Anno Domini 181*9*

The condition of the above obligation is such, That whereas the above bounden *John Butcher* hath made application for a License for a Marriage to be celebrated between him and *Stephen Sumner* of the County aforesaid: Now, in case it shall not appear hereafter, that there is any lawful cause or impediment to obstruct the said Marriage, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

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Hi Megan, As promised I went home and checked my records and sure enough I found John Butcher living with his son George and his family in Howell County, MO, in 1860. John is shown age 80 and born in North Carolina. I still think, however, that his age is too much. On the 1820 & 1830 censuses he gives his age which would equate to being born between 1780 and '90. At this time we are not sure when his father James arrived in Stokes County, but he applied for a land grant, which was rejected, in 1795. John married Cynthia Summers in Surry per bond of 20 Oct 1812. I only have the 1820, 1830, and 1840 censuses presently at my disposal, but it appears they had twelve children:

  - (3) George [27 Nov. 1820-10 May 1862], died Howell County, MO buried Langston Howell Valley Cem., md. 3 Mch 1847 [MB] Lucinda Snow d/o William & Sarah (Tucker), and #2 28 July 1853 Oregon Co., MO to Mehuldah Snow d/o Ruel & Chloe (Wilmoth) [Note: 1853 may have been when these Butchers left Surry];
  - (4) & (5) 2 unknown females, both born 1825-30;
  - (6) Matilda b. ca 1832 nfi;
  - (7) Caroline b. ca 1833 nfi;
  - (8) Cynthia [ca 1834-ca1852] md. 19 Feb 1851 [MB] Henry Stanley;
  - (9) unknown female b. ca 1836, gone before 1850;
  - (10) John b. ca 1840 nfi; (11) James [ca1840-1861?]; & (12) Henry b. ca 1845.

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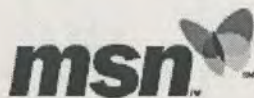

Mosby's Dist. The 1786 tax list adds William Duglass with 200 A, 1 wp. The Surry Co. 1787 tax list shows Alexander Douglas with 100 A, no poll; William Douglas with 200 A, 1 wp.]

3:77a. Will of Amos London, Sr., 24 May 1805. He is 68. Dau. Sally Summers. Thomas W. Lester to have 200 A adj my property & that of John Summers, Sr., when he is 21 if he gives \$2 ea. to his sisters Polly & Sally. No. exrs. Wit: Jesse Lester, M. Armstrong. There is a long letter following the will in which the testator says in part: . . . "about twenty years ago my old woman began to incur my displeasure and she together with her friends and her children, to wit, my two sons and some of the Bills's, has in hundreds of ways too tedious and too delicate to describe has impaired my feelings and fretted me to distraction I am left without a consort, I am reduced to almost poverty, and in particular abused and beaten by Amos, spit upon, frowned upon, by him and his family and treated in the most ungrateful manner, almost unheard of by a son to his father, so much repeated ill usage that my poor old grey hairs are almost brought down with sorrow to the grave . . ." Prvd by wit. Rec. Feb. Ct. 1807. [Note: Amos London's name appears on the 1777 tax list of William Jarvis. The 1785 Surry Co. tax list of Capt. Adkins shows Amos London with 200 A, 1 wp. Adkins' 1786 tax list shows Amos London with 400 A, 3 wp. SCDB D:18, 3 Apr. 1789, Amos London, Sr., to John London for 5 shillings, 200 A on N side Yadkin R on Big Seven Island, wit: Rezia Jarvis, Johnson Summers, John Palmer. Surry Co. minutes of the Court of P & QS show that he was a frequent juror, that he was road overseer 15 Nov. 1785. On 14 Nov. 1792, Isham McCloud, b. 1 May 1781, and Fanny McCloud, b. Dec. 1782, were apprenticed to Amos London until Isham reached 21 and Fanny 18, Isham to be taught the art of

a blacksmith and Faney the art of a weaver, also for her to be taught to read and Isham to read & write, each to be given two suits of cloathes at their freedom. 1790 Surry Co. census, p. 185, Amos London with 2 WM 16+, 1 WM-16, 2 WF. 1800 Surry Co. census, p. 707, Amos London with 2 WM-10, 2 WM 26-45, 1 WF 26-45. Surry Co. state census 1784-87 shows William Forkner in Capt. Humphries Dist with 1WM 21-60, 5 WM-21 or 60+, 4 WF, 1 black 12-50 4 blacks -12 or 50+. The 1785 tax list of Capt. Humphriss shows William Forkner with 300 A, 2 wp, 1 bp and Lewis Forkner with 150 A, 1 wp. The 1800 Surry Co. census, p. 651, lists Will Forkner with 1 WM-10, 3 WM 10-16, 1 WM 16-26, 1 WM 45+, 1 WF-10, 1 WF 10-16, 1 WF 45+, 8 slaves. Forkners Creek or Tarrarat River "including my improvement for complement," recorded SCDB C:8; #1030, 8 Dec. 1778, enters 200 A on Rutledge's Creek beg. at the Maple Springs and "including my improvement." SCDB D:178, 10 Apr. 1787, James Doak to William Forkner for L20, 34 A on ea. side Forkner's Creek adj sd Forkner, wit: Stephen K. Smith, William Won. SCDB F:335, 20 July 1795, David Humphreys to Lewis Forkner for L150 VA currency, 100 A formerly Thomas Smith's on Renfroes Creek where the public waggon road crosses sd creek, wit: Benj. Humpries, Thomas A. Word. Lewis Forkner served in the War of 1812 from Surry Co. The 1812 Surry tax list, Capt. Deatherage's Dist., shows Micajah Forkner, agent for Susanna Forkner, 1,860 A and 7 black polls; Thomas Forkner with 212 A and 2 bp; Joseph Forkner with 560 A, 2 bp; Martin Forkner with 1 bp; Pleasant Forkner with 165 A and 2 bp; James Forkner with 200 A and 2 bp. SCDB F:173, 27 Dec. 1794, Thomas Adam Word to Lewis Forkner, Edmund Hodges, and Obediah Baker, Elders of Baptist Church in Hollow Settlement, for the "desire said Word has to promote worship of the only true God and encouragement of Schools of Knowledge," 10 A on Lovins Creek, middle fork of Tarrarat River, Donaldsons School House Branch; part of state grant to Charles Word (specifies Elders give free privilege for worship of God of other established churches except when in use by Baptists, to keep up Schools and by no means erect Dwelling houses, houses of Public Drinking places or any other practice of immorality), wit: Richard Laurance, Matthew Davis, John McKinney, Senr. 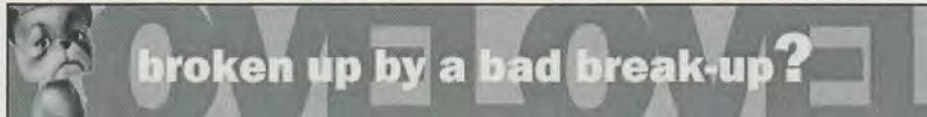

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Jim, I don't know.

Yes, I'd already found them on Surry County, and the rest of the passel of Butchers...but figuring out who belongs to whom there is a trick and a half. I've not really had time to follow up much past that. I \*think\* (this is me trying to pull five or six month research out of my head<g>) that the reason that I knew which William was mine had to do with birthdates. (I know mine was b: 4 MAY 1818 in North Carolina d: 24 NOV 1888 in Polk County, Missouri from his tombstone).

Based on William's responses in later censuses, his father should be someone born in Virginia, his mother born in North Carolina. (assuming he knew what he was talking about, which may or may not be true). It \*seems\* to me that the only Butcher I remember seeing on that census who was born in Virginia was somebody named John? But once again, that's six month old memory, not digging out the paperwork.

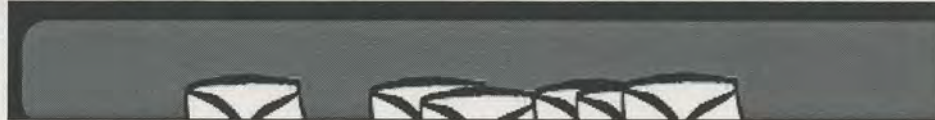

Will check on George Butcher here in Howell County. West Plains was red torn apart during the Civil War so was very lucky if I find something. Between North, South and bushwhackers this was of no man's land.

# LA Coroner Loses Job, Vows to Fight

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — County supervisors voted Thursday to remove Dr. Thomas Noguchi as the county's chief medical examiner because of mismanagement, but the "coroner to the stars" vowed to fight for his job.

The embattled coroner, whose office is the model for TV's "Quincy" series, met with the board in a closed-door session for several hours before the vote. After the session he said he was confident he would win back his post on appeal.

Board chairman Pete Schabarum announced that Noguchi would be demoted — possibly with no reduction in pay — on April 20 from the job of county coroner and chief medical examiner to that of medical specialist.

He said Noguchi will be officially notified of the board's intent by letter on Friday and said he has until April 26 to respond. The board scheduled another private session for the following day.

"I believe in the system," Noguchi told reporters. "I am sure that the evidence in the (appeal) hearing will bring me back to the position I not only deserve but should be functioning in."

He said he was "very proud" of his work and insisted that the supervisors wanted to remove him because they want "too much control" over his department and because he insists on "telling it like it is" in controversial cases.

"There is no question of the medical credentials of Dr. Noguchi," Schabarum said. But he added the board did question the coroner's "management capability."

"For instance," he explained, "the lack of adequate central management and control of operations. Simply put, the operation of the department is in chaos. Dr. Noguchi does not know what is going on in the department."

The coroner has also been accused with using county facilities for private work and with "sensationalizing" the alcohol-related deaths of actors William Holden and Natalie Wood.

# Board Decides to Lease Con

The Forsyth/Stokes Area Mental Health Board decided last night to lease a Roman Catholic convent on 12th Street as a home for violent children.

The Forsyth/Stokes Area Mental board wants a three-year lease if it can lease the building from the Roman Catholic Diocese in Charlotte. The home would be for so-called Willie M. children, who

are described as violent youths who are emotionally disturbed or mentally retarded.

Willie M. comes from the name of the plaintiff in a class-action suit filed against the state in 1979. The suit resulted in the state being ordered to provide special programs and better education and treatment for the children.

The Forsyth/Stokes Com-

munity Mental Health Center was awarded \$713,355 from the state to start programs for the Willie M. children.

The money will be used for inpatient care, specialized foster care, day treatment and for the home. The convent will be used to house as many as nine children. The nuns who now live at the convent plan to leave by June 30.

Twenty-six children in Forsyth County have been certified as Willie M. youngsters.

Most of them live with parents or foster parents.

In other business last night, Charles F. Brann reported to the board that the state has approved a group home for severely retarded adults.

The home will be for five men and women with behavioral and physical handicaps. It will be the first group home in the county for severely retarded men and women.

The site for the home has not been chosen.

the grand jury. Tilley agreed, and the FBI offered him protection through its witness protection program; planning to move him after his testimony and give him a new identity, Brereton said.

But, he said, on Aug. 4, 1981, Tilley was shot to death in front of his house in Eden.

Snow said that in a conversation with Mrs. Tate last January she made it clear that the people involved in the drug ring had killed. Unknown to Mrs. Tate, Snow was wearing a device to tape the conversation.

"She told me it was her understanding that the Tilley man was going to testify," he said. "She told me we were dealing with some very dangerous people in a very dangerous situation."

Snow, who got to know Tate while he was in the Yadkin prison, said that he was subpoenaed to testify before the federal grand jury here about his relationship with Tate.

He said that in the spring of 1981 he accepted \$2,000 from Tate, which he thought was a loan. He said that he knew it was not right for him to accept money from a prisoner, but that he was in a financial bind and needed the money to plant a bean crop.

He said that he began to believe later that the Tates thought the money was a

bribe. He said Tate asked him for special favors, such as use of a telephone for personal calls.

On Aug. 3, 1981, Snow testified, he resigned his position at the Yadkin Prison Unit under threat of dismissal. He said that prison authorities did not know about the \$2,000 then but that they had asked him to leave because of another matter.

He said he had rented a post office box in another name so he could correspond with a former prisoner, which was against regulations, and the authorities found out about it.

He also said prison officials did not know at that time that he had smuggled some marijuana into the prison for another prisoner.

Snow, who is married and has three children, said that he had initially decided not to cooperate with authorities but changed his mind when faced with a lie-detector test.

He said that he was not offered immunity from prosecution but that he hoped that by cooperating he would not be charged.

He said that he agreed to wear a tape device during a meeting with Mrs. Tate on Jan. 15 at the Mar. Gre Restaurant in Eden. They had met previously at Schiano's, a pizza restaurant, at Hanes Mall in Winston-Salem.

Tapes played in court yes-

terday showed that Mrs. Tate was inquisitive about Snow's testimony before the grand jury and the possibility he would cooperate with federal authorities.

She told Snow twice that he worried her.

"You've got me really worried," the tape transcript quotes her as saying. "I don't know whether you are bugged here or who you are going home to call. You know, really, I'm in a bad situation."

Another time, she is quoted as saying, "The only thing I'm worried about is you just making a deal with 'em."

She told Snow that he could not cooperate with the authorities. If he did, she said, he might find himself killed.

"I think that Tilley boy wanted to cooperate with them," she said. "He can't do it no more."

Mrs. Tate took the stand in her own defense and said that

she did not know anything about her husband's activities nor about Tilley's death. She said that she had been afraid for Snow to cooperate with the authorities because it might affect her husband's prison reclassification and it might get her younger son, Sam Tate, in trouble.

She said that Sam delivered the \$2,000 to Snow in Yadkinville.

She said that the law-enforcement agencies have harassed her and her family to try to get them to testify about drug activities.

Her older son, Linsley Tate Jr., has been charged with lying to the federal grand jury. His trial is scheduled for next week.


I would appreciate any information that you may have about their Native American (Cherokee) ancestry. My grandparents told us they were part Cherokee, but I have not been able to find a connection.

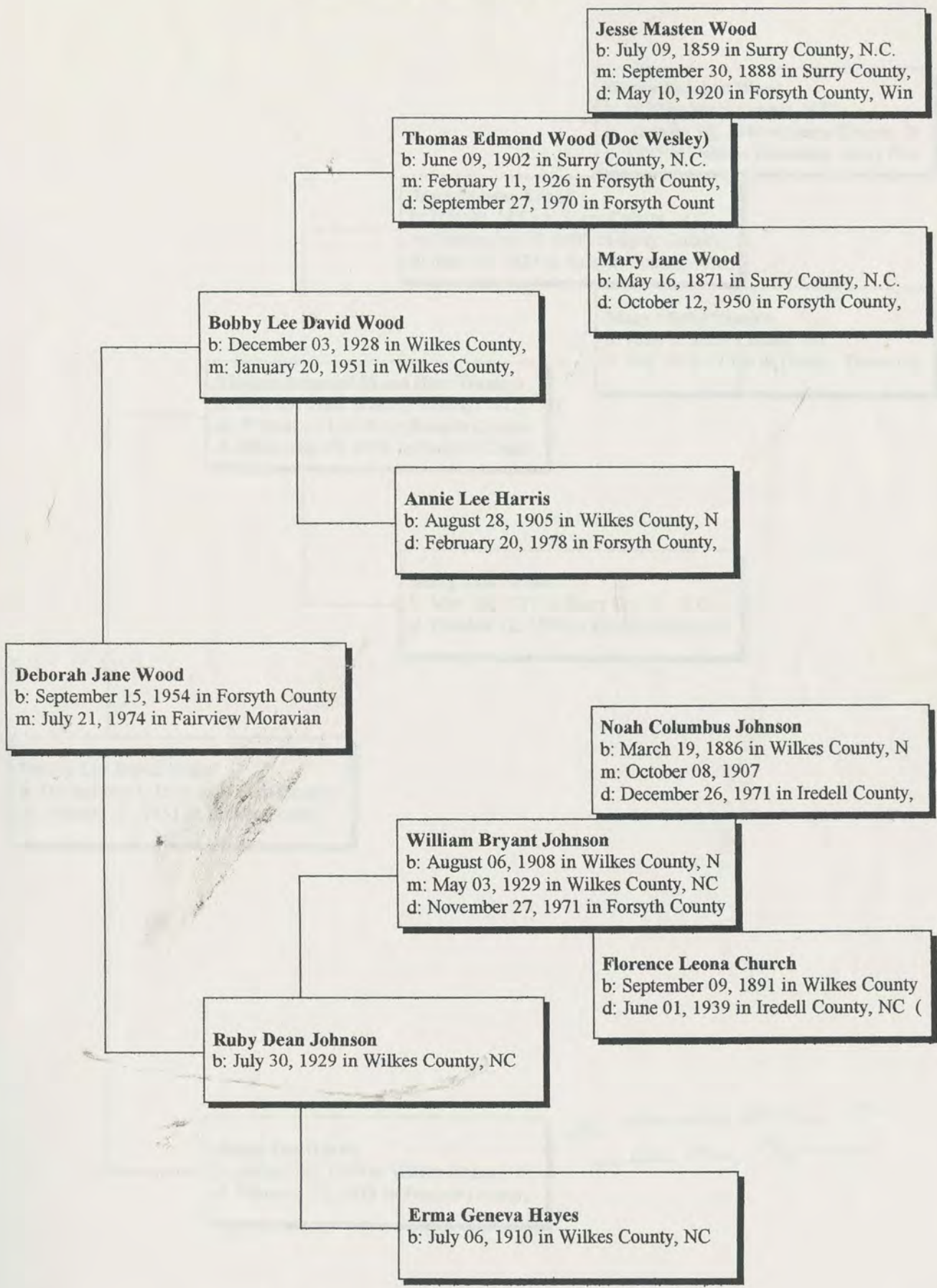

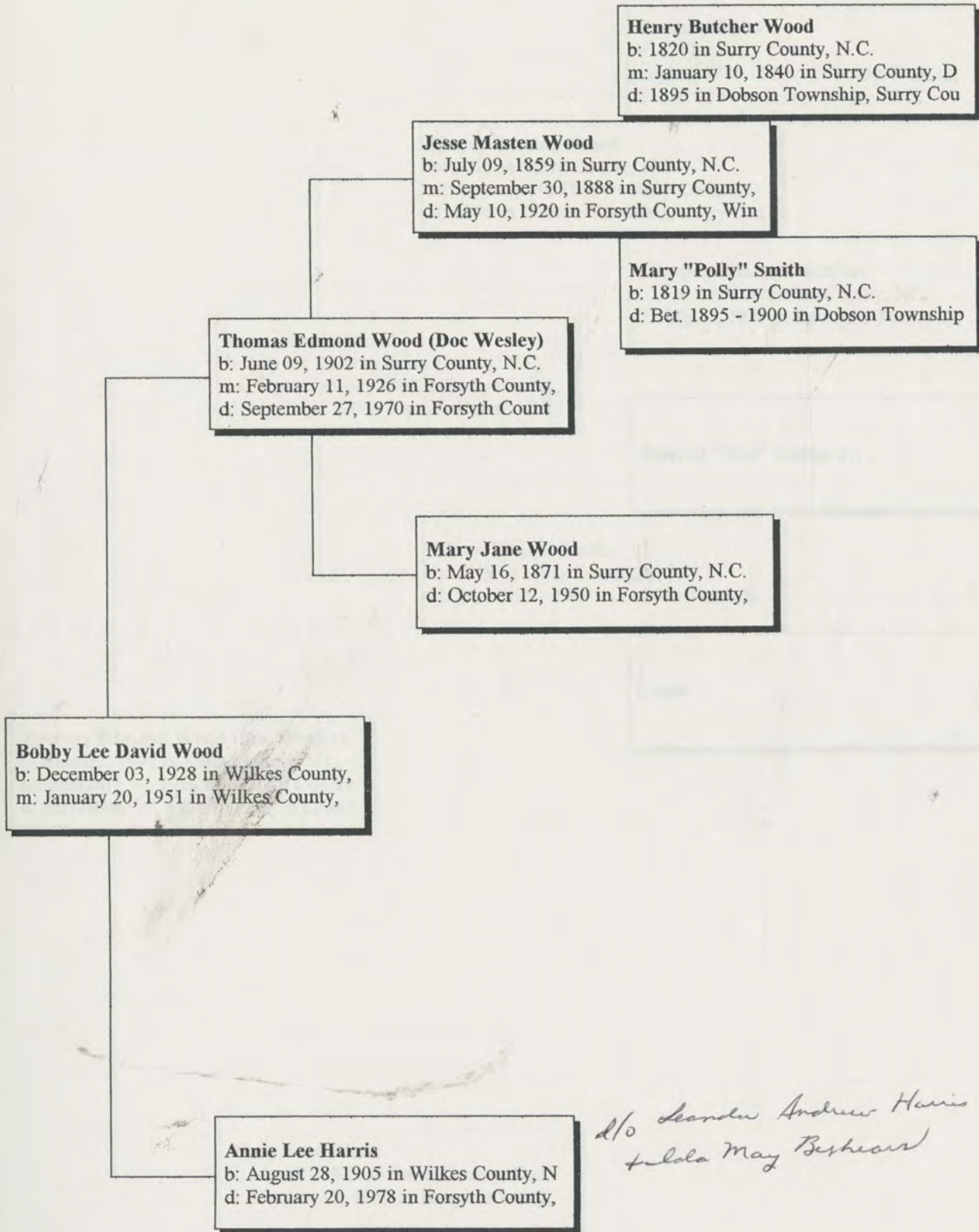


*Ancestors of Deborah Jane Wood*



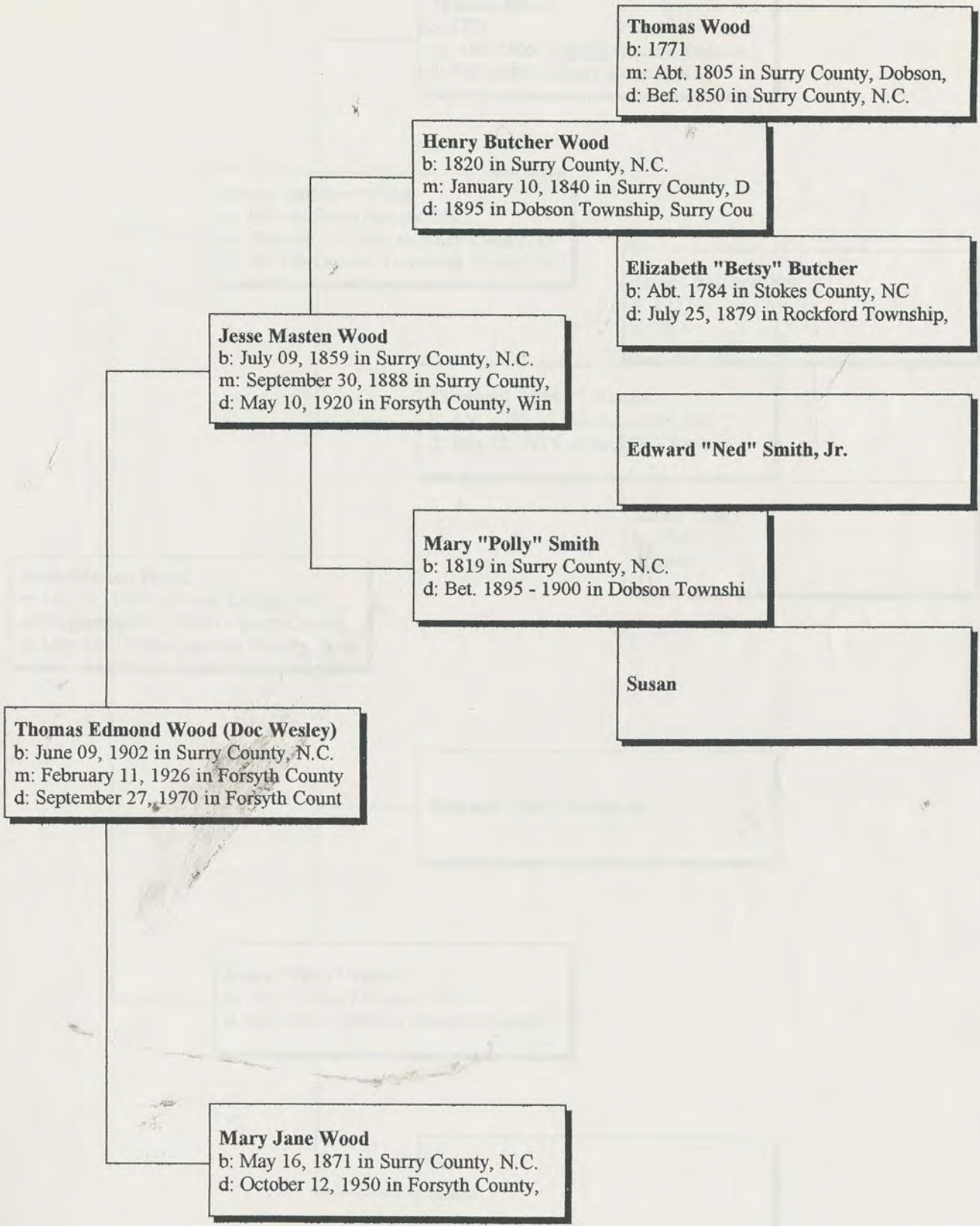


*Ancestors of Bobby Lee David Wood*



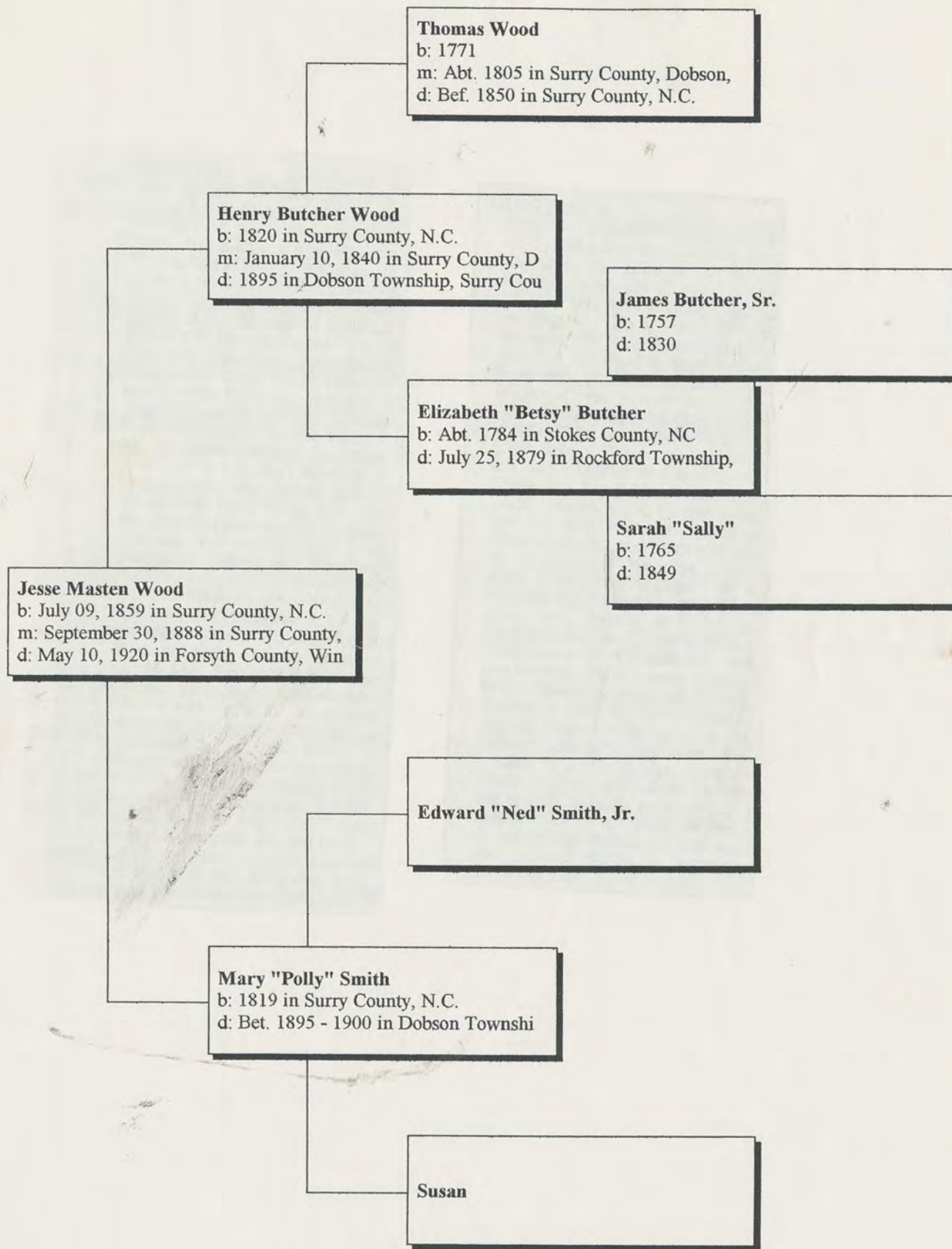


*Ancestors of Thomas Edmond Wood (Doc Wesley)*

## Work-or-Jail Bill Debated In House

Washington (UP).—House debate on the work-or-jail limited manpower service bill wound up in a tangle of oratory last night as proponents of the open shop and racial and religious equality prepared to offer amendments beginning today.

They indicated they would ignore pleas of some members not to "fatten" the streamlined measure which would bring into some phase of the war effort every man between 18 and 45 when and where he is needed. They will offer, among others, an anti-closed-shop rider as well as one that would give legislative sanction to the Fair Employment Practices Committee which seeks racial and religious parity for all workers in industry.

Rep. R. Ewing Thomason (D-Texas), asserted that amending the measure would be a "kiss of death."

These were other developments on the manpower front:

1. The House Labor Committee voted to hasten consideration of Permanent Fair Employment Practices Committee legislation, a move that may take the heat off that rider to work-or-jail. It referred F. E. P. C. bills to a subcommittee for action Thursday.

2. Undersecretary of War Robert P. Patterson told the House Military Affairs Committee that 1945 rocket production requirements are more than 10 times those of 1944. Increases of from 38 to 85 per cent are called for in high capacity ammunition, critical aircraft, heavy artillery ammunition, howitzer, small arms and mortar ammunition.

3. The Congress of Industrial Organizations urged the Senate Military Affairs Committee to hold public hearings on work-or-jail and give labor, industry, agriculture and Government officials adequate opportunity to testify.

4. The National Association of Manufacturers in a letter to the same committee said that "the work-or-jail bill, if fully enforced, will cut, not increase war production." The letter was signed by Ira Mosher, N. A. M. president.

## 205 Pressure Cookers In For Check-Up

The home demonstration office in the county courthouse here had taken on the appearance of a factory production line by late yesterday, as a total of 205 pressure cookers, brought in by Forsyth and Stokes County families, covered the floor and moved methodically across the work-table for dismantling, checking, cleaning of parts and reassembling.

Yesterday's work and that of previous days was in preparation for the pressure canner clinic, which will be conducted today. Sponsored by the State College Extension Service, the clinic is one of a series being held throughout the State to place canning equipment in reliable condition for what, it is hoped, will prove a peak year in home conservation of foods.

During the clinic today all pressure cookers will be fully tested to determine the working condition of pressure gauges and safety valves. Where major repairs are required, the owner will be advised. All services rendered at the

## Southern Bell Employees In Armed Services Will Be Given Full Credits on Return to Job

The Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company and Southern Federation of Telephone Workers yesterday announced the revision of certain company practices with respect to employees on military leaves of absence in the armed forces or the Merchant Marine.

In effect, the revision provides that employees returned to company service following leaves of absence in service, will be allowed full service credit for all such absence. As a result of this, such employees will be placed on the pay roll at the rate of pay they would have been receiving if they had been continuously on duty with the company, in the job classification they were in at the time they left.

The company's board of directors has authorized changes in the Benefit Plan which will give employees on military leave of absence full credit, for all benefit and pension purposes, for the time spent in service.

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## Five of Sextuplets Becoming Stronger

DENVER (AP). — After nearly a week of an up-and-down battle for life, the five surviving Stanek sextuplets are becoming stronger by the hour, doctors say.

The doctors said Saturday that two of the tiny babies, Jeffrey and John, were in good condition and the three others, Catherine, Nathan and Steven, were satisfactory.

Dr. James Strain, a pediatrician, said he is encouraged by the steadily improving health of the five. But he was reluctant to say the five have cleared all the hurdles faced by premature babies.

"Until they come off the respirators, I think we have to be cautious about them," Strain said. "As long as they need respiratory support, we have to be cautious." But he said "conditions are improving on all of them all the time."

Catherine, Nathan and Steven have been on respirators since birth. All three have shown symptoms of the lung ailment which killed Julia, the smallest of the sextuplets, on Tuesday night.

In the sophisticated nursery where the health of the five is monitored by as many as six doctors at a time, the babies were being fed donated mother's milk Saturday.

For Catherine, Nathan and Steven, it was the first time they had eaten orally. They had been fed intravenously since birth.

Jeffrey and John were breathing on their own Saturday, and Strain said the oxygen requirements for the other three were decreasing.

Jeffrey, who was having trouble Friday keeping down the breast milk, overcame the upset during the night and was being fed about seven half-teaspoons of milk every three hours.

**ASHEVILLE** — Six Nazis charged with conspiring to explode terrorist bombs in Greensboro in 1980 attacked the credibility of the government's main witness yesterday and claimed that he tried to push them into action.

Michael H. Sweat, a former agent with the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms, denied on cross-examination that he encouraged the defendants to carry out their planned attack.

The defense repeatedly questioned Sweat about a tape made Oct. 19, 1980, when the defendants were talking about calling off the operation. Sweat told them it would be "a piece of cake" with "no chance of getting caught."

This is the third time that the case has been tried in U.S. District Court in Asheville. The first trial in 1981 ended in a mistrial. The defendants were convicted in the second trial a few months later, but the case was overturned this year on appeal.

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## Tobacco Prices Up

Flue-cured tobacco prices averaged \$186.34 a hundred pounds on the Winston-Salem market yesterday, up slightly from Tuesday, according to Sam J. Young, the sales supervisor.

He said that prices by grades remained steady.

Demand continued to be strong with 2 percent of volume going under government loan to the Flue-Cured Tobacco Cooperative Stabilization Corp., Young said.

Flue-cured tobacco prices were mixed yesterday on North Carolina's three tobacco belts, the Federal-State Market News Service reported.

The quality of offerings was down on the Old and Middle Belt. Grade prices held fairly steady compared to the day before, but a few heavy volume grades showed losses of

\$3 to \$5.

On Tuesday, farmers sold 6,353,880 pounds averaging \$183.96 — down \$1.88 from Monday. Season sales total 94,862,588 pounds at an average of \$167.30

Prices rose yesterday on the South Carolina and Border North Carolina Belt. Gains were mostly \$1 to \$3 compared to Tuesday and occurred for all grades.

Gross sales Tuesday totaled 5,266,366 pounds averaging \$193.74 — down \$2.57 from Monday's high average. Season sales reached 120,795,893 pounds returning \$176.18.

Prices were a little weaker yesterday on the Eastern Belt. Heavy volume grades sold mainly \$1 to \$3 lower than on Tuesday.

Sales Tuesday grossed 7,573,446 pounds returning \$194.95 — down \$1.36 from Monday. Totals for the season

## House Approves Jones' Lease Bill on Oil, Gas

By The Associated Press

The U.S. House passed legislation yesterday to let North Carolina and other coastal states tap federal oil and gas revenues from the sale of offshore leases, setting the stage for Senate action on a similar bill next month.

The bill, sponsored by Rep. Walter B. Jones, D-N.C., won passage by a vote of 301-93, the News and Observer of Raleigh reported. The bill could bring \$7.74 million a year to North Carolina to finance coastal programs.

President Reagan has threatened to veto the measure if approved in Congress, claiming that it would add \$3

the sole beneficiary from the sale of the off-shore leases.

Jones' bill would set aside 10 percent of projected increases in the revenues for grants to the states. The amount returned to 30 states and five American territories could not exceed \$300 million a year.

The Senate version, sponsored by Senator Ted Stevens, R-Alaska, would set aside about \$400 million a year for the states, with about \$7.5 million for North Carolina.

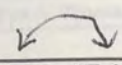

## FOUR KILLED BY LIGHTNING

### Three From One Family Meet Sudden Death While Working at Tobacco Barn

A stroke of lightning from a black cloud that passed over this section last Friday afternoon brought death to four persons three miles north of Mount Airy while at work, hanging tobacco in a barn. Tom S. McCreary, 62, his son, Ben, 18; and daughter, Callie, 18, and Harvey Butcher, 20, were victims of the current from the sky. And at the same time two mules belonging to the deceased were killed as they stood by the barn hitched to a wagon of ripe tobacco.

The party was engaged in filling the barn and gave no heed to the black cloud that was approaching from the west. Young McCreary and the Butcher boy were on the top rounds of the barn hanging tobacco while the elder McCreary and his daughter handed the sticks of tobacco to them. On the outside was Jim McCreary standing on the wagon passing out the tobacco and little Lum McCreary was passing it on to his sister and father who were on the inside of the barn. Jim McCreary on the wagon was badly shocked and burned and had one shoe split open by the electricity, and the little boy was shocked, but both soon recovered. The two large mules fell in their harness and lived only a few seconds. The two boys in the top of the barn were knocked loose from their hold and fell to the bottom and evidently met a sudden death. The Butcher boy's body was badly bruised in the fall from the top of the barn.

All the victims showed plainly burns from the lightning and the little girl's face and throat were blistered. The father was found in a reclining position with his back to the wall of the barn while his daughter had fallen across the tobacco furnace with her head upon her father's shoulder. The two who had fallen from the top of the barn were lying in a heap on the dirt floor.

The lightning struck a tree close to the barn, and it is supposed that a part of it went across to the roof of the barn and into where the four were

Examination showed a small hole in the top of the barn where it had entered. The stroke that followed down the tree is supposed to have been the one that killed the two mules and shocked those on the outside of the barn.

The four victims were buried at Mount Carmel Baptist Church cemetery four miles north of this city Sunday afternoon, the sad rites being attended by a crowd variously estimated from three to five thousand persons. One large grave was dug in which the remains of the three young people were buried side by side while the elder McCreary was buried in a separate grave by the side of his wife of a former marriage.

## Death Takes 3 In One Family

While the Grim Reaper again lost in the battle with the Stork for the month of August, the monthly report of Dr. R. L. Carlin, city health officer, also shows that during that month the number of deaths was the smallest for any month in 1927. There were 167 deaths in Winston-Salem for August and only 46 deaths.

The number of births in that month is an increase of 23 over July when only 134 were recorded and is an increase of 41 over August of last year when 126 birth certificates were filed.

Of the number of births last month, 51 were white and 12 colored. The low number of deaths in August is the biggest feature of the report for this month. It has not been better here in some time. In July of this year there were 192 deaths, which is 24 more than for August. In August of 1926 there were 49 deaths or 23 more than the present month.

Of this number of deaths 27 were white and 35 colored; 17 were males and 33 females. By age groups it is seen that there were deaths of 19 babies less than one year old, which is the largest number found in any age group. There were 10 deaths in the over 60 years old group.

Among the chief causes of death it is found there two were due to organic heart lesions; four to cerebral hemorrhage; and six to peptic ulcers.

A very small number of communicable diseases was reported during August. There were eight cases of measles, four cases of diphtheria and scarlet fever reported; 23 cases of whooping cough, three of whom died; and six and six colored persons during the month, none of whom died.

Although August is a month in which vaccinations make considerable break in the work of the Department of Public Health, the nursing division was busy as evidenced by the fact that 1599 home visits were made, a large part of these were made in the interest of babies.

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S. 8106, it appears that David Bray was born in 1743 in Brunswick County, Virginia.

When quite young he moved to Northampton County, North Carolina, and lived there until he was twenty-one years old, then moved to Bute County, and then to Rowan County, where he was living when he enlisted and served three months as Ensign in Captain Robert Moore's North Carolina Company; his next tour, served about three months as Ensign in Captain Robert Moore's Company, Colonel James Craig's North Carolina Regiment, and was out against the Cherokee Indians; after this he moved to Surry County, where he was drafted and served three months as a private in Colonel William Shepperd's North Carolina Regi-



ment; and afterwards volunteered and served ~~six weeks~~  
~~campaign~~ in Captain Samuel Dyer's Company, Colonel  
John Armstrong's North Carolina Regiment, and was in  
a skirmish at Hillsboro. No dates of service given.

He was allowed pension on his application ex-  
cuted August 13, 1832, while a resident of Surry  
County, North Carolina.

He died July 8, 1836, leaving no widow (her  
name is not stated), but the following children  
survived him- William Bray, Hannon Bray, Nathan Bray,

- (1) In her book The Brays of Fisher River (1969), page 11, Mrs. Edna B. Reece states that Nathan Bray, son of David Bray, Sr., remained in Surry County, NC, until 1816 when he sold 50 acres on Cody's Creek adjoining Hanon Bray to his uncle Littleberry Bray. - (1) Hiram Bray was born in Surry County, NC, and followed his parents' exodus into Indiana, first living in Greene County. There he was married twice, living there at the time of the 1840 census. By 1850 he was in Clay Township, Owen County, IN, living next door to Moses Bray, believed to be a first-cousin. From Blanchard's 1884 History of Owen County, page 782, we learn: "Braysville is situated in the southwest quarter of Section 18, Town 9 North, Range 3 West, and consists of 16 lots, all of which are 60 feet front by 160 feet in depth. The village received its name from the proprietor, Hiram Bray, who had it surveyed and recorded in the month of January, 1860. But little was ever done toward the development of the place, and at the present time some half dozen families constitute its entire population." He is buried in Section 20 (NE  $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Clay Township, Owen County, IN.
- (2) Sophia (Quigley) Bray wrote her will 8 May 1871, and it was probated in Owen County, IN, 8 August 1871, recorded in Book 2:279. In it she names grandson Isaac W. Hulbut [sic] and a deceased grandson, James H. Halbut [sic]. Thomas J. Phipps was the executor.

Genealogy of Lydia Key Cobb as known by Elbert Cobb. Tradition give that Lydia was the daughter of John Key, brother of Martin of Albemarle Co., Va.

Lydia Key was born in about 1772. Lydia's father was of English descent whose ancestors, according to tradition, were so named because they carried the key to the King's treasury. Lydia's father was a farmer and at one time kept a ferry and an inn. Lydia had one brother named Joseph and two sisters, Martha and Mary. Martha and Mary were near the same age, while Joseph and Lydia were near the same age and much younger than Martha and Mary, there being some children dead between Mary and Joseph. There could possibly have been some children older than Martha that my father knew nothing about. Lydia's people were Quakers. Lydia was first a Quaker, but later joined the Methodist Church. Martha married a tory who was wounded in the battle of Pyles' Defeat which was fought in what was then Orange Co., N. C., but what is now Alamance Co. Mary married a man named Box. To this union was born Josiah who became a noted preacher, Lydia first married Dentis Mullin. To this marriage, Lydia's father objected. Lydia's mother was dead at this time having died while Lydia was young. Lydia and Dentis had one son named Asa Mullin who settled in Madisonville, N. C. Dentis Mullin died of fever and



his widow Lydia married John P. Cobb. They lived in Haywood Co., N. C. Lydia, at one time, lived in what was then Burke Co., N. C., either while a maiden or after marrying Mullin. There was one son born to Lydia and John P. Cobb, William Alfred Cobb in Aug. 10, 1809. John P. died while William Alfred was a young man. After William Alfred married. Lydia made her home with him. William Alfred married Charlotte Henson who was born May 14, 1805. To these were born the following children: Reuben Franklin, b. Oct. 27, 1830; John Francis, b. April 21, 1832; Rebecca Leona, b. Sept. 28, 1833; Joseph Jasper, b. Oct. 28, 1835; Louisa Jane, b. Feb. 13, 1837; James Wesley, b. Sept. 18, 1838; Rufus, b. Sept. 30, 1842; Elbert Lorenzo, b. Aug. 26, 1843; Harrison Taylor, b. Now these may certify whom it may concern, that for the full accomplishing of their s'd intentions this 12th day of the 9th month 1793 they the s'd Joseph Keys and Mary Piggott appeared in a public meeting of the s'd people at Cane Creek above said and the s'd Joseph Keys taking the s'd Mary Piggott by the hand did in solemn manner openly declare that he took her the s'd Mary Piggott to be his wife promising with divine assistance to be unto her a loving and faithful husband until death should separate them or words to that effect and then and there in the same assembly, she the s'd Mary Piggott did in like manner openly declare that she took him the s'd Joseph Keys to be her husband, promising with divine assistance to be unto him a loving and faithful wife until death should separate them or words to that purpose and moreover the s'd Joseph Keys and Mary Piggott she according to the custom of marriage assuming the name of her husband as a further confirmation thereof did then and there to these presents set their hands and we whose names are underneath subscribed being present at the consummation thereof do, as witnesses hereunto subscribe our names the day and year above written.

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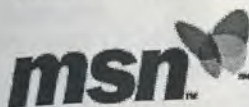

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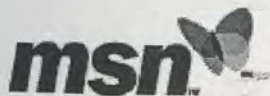

According to the 1860 census of Gilmer her name is Mary, which I am sure you know Polly is a nickname for. Anyway, my interest in them is because of Mary ("Polly") whose parents were--I believe--Robert Wood and Sabra Butcher. Yes, I would very much like to see and receive anything you care to share with me, and I will be more than happy to share anything I have. Let me forewarn you that I am utilizing free e-mail capabilities at the local library and receiving ged-coms, CDs, and attachments longer than 5 pages are strictly forbidden. 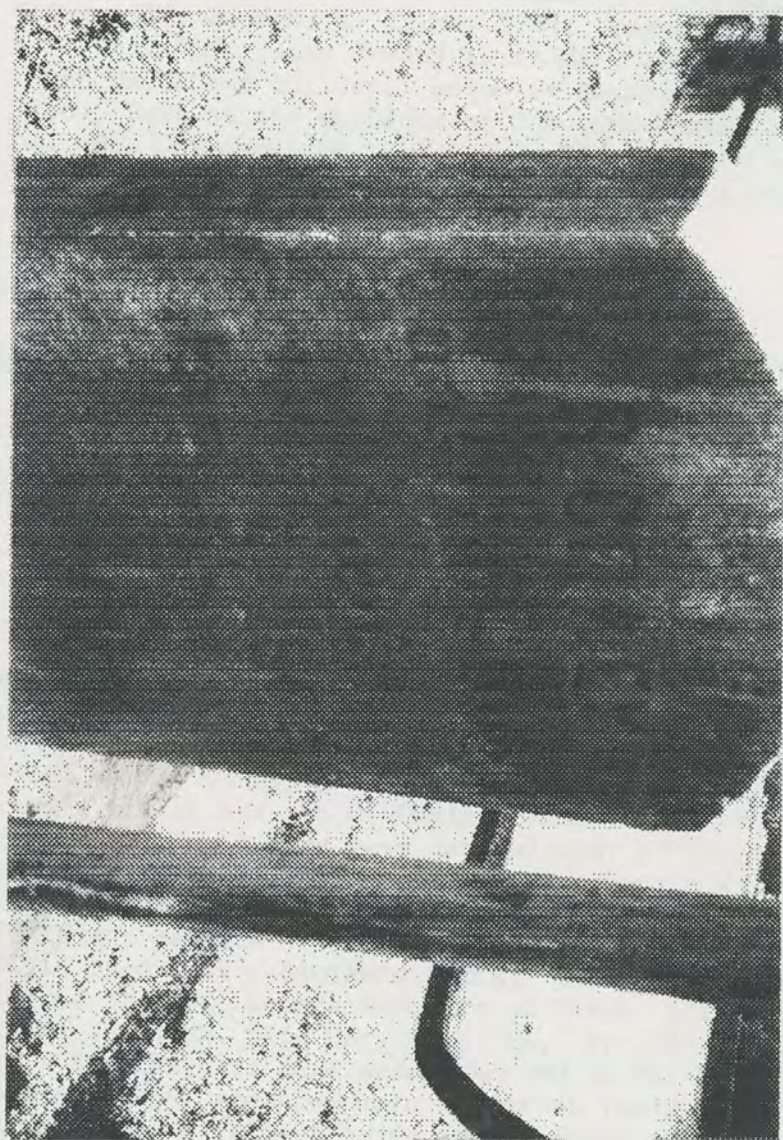

Some say Levi's father was son of Levin SPEER, and Nancy was daughter of Thomas SPEER. I have seen partial copy of Bible that lists children of Nancy SPEER b. VA ... mentions a William LAKEY, says: "This Bible belongs to John SPEER." Were John SPEER and Nancy SPEER the parents of my g-g-grandfather Levi? I also have part of Bible record of a Benjamin SPEER. Then there is an "Old" Andrew listed in First Census Republic of Texas, 1829-1836, as Andrew SPEER 76 b. MD, wife Mary 78 b. PA. By 1850 Census San Augustine Co., TX, they are same except Andrew is 86, Mary (sometimes 88, sometimes 58) and they have different young people and children with them. I believe he is Andrew SPEER sold out to Hugh LOGAN, KY - 1790? And was appointed to look after several children until they were of age. I do not find him in 1860. This Rice Key was from Surry Co., NC. He moved to GA before 1850 and lived in Gilmer Co. along with three of his brothers - John, Lewis and William. Rice Key died in Savannah, GA during the war and is buried there. Rice was married to Sarah Bullin in Surry Co., NC on 19 Jun 1836 and they had the following children: Leona (b. 19 Aug 1838), Iredell H. (b. ca 1840), Jasper (b. ca 1842), Newton (b. ca 1845), Levi (b. ca 1846), James (b. ca 1847), Nancy (b. ca 1849), Mary Ann (b. ca 1854), Rice L. (b. ca 1855), Sarah A. (b. ca 1856), Aaron (b. ca 1857), Thomas H. (b. ca 1858) and Arminta (b. aft 1860). {Sources: Surry Co., NC Marriage Records, US Census for NC, GA and AL and Lane's "Key and Allied Families"}

Rice's father was William Key (b. ca 1767) from VA. William lived in Surry Co., NC and was also supposed to have moved to GA after 1820 but to my knowledge no evidence exists that supports this.

Amherst Co., VA tax lists and family naming patterns support that this William was a brother of John Key (b. ca 1776 in Louisa or Amherst Co., VA, d. aft 1850 in Walker Co., AL) and Rice Key (b. ca 1760 prob. in Louisa Co., VA, d. ca 1830 in Surry Co., NC). The name of Rice was used frequently among descendants of all three of these men. During thirteen years of Key research, I have not once run across another Key family line that used this name.

These Keys lived in close proximity in far western Amherst Co., VA before migrating to Surry Co., NC where they all lived in the vicinity of Skin Cabin Creek. William, John and Rice Key are NOT descendants of John and Martha Tandy Key but grandsons of John's brother, Martin Key (b. ca 1700, d. May 1757 in Louisa Co., VA).

Received your letter of Jan. 6., and was glad to hear from you again. Yes, your interpretation of my very hastily written letter was correct. THE 1880 Surry Co. census shows Ruel and Amy Doss with children SALLY ANN, MAC, COLUMBUS, AND MARY. Ruel is listed as 45, and Amy as 40. And according to the 1900 census Ruel and Sally Ann had been married since 1886.

Those 20 years between 1880 and 1900 are crucial to finding some people, and I'm afraid you will have a hard time with Mac. He would have been 20 in 1886 when Ruel married Sally Ann if he was living. Mary would have been 14, but neither of them is listed in the 1900 census with Ruel and Sally Ann. I did not check the whole 1900 census for Doss's. You might get a copy and see if Mac is listed in another house hold.

My connection to the Wood family is through my paternal great grand mother, SUSAN ELLEN WOOD SHINAULT. She was born in 1850 the daughter of ANDREW AND LUCINDA HOLYFIELD WOOD. She married DANIEL MILTON SHINAULT, ( born 1855) around 1878-79.

I know very little about Andrew Wood except who he married and the names of his children. Any information you could give me on the Woods would be very helpful.

I am sending a copy of a picture of "Bum" Doss. Its not very plain but you can <sup>get</sup> some idea of what he looked like. I'm also sending a copy of my ancestor chart and a family sheet of Andrew Wood and what I have on his family.

As you can see my typing is about as sloppy as my writing.

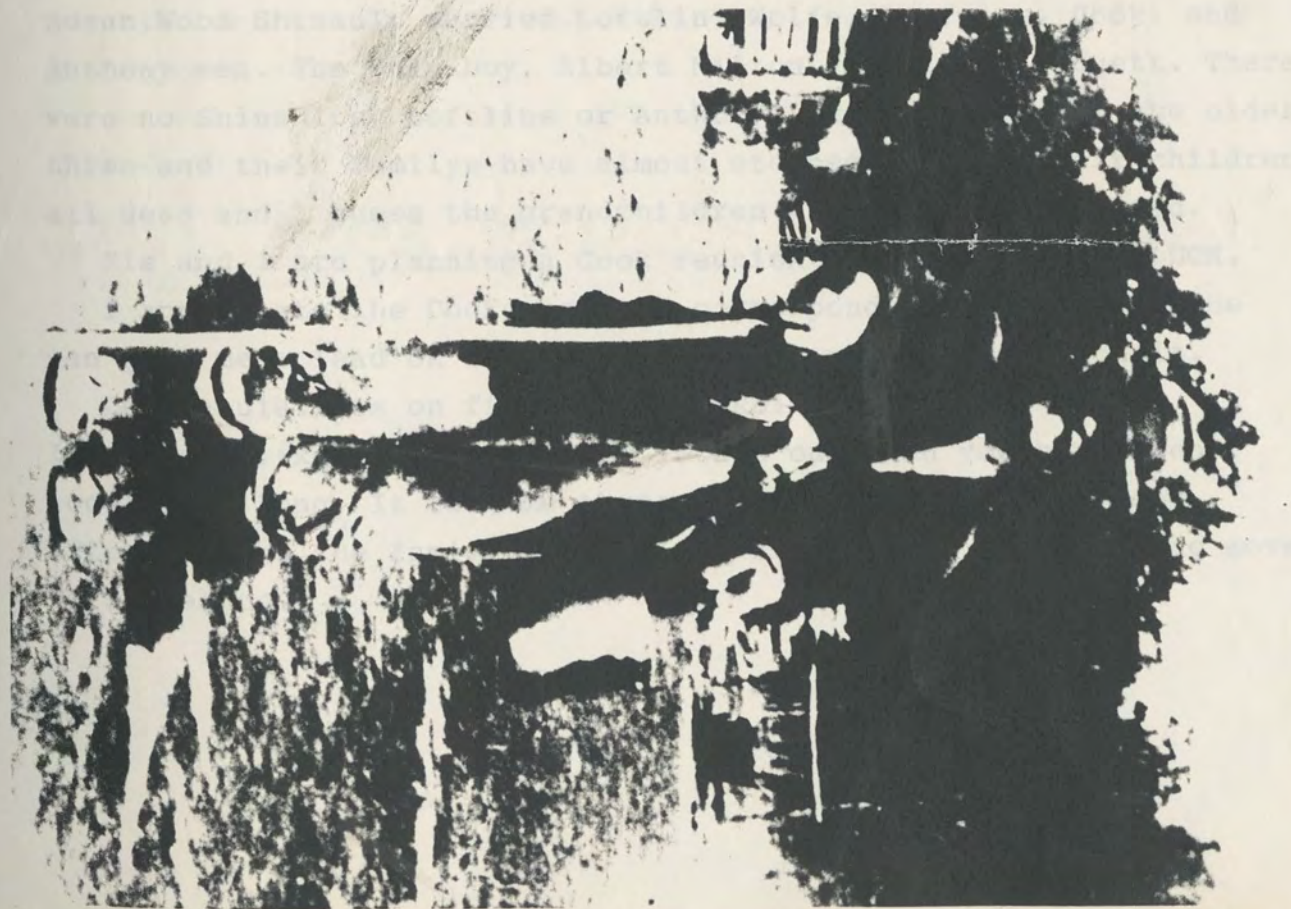

My copy of the Surry County Heritage came yesterday. I was so excited and anxious to get into it, I could hardly cook supper. I am pleased with the results of my historys I wish I had discovered Emma Jane Shinault Holyfields real father befor it went to print, but at least I got the history in, mistake and all. I have read the Edmonds and Evans historys and they correspond with the research I had.

The Shinault reunion was great. Its always my favorite, because my aunts and uncles are there. It was smaller this year. Some of the older ones where unable to make it and were missed by all. My line of Cooks don't have a reunion, but the children of Mary Jane Shinault Cook literally worshipped their mother and would only miss a Shinault reunion if too sick to come. The five girls of Daniel Milton and Susan Wood Shinault married Loftlin, Wolfe, Lawrence, Cook, and Anthony men. The only boy, Albert Milton, married a Badgett. There were no Shinaults, Loftlins or Anthonys there. They were the older three and their familys have almost stopped coming. Their children are all dead and I guess the grandchildren are not as interested.

Sis and I are planning a Cook reunion in "95". Wish us LUCK.

I appreciate the Cooke name to correspond with. I do hope he can give me a lead on where James Cook Came from in Virginia.

Congratulations on finding the missing Poindexter child. Its almost like finding gold to locate one when you have been looking so long. It took me three years to find Molinda Cook after I found the family in the 1850 census. Who knew she had moved to Stokes co.?



I have not heard from Hassell Doss and was very disappointed when I <sup>Went</sup> ~~Went~~ by his home after the reunion and no one was there. My Uncle Doug says he will contact him for me. I hope he will and at least find out who his father was. I left a note and my phone number when I went by. What ever I hear, I will let you know. These older people sometimes would rather not discuss the past. I just wish I could see him in person. I am a salesperson by trade and can usually get people to open up.

Do you know if either of the Poindexter children in this family is the parent of Vader Poindexter? Vader Poindexter married Benjamin Shinault, the youngest son of Daniel Sr. and Pheobe Whitt Shinault. Hope this finds your health continuing to improve. I received your last letter and immediately took the obit. to Mama's for confirmation of the family connection. We were right. Mary Jane Doss Baker and her brothers and sisters are the children of Rural Doss' youngest son, John Murphy Doss. Mama remembers playing with them as a child. She says she doesn't know how much Hassel can tell you about the older children by his first wife, <sup>\* RURAL</sup> but it might be worth a try.

I just got off the phone with Ailene Shinault. She is the child of Ben Shinault and Vader Poindexter Shinault. She was a little hesitant when I ask about her parents and grandparents. Aunt Ila Mae says that her grandmother Poindexter was never married, but had a whole house full of children. Her name was Delaney Poindexter. I have misplaced the Poindexter sheet you sent, so I couldn't check, but I seem to remember that name being on there. Ailene did say that a man from out of state had contacted her on the Poindexter family and that she would find his name and address and give it to you if you called her. Her number is 1-910-374-2265. She is retired from Reynolds and was never married, so she is at home most of the time. Delaney Poindexter had at least 8 children.

Dear James;

Received your letter yesterday and was so glad for an excuse to abandon my work and do some genealogy! Its my escape from every day worries. Dead ancestors can't cause too much trouble.

This has not been a wonderful month. Our oldest son graduated from basic training at Fort Jackson, S. C. on the 14th and we went down for the ceremony. Fort Jackson was built a little closer to hell than the rest of the Carolinas. It was miserable. Of course the fact that I was totally against his enlisting probably didn't help any. He only lacked three semesters graduating from Campbell University and even though he swears he will finish while in the military, you know how mothers are about their first born. I just plain didn't want him to leave home. I'm afraid my boys are always going to be my babies no matter how old they get.

Thank you so much for the Holyfield information from the Journal of N. C. Genealogy. I think the author of this article may be the same person who was in Surry Co. about 10 years ago doing research on the Holyfields. My uncle, G. E. Miller helped him find the old Jeff Holyfield cemetary which is about three miles back in the woods behind my cousin Ronnie Millers house. Months later the man sent my uncle a copy of the research he had done. Uncle Doog (G. E. Miller) gave me a copy which I rearranged and brought down to present in our line of the Holyfields. I am sending you a copy of it. It covers most all the Holyfields in the Valentine and Susannah Holyfield line. Mama and her family pronounce the name Hole-Field, with the Y silent. A distant cousin in Santa Anna California, pronounces his Holly-Field I guess either is correct.

The William Daniel Holyfield you ask about is the <sup>grand</sup>son of ~~Isaac and~~ ~~Valentine Jr and second wife Sally Whotan and son of Valentine (3)~~ and Nancy O'Neal. page 11. Page 19 list the children of William Daniel and the line continues through as far as I could find. I checked the research material he gave uncle Doog and found it to be correct. Hope this is what you where looking for.

The write up about Rural looks good except for one thing. The Susie Shinault who is buried at Double Creek Church of Christ is not the



same person as the Sallie Ann Shinault Shinault who married Rural Doss. The Susie Shinault at Double Creek is Susan Ellen Wood Shinault who married Daniel Milton Shinault. Daniel Milton was the brother of Sallie Ann Shinault Shinault Doss. I dont think a death certificate has been found for Sally Ann Shinault Shinault Doss, but she is probably buried at the old Shinault graveyard with Rural Doss. I have not checked Yadkin Co. for a death certificate. She had children living there and may have died there.

If I were you, I would certainly take a chance on asking the Hassell C. Doss in Level Cross if he was related and what he knew of the rest of the family. He can only say yes or no and I have found that most people are awfully nice. My sister and I are going to Yadkinville this week end. If I get a chance, I will ask Uncle Doog if he knows this man and if he would be cooperative in family research.

Thanks again for the information and let me hear from you.

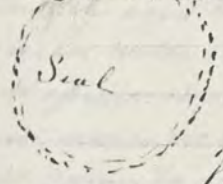

Judy,

Hello my name is Dillis Bolton. My great Grandfather was John Dudley McNeil, who was born in 1881 in Claiborne County, Tennessee. His Mother was Nancy Fletcher McNeil Butcher. John was eight years old when his mother married Jackson Butcher. I discovered that Nancy drew a pension for her husband's service in the Confederate Army and when I was last in Nashville I made a copy of her pension plus his original application. I thought this information might be useful to you in your research of the family of James Butcher Sr.

On the pension application he states his name "Jackson Butcher", born "Surry County, North Carolina, July 9th, 1834." Further; "I enlisted in June 1861 in General Stonewall Jackson's Command, under Colonel Kirkland, later Colonel Lewis, Captain James Waugh, later Captain Andrew Shore, 1st Lieutenant H. Jones, 2nd William Martin; Martin succeeded Jones." He also states he took part in the following battles: Massey Junction, Va., Winchester, Va., Cross Keys and numerous other battles. (Massey may be Manassass or Second Bull Run). He was wounded at Cross Keys, being "struck on leg 2 inches below knee with shell." He was unable to serve for four months. He was later captured at Petersburg in March 1865 and released in June 1865 after taking the oath of allegiance. This pension was filed on July 17, 1903. He also states he had been a resident of Tennessee for 25 years.

On the web page where I found your e-mail I found two Jackson Butchers. One, the child of William and Polly Butcher would be to young. The other, son of Henry and Nancy is in the right time frame. In 1879 a Jackson Butcher obtained a marriage license in Lee County, VA with Fereby A. Wood. He gave his age as 40 at that time. He gave his place of birth as Surry Co., N.C. He was the son of William & Polly Butcher. As Lee County is borders Claiborne County, Tennessee (the cemetery where Jackson Butcher is buried is only a couple of miles from Lee County line.), this may be the same person in an earlier marriage. This would indicate an earlier birth date for William and Polly's son.

Even though this is not my direct line, I am curious as to Jackson Butcher's ancestry. He and Nancy had one son, Robert Butcher, my great Grandfather's half brother. Hopefully you can use this information and maybe help me find which Jackson Butcher was my great Grandfather's step father. Thank You.

Once before, during World War II, Bost was reported missing when the USS Hornet was sunk.

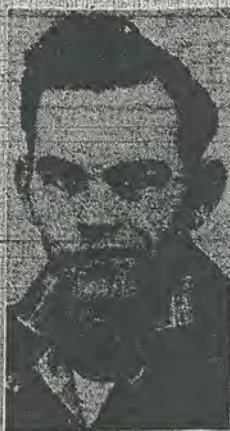

MRS. SALLIE SIMPSON died March 15 and was buried at Union Church Cemetery ... (from Ash Hill).

RICHMOND, VA - March 28--MISS JENNY WARN, an attractive young lady residing with her parents near Barton's Heights, a suburb of this city, died from a large dose of strychnine. No cause was given for the act.

At Jasper, Florida, a sensation was caused by the appearance of a lady and girl from Georgia who claim to be the wife and daughter of R. A. CHANCEY, a respected citizen who came here years ago, married into a prominent family and has several children. The lady from Georgia claims he deserted her 16 years ago and CHANCEY does not deny it. No steps have yet been taken looking to his prosecution ... (Jacksonville, Florida - March 29).

Longtown is a nice little village numbering about 75 inhabitants located in Yadkin Co., about half way between Jonesville and Hamptonville. It has 2 stores, a post office, an academy, a good furniture shop, and 2 churches--Methodist and Baptist.

Lee was born to William (Billy) Henderson and Margaret Francis Cain Cain. He was born in Stokes County, N.C. on May 23, 1892. He was the older child in Bill's second marriage. In his youth, as in his adult life, he made his living farming and was good at it.

Lee enjoyed fishing, hunting, and trapping. All of his life he was an outdoor person. In the summer he would take his hook, line, pole, and worms, along with his daughter Mary Margaret, down to the creek fishing. Summer or winter, Lee could be found on the creek fishing. If he was working in the crops and it started raining, he would come in and get his fishing gear and off to the water he would go. In the winter he would ice fish. He would go out on the ice to where the fish come up to the top of the ice to warm. He would take an ax hitting the ice where the fish were, killing them. After he had all the fish he needed he would get them up and go to the house and clean them to eat. Hunting was fun for him, he had many dogs, some of the best to be found.

Lee lived his life in Stokes and Surry Counties as a tenant farmer. He would carry his tobacco crop to Winston-Salem to be sold. As he traveled, he would pass by the Goff Place on Goff Road north of King. The Goff house was a very big, southern home with an upper and lower front porch. To Lee, this was a mansion. This was a beautiful house, one he dreamed of, and one he would like to call home. Little did he know then he would one day live in this same house, farm the land, or that it would be the place of his death.

From the farm he lived on just outside of Pilot Mountain called the Vaughn Spring place, which is off Hwy 268 behind The Community Bank, just east of the railroad tracks. He moved from Surry County in the twenties to the farm of his dream in Stokes County to live out his life.

Lee was married to Lou Ella Joyce, the daughter of Alexander and Mary Nunn Joyce, on February 11, 1912, by his grandpa Elder Henderson Cain. Lee and Ella had seven children: (1) Son, born dead, August 20, 1913; (2) Howard Lee Cain born (mother said July 12, 1914); his certificate of birth gives the date at July 10, 1914. He is living and married Evelyn Lena Tuttle on August 31, 1947. To them were born twins, Jerry Lynn Cain and Garry Lee Cain, on May 31, 1949. Larry Steve Cain born February 23, 1952. Terry Lee Cain born March 1, 1953. Carl Ray Cain born September 14, 1954. (3) Arthur Powell Cain, born (mother said January 3, 1916); certificate of birth gives the date of January 20, 1916. He is living and married Sadie Lee Moore on October 3, 1933. To them were born John Henry Cain, Peggy Cain, Billy Ray Cain, Nancy Cain, Arthur Powell Cain Jr., Verlie Mae Cain, Roy Lee Cain, Linda Fay Cain, and two children born dead. (4) William Alexander (Bill) Cain born June 11, 1920 in Surry County, died February 25, 1984, married Earsley Hauser in February, 1948. To them were born Alice Cain, William Lee Cain, and Deborah Cain. His second marriage was to Beulah

Johnson of Surry County. (5) Thomas Joyce (TJ) Cain born in Surry County on August 24, 1922. He died in Stokes County on October 25, 1926, a short time after Lee moved from Surry County to his dream home. (6) Mary Margaret Cain born April 16, 1928. She is living and married Garland Oliver (G.O.) Holmes on December 5, 1947. To them were born Jimmy Lee Holmes and Robert Lynn (Bobby) Holmes who was born in Surry County. (7) Son born dead, date of burial August 13, 1936.

Lee died on July 28, 1947 at 4:30 A.M. on a hill in the house of his dream. His family lived and worked the farm until 1949 or 1950 when all of the children moved from home to start their own families.

Lou Ella lived in Forsyth County until September 20, 1960 when she died at the home of her daughter, Mary Margaret Holmes. Lee and Ella are buried along with TJ, and the two stillborn children in the Joyce Family Cemetery located just outside of Pilot Mountain, N.C.

By the time this family picture was made, Robert and Sarah Frances had outgrown their first home. They bought 400 acres of land and a large five room house known as the Beamer — Callahan place.

A lot of work was done on this land by Callahan family members. The sons had cleared land and some of them had built homes there. The one thing that stands out in my mind about this family was the love and respect they had for each other. When one got married, they all pitched in to help him/her get a start. As long as my grandfather lived, there was always room for big family gatherings. They had a big birthday dinner for all the children's families to get together at Robert and Sarah Frances' home each year.

The Beamer — Callahan house had five rooms with a separate large log kitchen located about 40 feet from the main house. The kitchen was furnished with hutch cupboards, a table that would seat 16 people, benches (instead of chairs) for seating, a big wood-burning stove with oven, and a fireplace that would burn four foot logs. The kitchen was always warm and cozy. One major task on Saturdays was to get the lamps and lanterns filled with oil, the wicks trimmed, and the globes washed.

The furniture in the main house was handmade of black walnut timber. At one time, the house had ten beds. Almost all of the rooms had two beds, with a trundle bed underneath. A big shelf clock was located in each room. Though there were chests and trunks in all the rooms for storage, the house did not have a closet, so nails were used for hanging up garments and other items.

The spring house located at the bottom of a hill was "one of a kind." Used by four families (Robert

and Charlie Callahans', Johnny Gillispie's and Ed Clifton's), this wooden structure built over a spring was lined with rocks and fitted with benches for refrigerating milk, butter, and other food items. A long handled gourd was used for drinking at the spring. Carrying water up the hill in wooden pails for drinking, cooking, bathing, and washing laundry was not easy but necessary.

At the end of the spring house was a big vat used for washing up with lye soap when family members came in from the fields or doing other work. To make the lye soap, a hopper was filled with ashes. Water was poured over the ashes to yield lye. Meat skins and fat trimmings were boiled with the lye to produce soap.

So many memories come to mind when I think of my granddad's home. The dinner bell rang at 11:30 AM each day for the mid-day meal. All the families in hearing distance knew the time. If the bell rang at any other time, it meant help was needed. All adults who heard it would come to render aid.

When a telephone was installed, it was a big help. Of course, you knew your business and everyone else's who had a telephone. When the phone rang, everyone listened in, no matter whose ring it was.

Granddad loved his grandchildren (he had 98 in all) and would do almost anything to make them happy. Other he would send the granddaughter out of the room so he could call "Punch and Judy." He would crawl under the bed and pull down the spread, then out would pop Punch and Judy to talk to us — what a treat! My mother used to say there was enough love in that family to go around the world and back.

Even to say a final goodbye to my grandparents produced a beautiful memory. Each was buried in a casket, handmade by Preston Hodges, with seasoned black walnut boards from their farm. They are buried in the Little Vine Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery near Dobson. Granddad's headstone was furnished free to him as they were to all Civil War veterans. He had Grandmother's made in the likeness of his. She died in 1932 and he died in 1935.

Robert and Sarah Frances Callahan had seventeen children in this log house: Columbus, b. 1872; Charlie, b. Dec. 27, 1874; John Hugh, b. Oct. 10, 1878; Mary Jane, b. Sep. 19, 1879; Ardella "Dell," b. June 23, 1881; Fannie, b. May 29, 1884; Thomas, b. Nov. 15, 1885; Louisa, b. June 1, 1888; Benjamin, b. Dec. 24, 1889; Elizabeth "Bet," b. May 6, 1891; Amelia, b. 1894; Matilda, b. Aug. 16, 1896; and William, birthdate not known. (He joined the Standing Army and settled in Oklahoma City where he was buried when he died.) Triplets, died at birth; and another child that did not live long enough to be named.



Callahan — First Home.

This first home did not come easy for the Callahans. Robert was the son in the family to serve as a soldier in the Civil War. His brother, Richard, was left to be Home Guard. A Home Guard was a man left in the community to be on the alert for outlaw Rebel troops who would kill and steal for food and shoes. The Rebels were near starvation and some of them would do anything for food. Robert's brother got word to him that their mother was dying. Robert went AWOL (absent without leave) to try to see his mother. Before he could reach home, another Home Guard told him his mother had died. Robert then made his way back to his regiment, only to be told that the war had ended and all of his regiment had gone home. He started his journey back home, travelling by night thinking he might be mistaken for one of the outlaw Rebel soldiers who stole and killed. By this time, he was in rags; he had lost so much weight that even his family members did not recognize him when he got home.

On his way home, Robert Callahan stopped at the Butcher home. The Butchers' father and mother had been killed by outlaw Rebel soldiers. Only Rube, Sarah Frances, and George were left alive in this family. The Butcher children shared

food with Robert — they had hidden it under the floor of the house; all their other food had been taken by the outlaw Rebels who killed their parents.

When Robert did reach home, he was wearing rags and covered in body lice. He was not allowed in the house until he was bathed and treated for lice, and his clothes burned.

After he was nursed back to health, he returned to the Butchers' home where he met Sarah Frances. She was 13 years old and Robert was 25; he took her home to be his wife.

Robert and Sarah Frances Callahan's first home (still standing on Simpson Road in Surry County) and its furnishings were built entirely by hand with the help of Robert's family and friends.

There was no money to pay for help; everything was done for free or as exchange for help in time of need for others. Robert and Sarah Frances raised their thirteen children to be grown in this log house.

He was a tobacco farmer and I especially remember the beautiful tobacco twists he made and chewed. He took a job in Canada for awhile curing tobacco. He was a guard at the Prison Camp near Dobson, NC. In his later years, he lived in Kernersville, NC near his sons and youngest daughter where he ran a country store. He enjoyed playing the fiddle the "old timey way." He married Martha Elizabeth "Bett" Callahan Dec. 6, 1906. Martha (May 6, 1891-June 10, 1931) was the daughter of Robert "Bob" and Sarah Frances Butcher Callahan. Martha had a history of having severe epilepsy. She and her family were working in the tobacco field and she left to go prepare supper. She was found dead when the family arrived home.

John Morgan and Martha had nine children: Richard W. (June 16, 1908-Jan. 2, 1909); Rosa (Oct. 3, 1912-Dec. 24, 1912); Tildie Frances (my mother), b. ## HOWARD E. CALLAWAY

94

A single act can define a person's life. On a battlefield in France in 1944, Staff Sergeant Howard E. Callaway (1911-1944) of Surry County performed an amazing military feat when he single-handedly fought off a field full of German panzers. Entering "no-man's land" alone and armed only with a bazooka, Callaway disrupted a German panzer attack on his very first day in combat. Such an action by an untried warrior might appear foolhardy to most normal people, but Howard Callaway was no ordinary mortal.

This son of Surry County, in fact, came into the world in heroic dimensions, weighing well over ten pounds at birth. Uncle Sam's army would later be hard-pressed to get his six-foot-two-inch frame below 215 pounds of muscle and bone. At first reluctant to go to war, Callaway became a superb fighting machine once he committed himself to the struggle against Hitlerism. Steady nerves and deadly marksmanship earned him America's second highest medal for valor on his first day in combat, a feat that rarely, if ever, has been matched.

Had Hitler known that America produced men like Howard Callaway, he might have thought better about starting the war. The blood of pioneers ran thick in the veins of Howard Callaway. Generations earlier, some of his kinsmen had gone to Kentucky with Daniel Boone. Others helped thrash the British at Kings Mountain during the Revolutionary War. Still others marched with Lee and Jackson in the War Between the States. The tough sinews of the frontier spirit lingered in the hill country of the South well into the twentieth century. Men from this region were always good to have around in a fight.

Howard Callaway was born in 1911 near Lamsburg, Virginia, but when he was still a lad his family moved across the state line to a farm in the Round Peak community. Howard's parents, Thomas Daniel and Laura Faulkner Callaway, were hearty, rural folk who raised their large family to be self-reliant and industrious. Dan Callaway was never known to back down from a fight. He was an authentic mountain man who had that intense squint of the eye and fire in the belly of one who had carried on an unrelenting struggle for a livelihood in rocky, hostile terrain — but he had never given in.

The Callaway family frequently sat by the hearth in the evenings taking turns reading from

the classics of literature, which families in the area passed around or borrowed from school libraries. The cadence of King James verse also penetrated to the marrow of the bone and gave family members a solid foundation upon which to build a successful life. Survival took all of the resources that one could muster. After graduating from Beulah High School, Howard hoped to further his education in agriculture at N. C. State. He enrolled, worked hard to be ready for the fall semester, packed his meager possessions and an older brother took him to Raleigh. Upon arriving at N. C. State, he learned that he did not have sufficient funds and he returned home. Undaunted, he spent his time helping with the family farming operation and when time allowed he perfected his hunting skills. Rabbits, squirrels and birds were victims of his deadly accuracy and were regular fare at the Callaway table. Honey also from felled bee trees in the mountain, observed on hunting expeditions, was enjoyed daily. He became an accomplished beekeeper, traveling to the eastern part of the state during bee season. A survivor of the Great Depression, he emerged with the strength of character and the love of God and Country which would make him great.

For several years prior to the war Howard made his home with his sister and her husband, Hettie and Rufus Blackburn on Old Springs Road, north of Mount Airy. He was adored by the Blackburn family because of his keen sense of humor and entertaining conversation which endeared him to everyone, young and old alike. In June of 1940 he married the beautiful Mozelle Lawrence of Lawsonville. The following year the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor and war was declared.

Although not eager to go to war, his innate courage took charge and on that hot July day in France in 1944, he responded to a challenge as anyone familiar with his life would have expected him to do. When Howard arrived at the front, the Germans were on the attack. Drastic action was needed to save his comrades from the rain of exploding steel belching from German guns. He

headed into "no-man's land" and boldly placed himself in the path of the German engines of death. Bolts of flame and steel thundered back and forth.

First one tank exploded and then another, as well-placed shells hit home. When a third tank was incapacitated, the remaining German vehicles began withdrawing, leaving behind a lone soldier with a bazooka slung across his massive shoulder. Few men have ever experienced such a rude initiation on their first day at the front. Howard Callaway's reward was the Distinguished Service Cross awarded posthumously to his widow after the war. She was told that Howard Callaway was the only person from Surry County to be so honored.

The American forces continued to pursue the Germans who stubbornly gave ground as they retreated across France and toward their homeland. Staff Sergeant Callaway lost his life on the morning of November 24, 1944, near "Bloody Aachen," where the Germans made a fanatical stand. He died doing what he had done since his first day at the front, advancing directly into the face of the enemy's strength. Across exposed terrain and through murderous enemy fire, Callaway had advanced nine hundred yards that fateful morning before a partially concealed German panzer, poised in hiding as some devilish monster, flicked its fiery tongue and in a sudden flash of light mortally wounded a man of enormous courage.

Callaway's courage emerged from deeply hidden wells of character. He was representative of many fighting men from the Appalachian region whose remains lie in military cemeteries around the world. According to North Carolina author, W. J. Cash, these people from the area around the rim of the Appalachian range exhibited the most intense individualism the world had seen since the Italian Renaissance. Like Callaway, those who fell in the service of their country are deeply mourned by their loved ones. The nation should remember their sacrifices because it is not certain we will ever see the likes of them again.

## PORTO RICAN WORKERS NEEDED TO WORK IN VIRGINIA MINES

(Correspondence of The Associated Press)  
San Juan, Porto Rico, June 22.—Five thousand Porto Rican workers are wanted by a Virginia coal mining company to bring its mines up to 100 per cent output. At present these mines are under-producing about 75 per cent. The solution of this problem lies in labor and the Virginia corporation believes that Porto Ricans can furnish that. It is willing to pay transportation and provide homes for Porto Rican laborers if necessary can be found for bringing them North. This has been made much more perplexing by the sinking of the Carolina and the danger of other submarine attacks.

Still, Special Agent Roberts, who is in charge of the transportation of island workers to the mainland, is hopeful. He believes that the Federal government is going to make every effort to take North workers who register for employment. He points out that in the United States there is a shortage of all kinds of labor while here now that the sugar crop is over a large number of men are idle and without immediate prospect of finding work. If they are left here they are condemned to a long period of uselessness and poverty, while their presence in the North would be a real asset for the industries of the country.

## Traffic in Berlin

New York, July 16.—Tourist traffic in Berlin is increasing according to the Cologne Gazette of June 5. In May there were 119,657 visitors in Berlin, an increase of 10,300 as compared with May of last year. ## TWIN-CITY PEOPLE ASKED TO GIVE GLOVES TO HELP SAVE THE AVIATORS

Every possible effort is being put forth by the Government of the United States to manufacture aeroplanes in order to win the war. These aeroplanes are useless unless they are successfully operated by trained aviators. Every possible effort should be put forth to make aviators as comfortable as possible. Even in mid-summer the air in the higher altitudes is unpleasantly cold, and during the winter months it is extremely important to afford to these men every possible protection.

An excessive amount of clothing becomes cumbersome, therefore it is desirable to protect the body of the aviator with the very best, and at the same time, least bulky material. Vests made of kid gloves are found to be most useful in order to protect the aviators from cold. These vests may look like a patch quilt, because of the different shades and sizes, and most efficient, and many an aviator has been protected, used, and comfortable and made more useful and efficient because of the warmth which has been received from this useful, though peculiar, garment.

This work in Winston-Salem is under the auspices of the Junior Hospital Association and the ladies have located boxes at the following places: Red Cross room in the Twin-City Club building, Red Cross room of Salem Auxiliary in Delo Home, Anchor Store, Ideal Dry Goods Company, O'Hanlon's Drug Company, Mock-Baby-Stocking Company, Vogue, Watkins Book Store. These boxes are arranged as receptacles for kid gloves which may be deposited in them. Even soiled

gloves, and gloves of any and all colors, will be gratefully received. The larger the pieces of kid, the more rapidly can the garments be made. We feel sure that there are many elbow kids, as well as kids used by gentlemen, which can be made most useful for the purpose above indicated. Do not delay bringing the gloves to the places mentioned and deposit the same in the boxes. Even soiled gloves can be used because arrangements have been made to have them thoroughly cleaned so as to prevent any possible infection. It is hoped that the ladies having this matter in charge will have a most liberal response. Surely the people of our community will forego kid gloves in order to add to the comfort of the men who are defending us on the battle fields of the world.

It is confidently believed that it will in the future be the fashion not only to give the gloves which have been used and soiled, but it is hoped that it will be the fashion to purchase the newest and best kid obtainable in order that the greatest possible number of vests may be made and forwarded. If friends of the Cause of Freedom through the country cannot conveniently deposit their gloves in any of the boxes above referred to, will they kindly forward the same by mail to any of the stores so that the same can be delivered to the "wonderful" ladies in hand and so much at heart. While the boxes will be left at the various places for an indefinite period, it is possible, however, that it will take some weeks, after the gloves have been received, to have them cleaned, cut, and made into vests, and inasmuch as winter is not far off, the sooner the donations and contributions are made, the better.

**Africa under German control. Win War in East**

**Suffocate in Europe**  
"England cannot seriously risk a collapse in Egypt. If her life line running from Gibraltar through the Suez canal to India is successfully attacked, England is lost. Here we have the possibility of realizing peace. And Dr. Hans Ehrenberg, writing on the same subject in the 'Vossische Zeitung,' says the German people must realize that if they do not win their struggle for world-position they will be 'thrown back upon Europe to suffocate there.'"

"Possession of the coast of Flanders," he adds, "would not make Germany free as against America or the Anglo-Saxon combination. To escape from that position we must gain a secured outlet to the ocean, and to that end it is not enough to possess Constantinople; it is also imperative to gain control of the Suez canal. This would give Germany a pledge of victory in the future great naval and colonial war."

**PRESERVE FRUIT AND VEGETABLES**  
Drying Fruit is Urged Because of the Saying of Sugar; Canning is Urged as Good Method

(Special to The Journal)  
Raleigh, July 16.—Because of the scarcity of sugar, some people with an abundance of fruit have felt that they should curtail their canning and preserving operations, reserving their crops which have reached the Food Administration here. Such people have assumed the wrong attitude, according to officials of the Food Administration. The position of the Food Administration may be stated as follows:  
Every possible pound of fruit and vegetables that is not needed for immediate consumption should be saved through canning, preserving or drying.

The use of the dehydrating or drying method in saving fruits or vegetables is encouraged to the greatest extent possible, because no sugar is necessary for this purpose, and no cans or jars are necessary. Next to drying, canning is urged. The motto of the Food Administration is "Maximum Canning with the Minimum Sugar." Sugar will no doubt be more plentiful during the fall and

Jonathan Flinchum was born at Surry 1835 to Martin and Martha Flinchum, farmers, of Pilot Mountain area.

Recruited at age 27, he entered service with his brothers, Gideon and James, and was listed as absent around Drewry's Bluff 19 Oct 1862 but was listed as present though sick at Kinston 17 May 1863. In Nov-Dec 1863 he was present and was court-martialed Jan-Feb 1864 and confined 1 Dec 1864. No other information.

He married at Surry Elizabeth Denny, daughter of Joel and Nancy Jones Denny.

FLIPPEN, JOSHUA J. CPL  
CO E 53 REG NC

Joshua J Flippen was born in 1843 to Jessie A Flippen in Stokes County.

He volunteered at Flat Shoal 27 Mar 1862 when he was 19. He was a farmer and was 5' 10" tall. He was mustered in 30 Apr 1862 at Camp Mangum, Raleigh. He died three months later 24 July 1862 at Petersburg Hospital of typhoid fever.

William L Franklin volunteered 20 May 1861 when he was 29. He died around Manassas, VA, 4 Jan 1862 of pneumonia.

Ezekiel Freeman joined a group organized in Dobson 1 Sept 1861 by David M Cooper and Lacy J Norman. He was mustered in at Wilmington in Jan 1862. Taken prisoner by the enemy at Roanoke Island, NC, 8 Feb 1862, he was paroled 21 Feb 1862. He was again taken prisoner by the enemy at Gettysburg 3-5 July 1863. He was paroled and sent to James River, VA, 18 Feb 1865 where he was exchanged.

Ezekiel married Mary Jane Golden born in 1850, died 13 Jan 1928. Children: Susan, b 1870; Hugh, b 18 Dec 1873, md Annie Cave in 1895, d 29 July 1913; Lucy, b 1874; Molly F, b 1877; Laura, b 14 Feb 1880, md James "Dick" Snow, d 8 Sept 1930; Vance W, b 24 Nov 1889, md Rosa B Jones in 1910, d 26 July 1988.

In 1880 Ezekiel was farming near Dobson. He died 8 Jan 1912 and is buried at Welcome View Baptist Church. (See Freeman Letters.)

Dear Mother, I have taken the present opportunity to write you a few lines to inform you that I am all well. I will now try to say some of the things we have had since we started out here. We have had some hard march since we left home but since we are in camp we feel much better. We have one lb of flour 1/2 lb of coffee and some other things. We are stationed in a camp a quarter of a mile of the road and we march every day every five hours. I must close for this time as you can. No more at present but I will write until death.

We have a very little to eat. We have one lb. of flower 1/2 lb. of bacon a day, nothing else. We are stationed in about 6 miles of Richmond 3 quarters of a mile of the James River. The steamboats pass every day every fue hours----- We can hear the cars whistling up the track. I must close by saying you must rite as sune as you can. No mor at present but Remaining true Son until death.

If you knead any of the money you can use it and keep the balance for me till I come home. I must close for the present. Write soon and let me know whether you got the things I sent or not. My dear and affectionate Mother,

I avail myself of the earliest practicable moment to respond to your kind favor which I received by the perturbation of Capt. McGuffin. I was truly glad to hear from you and especially to learn that you were well. I have nothing special to write at this time. We all landed here safely last Sunday the 4th, this inst from our quarters at the Breastworks in the Old Dominion. However, we left a few of our sick. Hugh has been pretty sick since we came here though I think he will soon be well again. Dear Mother, we are just lying here in the woods and only have our old tents to shield us from the inclemency of the weather, the excruciating keen and piercing winds of winter and the Hoary dews of Heaven pinch us closely and naturally incline to take a retrospective view and cause us often to meditate our comforts and happiness we once enjoyed with you Dear Mother at your own fireside at your own pleasant fireside many cold winter days now past and gone while meditating on those pleasant times. I am often almost constrained to exclaim and roll back sweet moments roll back to me once more but alas I cannot see any present prospect of anytime soon realizing this Joyful anticipation of future ease but I trust that a righteous God mite give us a helping hand our efforts according to the of our cause and succus will perch upon our banners in every battlefield and be crowned



with a glorius and honorable and lasting peace." Then Dear Mother we will all march home with Laurels fresh upon our brows from the battlefield to enjoy peace with those we love most dear. The liberties for which we have been contending in battle array. Mother, I want you to send me a nice pair of fingered gloves and have my name worked on them and a pair of socks also, Mother, don't pay for anything until you get it done. You understand me. I have with the exception of socks and gloves got clothes plenty. There is no chance to get a furlough. None. We expect to fight soon. We have 30,000 troops here at Kinston and 80,000 more at Wilmington.

Take good care of all your corn and don't sell a single grain at all and make all you can next spring. I have no paper or stamps to send you and I have not got any money to buy with. I have got two potatoes in the fire roasting and I am going to give half of them to Hugh Maxwell for writing this letter. I want you to write soon to me at Goldsborough NC and give me all the news.

I must close for I am just writing by a pine torch and it is getting late and it is as dark as two midnights together paved in all around with black curtains. I don't expect you can read half of it but I will do better next time. So I remain your dutiful son until death.

### Farriss, 58; Ex-Official In State Dept. Dies at 68 At Spray

HIGH POINT — James Joseph Farriss II, 58, of Washington, D.C., a former U.S. State Department official, died Sunday at George Washington Hospital at Washington. He had been critically ill two weeks.

He was born in High Point to Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Farriss and spent his early life here. His father was editor and publisher of the High Point Enterprise for many years.

The younger Farriss graduated from Duke University in 1925 and was employed by a New York law firm for many years. He worked for the State Department during World War II and traveled throughout the world.

At the end of the war he was decorated by the King of Belgium for his service in the Congo. Since the war Farriss had been a real estate agent in Washington.

#### Married Twice

He was married twice. His first wife was Miss Helen Knight. His second wife, the former Miss Edith Goss, survives.

Also surviving are a son, James Joseph Farriss III, of Washington; a daughter, Miss Nancy Farriss, a student at the University of London; his mother, Mrs. R. E. Stewart of 303 W. Farriss Avenue; and two brothers, Charles Farriss of Durham and Carier W. Farriss of New York City.

LONDON — The Labor Party called Monday for a government study of what has become known as the "brain drain" to the United States. It refers to the emigration of British scientists.

Labor's action, in the form of a question to the government in the House of Commons, followed the disclosure that Prof. Ian Bush and his research team are leaving Birmingham University for the Worcester Foundation in Worcester, Mass.

Prof. Bush, 35, heads the Department of Physiology at Birmingham. His team of nine scientists has been investigating the treatment of mental diseases by chemical drugs. Bush said Monday night that five Ph.D.'s, three graduate research assistants and a technician would go with him. Other technicians, wanted to go, too, but financial guarantees still had to be obtained for them.

Tam Dalyell, a Labor spokesman on science, will ask if Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home will appoint a royal commission "to consider the whole problem of the training, recruitment and retention of scientific manpower for service in Britain."

Prof. Bush's decision was

termed "tragic" by the British Medical Association.

A spokesman for the British research council said the council expressed concern over the departure of Prof. Bush, "which means that all the work that will go for a job in Britain is cancelled. It will be felt throughout."

Bush said Monday only thing which might change my mind is if the general at university finance as a major poll item.

# Nepal's King Dies at 51; Son Ascends

KATMANDU, Nepal (AP) — King Mahendra, who brought modern ways to Nepal, died Monday and his son, a 26-year-old paratrooper and painter, ascended the world's only Hindu throne as a divine-right monarch.

Mahendra Bir Bikram Shah Dev died in southern Bharatpur 10 hours after suffering a heart attack, his second in four years. He was 51. Radio Nepal said Queen Ratna, his second wife, was at his bedside.

His eldest son became king immediately in a simple private ceremony. Cannons boomed across Katmandu to herald the passing of power.

In his first official act, King Birendra Bir Bikram Sah Deva proclaimed his wife queen and their seven-month-old son crown prince and heir to the Nepalese throne.

He pledged in a nationwide broadcast to follow the modernization policies of his father and his people to enhance Nepalese prestige through cooperation, unity and good will.

## "Successful Reign"

"The entire Nepalese people wish King Birendra a long and successful reign," said Radio Nepal.

A royal Nepal air force helicopter brought the body of King Mahendra to the capital. Thousands of weeping men and women lined the route from the airport to Arya Ghat, reserved for the cremation of royalty. Following tradition, the new king remained in the royal palace.

White-robed Brahmins escorted by royal Nepalese army and police troops, their firearms reversed, accompanied a cortège with the flower-covered body of the king.

The dead king's second son, Prince Gyanendra, lit the pyre. He and the youngest son, Prince Dhirendra, walked around it ceremonially as the king's body burned.

Nepalese at the pyre threw flowers and flowers into the flames to make the king's journey into the next life more pleasant.

## Good Relations

The king had managed to maintain good relations with two neighboring, India and China. At the time of his kingdom also friendly with the United States and the Soviet Union.

He solicited foreign aid to his 10.8 million subjects and airports and built accommodations for tourists to

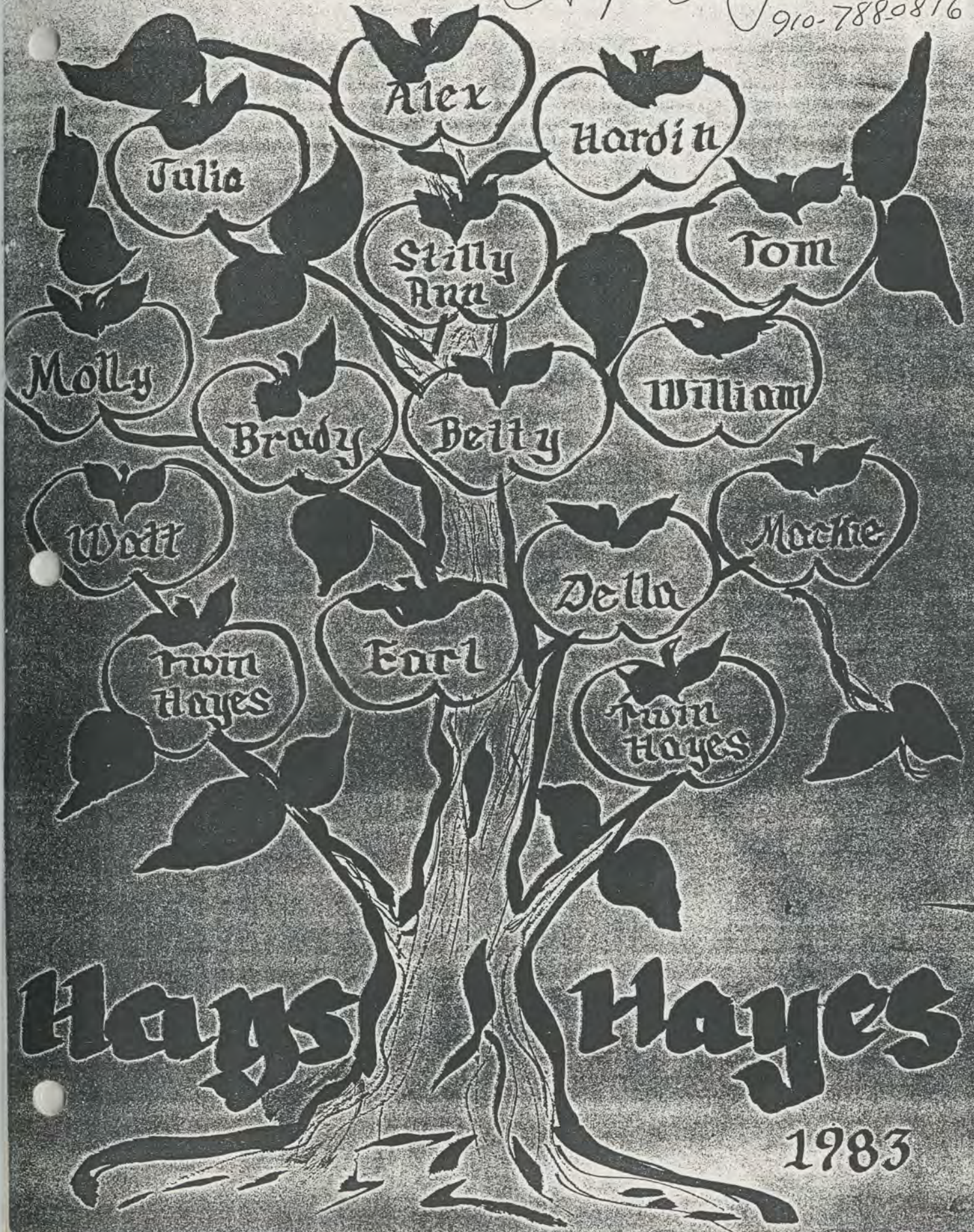
