Know, that we for and in consideration of the sum of fifty Shillings for every hundred acres hereby granted paid into our Treasury by Jabez Jarvis (have given and granted and by these Presents do give and grant unto the said Jabez Jarvis a Tract of Land containing one hundred and ninety one acres lying and being in our County of Surry, in the forks of Fishers River and the Fork in River Beginning at a Point on the Bank of the Fishers River and running North thirty nine Chains to a pine thence East forty nine Chains to a Beach on the Banks of Fishers River, thence South down the said River thirty nine Chains to a Post, thence West up the Fishers River to the Beginning as by the plat hereunto annexed shall appear; together with all woods Waters Mines Minerals Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Land belonging or appertaining, to hold to the said Jabez Jarvis his Heirs and Assigns forever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money yearly or otherwise as our general Assembly from time to time may direct. Provided always that the said Jabez Jarvis shall cause this Grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of Surry within twelve Months from the Date hereof otherwise the same shall be void and of no Effect. 5. BURRELL PACE b. 1758, Bertie/Edcombe Co., NC; d. 1816, Saluda, Polk Co., NC. Did he marry Lydia Woodruff? If so, when and where?
6. STEPHEN PACE b. before 1757. When did he die? Did he first marry an Indian girl, and second to Nancy Ann Walker? If so, when and where? Did he marry third to Lucy Walker 8 Mar 1799, Johnston Co., NC.

a. Pedigree Chart of Edmund Pace Jarvis, who was my great-great-grandfather. You can see that I would be interested in four families from Surry County:

1. The Jarvis Family. I believe that Reziah Jarvis and his two brothers, Eliphalet and Jabez, settled in the Fishers River area about 1772. I believe that the parents of these three brothers were John and Lucy Jarvis of Bladen County, but I cannot verify this. In any case, Reziah Jarvis was active in Surry County between about 1772 and 1813, when he and his family moved to Warren County, Tennessee.

2. The Pace Family. Reziah's son, Abner, my great-great-great-grandfather, married Patsy Pace, the daughter of the Rev. Edmund Pace of Surry County. I have quite a bit of information on the Paces, but need more.

3. The Rose Family. I have no information on the Rose family in Surry County.

4. The Walker Family. I have some very limited information on the Walker Family.

b. A Family Group Record of the Reziah Jarvis Family.

c. A Family Group Record of the Edmund Pace Family.

The second set of documents are basically abstracts of what I found on these four families during my day in Dobson. They may be of interest to other researchers.

Again, let me thank you again for your warm welcome. Mother and I look forward to another visit to North Carolina soon and the opportunity to see some of the friends we made there.

Here is what I have found so far; some by myself and other Submitting info

There was a man named John Pace listed on the annual report of Confiscated Property in Surry County NC in May 1784. I have a copy of the document. It is assumed that the land was confiscated because he was disloyal to the new nation.

However, others like Gideon Wright were declared traitors by the Court when their land was confiscated. There is no record that John Pace was declared a traitor. per Jon Pace

Some feel Amy Pace is daug of one of these Pace's in Surry Co NC believe Judy Cardwell feels this is her line we are just trying to prove who the Children were right now

and hard, until we find a Will or Probate of John Pace of Surry Co NC

This letter of Carrie Pace also States Dempsey Pace as s/o John Pace & Sarah Burge but we do need more proof to back it up Per Miles

The 1774 Surry Co tax list of John Pace confirms Richmond as a son of John. (Note this Richmond much older than the 1799 Richmond Pace as there are several Richmond Pace born around that same time frame but maybe not born in Surry Co NC) including My Richmond Pace b- abt 1800 to 1803 this Richmond appears in Harlan Co Ky with Mother Polly Pace Father unknown but Bruce Howards says he thinks Jesse Pace father s/o Thomas Pace but offers no proof only a supposition Per Darlene Pace So I have no clue who his father was only DNA evidence proves I am from this line of Pace's

1774 Surry Co NC Tax list John Pace is shown with his son Richmond Pace paying 2 polls, one for himself

and one for Richmond Pace so assume he is a son.. and some say he died in Rev War there is one note proving that he died with his father John Pace in RWar

There is a John Pace appearing on the 1777 Surry Tax showing two improvement valued at the cost of \$100.00. Look up

1782 Tax list were Burwell Pace, Sarah Pace & Keziah Pace was a look up and she only gave me Sarah Pace info

Sarah Pace she is listed as having 1 horse and 8 Cattle this came from Judy Cardwell who is part of the Surry County Genealogical Association which I joined.

Darlene, thanks for your membership to the Surry County Genealogical Association. Our spring 2005 journal won't be mailed until March 2005. Our winter journal 2004 was just mailed in November. We hope you don't mind waiting. Is there anything in particular on the Pace family that you need us to look up for you. You just stated the names you were researching were Jesse Pace, Thomas Pace, Richmond Pace, John Pace and Dempsey Pace. You might want to contact Betty pace at bapace2@juno.com on John Pace. I hope that is still a good email address. Below is some info she had sent us in a query.

John Pace and wife Sarah Burge Pace lived in Surry Co., NC by 1770. He and his family had come from VA through Northampton Co., NC and Halifax Co., NC. He was a Loyalist/Tory and apparently joined his neighbors, the Wright brothers of Surry Co., NC by that time to participate in the Battle of Shallow Ford, Surry Co. (now Yadkin Co.). He and his sons Thomas and Richmond died in that Battle.

We also had this little bit of info available.

Richmond Pace was born in NC in 1799. He migrated to TN, living in Franklin Co. in 1820-30 and Bedford Co. in 1840-50. He moved to Muhlenberg Co., KY by 1860 and died there in 1862. His wife Sarah Charles (1800-1872) was also born in NC. They may be related to John and Sarah Pope Pace of Surry Co. (info in query of Virginia Pace on the internet).

These dates are not the same as what you had down in your info so we don't know if this is of any benefit to you or not. If you will give me the names and exactly what you need and about the time frame, I will see what I can find for

you.
