Piedmont Mourns Loss Of Deputy

From Staff And Wire Reports

LEXINGTON -- A funeral will be held Monday for a Davidson County sheriff's deputy who was shot to death while trying to serve a warrant on a man accused of trespassing.

Deputy Todd Cook, 30, was shot at least five times from behind Thursday after he entered the home of Christopher Lee Cooper, 22, who also was wanted by Lexington police for questioning about an accusation of statutory rape, Sheriff Gerald Hege said.

Cook was a graduate of South Stokes High School, and his fiancee, Kimberly Simmons and her three children, Trevor, Torrance and Summer Hamilton are all currently living in Mount Airy. His father and step-mother, Herb and Bertie Cook are residents of Ararat, N.C. After the shooting, Cooper led lawmen on a car chase that ended when he crashed through a roadblock and wrecked. Officers found Cooper dead in the car, apparently of a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head.

Hege said Cook's murder was especially senseless because the warrant against Cooper was "a step above a traffic violation."

"My job is to bring 'em home every day and I didn't do that and I apologize for that," Hege said, his eyes filling with tears and his voice beginning to tremble.

Lexington Police Lt. Keith Owen said his department began investigating Cooper a few weeks ago after a Lexington man reported that Cooper was having sex with his 15-year-old granddaughter.

The girl's mother took out a trespassing warrant against Cooper on Thursday because he went to their Lexington home after she told him not to, according to the warrant filed at the Davidson County Magistrate's Office.

Cook went to Cooper's house to serve him with that warrant.

Cooper's father, Arthur Cooper, said fear of being arrested for a sex crime might have driven his son over the edge.

"Chris told me that he was very upset about the (statutory rape) threat, and that he was going to try do some things to make his life better," his father said. "Chris told his mother and his step-dad that he only saw two ways out of this, one was prison and the other was a pine box."

Investigators believe that when Cook arrived at the home, he spoke with Cooper, who went to a bedroom, got a rifle and shot Cook. Paul Cook, 16, Cooper's stepbrother and no relation to the deputy, told authorities he heard footsteps, a shot, a thump like someone fell and several more shots, Hege said.

Capt. Chris Coble said Cook never drew his pistol. The deputy was found at the doorway, his head lying against the door.

Investigators said Cook was shot up to five times from behind with a 7.62 mm assault rifle and with a 12-gauge shotgun in the front near his right shoulder, but his bullet-proof vest deflected the pellets.

After the shooting, deputies, Highway Patrol troopers, Lexington police and enforcement officers from the Division of Motor Vehicles searched for Cooper.

Officers heard a gunshot as Cooper's vehicle went past the roadblock. Two officers returned fire, but neither of the shots struck the interior of Cooper's car, Hege said.

Because officers used their weapons, the State Bureau of Investigation will look into the incident.

Cooper had a history of minor arrests, including injury to personal property, misuse of 911, giving a false report, speeding, misdemeanor

larceny and resisting a public officer. Investigators found paraphernalia used to make pipe bombs and survival magazines at Cooper's house, Hege said.

Cook worked for the sheriff's department for three years. His survivors include his parents, an infant daughter with Down syndrome and a fiancee.

The funeral will be held at 2 p.m. Monday at First Pentecostal Holiness Church.

I'm enclosing copies of a few pages from the descendants of Peter Cook for information only. This is not my direct line but his descendants married my relatives and it was necessary to compile his history also. These Cooks were Quakers and most of the information came from the Garrett Genealogy (Welcome Garrett was an ancestor of mine) and/or the Quaker records. Response: The earliest date I found for Cook in Rowan County, N.C. was in "Carolina Cradle," by Robert W. Ramsey and found on page 53. "Beside the McConnells, other pioneers known to have been in the Davidson's Creek settlement prior to 1752 were John McWhorter, Henry Potts, Thomas Cook, Joseph Reid and The Reverend John Thompson. It is probable that Samuel Baker, Thompson's son-in-law, was among those present, for he was operating a mill on Davidson's Creek in 1753."

Ramsey writes that the McConnells were in Nantmeal Township, Lancaster County, Pa. in 1737; some were in Orange Co., Va. in 1740 and on Davidson's Creek, N.C. in 1850. Baker was also in Lancaster Co., Pa. So it is likely that the others listed were also from there. People traveled in groups in those days.

The earliest tax list for Rowan found is listed in Jo Linn's book, "Wills And Estates Records, Tax Lists For 1759 and 1778." The men named Cook in 1759 (page 112) are Abraham Cook, Cornelius Cook, John Burghart Cook, Thomas Cook and Stephen Potts. I do not know if these men were there in 1761 when your William Cook was born.

There was a pioneer preacher named William Cook who was there by then. He helped establish some churches and was pastoring Flat Rock Baptist Church in what is now Yadkin County when he died in 1812. No will listed. He was said to be from eastern N.C. and was at a church in Warren

Co., N.C. before coming to Rowan Co. In Surry County (later Yadkin) in the 1780s were William Cook, Senior and Junior, John Cook, Nicholas Cook. William Cook Sr. died in 1801 and left a will.

Keep in mind that your ancestor was born in Rowan in 1761. This looks as if William Cook Jr., who was in Surry when his father died in 1801, is the most likely person to be the ancestor you are looking for. More documentation will have to be found. Maybe the readers can help.

regiment. The regiment marched across Susquehanna River through the Jinnissee country to Fort Pitt where they were stationed during the winter.

As soon as the winter broke Gen. McIntosh ordered the regiment to march to a place now called Fort McIntosh. They were employed in building that fort. Then they marched to the Tuskroris River where they were employed in building Fort Lawrence. After they built the fort the Wyandotte tribe besieged the fort. After some lapse of time they were evacuated with the loss of nineteen men and marched back to Fort Pitt where he was discharged by Capt. Thomas Prator.

He was born 12 July 1759 (record taken from his father's register). Since the war he has lived in Stafford Co., Va., and for about thirty years in Shelby Co., Ky. His discharge was burned in his brother's house in Stafford Co., Va., in

23 Aug. 1839. Green Co., Ky. Catharine Cook of said county, aged 80, declares she is the widow of Benjamin Cook. She was married 25 Dec. 1779 in Charlotte Co., Va. About three years or a little upwards previous to her marriage with Cook he enlisted in Charlotte County under Capt. Walton and marched immediately with him through North Carolina into South Carolina and was at the battle of Stono in 1776. He served twelve

Her maiden name was Catharine Brewer. Cook died in Charlotte Co., Va., in 1806 and immediately after his death she moved to Green Co., Ky. She was born 13 Sept. 1759. Benjamin Cook was born 8 April 1758 and died in March 1806 (records in her family Bible). The parson or minister who performed the ceremony was named Johnston or Johnson.

In the spring of 1781 in Charlotte County her husband volunteered in the company of Capt. William Morton and others for three months and marched to Guilford Court House, N.C., and was in the battle fought in March 1781. He served two months. His first discharge was given by Capt. Walton or Capt. Habersham. Her eldest child, Martha, was about two years old when her husband volunteered on the last tour. The officers who served this tour with him were Col. Cock, Maj. Hubbard, Capt. Booker, Capt. William Morton, Capt. Gains, Capt. Thompson and Capt. McDowell. -SIC[1779]

24 Dec. 1799. Charlotte Co., Va. Marriage bond: Benjamin Cook to Catharine Brewer (spinster), daughter of Sackville Brewer of said county. Security, William Cook.

1 Sept. 1777. Discharge of Benjamin Cook, private in Capt. Shadrach Wright's company in First Battalion of Continental Troops of Georgia for twelve months, signed by Col. Joseph Habersham at Savannah.

20 Aug. 1839. Green Co., Ky. Thomas Gains of said county,

aged 80, declares he was acquainted with Benjamin Cook from his childhood until his marriage with Catharine Brewer. He lived a near neighbor to him for twenty-five years after his marriage until he had children grown. In the spring of 1776 not long before the Declaration of Independence, in Charlotte Co., Va., where Cook was raised and lived and married, Benjamin Cook enlisted under Capt. Walton for twelve months and marched through North Carolina to South Carolina and was in the battle fought at Stono. He did not serve with Cook as he was serving in a different part of the country but he knows Cook enlisted for twelve months and marched from his place of residence. About two years after Cook returned he married Catharine Brewer in 1779 in Charlotte County. They raised a large family of children. In 1781 Benjamin Cook volunteered in Charlotte County in a company raised by Capt. William Morton and Gains and others and marched in the spring through Halifax and Pittsylvania counties to Guilford C.H., N.C., and was in the battle fought at Guilford in March 1781. Cook served two. months. It was proclaimed by Col. Read, the colonel of Charlotte County, that those who volunteered should be considered as having served a full tour of duty. The officers were Col. Cock, Maj. Hubbard, Capt. Morton, Capt. Thompson, Capt. McDowell and Capt. Dawson. Gains acted as ensign and as adjutant. Cook was born about 1757 or 1758 and died in Charlotte County in 1806. Immediately after his death Catharine removed to Green Co., Ky. She is near 80 years old.

Gains was born in Hanover Co., Va., 7 July 1759. He lived with his father in that county until about 4 or 5 years of age and then removed to Charlotte Co., Va., and lived there

until 1817 when he removed to Green Co., Ky.

3 Oct. 1839. Green Co., Ky. Benjamin Cock [signed Benj. B. Cook] of said county declares he hasfrequently seen the old family Bible which belongs to Catharine Cook. Benjamin Cook was born 8 April 1758 in Hanover Co., Va., and died in Charlotte Co., Va., 27 March 1806, aged 48 years. Catharine Brewer was born 13 Sept. 1759. Benjamin Cook and Catharine Brewer were married 25 Dec. 1779. Martha W. Cook, eldest child of Benjamin and Catharine, was born 25 Jan. 1781.

24 Feb. 1840. Green Co., Ky. Catharine Cook of said county declares she thinks she is mistaken in the date of the battle

13 Jan. 1841. Green Co., Ky. Catharine Cook of said county, aged 81, declares she has found the discharge of her husband

Benjamin Cook.

Catharine Cook of Green Co., Ky., widow of Benjamin Cook who died in 1806, private in the company of Capt. Morton in the regiment of Col. Cocke in the Virginia line for sixmonths, was placed on the Kentucky pension roll at \$20 per annum under the Act of 1838. Certificate 3323 was issued 20 May 1840. Increased to \$46.66 on service of sixteen months 24 Feb. 1841.

COOK, Benjamin (Jemima). W.8630.

31 July 1832. Middlesex Co., N.J. Benjamin Cook of the City of New Brunswick in said county declares he was born in My records indicate that John Cook was married two times, to sisters, Priscilla and Edith Jessop. Priscilla died before 1814, leaving on child, and he married Edith 08 Jun 1814 in Surry County. James Cook, was Bondsman, for the marriage.

Luther Byrd was a genealogist in the 1940's who lived at Westfield and did lots of work on the Jessop/Jessup and other families in Surry County and he indicated that Priscilla married John Cook, who was probably a son of John and Lydia Hussey Cook; and that Priscilla's widower married Priscilla's younger sister, Edith.

Information from another source indicates that she married John Cook, son of Henderson Cook. The only references to Henderson Cook indicate he moved west. I do not find a Henderson Cook among the Westfield, Surry-Stokes area, so he may have moved west from Guilford, Rowan, or what is present-day Yadkin County. Hiram Cook moved from Guilford to Westfield and his parents went west from Guilford (New Garden MM) in 1823-1827. It is possible that Henderson went west about the same time. The Chandler-Jessop line went to Indiana and some moved on to Washington State, where they are presently living.

I'm enclosing Family Group Sheets from my computer on John Cook and Hiram Jessup. Pedigree charts for Edith and Priscilla Jessup, the first 11 pages of "Thomas Jessop Heirs" dated 19 Oct, 1996; first 7 pages of Descendants of Robert Cook dated 12 Nov 1997, and 9 pages from the Registry Report on Peter Cook dated Nov 1997.

My apologies for being so late in replying to your letter, but my computer died and it has taken since late December to get it repaired and the data recovered.

Wilma Hiatt of the Surry County Genealogical Association said you had inquired about the information on the Cook family. The information placed in the library is actually a printout of part of the data on the Cook families that I'm trying to search. The work is in process, far from complete, and open for any and all corrections, help, assistance, etc. I told her I would be happy to send you a copy of a current printout, rather than a copy of the one in the library, since it is being updated almost daily.

At this point, my research is in two parts: (1) starting with my pedigree and going back each generation; and (2) the Cooks who came to North Carolina via the New Garden Quaker settlement in Greensboro, and married into my family (not my direct line). The first group goes back to Robert Cook [ca 1720] and the second group goes back to Peter Cook [b.1674]. Robert's line may at some point connect to Peter Cook; however, I have not made that much progress.

In addition to these two lines, Jerry Cook traced the Yadkin County (originally part of Surry) Cook family. He died suddenly this year before I got a copy of his work. He stated that these Cooks were not connected to the others in Surry County. I have not yet seen his work, but look forward to getting a copy. I understand his son is working with both the Yadkin County and Surry County Genealogical Societies to preserve his father's work. Your query has shown me the connection that may exist and prompts me to get a copy soon. I had never connected my Martin line with my Cook line, other than the marriage of my grandfather (the Martin line) and my grandmother (the Cook line). I had considered them separate lines back past 1899 when my Dad was born. I have not yet researched the Martin line but hope to do so at some time. I'm enclosing a copy of the information I have in the computer.

There is enclosed a copy of a map of the original Surry County boundries with the Yadkin River highlighted at Jonesville. It seems that your Obediah Martin lived on the Yadkin River and Jonesville was originally named Martinsborough. He apparently was an attorney since he gave his son, William, half of his law books and also witnessed so many wills in Surry County. This may or may not be the part of the Yadkin River for your Martins. The East Branch of the Yadkin or Little Yadkin on the map (which is now Stokes County) is the homeplace of Col. John "Jack" Martin [ca 1756-1822] who built the rock house and left at least 7 sons in the Stokes County area. This is the location of the Martin's that produced my Grandfather's Grandmother, Sarah Martin [1810-aft 1851 in MO]. My homeplace is at the top of the hill above the headwaters of the Flat Shoal Creek and north of Tom's Creek on the map. It is my opinion that all the Surry County Martins are related.

Many of our relatives went to Indiana, especially from the Garrett and Jessup lines. I have information on both of these lines, if you descended from them. I would be interested in knowing how you are related to all these families.

I'll admit that the enclosed information is forwarded to you with selfish motives, for I believe you will be able to help me by sharing your information more than this will help you. Any information or help you will share will be most appreciated. Also, if you have questions or need information on my other lines, please let me know. Please don't put this on the internet since it is not in final draft and that would make corrections almost impossible.

Dear Genealogist,

Your letter to the Surry County Genealogical Society has been forwarded to me for reply since we share both families listed in your letter. I have worked extensively on both families, have placed some information in the Surry Community College Library, and have entered the information in my computer. I will be happy to share any information; however, it is my desire that none of my information be placed in the internet since it is in the working stages and subject to correction.

In response to your request for information about Surry County, the following might be of help:

Surry was formed from Rowan in 1771. Rowan was formed from Anson in 1753. Anson was formed from Bladen in 1750. Bladen was formed from New Hanover in 1734. New Hanover was formed from Craven in 1729.

Craven was first created as Archdale Precinct of Bath County in 1705. The name was changed about 1712. Between 1663 and 1729 North Carolina was under the control of the Lords Proprietors and their descendants who commissioned colonial officials and authorized the governor and his council to grant lands in the name of the Lords Proprietors.

The following counties were formed from Surry County: Wilkes in 1777; from which Ashe was formed in 1799. Stokes in 1789; from which Forsyth was formed in 1849. Yadkin in 1850.

In addition, the Quakers first established the Cane Creek MM in Orange County, then New Garden MM at Guilford County, and moved west to present day Yadkin County and to Westfield which is on the Stokes/Surry line. The Jessop/Jessup families are and have been Quakers which fact has been most helpful in tracing this family. Many are and have been prominent in the Friends Churches thru the years.

The young woman had a U.S. flag in her hand and asked if the one hanging outside could be replaced with a new one in honor of her grandfather, Charlie Cook. I told her I would be happy to and the next flag she saw flying would be the one she had brought.

I was so touched by the gesture and the

After she left, I realized I did not even get her name, even though she told me where she lived. The next day I was telling the story to Jo Ann Cockerham of Jo Jo's Flower Shop and she was acquainted with the young lady and her family. I was able to get in touch with her parents, Ron and Dixie Atkins, and they gave me the phone number for their daughter, Sarah Rutledge.

I called her and told her how deeply touched I was and how much I wanted to help her do something special in honor of her grandfather. I explained to her that I was in the process of getting a new flag pole for the funeral home and we would hang the new flag in Charlie's honor. We set a day and time for her and her family members to come by and raise the new flag and have some photos taken.

Sarah arrived with her grandmother, Betty Southard Cook; her mother, Dixie Atkins; and her 15-month-old son, Lane. How touching it was to see four generations pay tribute to their loved one who fought for our country.

The story about Charlie Cook got more interesting as I talked to his family. Sgt. First Class Cook served 25 years in the U.S. Army. He first joined at age 17 but his entry was delayed by an attack of appendicitis. He served for four years until the death of his father, the Rev. L.M. Cook. It was another three years before he reenlisted. He traveled to all but two states and had been on every continent at the time of his retirement.

He served in Korea, Germany, Greenland and Vietnam. He was the oldest member of his platoon in Vietnam and all his

buddies called him "Pops." He served two tours of duty there and he was one of nine men who made it back home alive. During his last tour in Vietnam, Charlie suffered a major heart attack and a cardiac arrest. He woke up about a week later in Hawaii in the coronary-care unit. He made a full recovery and then was reassigned to Fort Benning, Ga., where he served until his retirement and honorable discharge.

While serving our country, Cook earned two Bronze Stars and a Silver Star for heroism, and four Purple Hearts, of which he never bragged.

In fact, his daughter Dixie stumbled upon this information while going through some papers. She took all the information and ordered all the medals and ribbons that he had never received while in service and had them framed for him. She said that it was the only time she ever saw her father speechless.

Charlie was well known for making everyone laugh and always had something to say. He was the Dobson Welcome Wagon to everyone.

He was truly a hero to his wife, Betty; daughters Dixie and Cindy; grandchildren Sarah and Cody; greatgrandson Lane; and to all that knew him.

Charlie Cook was a dedicated member

Thank you for your letter dated July 22, 2002 regarding Lucinda Cook and Lucy Cook. We are sorry that were not able to find information on these ladies in our file. Surry County did not keep birth records until 1913. The birth records could have come from the Quaker records as there are a lot of Cooks listed in Hinshaw's North Carolina Quaker Encyclopedia.

We have several members researching the Cook family and you might wish to write Rilla M. Gregg, 728 Rolling Ct., Kernersville, NC 27284. She has done quite a bit of Cook research and might be able to help you.

We checked our family files and several books that were in our research room on the Cook family but was unable to find anything to help you.



Our mama had a lot of heartaches in this old world, but praise God, she is at peace now.




Mama had 21 grandchildren, 32 great grandchildren and 2 great, great grandchildren.

Viola Byrd was born on July 12, 1904, to Luther and Neelia Byrd in Ronda. She graduated from Ronda High School and taught school for two years. On February 13, 1933, she married John W. Hurt. They were farmers who raised 4 children and 8 grandchildren. Today she also has 6 greatgrandchildren.

She has been active in church, in the WMU and in the Home Demonstration Club all her life.

Mrs. Viola worked on a farm and raised a garden each year to put up foods to feed the family. She also sewed and made the clothes for the children. She took care of her father-in-law and mother-in-law for 20 years.

I can remember her telling us children stories of her life growing up on a farm. She was the oldest girl of ten, so her parents depended upon her to help.

She remembers making biscuits for her family when one of her brothers or sisters was born. She was so small, she had to stand in a chair to reach the table.

Also, she tells of learning to sew before she was old enough to go to school. She would cut out shirts and sew them up at age 5 or 6 years old. She could not make the sewing machine to treadle forward because she was not big enough to operate it correctly.

She has always been the type of person who thinks of others before herself. That is probably because of the way she was raised — in a good Christian home and she raised her family in the same way.

Mrs. Viola was employed by Spainhours as an alterations lady for years. She retired from Spainhours in 1970.

She always gave parties for others and was 50 years old before she had a birthday party for herself. Her sister-inlaw, Opal Byrd and myself gave her a surprise party. She was very pleased.

She has had a lot of sickness in her lifetime, but always had such will power to live that she would overcome her sickness. In 1974, she had a stroke that paralyzed her from the waist down. Doctors said she would never walk again, but with her will power and the power of God she walked again and is still walking with the help of a walker.

She helps at home by stringing beans, peeling potatoes and tomatoes for canning and freezing. Now 90 years old, she still goes to Macedonia Baptist Church almost every Sunday. She is truly an inspiration to others.



Former Teacher Honored On Her 100th Birthday

Grace Cooke sat at a picnic table beneath a huge oak tree Wednesday and talked to each of the guests who had come to Oak Grove Baptist Church to help celebrate her 100th birthday.

Mrs. Cooke arrived with her daughter, Jean Wright, wearing an orchid corsage pinned to her navy and white paisley dress. The orchid complemented her silver-white hair and peaches and cream complexion.

Her petite, trim body moves with ease. Her mind is brilliant and she proved that as many of her former students and teachers sat down to chat with her. With a few clues, she remembered most of them.

John Hamilton, who coached at Beulah High School for many years and later became principal, gave Mrs. Cooke a hug as they talked about days when she taught there. Jokingly, he said, "I never dreamed I'd be wishing you a happy birthday in a church cemetery."

The cemetery is located on the back lawn and sepa-

rates the church and the picnic area.

Just as he departed, Jack Seal came by to remind Mrs. Cooke that she had been his teacher about 65 or 70 years ago at Zion Hill.

Tiny Hall mentioned that she attended Sheltontown School when Mrs. Cooke was the school principal and that her sister, Flossie Graves, who was also present, went there, too.

Mrs. Cooke said she must have been about 17 when she first started teaching at the Bunker School and later at Sheltontown, a three-room schoolhouse. From there she taught at Zion Hill.

Dorothy Hicks reminded Mrs. Cooke that she

boarded with her parents, Ed and Grace Smith, while teaching at Zion Hill.

With that, Mrs. Cooke added, "I rode a horse and buggy to their home and stayed during the week and then went back home on the weekends.

"Oh, there were so many schools, but most of my years were spent teaching at Beulah," she said.

Teaching Career

During her career, she taught for 43 years, substituted for six years and has been retired for 35 years. She said that most of her students were very good, and, after hesitating, recalled having a couple of little boys who had been fighting. "We had an ante-room at the school, so I carried them in there and talked to them. I asked if they would promise not to do that again. One of the boys said he promised not to fight anymore. The other one said he couldn't make that promise because he didn't know whether he would or not."

Laughing, she added, "He was honest."

As she chatted, more friends came by to speak to her. Margaret Moxley brought her a long-stemmed red rose and Mrs. Cooke said, "I love you."

Evelyn Sheets and her brother, Junior Snow, came together and presented Mrs. Cooke with a lovely arrangement of flowers. Their father was a cousin of Mrs. Cooke.

Irene Gentry Monday reminded Mrs. Cooke of the days when she was a neighbor and Alice Isaacs congratulated her on her 100th birthday, adding, "We're not far behind you."

It was past noon, so the Rev. Milton Sewell pronounced the invocation and Garner Jarrell invited the 80 guests to enjoy a barbecue luncheon that he and his wife, Linda, had prepared for this special occasion.

In addition to the food, the group was also entertained with music presented by Johnny Vipperman, Nicholas McMillian, David Moose, Flossie Graves and other musicians.

As the party came to a close, the genial Mrs. Cooke added that her sister, Emma Bunker, had so wanted to live to be 100, but died at the age of 96.

They were from a family of 11 children. Two had died at an early age and three passed away just in recent years. These included Emma, Sarah Sparger and Charles Snow.

One sister, Ruby York, lives in Charlotte and her brother, Columbus, resides in Washington.

Their parents, Preston and Alice Snow, made their home at Mitchell's River where he owned a general store and Mrs. Snow had the post office at Good Springs.

The widow of Sam D. Cooke, this perky lady resides with her daughter on West Pine Street. Referring to Jean, she said, "Why, she doesn't even let me wash the dishes. But that doesn't worry me one bit," she said with a twinkle in her eyes.

Her daughter says she loves to read the morning paper and can't wait for The Mount Airy News to come in the afternoon. She also watches TV a lot," she added.

Family History

Mrs. Cooke was born Grace Elizabeth Snow on June 8, 1897. She and her husband had two children, Jean, and a son, the late Irvin Cooke. There are two grandchildren, Diane Ramey and Gray Wright and four great-grandchildren, Alan and Amanda Wright, Matthew Ramey and Justin Hill.

Most of these were at the luncheon celebration, along with church members and seniors from the community.

Mrs. Cooke is the oldest member of Oak Grove Baptist Church and often attends services there. She also enjoys gathering there for the Wednesday luncheons for the seniors group.

She has rested up from the Wednesday party and is ready for another afternoon of partying. Jean says they will be receiving guests again this afternoon beginning at 2 p.m. at their home on West Pine Street.

Surry Resident Celebrates 105th Birthday Wednesday

One of Surry County's oldest citizens celebrated her 105th birthday Wednesday surrounded by her family and friends.

Grace Cooke turned 105 as her family fondly remembered some of her accomplishments during a cookout at Oak Grove Church.

"She taught school for 50 years. Forty-three of those years, she taught full time, and

for six years she taught as a substitute teacher," said one of Cooke's relatives.

According to family members, Cooke took care of her own affairs until she was 100 years old. Then she moved into her daughter's home where she lives now. Cooke is confined to a wheelchair and can barely see or hear. But the party was still festive with lots of flowers and a beautifully decorated cake.

A group of bluegrass musicians was on hand to help the

crowd sing "Happy Birthday." Even Surry County Commissioner Gary York stopped by to wish her well.

The event was part of the monthly Senior Luncheons that are put on by Garner and Linda Jarrell. Wednesday was the seven-year anniversary for the weekly luncheons. They provide food and fellowship for seniors who sometimes don't get enough interaction with the

community and other seniors.

Garner Jarrell said they had about 150 guests yesterday.

"We know how many we had by counting the number of plates we have left," smiled Jarrell.

When asked what Cooke used during her life to be able to live so long her daughter Jean Wright said, "Well, she didn't smoke or drink or anything like that. She believed in living right and hard work. She drank lots of coffee and loves to eat vegetables. Up until she was 100, she could spell any word you asked her and she used to read every word in *The Mount Airy News* every day."

COOK

Commander Gerald (Jerry) Wilson Cook, 63 United States Navy (Retired), a native of Winston-Salem, N.C., died May 10, 1996 at Forsyth Memorial Hospital. He was born at the old City Hospital in Winston-Salem, October 1932. His parents were Paul Wilson Cook and Edna Catherine Moser Cook both long-time residents of Winston-Salem. Jerry attended grammar school at Old Town School in Forsyth County, and graduated from Reynolds High School in 1950. He won a four-year U.S. Navy scholarship through competitive exams to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill while a senior student at Reynolds High. He was sworn in as a midshipman in September 1950, and earned a regular commission in the U.S. Navy in 1954, and retired as a full Commander in Naples, Italy, in 1977. At Chapel Hill he was elected and served as the Secretary/Treasurer of the UNC student government, worked on the Daily Tarheel newspaper with Rolph Neil and Charles Kuralt, was involved in numerous organizations and activities there, and was inducted as a member of The Order of the Old Well for outstanding scholarship and leadership. He was a member of Sigma Chi social fraternity and Alpha Phi Omega service fraternity.

During his U.S. Navy career he served on several ships in the Pacific Ocean at the Naval Air Station, Brunswick, Georgia; as an advisor to the Vietnamese Navy in Saigon; at the Naval Receiving Station, Washington, D.C.; at the Naval Air Station Atsugi, Japan; at the Defense General Supply Center Richmond, Virginia, at the Pentagon in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations; and finally four years at the Navy Support Activity, Naples, Italy, in charge of a \$21 million resale activity employing over 600 civilians and serving some 13,000 Americans and ships of the Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean. He was awarded the Navy Commendation medal, the Navy Unit Commendation ribbon, American Defense medal (twice), the Foreign Service Medal, the American Expeditionary Force medal, the Vietman Service medal, and two service medals from the South Vietnmese government. He was issued several letters of commendation for outstanding service, including a commendation from Admiral Elmo Zumwalt for service in the Pentagon as head of the Military Assistance Division in the Office of the Chief of Naval Opertions from 1969-1973 during which time he managed the Vietnamization of the U.S. Navy's portion of the Vietnam war during the American withdrawal. After retirement from the Navy, he lived in Flordia for six years, returning to Winston-Salem in 1983. While living in the Old Salem Historic District, he served as president of the Old Salem Residents' Association for two and one half years. He was an independent casualty insurance broker working with the Conrad Insurance Agency at Reynolda Plaza in Winston-Salem. For over 40 years Jerry researched early pioneer families in the area where Yadkin, Wilkes, and Iredell Counties meet. He published six books on genealogical and historical subjects, and has contributed a number of articles to the genealogical societies of Forsyth, Iredell, Surry, Wilkes, and Yadkin counties. He is survived by his mother, Edna Catherine Moser Cook of Winston-Salem, two daughters, Sandra Elizabeth Cook Reid of Johnson City, New York, Charlotte Edna Cook McIntosh of Greensboro, N.C. a son Charles Wilson (Will) Cook of Chapel Hill, N.C., their mother is Julia Elizabeth Shields, a native of Chapel Hill, also surviving are three grandchildren, David, Peter and Daniel Reid of Johnson City, New York. At a later date there will be a short graveside service at Mt. Tabor United Methodist Church where he has been a member since 1938. Any memorials or contributions are requested to be sent to Mt.
