## First Generation

1. **Peter (Pete) Herman Jarrell** was born 1 Jun 1905 in Patrick Co., VA. He died 17 Jan 1959 in Forsyth Co., NC (W-Salem) and was buried in Salem U. Meth. Ch. Cem..

Pete Jarrell is pictured in the Senior Class of Central Academy in 1925. Photo included in family history.



Pete Jarrell was 20 and lived in The Hollow, VA when he married Lois Robertson (age 18) on 26 Sep 1925 at the Court House, Dobson, by R. S. Folger (JP). Lois lived in Danville, VA. Witnesses were Ben and Alma Jarrell.

Pete Jarrell was a taxi/jitney driver in 1926 and 1928 when his first two children were born. Per birth certificates 12-789 and 14-960.

Pete Jarrell taught school at Mt. Bethel in Virginia for a short time.

Pete drove a taxi when he and Josephine were first married. They got married in 1931 and lived on Wards Gap Road. A daughter was born while living there but she died of pneumonia. A son Don was born in 1933 while living there. Pete was farming at that time son Donnie was born in 1933. They moved to Lexington (NC) shortly after his birth. Daughter Betty was born after their move in 1934. Pete owned a service station in Lexington for a short time before they moved to VA to live with Louise's grandparents. Daughter Louise was born there in 1936. When Louise was two years old they moved to the Westfield area and Pete farmed on three different farms before moving to the Mount Airy area in 1942. The family lived on Pete's brother Ed Jarrell's farm until Louise was in the second grade and Pete operated a country store for Ed. He soon opened his own store and they bought an old house for the family to live in. Pete's grocery store and service station was on Springs Road just outside Mount Airy. He also had a Grocery Store on the Wards Gap Road. (information from Louise Jarrell Yoder October 2002)

P. H. Jarrell underwent an operation for appendicitis Monday afternoon at the local hospital. He is recovering nicely. (The Mount Airy Times dated Friday March 23, 1945 in the White Sulphur Springs (News)). Miss Marie Jarrell of Greensboro, was called home Monday night due to the illness of her father, and will spend a few days at her home here. (The Mount Airy Times dated Friday March 23, 1945 in the White Sulphur Springs (News)).

Pete Jarrell had three different grocery stores on Wards Gap Road. His family lived at White Sulphur Springs which was on the Springs Road (now called Riverside Drive). He had one store that he rented from Taylor Anderson, one that was owned by his sister Mora Smith, and one at the Crossingham Road that belonged to Jack Smith's parents. He also ran his brother Ed's store on Springs Road at one time and then operated a little store that belonged to A. E. Belk near Ed's house, prior to the ones on Wards Gap Road. (info from Louise Jarrell Yoder)

Pete Jarrell died at Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem at age 53 from a gun shot wound of the head, self inflicted. He was a merchant/grocerman.

Peter Herman (Pete) Jarrell, age 53, of Rt. 6, Mount Airy, died at Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem at 1 p.m. of pistol wounds. He was found in his parked car on Green Hill Road at 11:30 a.m. near the Salem Methodist Church, three miles north of Mount Airy. A note and a will were found on him. He was owner and operator of Jarrell's Grocery on the Ward's Gap Road until three weeks ago when he closed the store on account of ill health.. He is survived by his wife, the former Josephine Boyd, two sons, Richard Jarrell of Danville, VA and Donnie Jarrell of the US Army stationed in Germany; three daughters, Mrs. Marie Justice of Charlotte, Mrs. Bettie Ayers of Mt. Airy and Mrs. Louise Hall of Mount Airy, three brothers, Ed Jarrell of Mount Airy, Ben Jarrell of Mt. Airy and John Jarrell of Daytona Beach, FL; three sisters, Mrs. Tom Moore of Ararat, VA, Mrs. Ella Worrell and Mrs. Mora Smith of Mount Airy. (from Memorial Obituary)

Peter married (1) **Lois Arlene Robertson**, daughter of W. M. Robertson and Susan, on 26 Sep 1925 in Surry Co., NC (Dobson). Lois was born 28 Feb 1907 in Cascade, VA. She died 12 Mar 1930 and was buried in Salem U. Meth. Ch. Cem..

Lois Arlene Jarrell died from Tuberculosis. She was in a sanitorium but was brought home to die. They lived in or around Lexington at the time. Lois was born near Rockingham County (possibly Eden). Lois's sister took her son Richard when he was a baby. Lois wasn't able to take care of him. (per Louise Jarrell Yoder Nov. 2002)

Lois A. is buried in Salem United Methodist Church Cem., Surry Co., NC.

The cemetery record was typed that she died in 1934 rather than 1930.

Betty Jarrell Ayers Jan. 9, 2003.

Peter and Lois had the following children:

Josephine Alice was age 25, a widower, when she married Pete, age 26, also widowed. They were married in Hillsville, VA.

Alice Josephine Boyd's name appears on some records as Josephine Alice Boyd. She always went by the name of Alice Josephine. (information from daughter Louise, Nov. 2002)

Alice Josephine Boyd Gunnell, age 89, of Central Continuing Care of Mount Airy, the wife of the late Columbus Gunnell and the late Pete Jarrell, died Friday night, Jan. 19, 1996 at Central Continuing Care. She was a homemaker and a longtime faithful member of Pleasant View Baptist Church. She was a member of the choir until she was disabled. She read her Bible through 23 times. Funeral services were conducted at Pleasant View Baptist Church by Rev. Keith Casey and Rev. Steve Parks with burial in Salem United Methodist Church Cemetery. (information from her obituary)

The daughter of Alice Josephine Boyd Jarrell Gunnell, Louise Jarrell Yoder, wrote a lovely poem as a Tribute to her Mom entitled "Memories of Days Gone By."

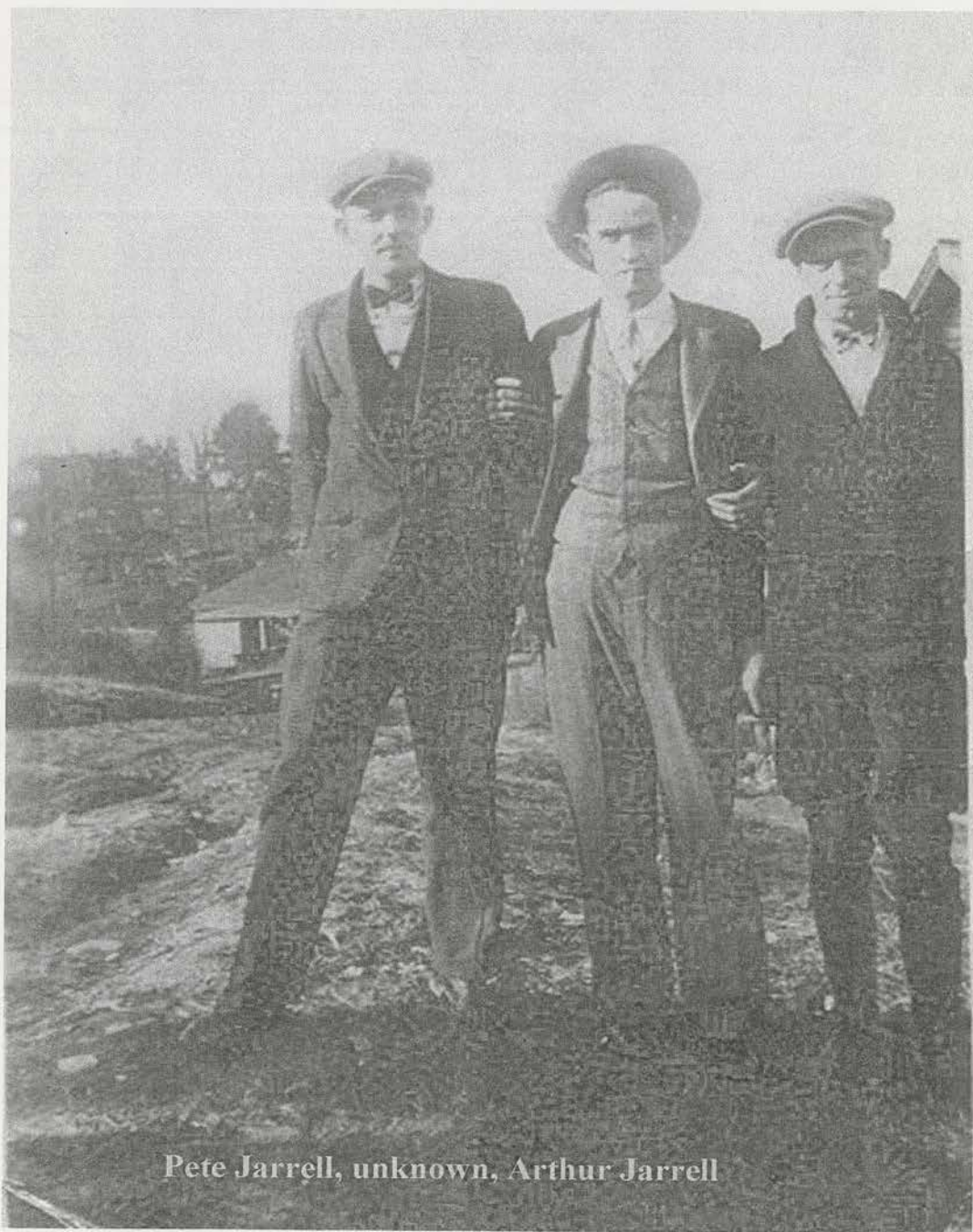

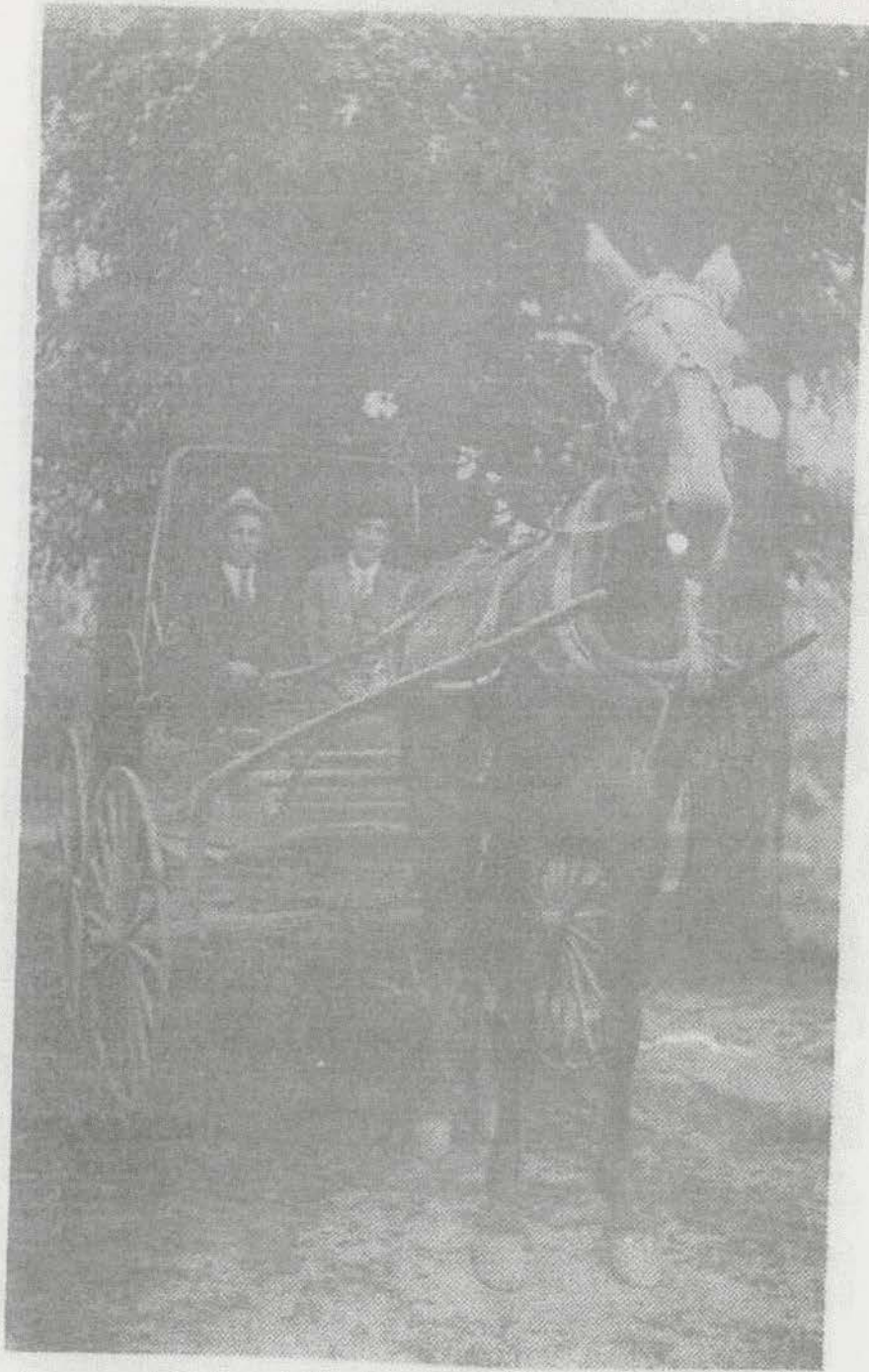

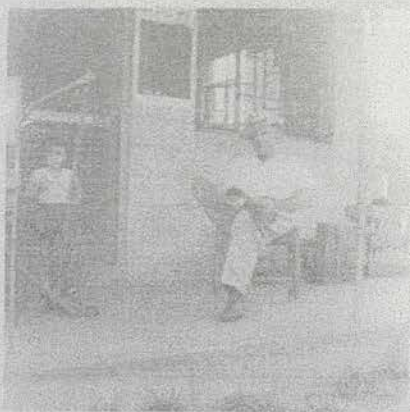

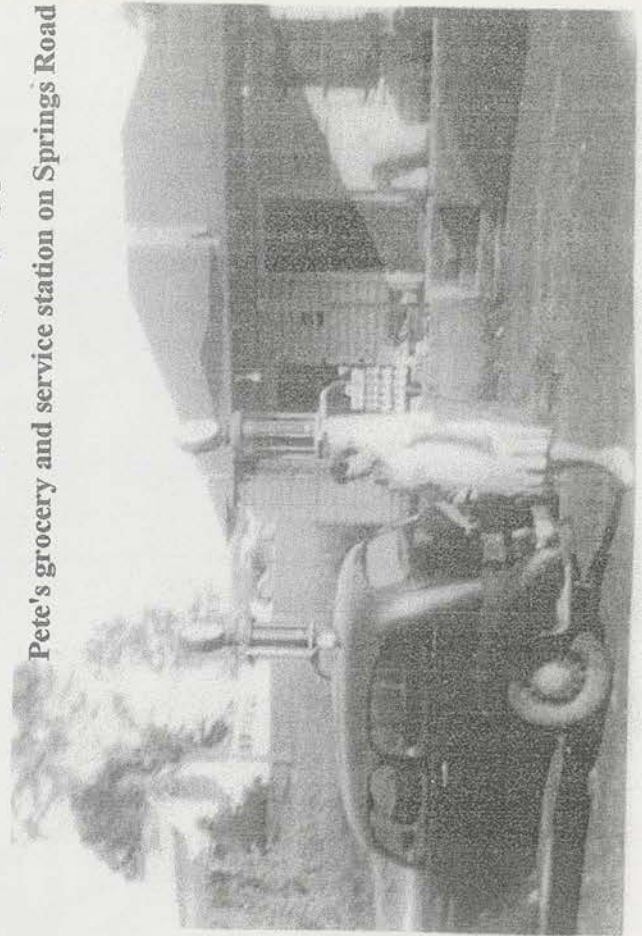

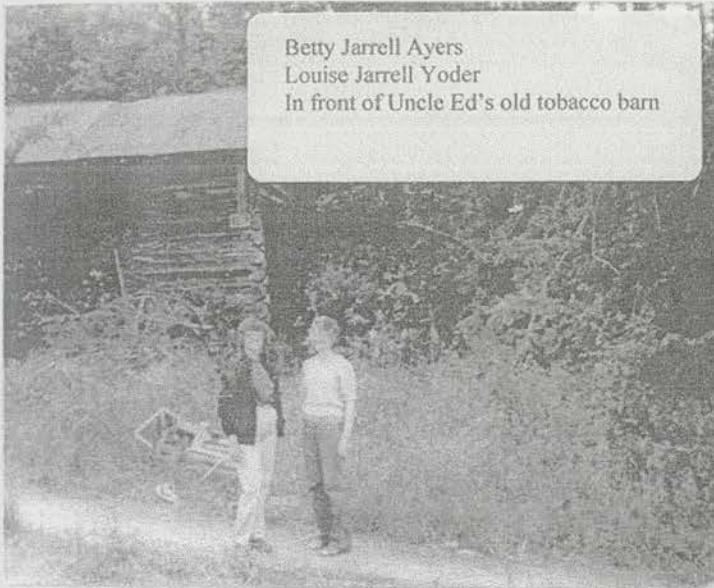

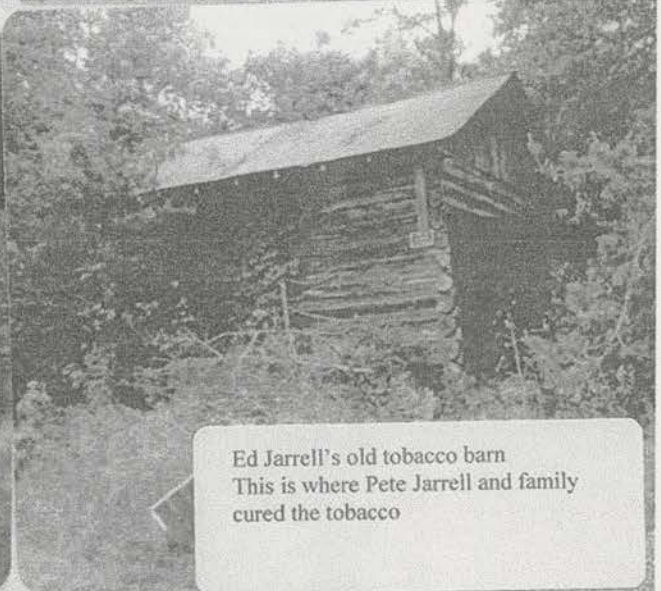

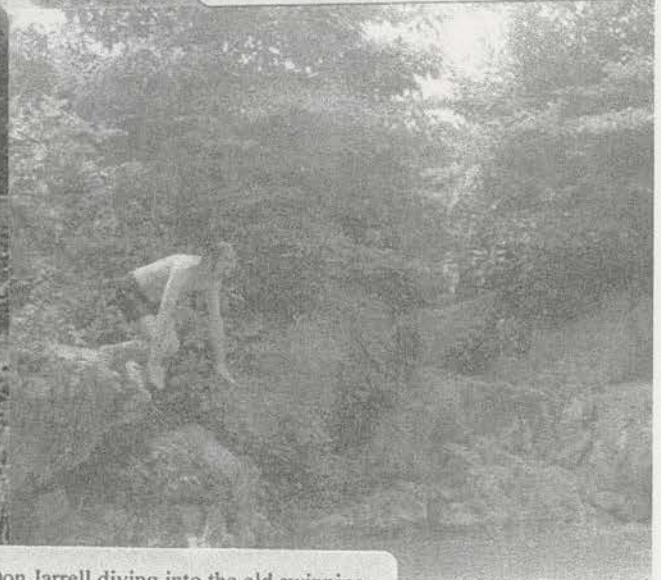

MOUNT AIRY, Jan. 17—Peter Herman (Pete) Jarrell, 53, of Route 6, Mount Airy, died at the Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem at 1 p.m. today of pistol wounds.

He was found in his parked car on Green Hill Road at 11:30 a.m. near the Salem Methodist Church, three miles north of Mount Airy. A note and a will were found on him.

Jarrell was owner and operator of Jarrell's grocery on the Ward's Gap Road until three weeks ago when he closed the store on account of ill health.

He was born in Patrick County, Va. Surviving are his wife, the former Miss Josephine Boyd; two sons, Richard Jarrell of Danville, Va., and Donnie Jarrell of the U.S. Army stationed in Germany; three daughters, Mrs. Marie Justice of Charlotte, Mrs. Bettie Ayers of Mount Airy and Mrs. Louise Hall of Route 1, Mount Airy; nine grandchildren; three brothers, Ed Jarrell of Route 6, Mount Airy, Ben Jarrell of Mount Airy, and John Jarrell of Daytona Beach, Fla.; three sisters, Mrs. Tom Moore of Ararat, Va., Mrs. Ella Worrell and Mrs. Moore Smith of Route 6, Mount Airy.

Dorothy Marie was a young girl when her mother died of TB. Mora Jarrell Smith took care of her after her mother's death until Pete and Josephine were married. When they were married Marie came to live with them. Marie's brother Richard's aunt put up such a fight to keep him that Pete left him there. Since she had cared for him since birth, he was like her own son. (per Louise Jarrell Yoder, Nov. 2002)



Dorothy Marie Jarrell m. 1st Jack Thomas Justice. She had two children by Jack Justice. After he died she m. 2nd Carlton Williams whom she divorced and m. 3rd Howard Cody Ross and later they divorced. Marie and Howard Ross had no children.

Carlton Williams and Dorothy Marie were divorced. Dorothy then married Howard Cody Ross. They had no children. They divorced. (per Louise Jarrell Yoder, Nov. 2002)

3. **Richard Haywood (Hayward) Jarrell** (Peter (Pete) Herman) was born 29 Aug 1928 in Surry Co., NC (Mt. Airy). He died 14 Apr 1983 in Danville, VA and was buried 16 Apr 1983 in Mountain View Cem., Danville, VA.

Richard's mother was a Robertson. Her sister Annie Belle Robertson Roach took Richard when he was a baby because his mother had TB and couldn't care for him. His mother later died. After his



dad Pete Jarrell and his second wife were married, Annie Belle didn't want to give Richard up. Pete let Richard remain with Annie Belle and raise him. He was like her own son, as she had cared for him since birth. Richard's sister Marie was cared for by Pete's sister Mora Jarrell and when Pete remarried, they raised Marie along with their other children.

Richard's middle name is in question. According to the Bible records, it is Haywood, but his daughters listed it as Hayward in his obit. Richard's middle name was later changed to Hayward by his foster mother, Annie Belle Roach per Betty Jarrell Ayers.

"Son of Local Man Receives Purple Heart" - The Purple Heart has been awarded to Corporal Richard H. Jarrell, of 410 Greensboro Highway, Danville, VA, son of Pete H. Jarrell, Mount Airy, Route 5. Cpl. Jarrell was wounded while in action in Korea. Cpl. Jarrell, who received his training at Camp Pickett, VA and went overseas in February 1951 is with the First Cavalry Division, 5th Regiment. After being treated for his wounds, he was back on duty. (information from a newspaper article with photo)

Richard Hayward Jarrell was born Aug. 31, 1928 in Mount Airy, NC and died Apr. 14, 1983 in Danville, VA. He was survived by two daughters Mrs. Arlene Thompson and Miss Linda Sue Jarrell, a sister Mrs. Marie Ross and and foster mother Mrs. Annie R. Roach. Also two grandchildren Mikal Ashley Thompson and Elizabeth Belle Thompson. Pallbearers were Max Everhart, Landon Clay, Julius Carroll, Herman Pugh, Jesse R. Custer, Harold Sisk, Joe Kahle, Terry Prior. His funeral service was on Sat., Apr. 16, 1983 at 2:00 at Swicegood Chapel in Danville, conducted by Rev. Floyd Carter. Interment at Mountain View Cem. in Danville. (information from funeral home folder)

5. **Donny (Donnie) Boyd Jarrell** (Peter (Pete) Herman) was born 30 Aug 1933 in Surry Co., NC (Mt. Airy).

Donny Jarrell in Germany on Field Training - Specialist Four Donny B. Jarrell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Pete H. Jarrell, Route 6, Mount Airy, recently re-enlisted in Germany for six years in the Regular Army. Specialist Jarrell, an instructor in the 32nd Signal Battalion's Company D in Darmstadt, entered the Army in 1953 and arrived in Germany in October 1957. The 25-year-old soldier attended Mount Airy High School. (The Mount Airy News, Tuesday, Dec. 9, 1958)

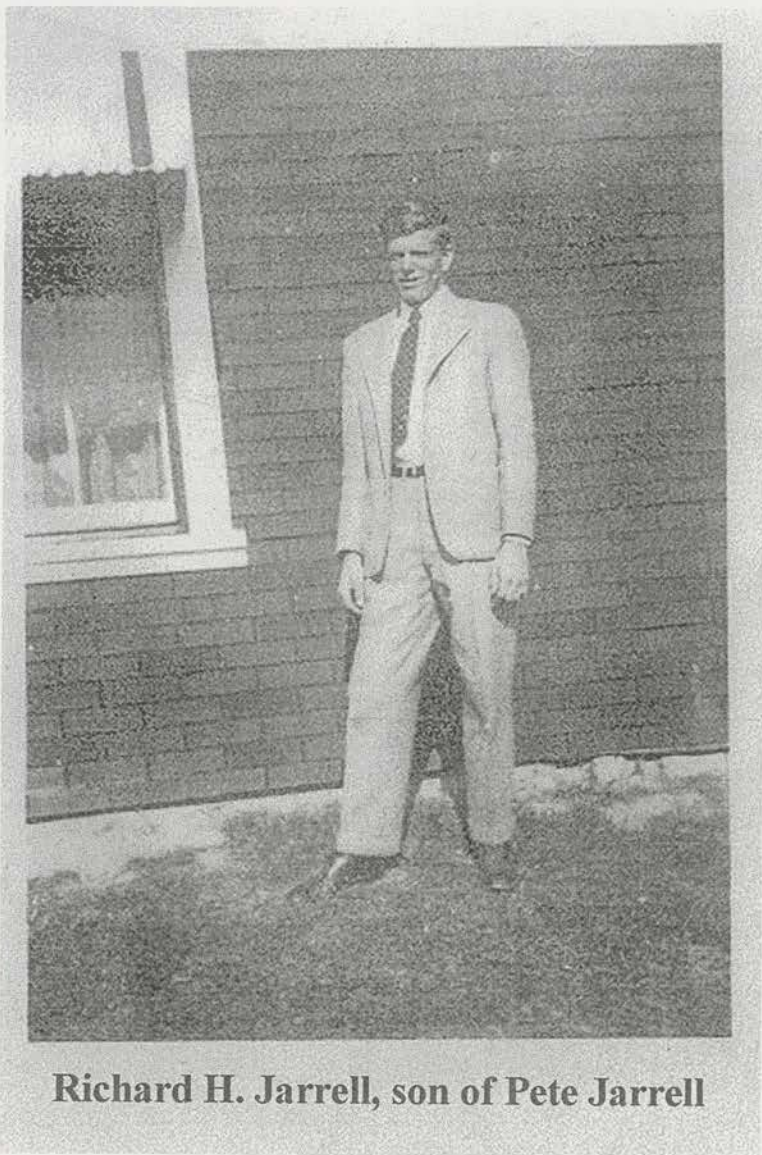

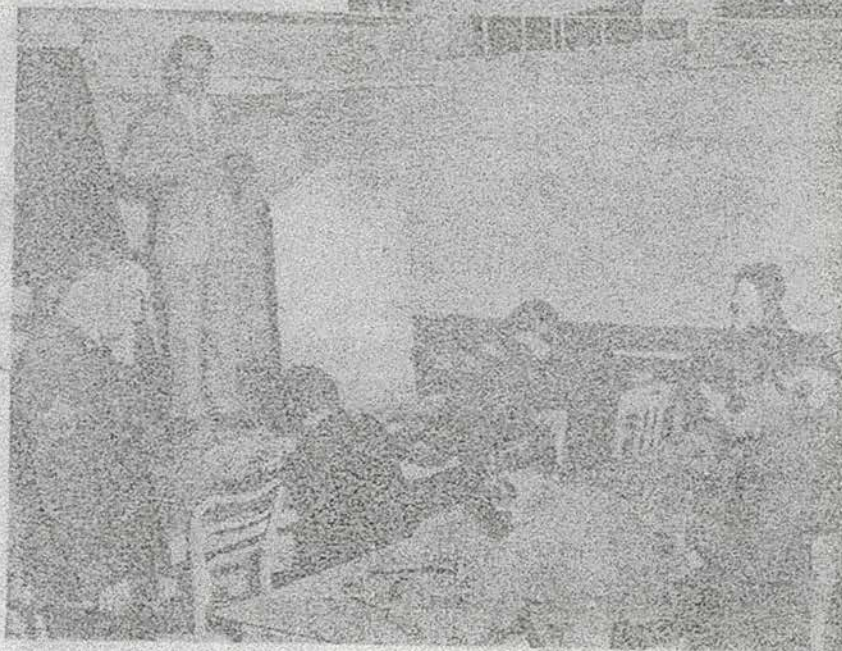

## HAVEN FOR HAMS

**O**NE OF THE fastest-growing ham radio clubs in Europe is now fitting out new clubrooms, classrooms and its radio equipment in spacious new quarters—the entire top floor of the Darmstadt Post Hq building.

Founding father of the Central-Frisch Amateur Radio Club is Sgt Bruno V. Ciallo, an ardent ham himself, who decided about six months ago that a large number of Germans and Americans in the Darmstadt area had a genuine interest in radio operation and would like to join together in a common center of mutual interest and fellowship.

His theory turned out to be right, and today the Central-Frisch club has 110 members.

Sgt Don Jarrell of V Corps radio school in Darmstadt teaches international Morse code two evenings a week. He says it takes the would-be licensed ham two to three months to master both the code and theory to pass the license exam.

German and American requirements for licensing amateur operators on certain assigned frequencies are very similar. German law requires 12 words per minute transmitting and receiving against 16 for Americans.

A German civilian, Hans Linck, teaches radio theory, and CWO William Stroebel acts as adviser for the group. Stroebel operated a ham station in Panama for seven years before he shipped to Germany.

Through the cooperation of Lt Col Gustav H. Franke, Jr., Darmstadt Post CO, the club a few weeks ago began moving into its new quarters, where there will be plenty of room for new members.

Both Sgt Jack W. Hampton of D Co, 32d Sig Bn, club vice-president, and Rudolf Bientl, secretary, said the club will welcome newcomers with a genuine interest in radio.

At the moment, until it receives its own

**Ruritan Club Closes Year and Presents Awards**

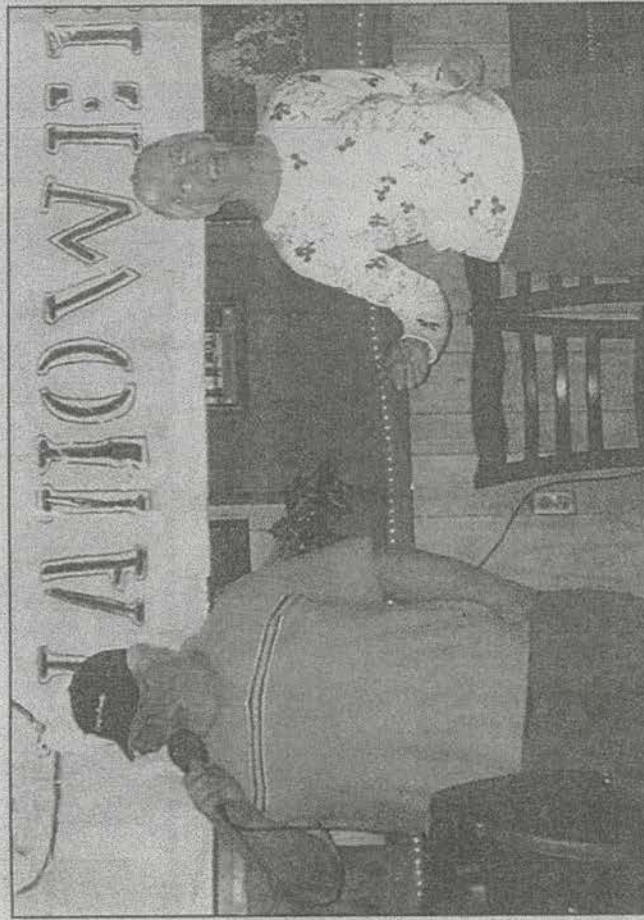
The Lambsburg Ruritan Club named two Ruritans of the Year and recognized a country band for their support during the year.

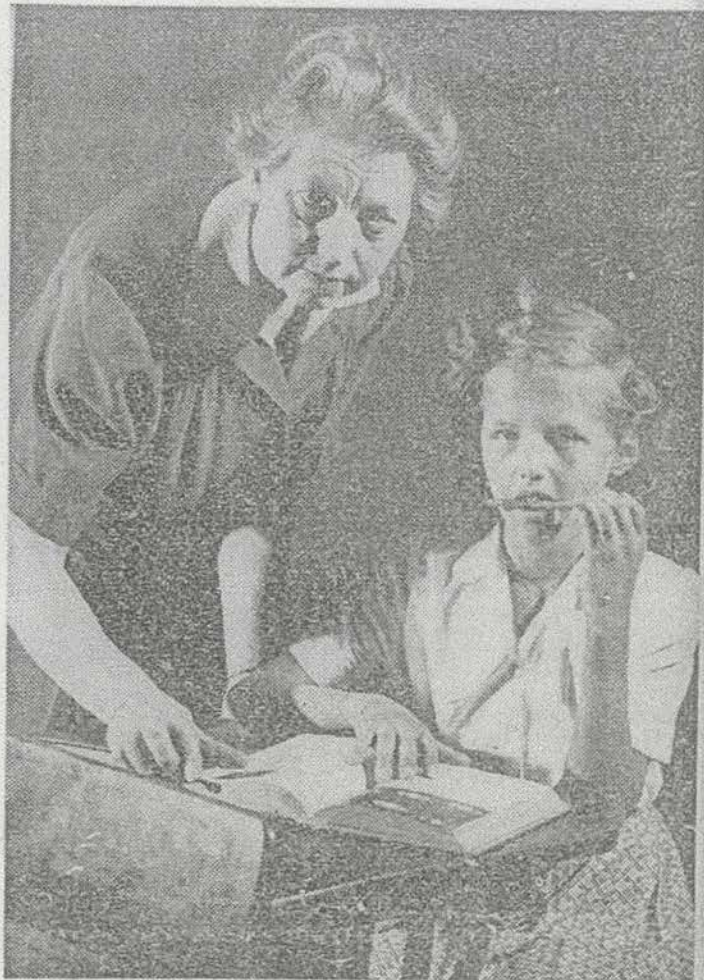

Ave., Nevada, has been awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for extraordinary heroism while participating December 1 in four medical evacuation missions in support of an infantry platoon which was under heavy attack by two North Vietnamese Army companies.

The landing zone was not secure, and on all four missions Officer Yoder received hostile automatic weapons fire.

During the four flights into the endangered area, Officer Yoder evacuated 10 seriously wounded soldiers, and brought badly needed ammunition and other supplies back to the unit on each return flight.

Other medals awarded Warrant Officer Yoder includes the Air Medal with "V" device for heroism with 32 oak leaf clusters, the Bronze Star, National Defense Medal, Vietnamese Campaign medal, Vietnamese Service Medal and Good Conduct Medal.

Yoder returned to the states May 23 of this year following one year of service in Viet Nam. His wife, Louise and children reside in Ames. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Yoder of 1401 Florida Ave., Ames.

Yoder served as a helicopter pilot with the U.S. Army Troop C First Squadron, 9th Cavalry. He will be stationed at Ft. Wolters, Mineral Wells, Tex.
