

Obituary

James completed the 7th grade at the Stoney Ridge Elementary School. He was a hardworking young man as he labored on the farms with his older brother Elmer Oscar and his wife Nolia. They took Eldridge and Eleanor and reared them as they grew to adulthood after the passing of their parents. James later followed his older brother Vernon Eugene to Slab Fork, West Virginia, to work in the coal mines. While in West Virginia, James met the love of his life, Lula Mae Cook who was then the radio announcer for her father, Pastor Walter C. Cook's broadcast.
