3rd year: You need a recertification seminar at no registration cost. The only cost will be a \$7.00 book fee.

4th year: You will need to start over with the First Aid/CPR certification class.

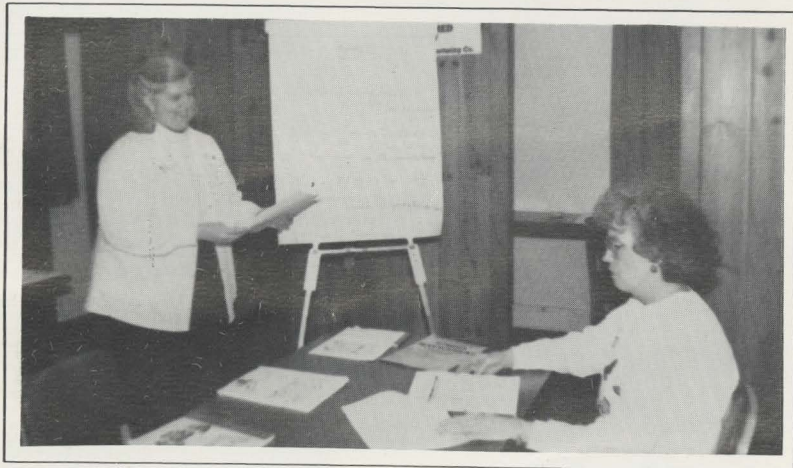
Get Involved in the Adult Education Program

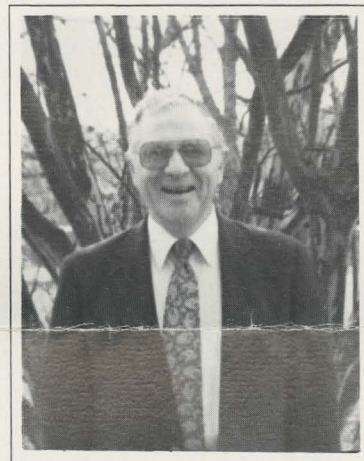

Old Newsletters Available In Chatham News Office

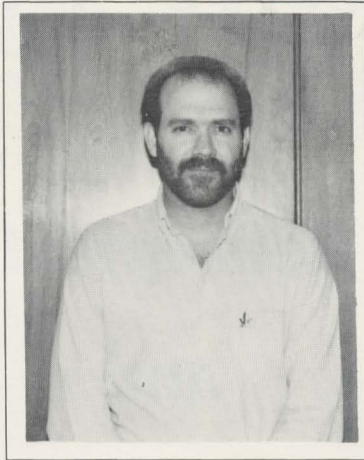

I Hear You

If you like to hunt, ride a motorcycle, or go to rock concerts, you're likely to become hard of hearing a bit earlier than you would if you enjoyed quieter pastimes. If you are surrounded by loud noise every day at work, you could suffer a serious hearing loss. The danger is so prevalent that protecting employees' hearing in the workplace is required by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration.

Noise levels that can damage hearing are most common in manufacturing plants, transportation, construction, and the military, according to the Environmental Protection Agency. But wherever you work - or play - anything louder than 85 decibels (about as loud as a power mower) can cause damage.

An occasional very loud noise isn't as harmful as long periods of fairly loud noise, audiologists say. The real problem is that hearing loss caused by noise is so gradual that it isn't apparent to the affected person until the damage is done.

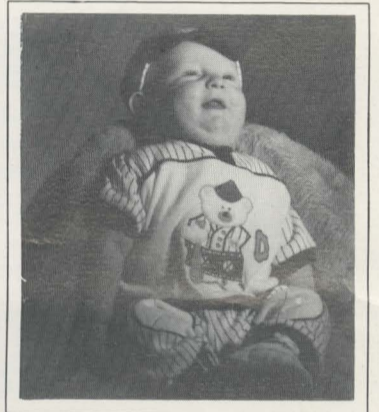
If you work in a noisy environment, your employer is required to measure workplace noise levels, test your hearing once a year, educate you on how noise affects hearing, and provide you with earplugs or other protection. But that's only part of the solution. It's up to you to take proper precautions wherever you are. Your hearing could depend on it.

Christopher Shane Castevens is the 4 month old son of Chris and Tammie Castevens (both of Yarn Finishing). Christopher is 3 months old in this picture.

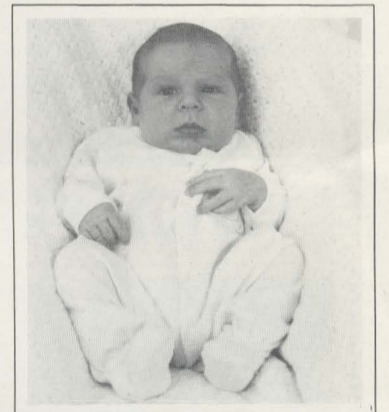

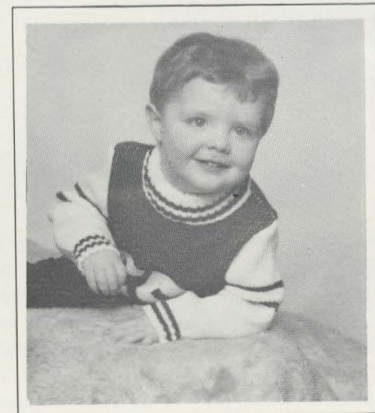

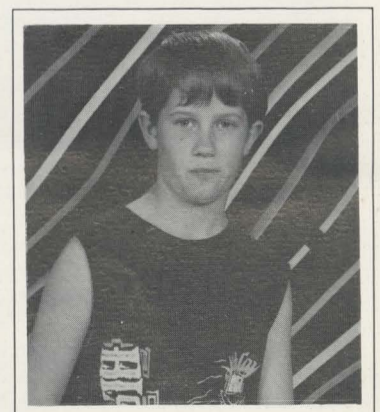
