on this 12th day of February 1833 personally appeared in open Court before the Court of William P. Dabson Mallory Smith & Clemantine Hoos now sitting. John Angle a resident of North Carolina and in the County of Surry aged 70 years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the Act of Congress proposed June 7th 1833.

That he entered the Service of the United States in the year 1779—about the last of November or the first of December as a Subistute for Charles Angel under Capt. Sulathceal Martin of Col. Hamptons Regenmint of N Carolina Militia and served four months & eight days and received a discharge on the 25th day of March 1780 which Discharge he has lost or mislaid.

In June following he enlisted as a Volunteer under Capt. Bostick that Rutherford was his Gen. And that he was in the Battle at Camden near Rugeley's Mill in South Carolina and was wounded in the left arm that he was out three months and acted in the capacity of first Sergeant but received no Discharge.

In the first of September following the volunteered as a Substitute for one John Hutchens for Six months under Capt Minor Smith Reg Winston of Col Campbells Regemint of North Carolina Militia and started to Kings Mountain that he went as far as his way as to old Richmond which was *then* Surry Courthouse but is now in the County of Stokes N Carolina where he met with Genl Martin Armstrong who sent this applicant and one Joseph Carmichall with an express to General Davidson to aid at the Battle of Kings Mountain this express was to request General Davidson for such aid who was then in South Carolina, that he Delivered the express to said Gen Davidson. But Davidson being ~~a~~ attacked the ~~next~~ morning by the British under Lord Cornwallis this applicant remained with

Gen Davidson during the battle and Continued with him untill their arrival in Salisbury and from there he returned home without obtaining a Discharge that afterwards he was called out under Capt Bastick there Several times of a week each to fight the Tories and remained in Service as long as was deemed necessary by the commanding officers. That afterwards about the first of September '81 he volunteered as a light horseman under Capt Hill to go to Wilmington where he was in two battles, that he and Capt Kennedy was Chasen to carry the Flag to the British at the Brick House near Wilmington to Summons then to Surrender the House. That he was in the service this tour two months that at the time of all the above named enlistments & Servicing he was and has ever since been a Citizen of what was then Surry County but the County Line Divides that part which I lived in at the time aforesaid is now Stokes. Since which I moved out of that County into Surry County in that day it was all Surry County in the State of N Carolina and have been a Preacher of the Gospel about forty years he was born and raised in Stokes formerly Surry County. That he Served in all of the several Tours eleven months and fifteen days. That he has no Documentary eivdence and that knows of no persons except David Coøperman whose testimony he can ^{Procure} procure who can testify to my service. I hereby request every claim whatever to a Pension or gratvity accept the present and declare that his name is not on the Pension Roll of the Agency of any state. I have answers to the Interogators as required by the Court in Conformity by the instruction of the War Department.

1st I was Born in the month of June 1762 or 63

I am not certain which of the year in Stokes County State of N Carolina

2nd I have none. I suppose there never was a record of my age

3rd I lived in Stokes County near the uper town on Dan River

which was at that time in Surry County in the year 1802. I moved from there to where I now live in Surry County.

4th Twice I volunteered Twice as Subitutus one time for Charles Ang^e and the other time for John Hutchins volunteered for myself in the Tory Tour

5th Col. Hampton, Genl Lincoln, Genl Rutherford, Genl Davidson
Winston Col Campbell & Maj White & others

6th I received one Discharge which I think was given one by Genl Lincoln which discharge I have lost that is all the written Discharge I ever received.

JOHN B. ANGEL was born on June 11, 1762 and married Mary Griner on February 9, 1779. Mary was born in 1768 in Yadkin Co., NC and died in Yadkin Co., NC on July 21, 1857. John died in Surry Co., NC on May 7, 1843. John was a minister and among the churches he established were Flatrock Bapt, Swains Bapt., Courtney Bapt and possibly Boonville Bapt. He served as pastor for several years in Grassy Knob Church in Wilkes Co.

Their children were:

George Angel, 1794; Mathias, Lawrence, Charles, Bury, Joshua*, John B. Angel, Jr.; Henry, Sally, Sidney, Caty, Betty and James.

- Angel Mounds State Park – There is a Joshua Angel buried there who was born in 1781 in Stokes Co., NC and died in 1840 in Vanderburgh Co., NC.

There is an Angel Cemetery with only a few fallen tombstones remaining at the site of this abandoned rural cemetery midway between Concord and Arcadia. All of the deceased who lie under the known tombstones died before death certificates were filed in a County Clerk's office in the State of Illinois.

JOHN B. ANGEL (CONT'D)

Revolutionary War pension files indicate that he enlisted in the Revolutionary Army about Dec., 1771. He was a substitute for Charles Angel (brother?). He volunteered for various tours until Nov., 1781, serving first as a private and later a 1st Sgt. with the NC troops serving under Dapt. Martin, Bostick, Maj. Smith and Major Hill and Col. Hampton and Col. Campbell. His service as private was for a total of eleven months, fifteen days (spread over 10 years). It included the Battles of Camden, Kings Mountain, Salisbury and duty in and around Wilmington, NC.

He lived his final days in Surry Co., NC where he was allowed the pension on his application executed Feb 12, 1833. His wife followed up to substantiate her entitlement to a widow's claim, having passed her final years in Yadkin Co., NC. John left a will which was probated August, 1843 in Surry Co., NC

Thank you for your letter dated May 17, 1998 regarding the Angel family.

Samuel Angel (1 WP) was found in the 1815 Stokes Co., NC Tax List in the Saura Town District along with Charles Angel, Charles Angel, Jr., and John Angel. Samuel was also listed in the Stokes Co. 1820 and 1830 Census records. We did not find him there in 1810. A Samuel Angel was found in Tyrrell Co., NC in the 1840 Census records. This Angel must be the older Angel born ca. 1793, probably the father of Samuel Angel born in 1832.

Charles, John and Laurence Angel were found on the Stokes Co. Historical Map. Charles and Laurence lived near each other in 1780 and 1790 near the Philadelphia Road and the Dan River area. John Angel (1789) was near the Little Belews Creek. They were probably related to your Samuel Angel. This map can be purchased along with the index from the Stokes County Register of Deeds Office, P. O. Box 67, Danbury, NC 27016 for \$4. They are very nice maps that show the location of the early settlers of Stokes Co.

Since Stokes Co. was formed from Surry Co. in 1789, the two Samuel Angels you mentioned in your letter were born after that date. Therefore, we did not find information in Surry on Samuel Angel.


Early land deeds for Charles, Laurence, and John Angel were probably in Surry Co. If you find that you are interested in these deeds, write us again.

Descendants of some of these Angels must have returned to Surry Co. as Edmund, Henry, John, Mary, and Nicholas Angel were listed as head of household in the 1850 Surry Co. Census.



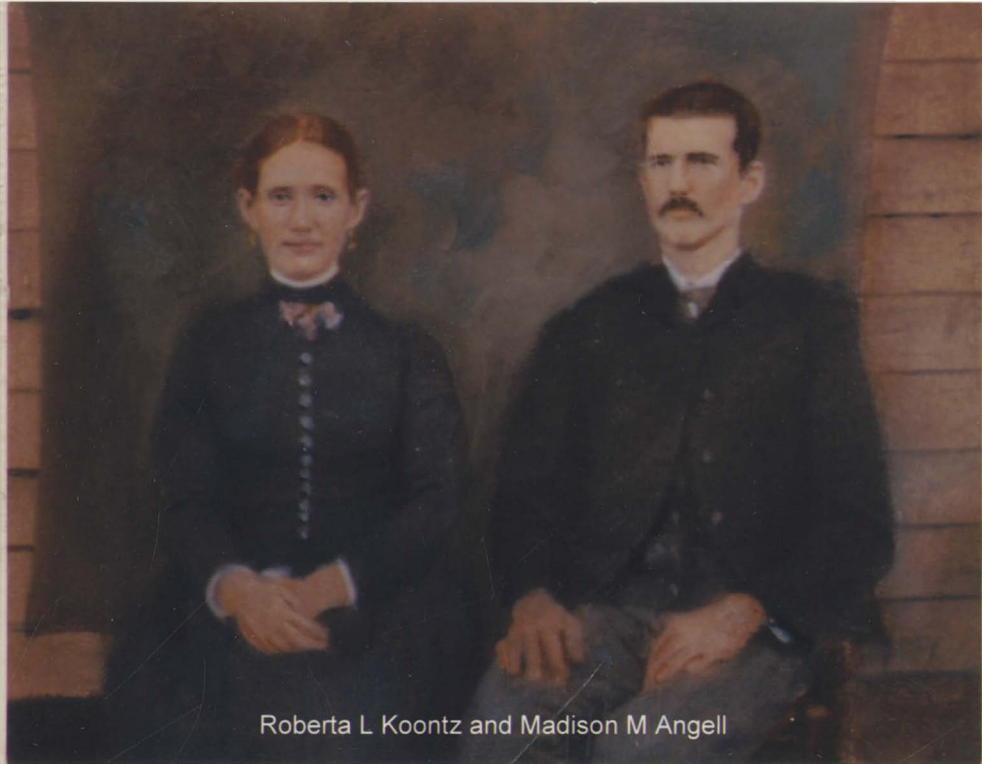
Were you able to find the exact date of marriage for John and Mary and where they are buried? If so, we would like to have the information for our files.
