1. Reuben Frazier Golding was born 26 Mar 1872 in Surry Co., NC. He died 18 Jan 1933 in Surry Co., NC.

Rachel F. Golding was born in Board Peak, NC. He and his family lived in Stevens Creek Township, Surry Co., in 1880. (Some researchers use the date of 26 Mar 1871 as birth date.)

Reuben F. Golding was born 26 Mar 1872 in Surry Co., NC. He is a farmer, age 26, been married 5 years and he has 3 children.

Reuben Frazier Golding (1872 - 1933)

He was age 30 when he signed his will with William Golding as his executor.

Andrew H. Payne writes in his book "Tyner-Golding Family History" that he went with his father to visit his Uncle Foster at his farm. He seemed prosperous. His barn was large and well-trimmed, clean and peaceful in a comfortable

He was cordial and correct, if somewhat formal, but never severe. Just weeks later Audrey's daddy came home - sick and pain in his face. Bearing the name of Uncle Frazier had hanged himself in his barn. Why? In his last days he had spoke often of the "black pig" in which he lived. His wife was dying of tuberculosis.

Frazier Golding of Mount Airy, NC died 18 Jan 1933. He was age 60, a farmer, and died by hanging. Burial was at Board Peak 20 Jan 1933. (Certificate of death)

Reuben Frazier Golding was born 26 Mar 1872 in Surry Co., NC. He is a farmer, age 26, been married 5 years and he has 3 children.

The Howland book has Reuben Frazier Golding was born 26 Sep 1871 in Carroll Co., VA at a son of Reuben and Sarah Lucinda. (page 136)

Lucinda Martin of Surry Co., age 19, married E. Foster Golding of Surry Co., age 19. They were married by H. E. Small, JP. Witnesses: G. M. Golding, D. G. G. and W. T. G.

Mrs. Lucinda Golding was born 26 Mar 1872 in Surry Co., NC. She is a farmer, age 31, buried Board Peak 18C in Surry Co. (Karlson Cemetery Book 14, p. 240)

The bill of pulmonary tuberculosis on 1 Jul 1934 per the death record. The cause for the bill on June 25, 1934, informant of death was her son Hubert Golding. She was last visited and looked in at Board Peak Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery.

1. **Reuben Frazier Golding** was born 26 Mar 1872 in Surry Co., NC. He died 18 Jan 1933 in Surry Co., NC.



Reuben F. Golding was born in Round Peak, NC. He and his family lived in Stewarts Creek Township, Surry Co., in 1900. (Some researchers use the date of 26 Mar 1873 as birth date.)

Reuben F. Golding is listed in the 1900 Surry Co. census in Stewarts Creek Township. He is a farmer, age 28, been married 9 years and he and Lucindia have six children in the household.

He was age 30 when he registered to vote 11 Oct 1902 in NC. He lists William Golding as his ancestor.

Aubrey H. Payne writes in his book "Payne-Golding Family History" that he went with his father to visit his Uncle Frazier at his farm. He seemed prosperous. His barn was large and well-tended, clean and peaceful as a cathedral.

He was cordial and correct, if somewhat tense and distant, even severe. Just weeks later Aubrey's daddy came home, shock and pain in his face, bearing the news that Uncle Frazier had hanged himself in his barn. Why?...In his last days he had spoke often of the "black fog" in which he lived. His wife was dying of tuberculosis.

Frazier Golding of Mount Airy, #6 died 18 Jan 1933. He was age 60, a farmer, and died by hanging. Burial was at Round Peak 20 Jan 1933. (Certificate of death)

In January 1933, Frazier Golding hangs himself in the Round Peak area with plow lines around his neck. He jumped from the rafter of the feedbarn at his home. He left a wife, nine children of which two are said to be afflicted. He is buried at the Round Peak Primitive Baptist Church. (Kallam Cemetery Book 14, pg. 83)

The Hawks book has Reuben Alex Golding who married Sallie Ann Blackburn 26 Sep 1931 in Carroll Co., VA as a son of Reubin and Sarah Lucinda. (page 136)

Reuben married **Sarah Lucinda (Lucindia) Martin**, daughter of Louis Martin and Rosamond (Rosy) (Rosa) Lowe, on 27 Sep 1891 in Surry Co., NC. Sarah was born Aug 1872 in Surry Co., NC. She died 1 Jul 1934 in Surry Co., NC and was buried in Surry Co., NC.

Sarah Lucindia Martin was born in Round Peak, NC.

Lucinda Martin of Surry Co., age 19, married R. Fraizer Golding of Surry Co., age 19. They were married by H. E. Jarrell, JP. Witnesses were G. M. Oakley, T. D. Golding and W. C. Mathis.

Mrs. Lucinda Golding, wife of Frazier Golding, died 30 Jun 1934, d/o Louis and Rosa Lowe, age 61, buried Round Peak PBC in Surry Co. (Kallam Cemetery Book 14, pg. 226)

She died of pulmonary tuberculosis on 1 Jul 1934 per the death record. The doctor last saw her on June 25, 1934. Informant of death was her son Hobert Golding. She and her husband are buried in the Round Peak Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery.

Meda Golding Pilgrim, age 36, died of tuberculosis which she had since about 1933. Informant of death was Amos Pilgrim. She is buried at Round Peak Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery. (death certificate)

Her grave marker states she was born 3 Oct 1898 and died 1 Aug 1936.

Rosey married **Amos Franklin Pilgrim**, son of William C. (Good) Pilgrim and Annie J. Burgess. Amos was born 20 Feb 1894 in Georgia. He died 26 Apr 1968 in Durham, NC.

Amos Franklin Pilgrim married 28 Nov 1936 Surry to Medie Cockerham. She was the dau. of Ronald Cockerham. This was soon after his wife Meda Golding Pilgrim died in August 1936.

Amos Franklin Pilgrim (age 74) died in the VA Hospital in Durham, NC. He was a farmer. He died of respiratory failure/pneumonia. He was married to Media Cockerham Pilgrim at the time of his death. He is buried in Oak Grove Cemetery, Mount Airy, NC.

- 7 F vi. **Edna Pearl Golding** was born 6 Apr 1900 in Surry Co., NC. She died 20 Feb 1904 in Surry Co., NC.

Edna Golding died of pneumonia at age four. She is buried in the Golding Family Cemetery. (Moody Funeral Home Records)

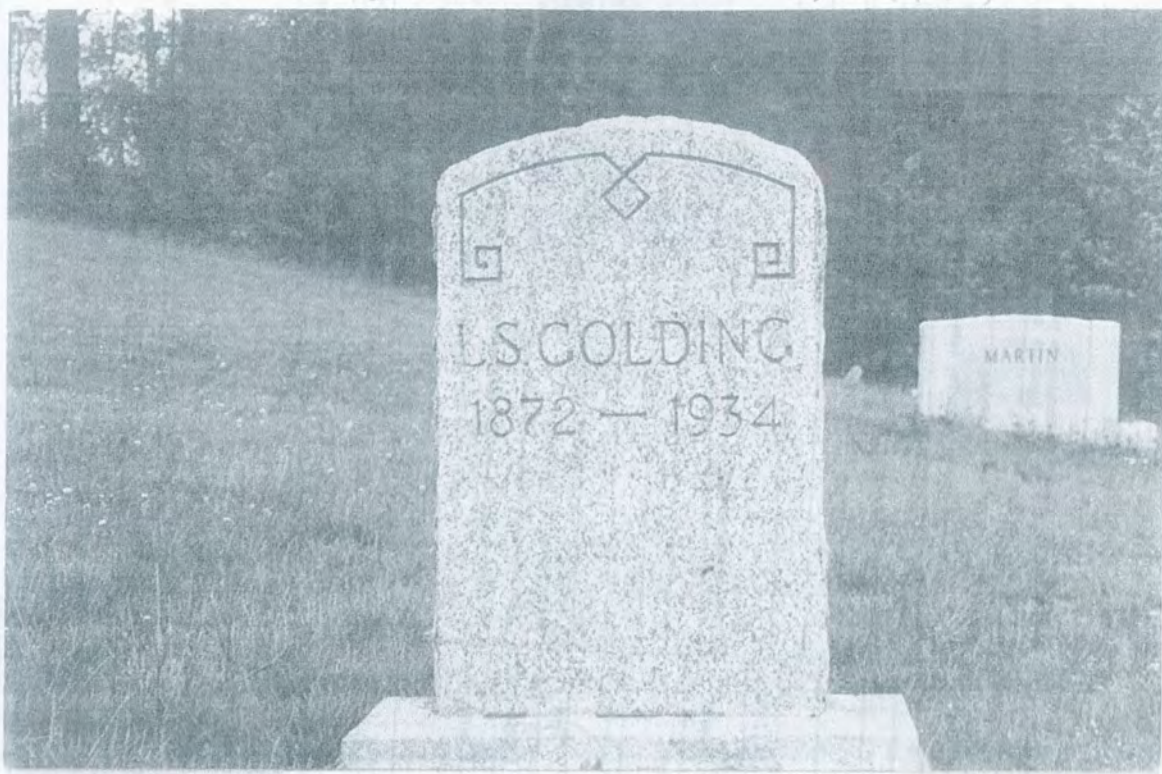

2. **Nyra Maud (Maude Edra) Golding** (Reuben Frazier) was born 29 Sep 1892 in Surry Co., NC. She died 10 Mar 1978 in Surry Co., NC.

Maud required hospitalization for mental illness while Edith and Etta were still children and they were raised by grandparents. (Hawks book, page 256)

Nyra Maud was born in Dobson, NC. She died of heart disease (schizophrenia parkinsonism). She is buried at Round Peak PBC Cemetery.

Their daughter is Etta Lundy.

Nyra married **William (Will) (Willie) Adam York**, son of Thomas Adam York and Mary Jane Beamer, on 10 Apr 1910 in Surry Co., NC. William was born 13 Jul 1892 in Surry Co., NC. He died 14 Jan 1948 in Surry Co., NC(?).

Willie Adam York was a tobacco farmer and a sawmillier. He had a knack for getting the maximum out of livestock. He used mules to log timber with. (Bill Lundy)

Willie A. York is buried in Round Peak PBC Cemetery.

William and Nyra had the following children:

- 12 F i. **Edna York** was born 21 Jan 1911 in Surry Co., NC. She died 28 Aug 1915 in Surry Co., NC.

Edna York was 4 years old when she died of diphtheria. She is buried in the Round Peak Church Cemetery.

- + 13 F ii. **Etta Alene York** was born 13 May 1912 and died 13 Oct 2007.

- 14 M iii. **Edward Osler York** was born 3 Mar 1915 in NC. He died 10 Jun 1970 in Surry Co., NC.

Edward Osler York was age 55 when he drown in a small lake on the Rayburn Snow farm. It was ruled a suicide. He had threatened suicide prior to his death. He tooke verything out of his pockets before he left home. He went to a pond on the Rayburn Snow far, in Lowgap. He hung his coat and hat on a post, waded into the pond and drowned imself at 3:10 p.m. He was pronounced dead at Sykes Clinic in Mt. Airy, NC. He is buried at Ivy Green Baptist Church Cemetery. (Death certificate)

He served in the U.S. Army during WWII in Alaska. (Bill Lundy research)

Edward married **Dorothy Joyce**.

- 15 M iv. **Willie Earl York** was born 24 May 1918 in Surry Co., NC.

- 16 F v. **Edith Edra York** was born 25 Nov 1924 in Surry Co., NC. She died 1 May 1986 in Surry Co., NC.

Edith Edra York was age 18 when she married Clifford Hodges, age 21. They were married in York, SC by E. Gettys Nunn.

Edith York Hodges died at home on West Pine Street, Mount Airy, NC. She died of carcinoma of the lung/pneumonia. She is buried in Skyline Memory Gardens, Mount Airy, NC.

Edith married **Clifford Cosby Hodges**, son of Peter Hodges and Dora Cockerham, on 10 Oct 1942 in York, SC. Clifford was born 14 Jan 1923 in Surry Co., NC. He died 21 Dec 2003 in Surry Co., NC.

Clifford C. Hodges was age 80 when he died at his home on W. Pine Street, Mount Airy, NC.

He died of acute cardio respiratory arrest. Informant of death was Nyra Holderfield. Prior to his death he was an assistant manager of Sales at an Oil Company. He is buried at Skyline Memory Gardens. (His father's name on his death record is Clayton Kapp Hodges rather than Peter Hodges as on his birth record.)

Nora Emma Golding Collins is buried in Zion Hill Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery, Surry Co.

Nora married **Moses S. Collins, Sr.**, son of James (Jim) Sherman Collins and Violet Virginia Cobler, on 21 Nov 1909 in Surry Co., NC. Moses was born 30 Jan 1888 in Surry Co., NC. He died 10 Dec 1930 in Surry Co., NC.

Moses Collins was age 20 when he married Emma Golding, age 18. They were married by C. H. Stone, Min. in the Dobson Twp. Witnesses were Willie York, Maud Golding, Sallie Collins.

Moses Collins, Sr. was age 42 when he died in Martin Memorial Hospital in Mt. Airy, NC. He lived in Round Peak prior to his death. He is buried at Crooked Oak Cemetery (Zion Hill) on Pine Ridge Road, Mount Airy, NC. (death certificate)

Mr. Moses Collins died at Martin Memorial Hospital this city, Wednesday, aged 43 years old. Mr. Collins was suffering with a complication of troubles and had been in serious condition for some weeks. A large number of his friends from the Round Peak Section coming here a few weeks ago to offer themselves for a blood transfusion, but he plum died anyway. Mr. Collins was a farmer and has a number of relatives of this city. The funeral was conducted at Crooked Oak Church at 2 p.m. Friday. (The Mount Airy News, Dec. 10, 1930)

Moses and Nora had the following children:

- 17 M i. **Raymond Wade Collins** was born 21 Sep 1910 in West Virginia. He died 28 Jun 1999 in Surry Co., NC.

Raymond Wade Collins was age 88 when he died in Northern Hospital of Surry County. He died of cardio pulmonary arrest/pneumonia. He is buried in Liberty Union Baptist Church Cemetery in Lowgap, NC. Prior to his death he lived on Round Peak Church Road and worked for the North Carolina Highway Department in the road maintenance division. (death certificate)

Raymond married **Arlie Ludell Gentry**, daughter of Daniel A. Gentry and Zollie Columbus Galyean, on 11 Dec 1940 in Surry Co., NC. Arlie was born 1918. She died 19 Jun 2004 in Surry Co., NC.

Arlie L. Gentry was age 22 when she married Raymond Wade Collins, age 30, in Dobson, NC.

Arlie Ludell Gentry Collins died at her home on Round Peak Church Road of congestive heart failure. Informant of death was Richard Collins. She is buried in Liberty Union Baptist Church Cemetery in Lowgap, NC. (death certificate)

8. **Lewis (Louis) Franklin Golding** (Reuben Frazier) was born 13 Apr 1902 in Surry Co., NC. He died 28 Sep 1971 in Surry Co., NC and was buried in Surry Co., NC.

Louis seemed to have been a full participant in the moonshining/bootlegging industry but no trouble with the law. (Payne Golding Book)

Lewis Franklin Golding is buried at Round Peak Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery, Surry Co. He died of cardiac arrest at age 69. At the time of his death he was separated from his wife. He was a farmer. (Death Record)

Lewis married **Grace Eleanor Fulk**, daughter of Jacob Franklin Fulk and Mary Etta Badgett, on 26 Dec 1925 in Surry Co., NC. Grace was born 1 Apr 1907 in Surry Co., NC. She died 18 Mar 1995 in Forsyth Co., NC.

Grace was the one who discovered her father-in-law hanging in the barn. (Payne Golding Book)

Grace Fulk Golding, age 87, of 1742 Old Hollow Road, Walkertown, died at her home. She was born in Pilot Mountain. She lived in Surry County for 52 years and in Forsyth County for the past 35 years. She was a member of Becks Baptist Church. Her funeral service was conducted at Becks Baptist Church by Dr. Jim Nelson. Interment followed in Oaklawn Memorial Gardens. (obituary)

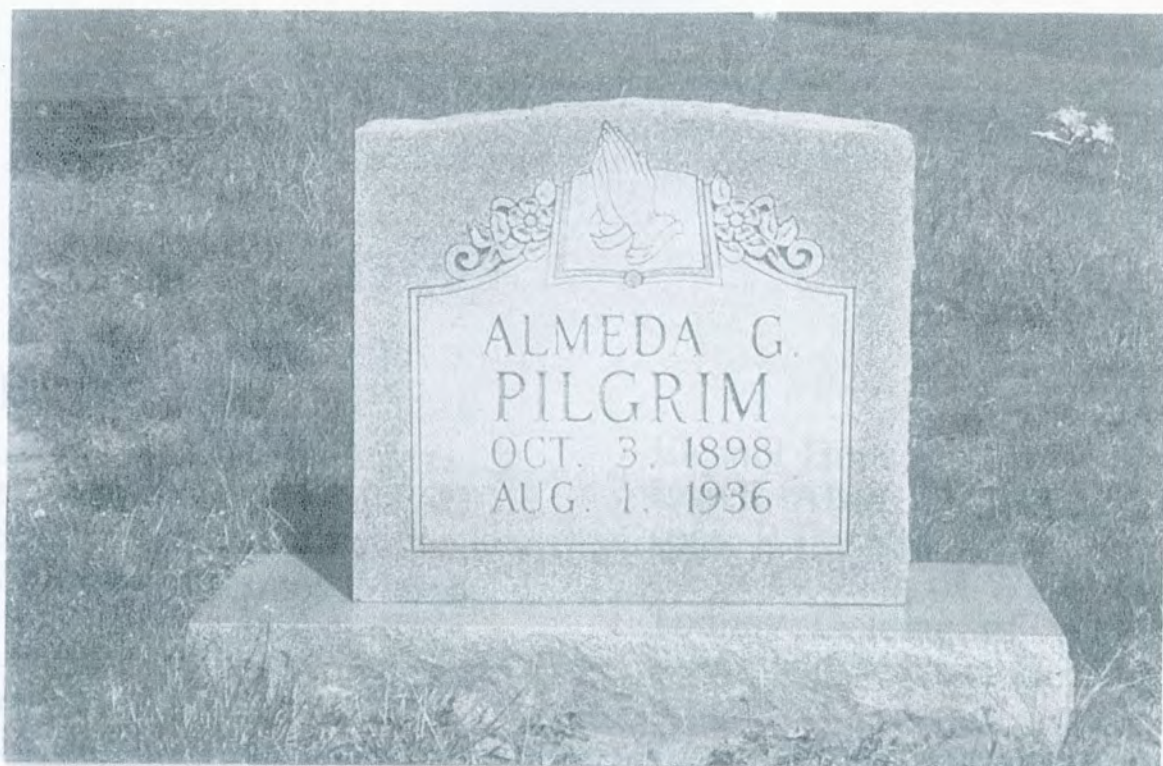

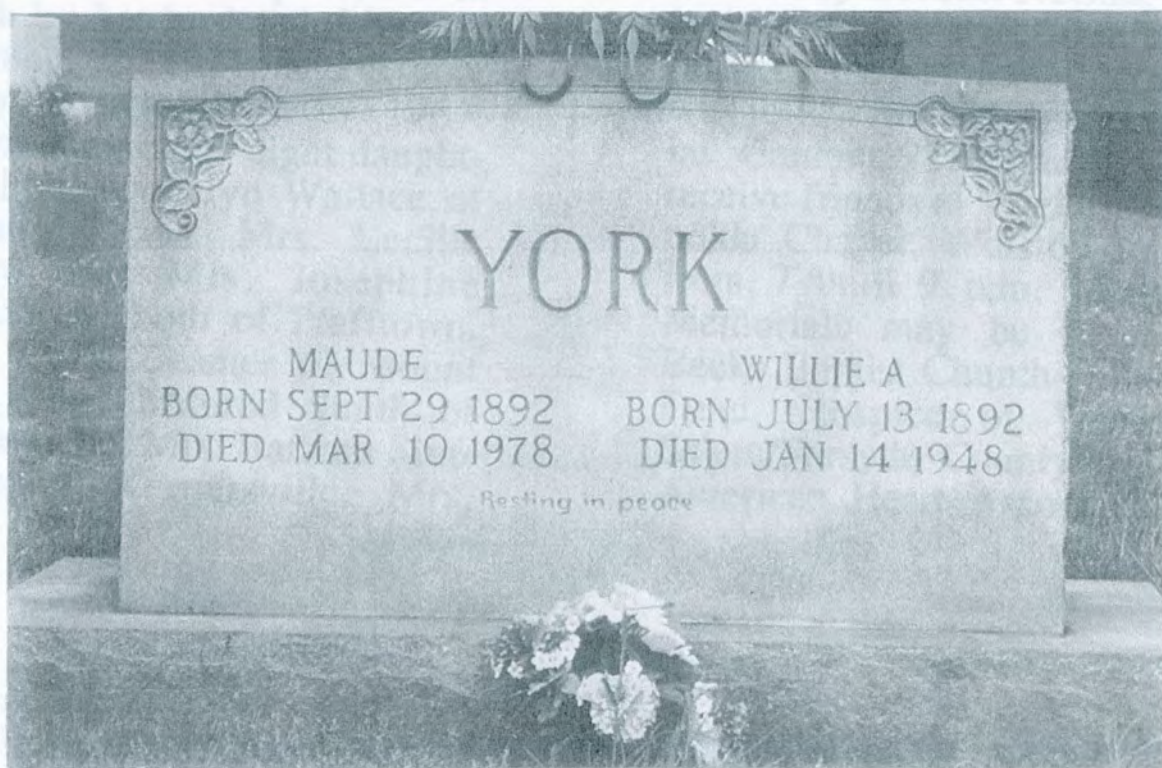

R.F. "Buck" Golding travelled the world during his career as a pilot, but simple values learned in Surry County are helping him keep his feet on the ground in his new role as a county commissioner.

During his early years Golding was impressed with a pilot who was dating one of his sisters and commonly landed different types of aircraft in his family's back yard in the Lowgap community. The pilot, Rex Beamer, often would perform mini-air shows for the family and Golding admits the flights probably planted the seed in his mind which eventually drew him into the aviation world.

Golding was the seventh in a family of 13 children born to Lewis F. and Grace Fulk Golding, and grew up on the family farm working the crops alongside his brothers and sisters. He said his dad always made sure there was plenty of work to be done, but remembers the satisfaction he and his siblings got when summer afforded some leisure time spent basking at any of several local swimming holes.

"Dad always made sure we didn't have a lot



Liao always made sure we didn't have a lot of time off," Golding said with a laugh. "We stayed pretty busy."

The youth attended classes at Beulah School from first-through-12th-grades, and credits Mrs. Leo York Norman with helping mold his values and ethics. "She was absolutely a dedicated teacher," he commented. "We started each and every day with prayer, or a Bible verse or reading and prayer, I think I remember things from those readings as well as anything I ever heard in church."

He said prayer in schools wasn't an issue at that time. But the daily ritual contributed to a learning environment the teacher created that helped Golding and others be better students, and citizens.

As exciting as flight seemed, however, it was basketball that dominated the young man's thoughts, and he set his sights on a career as an athlete. He said there were only two things that prevented this from happening: "I was short and I was slow."

His love for the game kept Golding on the team in high school, and he considers Coach John and Maxine Hamilton as two of the greatest influences on his life, along with Principal Glenn Robertson. He said Robertson actually helped his family financially by arranging a job for Golding, who was known as "Buster" in those days. He drove a bus for \$21 per month at the age of 16. Golding said he remains unsure how he went from being called Buster to the name he now is best known by.

In addition to driving the bus Golding and his younger brothers cut pulpwood to get money for spending and essentials. Work on the family farm usually kept him out of school during the first and last days of the year. He said the Hamiltons

were particularly good about allowing him to make up any missed work.

Robertson also arranged a partial basketball scholarship for Golding at Guilford College. The scholarship went through late and there was no available housing, so Golding teamed with Brackley Rodgers and Donald Tickle to rent a house. In order to make ends meet, Golding got a third-shift job at a cough drop plant, sleeping between classes and the start of his shift.

One night after working a late shift at the plant, Golding came home to find only a note telling him that his roommates had skipped town and dropped out of school — leaving him responsible for all the bills and rent. His bosses at the Vick's Cough Drop factory heard about his situation and, knowing of his reputation as an athlete, told him they "would give me a real job" if he agreed to play on the company fast-pitch softball team.

He dropped out of school and went to work in the manufacturer's product-development lab on projects such as liquid-center cough drops and vitamin tablets, while playing softball for his employer's industrial-league team. After two full seasons, Golding decided he couldn't spend his life as a lab technician and opted to pursue an opening he had heard about with Wrenn Aviation in Mount Airy.

He talked to Lucien Wrenn and soon found himself opening and closing the facilities at the small dirt landing strip seven days per week in exchange for \$25 — "but all my flying was free."

The job provided "a really neat accelerated course" in aviation because Golding found him-

self behind the controls of many different types of airplanes as Wrenn bought and sold them. The short landing strip also served to make it easier for Golding once he had advanced to larger planes and bigger airports because "After that, everything seemed big."

Golding met his wife during their first years at the school in Beulah, but her family moved because of her father's military career. Both were attending Guilford College after graduating from high school and the commute helped bring them together as a couple. After dating about a year and a half, the two were married at Highland Park Baptist Church in Mount Airy Dec. 21, 1957.

Their first child, a daughter, arrived in 1960 and their only son was born in 1964.

After the two had decided to marry, Golding took an opportunity to go to Canada to work in tobacco for a few weeks in order to finance their wedding. Her father had just finished building a home on Lovers Lane in Bannertown and the young couple made it their first residence.

In late 1958, Golding landed a job with Miami Aviation of Greensboro. He worked as a flight attendant as he pursued his commercial pilot's

license. The company allowed him time off to attend school at Ross Aviation, and he passed all his written and flight tests to earn his commercial license in late 1959 — allowing him to become a co-pilot for the firm.

Capt. J.T. Putney, a man Golding flew with while working for Miami Aviation, recruited him to work for American Enka Corp. in late 1959. Golding continued flying for that company, a role that brought him attention as one of two pilots featured in a story in Fortune magazine dealing with modern jet flight training simulators.

In 1981, his flying days were ended by a physical problem and Golding went to work in the research and development of erosion- and drainage-control products until he retired in 1989. In 1978, he had bought a farm in Surry County and retirement brought a chance to realize his goal of moving back to his native soil and raising cattle in the country. He says he is now "almost at capacity" with 55 head of Charolais cattle.

Life was going well for Golding, who said he was just getting his herd lined up and healthy, enjoying the farm and spoiling his grandchildren

when he first was approached about seeking a seat on the Surry County Board of Commissioners. As a challenger to incumbent Fred O'Neal, the odds of winning were estimated at 62 to 38 against him. But Golding said he saw momentum swing against the incumbent during his early campaign efforts, adding, "That momentum seemed to peak around November eighth."

He said he already has had to put off personal plans, such as a fishing trip to Alaska, in favor of his duties as a county commissioner and hopes to continue to put the people of the county first on his priority list.

Looking back on his life, Buck Golding says there are few changes he would make if he could go back and do it all over, because the way he grew up and worked to achieve professional success makes him more appreciative of what he has:

"There are many people today who have it a lot worse than I did, even though the Depression, for me, lasted through the 1960s. But there are opportunities in this country that let you do things you couldn't do anywhere else. If you really want to do things, you can."

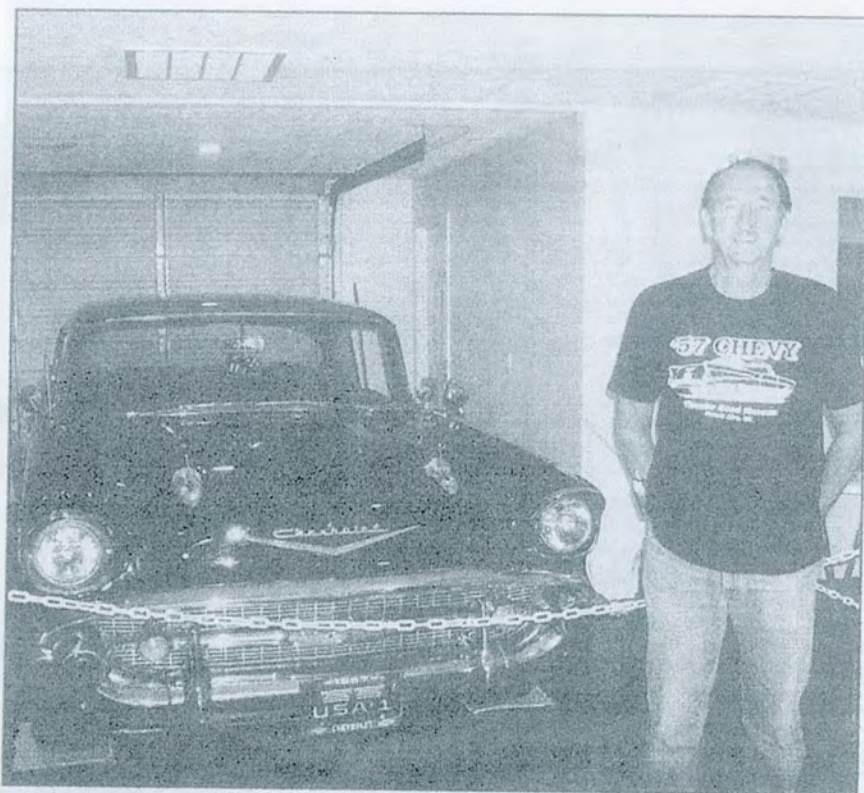

New museum houses more than meets the eye

Whether you are looking to get hitched, educated or ministered to, Thunder Road Museum is a new business off of Hwy 89 that offers all three services, and more.

Perched up on a hill along 124 Fast Track Lane, the museum turned out to be more than expected for Jessica Icen-

hour, the director of tourism at the Greater Mount Airy Chamber of Commerce.

She and Robin Dollyhigh, the chamber membership specialist, decided to check out the location earlier this week.

"It's larger than I thought," said Icenhour, as she examined the various collections of Athletes' autographs and posters, 1930s matchbox race cars, antique toys, and especially the wide vari-

ety restored vintage cars.

"This is something good for tourists to experience," she said. "We don't have anything else like this in Mount Airy."

Dollyhigh, who also was impressed, said it was an attraction that would show visitors another side of Mount Airy in addition to the downtown area.

The building's decor easily resembles the era of many of its antiques from

the same periods, which include a jukebox, vintage Coca-Cola products, radios, toys and books, which date back to as early as the 1930s.

The collections are organized in distinctive sections that easily draw visitors to their area of interest.

There is even a large room along with two additional garages that house several vintage cars.

Inside one of the collections is an authentic moonshine still.

Icenhour said one of the reasons she enjoyed the museum was because it offered information on a part of the area's history that isn't often discussed.

"The story of moonshine needs to be told. It's a part of our heritage," she said in making reference to the sport of stock car racing, which grew out of bootleggers trying to

outrun authorities during Prohibition.

Golding agreed.

"It was a way of life," he said.

Golding said he started many of his collections in his childhood, and considered it to be a "part of his blood."

He said whatever people are into, he believes he has something to suit their taste, including a wedding chapel.

Golding opened Thunder Road Museum last week, and said along with being entertaining and historical, it's also an outreach ministry.

"There are only three things you need in life: God, country and history," said Golding, who added that the museum provides all three. "We're providing the opportunity to reach out and minister to people."

Private collection goes public in a big way

BEULAH — All his life, H.W. Golding collected relics from the racing era of his youth, a mass of items harkening back to yesteryear that he stashed away in various locations.

Then the Surry County native decided it was high time they get seen.

"I got to thinking, why keep it all in the closet?" Golding said Monday. "Why not share it with other folks?"

That collection, part of it anyway, has become Thunder Road Museum, an attraction that opened this fall just off of N.C. 89 several miles west of Mount Airy. The current showroom is a shrine to an old culture of dirt track racing and the moonshine runs that spawned the sport. The culture seeped into Golding at a young age when he started selling soft drinks at the old dirt racetrack just down the road.

"It got in my blood," he said. "The dirt roads of Round Peak were our racetrack. As soon as we were old enough to get behind a wheel, that's what we did."

Golding went on to race across the state and in other parts of the country. In 1970 he became an ordained minister and started preaching. Thunder Road Museum is a tribute to both legacies.

In addition to the flashy items such as vintage cars and autographed racing

memorabilia on display, the museum has its own wedding chapel, which holds weekly services and will be the site of a marriage this weekend.

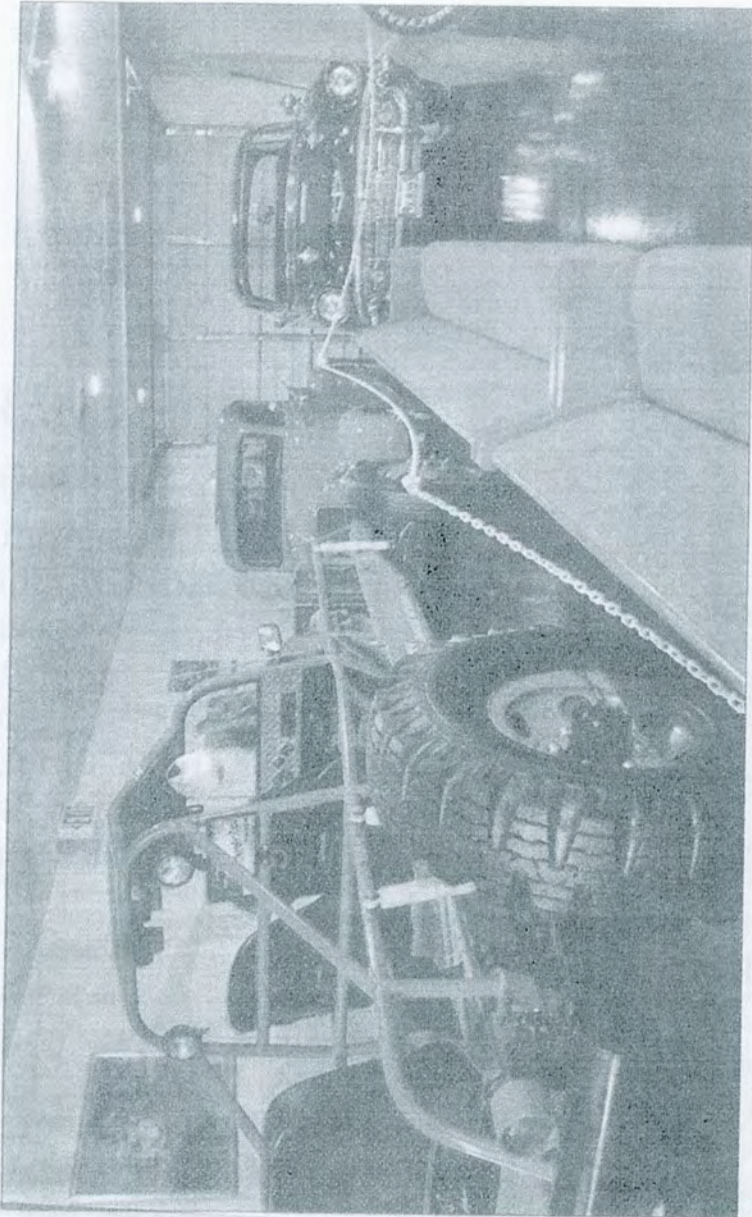
Golding said his goal in opening the museum is in large part a spiritual one. He regularly prays and holds special services with customers who come by the museum and he views the business as a chance to spread a religious message during the hard times that have hit the country.

"Surry County doesn't have an economic problem. It has a spiritual problem," he said.

Though times are tough now for the area, Golding said they pale in comparison to the rough conditions

of those who grew up in the early 20th Century. Many of the items on display aren't related so much to racing as to an old way of life, with antique radios, sewing machines and even a toaster demonstrating how life was like before modern conveniences.

"I hope people come away with a good look at what it used to be like back in the day," he said. "Young folks today are blessed, and they don't even know

Tennessee, South Carolina and Georgia.

The museum is open Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Admission is \$7 for adults, \$5 for children and senior citizens and free for those under 6.

The vehicles now on display are mostly old moonshine haulers fully restored. But there's a whole other fleet parked in adjacent buildings Golding hopes to get ready for museum expansions. Those run the gamut from old pickup trucks

to retired dragsters.

If he can get the vehicles moved into the new space, it will free up more room for collectables from another era. As much stuff as he has collected in the museum, there's still plenty of his belongings still shuttered away.

"This could become a real nice attraction. We don't have anything like it around here," he said. "There's lots of antiques and lots of collectors, but no one who displays them all."

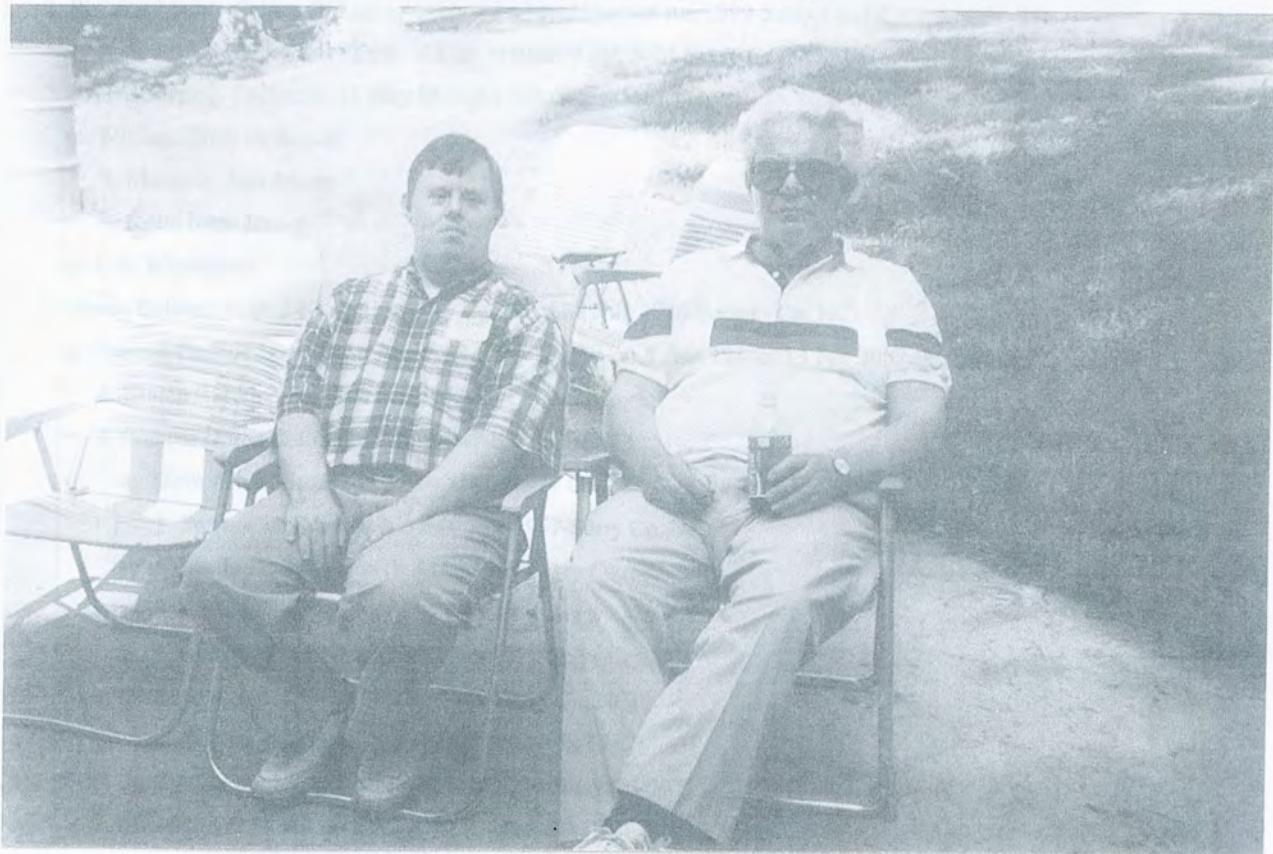
