On February 13, 1922 our God of grace and mercy blessed us with the beautiful spirit and presence of his child, Mother Frances Roberts Brim. She labored faithfully for ninety-three years in the name of her savior Jesus Christ and on December 31, 2015 he reclaimed his daughter.

Frances, affectionately called "Mama Frances," or "Mother Brim," began her journey in Ararat, Virginia where she was educated. She went on to meet the love of her life, Joe Brady Brim. The two married May 10, 1941. Side by side they served God with a passion that touched many lives. They were unwavering in their faith. Mother Brim joined the church in 1941 and was baptized in 1945. The ministry at that time was called Paynetown Holiness Church. With a 74 year membership she served in the following capacities: kitchen committee, senior choir a number of years, served on the Mothers board, and served as president of a home mission for almost twenty years. With the title General Mother she served the general church for twenty-five years at Triumphant Pentecostal Church (Apostolic) Inc; of which her greatest length of service to the church was under the tenure of Bishop Tony O. Carter. During those 38 years she displayed great fortitude and courage towards the growth of the ministry. She was a model mother, a rock.

Mother Brim was a skilled domestic worker and was keen on cleanliness. She was an orderly woman. She took pride in taking care of her home. Known for her style, Mother Brim loved to dress up with her fancy hats and matching accessories. She opened her mouth with wisdom and comforted everyone with her delicious food, kind words, and gentle spirit. Those who came to uplift and encourage Mother Brim found themselves leaving encouraged and

uplifted by her powerful anointing. A wellness visit with Mother Brim would always culminate in the presence of the Lord, with scripture, and prayer. Mother Brim was a firm prayer warrior, preaching until the end.

Mother Brim, the second of seven children, was preceded in death by her parents, James Early and Lucy Caroline Sawyers Roberts; loving brothers, Clarence, Gentry and Aaron Roberts; and by her devoted husband of 52 years the Elder Joe Brady Brim Sr.

She leaves behind to cherish her memory two loving daughters, Mrs. Barbara (Bill) Lloyd of Florida; Minister Rosa Harris of Greensboro, North Carolina; one son Mr. Joe Brady Brim, Jr. of Michigan; 11 grandchildren, among them 7 incredible grandchildren Beverly, Gurvis, Curt, Tyrone, Dwaine, Mario and Michael; 26 great grandchildren; and 7 great-great-grandchildren; three sisters Ms. Pearl Abercrombie and Ms. Mabel Richardson both of New York; and Mrs. Hazel Strickland of Phoenix, Arizona; four sisters-in-law, Mrs. Levonia Brim Jenkins of Atlanta GA; Mrs. Jessie M. Brim and Mrs. Iva Ingram Roberts of North Carolina; and Mrs. Elaine Roberts of Hampton VA; and a whole host of nieces, nephews, cousins, the Triumphant Pentecostal Church Family and her loving pastor Dr. Tony O.
