of the second part. Witnesseth: That for and in consideration of the sum
of one dollar each to the other in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby
acknowledged. Ther parties hereto bind themselves to the following: The
party of the first part has this day sold to the party of the second part
the Bryant farm situated in Franklin township, Surry County, N.C., on the expres
condition that he is the last bidder at the sale to be held by W.M. Jackson
trustee on Jan. 26th 1926 and is to have in lieu thereof, \$2500.00 cash,
notes payable in one, two and three years for \$1000 to be secured with a
deed of trust on the land at 6% and the choice of either ~~in~~ ~~in~~ two
tracts of the lands of party of the second part in Carroll county as per
survey of A.H. Morris surveyor, free of encumbrance. Party of second part
is to have immediate possession of Bryant lands and also possession for
the crop year of 1926 on the Virginia lands and to pay one-sixth of the
crop for rent and in the event he moves to Brant land and re-rents the
Virginia land he is to pay one-third of the rents. This is subject to
the approval of the Virginia lands by J.W. Hutchens who is to go today and
