three (3) deacons for the first one hundred (100) members of the church and three (3) additional deacons for each additional one hundred (100) members up to five hundred (500) members; and then as many other deacons as the church may require. Each deacon shall serve a term of three (3) years.

Election of Deacons: At the regular church conference during the month of August Following the conclusion of the worship service on the Sunday prior to the church conference during the month of July, a business meeting will be called for the purpose of deacon nominations. + The church membership shall nominate from among the members of the church those who have proven themselves to have scriptural qualifications (I Timothy 3:18-

13)- and having been a member of Westfield Baptist Church for at least one (1) year. The church will elect the required number from that list at the next church conference. One third of the deacons shall be elected each year. No deacon shall be eligible for re-election for one year after rotating off. A deacon may be removed from office by following the same procedure as for the dismissal of the pastor. In case of death or removal or incapacity of an active deacon to serve, the church may elect another deacon to fill the unexpired term. Men transferring their membership to the church who are already deacons shall remain as inactive deacons until such time as the church may elect them to the active deaconship.

Ordination: The deacons shall be ordained that have not previously been set apart.

Honorary Deacons: The church may promote to honorary life membership any deacon who by reason of age or infirmities, after honorable service, no longer is able to render active service. He shall have no voting power.

Officers: The active deacons shall elect annually their own chairman, vice chairman, and secretary in the month of August. September.

Responsibilities: Deacons shall at all times consider themselves as servants of the church. With the pastor, and as the Holy Spirit may direct, they are to consider and make recommendations to the church in all matters pertaining to its works and progress; including overseeinger of the discipline of the church; establishing and maintaining spiritual fraternal relations with all members of the church; assisting the pastor in the observance of the ordinances; having general oversight over the upkeep, repair and use of all the church property; and supervising the financial program of the church. They shall arrange for regular meetings and for such committees as necessary to the discharge of their duties. and having general oversight over the church's physical and financial assets in accordance with Acts 6:1-4. The Deacons will serve other committees in the discharge of their duties by advising, guiding, and praying for them as they work.

Meetings: They shall meet once a month before the monthly business meeting of the church. The pastor, or the chairman of the deacons, may call the deacons into special session whenever need for such arises.

C. Trustees Directors:

Election: The church shall elect at least three (3) members to serve as Trustees Directors. One-Each trustee Director shall be elected in like manner as and with the deacons to serve for three (3) years on a rotation basis with one director rotating off each year. Should a Vacancies vacancy occur during the term, the vacancy will be may be filled any time with the one elected by a special called meeting of by the church being and a nominee elected to fill out the unexpired term. of the one whose vacancy is being filled.

<u>Duties:</u> The trustees— **Directors** shall, as provided by the law and the action of the church, hold in trust the title to all property of the church and and shall represent the church in

all matters of legal responsibility regarding the purchase, improvements and disposal of church property. They shall have no power to buy, sell, mortgage, lease or transfer any church property without a specific vote of the Church authorizing such action; neither shall they have any control over the use of the church property except by vote of the church.

D. Clerk.

The clerk shall be elected annually. It shall be his/her duty to attend or be represented at all ehurch Church business meetings, to keep an accurate record of all business transactions, to and to prepare the annual associational letter. and to notify all officers, members of committees and messengers of their election of appointment. He/she shall issue letters of dismission as authorized by the church, preserve all papers and valuable letters and records that belong to the church, and see that an accurate roll of the church membership is kept with dates and methods of admission and dismissal, change in name, correct mailing addresses, and other pertinent information. An assistant clerk shall be elected annually to serve as Acting Clerk in absence of the Clerk

E. Treasurer.

The treasurer shall be elected annually. It shall be the duty of the treasurer to receive, keep in a bank, and disburse by check upon proper authority, all moneys or things of value—that are given to the church, and keep at all times an itemized account of all receipts and disbursements; rendering monthly accounts (Treasurer's Report) to the church, to be preserved by the church clerk. The treasurer's books may be audited as arranged by the church, and all books, records and accounts kept by him/her of the church's funds shall be considered the property of the church. The treasurer shall upon invitation meet with the deacons, and shall be an ex-officio member, if not a regular member of the Finance Committee. In additional to the Treasurer, T there shall be an—assistant treasurers elected annually.; the number to be recommended by the Finance Committee and presented to the church at a regular business meeting for approval.

ARTICLE VI - GENERAL

Section 1. License:

When a member announces to the church that he feels the call to the ministry, the church, by majority vote, may license him as an acknowledgement of his call to the ministry and encouragement to make preparation for it. The clerk of the church may furnish the member with a copy of the minutes or a certificate of license as his credential. It is understood that the performance of civil duties by the member shall be governed by state law.

Section 2. Ordination:

In the event this church has been requested to ordain a member who has been called as pastor of a Baptist church, the following procedure shall be followed; the church will express its approval by a vote of three-fourths of the members present at any regularly arranged business meeting of the church. The church then shall invite the Associational Council an Ordination to examine the candidate concerning his fitness for the ministry. In the event the association has no such council, this church shall invite representatives of the neighboring churches to examine the candidate and report to the church. Then in the event that—If the report is favorable, the church shall proceed with the ordination.

Section 3. Affiliation with associations and conventions.

We—This church recognizes that there is mutual helpfulness in the association of the churches who are in such agreement in faith and practice as to encourage the spirit of fellowship and good will. We—This church also recognizes that there have been devised, through the voluntary cooperation of churches of like faith and order, organizations whose purpose is to implement the missionary, educational and benevolent interests and obligations of the individual Christian and his church family.

Believing that the Surry Baptist Association of Southern Baptist Churches, the Baptist General State Convention of North Carolina, and the Southern Baptist Convention are organizations which have as their sole purpose the promotion and support of missions, education, and benevolence of the character and in keeping with the spirit of the Constitution and the Statement of Faith and Belief of this church, we-this church therefore agrees to participate in these organizations through our duly elected messengers and our support of the causes which those organizations represent.

Section 4. Property Holding.

It is agreed that the securing and maintaining of real property, buildings and equipment by this church shall be for the express purpose of providing facilities for public worship and for the engagement upon the missionary, educational and the benevolent interests of this church, of the character and in the spirit of this Constitution and Statement of Faith and Beliefs of this congregation.

Section 5. Withdrawal of affiliation

This church may withdraw from affiliation with the association and conventions by a vote of two-thirds of the resident membership. The vote may be taken after one month's notice to all church members; provided that, in the event such vote is less than unanimous, the property and debts of the church shall remain vested in the group in the church desiring to retain its affiliation with the association and conventions; provided further that in all matters relating to its internal affairs the church remains and shall be an autonomous body.

ARTICLE VII - ADOPTIONS AND AMENDMENTS

Sections 1. Adoption.

This constitution shall be considered adopted and in its-immediate effect if and when two-thirds of the members present at the business meeting at which vote is taken shall vote in favor of same. This vote shall be taken not less than thirty days after formal presentation of the constitution to the church.

Section 2. Amendment.

This constitution, with the exception of Article 6, Section 5, may be amended, altered, or repealed by a two-thirds vote of the members present, at any regular business meeting of the church; provided, however, that such amendment, alteration, or repeal has been given to the clerk in writing; and this proposed change shall be presented to the church at least thirty days prior to the time that the vote is taken.

Article 6, Section 5, may be amended, altered, or repealed by vote of two-thirds of the resident members after one month's notice to all church members.



A Vision for Our Future...

Discussed at Business Mtg. October 2004

What's our purpose?

- Our church's Mission Statement is found in Colossians 1:28: "We proclaim Him, admonishing every man and teaching every man with all wisdom, so that we may present every man complete in Christ."
- Our mission will be severely hindered if we allow ourselves to run out of space for new worshippers.

Should we act now? YES!

- According to the North Carolina Baptist State Convention, once a church's worship attendance reaches 80% capacity, that church should begin an expansion project.
 - ⇒ Our Sanctuary seats approximately 230 worshippers comfortably. Our average worship attendance is around 200 people.
 - ⇒ That means that on an average Sunday WBC is already at 87 % capacity.
- Over the past 3 years, we've added approximately 20 worshippers per year. At that rate of growth, we will be totally
 out of worship space in 18 months or less!

What are our options?

- We could do nothing. BUT, if we do nothing, we will stop growing!!!
- We could begin a building project. BUT, it will take several years to pay off our loan and save up for a down
 payment on a new Worship Center. We cannot afford to wait several years.
- Adding a second service is the best solution.
 - ⇒ We will be better stewards of the resources God has given us by increasing our worship capacity without spending any additional money.
 - ⇒ This will also give more opportunities for worship and service.

Will two services hurt the unity of our church? ONLY if we let it.

- The biggest challenge to unity comes when a church begins a new style of worship; which we are not planning to do.
- We will make unity a priority.
 - ⇒ We will have a "Coffee Fellowship" each Sunday morning from 9:30 to 9:45 in the Fellowship Hall.
 - ⇒ Our church will continue to have the opportunity to worship and fellowship together as one at our Twilight Worship on 5th Sunday nights.
 - ⇒ We will still only have one Sunday School hour so that the unity of our classes will remain untouched.
 - ⇒ We will continue to search for more ways to bring the entire church together for fellowship and worship.

How will it work?

- The early service will be identical to the 11 o'clock service except for the following differences
 - The choir will not be singing at the early service. In place of the two choir songs, we will use soloists, instrumentalists, creative movement, drama, etc.
 - ⇒ Super Church and the Children's Sermon will be held during the 11 o'clock service only.
 - ⇒ Baptisms, Baby Dedications, and other special events will take place during the 11 o'clock service.
- The Lord's Supper will be observed in BOTH services each 5th Sunday.
- Our Pastor will attempt to preach the same message in both services.
- The Nursery will be staffed during the early service as well as Sunday School and the 11 o'clock service.

Dear Church Family,

"For I know the plans I have for you", declares the Lord, "plans for welfare and not for calamity, to give you a future and a hope" Jeremiah 29:11

As a church body, we were challenged by that Scripture as we started our building campaign just a few short years ago. We have tried to stay in God's will and God has been faithful with His promise. As your Finance committee, we would like to highlight the 2003-2004 church year and how God has kept His promise.

In the 2003-2004 fiscal year our total budget was \$166,640.03. We ended the fiscal year September 30, 2004 with total expenses of \$159,944.64, ending under budget \$6695.36. We came in under budget partially due to \$5464.63 left unspent in the Building and Grounds budget. The biggest change and largest expense this year was the expansion of the choir loft. In March, the church voted to expand the choir loft and replace the carpet with tile in the vestibule. Total cost of this improvement was \$2093. In May, the Audio Visual committee requested permission to purchase a new camcorder to tape the Worship services and two VCRs to record and make extra tapes. The request was approved at a cost of \$453.37. In July lightning damaged one of our air conditioning compressors. It was repaired by Loftis HVAC and turned into our Insurance company. Our total cost was \$500, which was our policy's deductible.

In the May business meeting, a motion was made to pave part of the vacant lot across the street at a cost of \$14,160 by Lane Creed Paving. Although the motion was tabled, Finance recommended that our next 5th Sunday offering on May 30th, go towards a parking lot fund. Motion carried. We received \$5663 in our offering and those monies were placed in our Money Market account until needed.

In our CTB account, we started the church year was a loan balance of \$252,950.69 and ended the fiscal year with a loan balance of \$196,976.41 for a reduction of \$55,974.28. Our loan payment of \$3490 each month currently breaks down into \$754.98 going towards interest and \$2735.02 going towards the principal. Our 5th Sunday offerings this church year were as follows:

- Nov 03 \$5586
- Feb 04 \$7082
- May 04 \$5663 goes towards parking lot fund
- Aug 04 \$3467

In January 2004, we transferred \$2000 from the checkbook to the principal. On May 6th we again transferred \$5000 from the checkbook to the loan for another principal payment. These extra monies were collected from memorials given to the CTB fund. All 5th Sunday offerings and extra payments totaled \$23,435.

This church year our interest rate started to climb from a low of 4% in October 2003, in June 2004 increases to 4.25%, in August 2004 to 4.5% and in September 2004 again increased to 4.75%, where in currently remains. We still maintain a cap of 6.625%.

Dear Church Family,

As your Finance Committee, we once again have the pleasure to highlight the financial accomplishments God has allowed us to achieve in the 2004/2005 church year.

Our total budget in the 2004/2005 fiscal church year was \$183,006. We ended our fiscal year September 30, 2005 with total expenses of \$178,200 ending the fiscal year under budget by \$4,806. We came in under budget partially due to \$5,514 left unspent in the Building and Grounds budget. The line item of New furniture and equipment ended over budget by \$3,679. Contributing to the overage for this line item was the purchase of a new convection oven in May at a cost of \$3,427 and Phone tree software in June at a cost of \$914. Both items had been discussed and approved by the church during regular business meetings.

In September 2004, our church was made aware of the need for more transportation for our growing youth ministry. On September 26, 2004 we had a special offering to start a van fund. We collected \$3,021 on that day and added to this amount over the next few months, ending with a balance of \$9,145. January 2005 our church purchased a used 1992 Ford van for the amount of \$4,500 from Sylva 1st Baptist Church. All necessary maintenance was performed on the van over the next few months and the remaining balance (\$2,182.65) was transferred to our Building Fund loan principle, May 2005.

January 2005 the Bruce Lowe Memorial broke ground in the front yard of our church. The church had voted and approved this memorial, totally financed by the Lowe family. Dedication of the memorial in Memory And Honor of Bruce Lowe occurred on February 27, 2005.

In the April business meeting our church voted to cover our stained glass windows with Lexan and to encase the trim in vinyl. Estimated cost of bids \$3,090 to \$3,760. By year-end we have spent \$1700 for labor. Work is still in progress.

In our CTB account, we started the church year with a loan balance of \$196,976.41 and ended the fiscal year with a loan balance of \$137,202.72 for a reduction of \$59,773.69. Our 5th Sunday offerings this church year were as follows:

- Oct 04- \$6,197
- Jan 05 –no church service, ice
- May 05 \$5,302
- July 05 \$6,423

Total monies from 5th Sunday offerings were \$17,922 and all were applied directly to the loan principal. The church year started with a loan interest rate of 4.75% and continued to climb monthly until we modified the loan in July 2005. At that time we capped the interest rate at 6.25%, where it remained at the end of this fiscal year.





Job Description Associate Pastor of Youth & Children

I. PRINCIPAL FUNCTION

The Associate Pastor of Youth & Children is responsible for coordinating and leading the Youth and Children's Ministry at Westfield Baptist Church

II. RELATIONSHIPS

The Associate Pastor of Youth & Children shall be supervised directly by the Pastor and indirectly by the Staff Relations Ministry Team. He shall be a member of the Church Council and shall work in close association with appropriate committees and organizations as needed.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES

The Associate Pastor of Youth & Children shall serve as a minister to the youth and children, and their families through counseling, visitation, and participation in worship. He is to design and implement a well-balanced Youth and Children's Ministry, which will meet the needs of today's young people. Additional responsibilities include the following:

- the Associate Pastor of Youth & Children shall lead the Youth in Sunday evening Bible study and fellowship and Wednesday night Bible study and fellowship, evangelism, service, fellowship, and visitation;
- coordinate and facilitate a Children's Church during the Morning Worship service;
- lead in worship services as requested by the Pastor (attendance on Sunday and Wednesday is required unless leave is being taken);
- coordinate and facilitate one (1) special activity for the Children's Group per month and one (1) special activity for the Youth Group per month (such as trips, retreats, fellowship events, etc.);
- organize and accompany Youth to an approved Youth Camp each summer;
- organize and accompany Children to an approved Children's Camp each summer;
- plan and accompany Youth on (at least) two (2) mission projects/trips each church year;
- coordinate and organize, maintain, and work with lead teams in planning and execution
 of planned events such as Vacation Bible School, organized recreation, youth retreats,
 summer mission projects, and evangelistic endeavors;
- work with the finance committee to plan and administer an annual budget for the Youth and Children's Ministry programs;
- serve as a member of the Church Council in planning and organizing the church's yearly calendar;

- keep parents informed about the Youth and Children's programs in the Church and enlist their support, assistance, and cooperation;
- work closely with the Sunday School leadership to insure an effective Bible teaching program for the Youth and Children of the Church;
- when absent, the Associate Pastor of Youth & Children must arrange for a substitute teacher (no meetings should be cancelled due to his absence if at all possible);
- attend weekly Church Staff meetings as scheduled;
- assist the Pastor in ministering to EVERY member of the congregation as needed (through hospital visitation, in-home visitation, counseling, etc.);
- serve as a Christian role model at all times;
- be a member of Westfield Baptist Church;
- perform other duties as assigned by the Pastor and/or Staff Relations.
