Frank Freeman, native of Dobson, is one of the younger members of the Surry county bar and has spent his entire life in the Surry county seat. He was graduated from the Dobson High School and then attended The Citadel at Charleston, S. C., N. C. State College and took his law course at Wake Forest College. He taught school at Germanton one year and at Dobson two years before entering into the practice of his profession.
