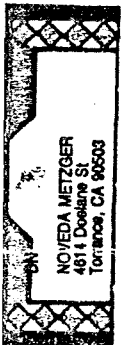

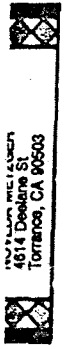

Dear Mrs. Lewis:

I am enclosing a check for \$42.90 for the book, Heritage of Surry County. Also, I would like for you to help me with several questions, or at least direct me to who I should ask.

First of all, is there any regular genealogical publication that covers Surry County? I know there is a North Carolina Genealogical Review (it's at my local library) that covers the entire state of North Carolina, but I'm looking for something more specific; for instance, a quarterly that specializes, say, in Surry, Wilkes, Yadkin, etc., or maybe the western half of the state.

Also, could you give me the addresses of any publishing houses that publish books on Surry Co.? I know there is a book, Surry Co. NC Marriage and Bonds 1786-1868, but I don't know who publishes it.

Related to that, if there is not a bibliography of Surry Co. in the Heritage book, maybe someone at ~~the~~ your historical society could tell me where I could find one.

Also, I'm enclosing a 4-page family history which shows the Surry Co. connection. I would appreciate it if you would give it to the Surry Co. historical society for them to cross-refer to their files for future reference.

I hope all this if not too much trouble for you. The fact is, I've been unable to trace my family tree back further than circa 1795, and I would greatly appreciate any assistance which you could provide. Thank you.

Dear Norma,

After hours of looking at and attempting to understand the Rutledge data I had and the information you sent me, I finally had an insight. While the Rutledge family of Surry County is probably related to the Rutledge family of Stokes County, there was no real movement between them. The Surry Rutledges lived on Deep River or Creek and remained in Surry throughout the 1800's. The Stokes Rutledges lived on Neatman Creek in Surry until that part became Stokes in 1799. I now realize that there was no migration across the Yadkin River. ⁸⁷

I then proceeded to put all the census data regarding each family on two big sheets; my normal way of working with census data. I would not have bothered with the Surry Rutledge sheet, but I thought it might be helpful to other reseachers in Surry County. I am sending you a copy of both sheets; each sheet copies as four pages and then you have to assemble them.

I also entered the information from Yadkin County Heritage, Stokes County Heritage, (both of which you sent me-they were very helpful), the will of William Rutledge dated 1803, and Surry County Will Abstracts 1771-1827.

In the Yadkin County Heritage-Ben Rutledge Family 856, there appears to be something missing in the middle of the first page "Elizabeth Steelman. County, Tennessee and died there." Maybe it is printed that way in the book but if a line has been left out it might be helpful.

In the other documents you referred to in your letter regarding Enos Rutledge, the Deputy Sheriff, and his brothers, William and Nathan, it is very interesting to note an interaction between the Rutledges, the Axsoms, and the May family.

There are three other Rutledge wills which should be helpful:

Surry 1836 Will Book-4/91 E. Rutledge

Surry 1846 Will Book-4/253 William Rutledge

Stokes 1861 Will Book-4/339 Isabella Rutledge

Do you have access to these will books? If so, copies would be greatly appreciated.

Also, is there an index of Surry County and/or Stokes County marriages? A copy of the Rutledge bride and the Rutledge groom index should be very helpful.

I don't know if I am imposing on your good will too much. If so, just tell me.

At this time, I am convinced that the William who went to Gibson County, IN, was the son of either William or Johnson of Stokes and was the grandson of William and Matilda (King) Rutledge. This latter William may well have been related to the William of Surry who died in 1781. He was not, however, his son since he had a son in Surry named William Sr. So, the search goes on, but can now be more directed to Stokes. What is the county seat of Stokes and is there a library of substance in Stokes County?

I am also enclosing a copy of some information I have about the Rutledge family in Indiana.

Again, perhaps your kind offer to be of assistance to me has been exhausted. You have certainly helped more than I could ever have expected. If you want to stop, just say so and I will certainly understand.

HUSBAND - Johnson/William RUTLEDGE-144

This Rutledge progenitor lived in North Carolina. About 1802, he moved his family to Tennessee. He and his wife died about 1807.

He and his wife had children named William and Elizabeth.

Their son, William, was born in North Carolina in 1788. There are only five families named Rutledge in North Carolina in 1800 that have a male child between ten and sixteen years of age. William would have been twelve. These five Rutledge families were headed by Johnson, William and William, all of Stokes County, James of Rowan County, and John of Lincoln County. Since William's parents moved to Tennessee around 1802, they would not be in the North Carolina Census of 1810. The family of James Rutledge was still in Rowan County in 1810. The family of John Rutledge was still in Lincoln County in 1810. The families of William, William, and Johnson Rutledge were not in North Carolina in 1810. Therefore, William's father was either Johnson or one of the two Williams listed in Stokes County in 1800.

William, born in North Carolina in 1788, and Elizabeth, born in Tennessee in 1803, moved to Gibson County, Indiana, in 1811, about four years after their parents died.

Johnson Rutledge, born in North Carolina in 1801, and Mary Rutledge, born in 1802 or 1803, appear in Gibson County about the same time. Mary married Stephen McKedy and Johnson married Margaret McKedy, Stephen's sister. This would suggest that Johnson and Mary were siblings. Also, William named his second son Johnson, which would indicate a close relationship between William and Johnson. It seems logical to conclude that Johnson and Mary were siblings of William and Elizabeth.

There may have been another brother name Absolum. The estate of Absolum Rutledge was placed on sale on October 7, 1826. Purchases were made by William Rutledge, Elisha Pritchett, William Douglas, Mary McKedy, Johnson Rutledge, Patay Teel, and James McKedy. All of these people are members of or related to the Rutledge Family.

There is a Nancy Rutledge who was born about 1807. She married Isaac Douglas on February 20, 1827, in Gibson County, Indiana. In 1850, she was living in Johnson Township, and the Census says she was born in Delaware. In 1860, she is still living in Johnson Township, but was born in Georgia. In 1880, she is still living in Montgomery Township and was born in Indiana and both her parents were born in Tennessee. This Nancy could be another sibling of William and Elizabeth, a child of William, or a child of Absolum.

In the 1860 Census, there is a Sylas J. Rutledge, age 18, living with an unrelated family in Johnson Township of Gibson County. He was an apprentice wagon maker. Sylas was a musician in Company E of the 58th Infantry Regiment during Civil War. The regiment was formed at Princeton, Indiana, in October 1861. Sylas died at Evansville, Indiana, on May 26, 1862. The family Sylas came from has not been identified.

If this man is Johnson Rutledge, then he and his wife and one son were living in Surry County, North Carolina, when the 1784-1787 Tax List was compiled. In the 1790 Census, the family had three sons and one daughter, living in Stokes County, adjoining Surry. One of the additional sons would be William, born 1788. In the 1800 Census, the family was still in Stokes County, but now had seven sons and two daughters.

If this man is a William Rutledge, then he and his wife were living in Surry County, North Carolina, when the 1784-1787 Tax List was compiled, and would have been one of the following three families:

Family A: William, wife, four sons, two daughters.

Family B: William Sr., wife, two sons, one daughter, eight blacks.

Family C: William, wife, two sons, two daughters.

(Family B is ruled out by the fact that William is listed as William Sr. which would mean that he has a son William. In the family searched for, son William was not yet born)

In the 1790 Census, the family was living in Stokes County, North Carolina, and would have to be one of the following three families:

Family D: William, wife, three sons, three daughters.

Family E: William, wife, three sons, two daughters.

Family F: William, wife, three sons.

In the 1800 Census, the family was living in Stokes County, North Carolina, and would have to be one of the following two families:

Family G: William, wife, four sons, two daughters.

(2 sons 16-26, 1 son 10-16. 1 son <10, 2 dau. <10)

Family H: William, wife, five sons, three daughters.

(2 sons 16-26, 1 son 10-16, 2 sons <10, 1 dau. 16-26, 2 dau. <10)

In Families G and H, the son 10-16 would be William, age 12.

It has not been possible to connect these families to each other across the years due to the paucity of data.

William settled in Montgomery Township of Gibson County, Indiana, in 1811

In the History of Gibson County Indiana by Gil R. Stormont, published in 1914, it states that Elizabeth Rutledge and a elder brother made the trip from Tennessee to Gibson County in 1811, on horseback, when Elizabeth was eight, and that their parents had died four years earlier. This elder brother would likely be William who would have been about 23 years of age. The only other possibilities would be Johnson, who would have been about 10, or Absolum, who may not have been related at all. Moreover, both the Stormont book and The History of Gibson County Indiana by James T. Tartt published in 1884, state that William Rutledge was an early settler of Gibson County, Indiana. No other Rutledge is mentioned in that regard.

As a result of the evidence set forth in the notes on William's father, it is reasonable to conclude that at least three or perhaps four of William's siblings made the trip to Gibson County and settled there. It should also be noted that William's first son, Ezekiel, was born in 1812 in Indiana, and William's wife was born in North Carolina. There is no record in Gibson County of the marriage between William and Sarah. It is likely that William and Sarah were married before the migration from Tennessee to Indiana. If William brought Sarah with him, then the story in Stormont's book about William and Elizabeth coming to Indiana on horseback should not be interpreted to mean that the two of them made

William died of "winter fever", after an illness of 18 days.

Johnson was in Gibson County by 1821 when he married and was there the rest of his life. He was living in Columbia Township in 1850, and then Barton Township in 1860, 1870, and 1880. He died before 1887 since his second wife remarried in 1887.

Johnson owned most of the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 6, Township 3 South, Range 9 West, in Barton Township, Gibson County, Indiana, consisting of 30 acres. He also owned the west half of the northwest quarter of Section 5, consisting of 85 acres.

In 1880, Johnson and his second wife, Nancy Ross, had her daughter by her previous marriage, Marietta Ross, age 13, living with them.

Elizabeth moved from Tennessee to Montgomery Township of Gibson County, in 1811, with an elder brother.

After marriage, Elizabeth and Elisha lived in Montgomery Township until his death in 1853. Elizabeth continued to live in Montgomery Township until her death in 1897 at the age of 94.
