Parker was born to Mr. Samuel D. Pa. and Mrs. Hessie O. Parker on August 31, 1932. Max was the third child out of five. He was born at Dobson in Surry County. His family later moved to Boonville and then to the Courtney Community.

Max Parker's wife, Coleen Y. Cook Parker, was born to Robert Lee and Vertie Viola Anderson Cook on July 2, 1937, in Iredell County. Coleen was the youngest of fourteen children.

Max and Coleen were married on August 20, 1955, by Charles Dunn in York, South Carolina. Then they lived in Courtney. Then on October 4, 1956 in the Davie County Hospital, Coleen and Max had their first child who was a girl and they named her Sheila Jelane Parker. On June 26, 1977, Sheila married Brian Dezern Mosteller from Boonville. At this time they have no children.

Max and Coleen had another daughter on November 1, 1960, also at Davie County Hospital. They named her Robin Yvonne Parker. On June 16, 1979, Robin married Christopher Logan Brown. Robin and Chris have no children either.

On February 20, 1967, Max and Coleen had their last daughter who was named Melissa Dawn Parker. Melissa attended Courtney Elentary and will attend Forbush High. The fa. belongs to the Courtney Baptist Church.

tersons came down to Surry County from Virginia, possibly from around Natural Bridge. Other family members seemed to believe that the Pattersons of this area were descended from Gilbert Patterson who settled first in the eastern part of North Carolina.

According to the Colonial Records of North Carolina, Vol. 4, page 453, Gilbert Pattison (Patterson) was granted 640 acres in Bladen County at a council held at Wilmington on the fourth day of June, 1740. Bladen County, at

that time, extended westwardly across the United States, its western boundary was undetermined. Another tradition is that they carne from "Patterson Springs" which is in presentday Gaston County.

This Gilbert Patterson is believed to have been the father of Greenberry Patterson I. Greenberry Patterson I obtained land on "Mill Creek" in what is now Yadkin County, North Carolina, on April 3, 1780. He built a mill on North Deep Creek in 1791. Greenberry was probably born about 1740/50 and died in 1798 in Surry (Yadkin) County. He is shown on the 1790 Surry County census with four males over 16, and four males under 16. The 1784-1787 tax lists of Surry County show Greenberry Patterson with 1 male over 16, 5 under, and 4 females. His wife's name was Rebecca.

It is believed that Greenberry Patterson I had at least 12 children. Later cansus records indicate that some of those children were born in Virginia. The children were: Greenberry, John, Joel, Rebecca, James, Benjamin, Mary (Polly), Gilbert, Keziah, Isaac, Jesse, and

(1) Greenberry Patterson, born September 15, 1775, in Virginia, died December 19, 1852, in Yadkin County. He is buried in an old cemetery between Boonville and Yadkinville near one of his father's early land purchases, and which property later belonged to Dr. Thad Shore. The name of his first wife is unknown and the names of his children by her. He married on August 24, 1822, in Surry County, Catherine Creson. She died after 1853 for in that year she was allotted the dower lands of her deceased husband, Greenberry Patterson III

Possibly William, born in 1811, who married Caroline Maynard on February 17, 1833, in Surry County, is a son of Greenberry's. William had children: Samuel (1834); Mary A. (1836); Harrison (1839) who married on January 3, 1867 in Yadkin County, Sarah E. Whitaker; Saluda (1838); William (1840) who was living in the household of Greenberry II in the 1850 census; John (1843); and Greenberry III (1846).

Jane Patterson who married Hugh Bryant on December 26, 1837, in Surry County, may well be a daughter of Greenberry II, as well as Caroline who married John Bryant, Jemina who married Charles Bryant on February 2, 1845, and Mary Pauline who married George D. Brindle. This relationship has not been proven, however.

(2) John Patterson, believed to be a son of Greenberry Patterson I married on November 14, 1797, in Surry County, North Carolina, Edy Johnston.

(3) Joel Patterson, son of Greenberry Patterson I, married on August 5, 1801, in Surry County, Sarah Harding, born in 1783 in Virginia, the daughter of William and Obedience Hutchens Harding (see article on the William Harding Family). Joel and Sarah removed to Jackson County, Missouri. The names of their children are unknown.

(4) Rebecca Patterson, born September 15, 1777, died October 24, 1837, and buried in the Patterson-Bryant Cemetery previously mentioned, married first on September 9,

1803, in Surry County, Renne Harding, born August 15, 1774, in Virginia, son of William and Obedience Hutchens Harding (see article on Renne Harding Family). Rebecca married second, in 1814 after the death of Renne Harding, Joshua Creson.

(5) James Patterson, date of birth unknown, died in 1833, married Elizabeth "Betsey" Speer, His children were Lewis W., Joel (married Sarah Patterson, daughter of Jesse), Kezia, Nancy, James, Greenberry, Rebecca, Aaron B., and Sarah (who married William Carr or Kerr). Aaron and Sarah Patterson Carr moved to Davidson County, Tennessee. They signed a power of attorney to Aquilla Speer in connection with the sale of land belonging to

(6) Benjamin Patterson married on February 12, 1817, in Surry County, North Carolina, Mary Jackson. I do not know the names of his children

their father's estate.

(7) Mary (Poily) Patterson was a daughter of Greenberry Patterson's, but nothing further is known about her.

(8) Gilbert Patterson married on April 25, 1807, in Surry County, Mary McBride. They removed to Davis County, Indiana. The names of his children are not known to this writer. Gilbert was probably named after his grandfather. Gilbert was still living in 1855 when he signed a power-of-attorney to William Harding to sell land he had inherited from his father. Greenberry I.

(9) Kezia(h) Patterson married William Patterson, Jr., son of William Patterson. Their marriage bond had no date in the register of marriages found at Dobson, North Carolina.

(10) Isaac Patterson died sometime after 1860. He appears in the Yadkin County census for that year.

(11) Jesse Patterson, born in 1781, died after 1850, is believed to have been married three times (but possibly there was another Jesse Patterson). #### REVEREND HENRY PATTILLO 770

The name Pattillo was originally spelled "Pattuloch" meaning in Scotch "The Foot of the Lake." There are at least 18 variations: Pettelleaw, Pettillok, Pittilloh, Pettullo, Pettelly, Pattulock, Patillo, Pattullo, Pittillo, Pittulo, as well as shortened versions:

Tullock, Tullo, Tullos, and Tulloss (see Dundee, Scotland, Parish Register 1682-

1740, Christenings)

The family name originated either from one of two place names, Pittellock, near Freuchie,

or Glenfarg, Perthshire.

ade de Pettillok is mentioned in a memo of 1295, and is probably the Adam de Pethilloch who appears as assizer at Perth in 1305.

William de Pettillok held a charter of lands of Gibblolistoun in Fife from Robert I.

John de Pyttyllok held a toft in Portyncrag in 1433.

A history of this family by M.J. Miller, Beaumont, Texas, states, "The Pittillo family is an ancient family residing at Balumbic near Dundee in Scotland. During the reigh of Louis VI of France, he came over into Scotland, and Robert Pattillo, with several other men joined the King's Archer Guards and so distinguished himself in an insurrection in Gascony that the King promoted him with an appointment of Governor of one of his provinces. From this circumstance the Pattilio coat-of-arms was established, which is an unbent bow resting on a shield: the crest, a mailed glove with a rose in hand. The motto 'Et decerpta dabunt odorem' (and plucked, they will give forth an odour).

Robert Pattulloh is called a "great captain" in Chambers History of Charles VII, page 178.

He went in 1424 to France.

The family may originally descend from the nan legate Pettellus who came to Brittain in

The Pattullos of Fife and Perth were a sept or dependent of Clan Macgregor. The Wigtonshire Pittullichs were members of Clan Donald of Keppoch (see Clans, Septs, Regiments of the Scottish Highlands, by Frank Adam, p.

Henry Pattillo, the subject of this article, was born in Scotland in 1726. He made frequent reference to his parents, but only his mother's name, Jane, has been handed down. He had a brother named George, and together they emmigrated to Virginia in 1740. George settled in Charlotte County, Virginia, and

raised a large family.

As a youth, Henry was placed with a merchant to learn the art of trade, but he soon had enough, and began to teach. He then turned to the ministry.

In Virginia, Henry became acquainted with Samuel Davies (1723-1760) and was invited to return to the Davies home in Hanover County, Virginia to live and to study. Henry began a journal on August 10, 1754, about this period of his life.

Henry met and fell in love with Mary Anderson of Hanover County. According to his journal, the newly-wed couple lived in a house 16 x 12, which was later struck by lightening and burned.

Henry Pattillo delivered his "trail" sermon in April, 1756 in Hanover County. On September 28, he opened the Presbytery held at Cub Creek in Charlotte County, and was granted a license to preach. In September of 1758, he accepted calls from congregations at Willis, Byrd, and Buck Island.

In 1765 he was at the Presbytery at Hyco, in Caswell County (then Orange) and was invited to supply central North Carolina churches including Hawfields, Eno, and Little River. He and his family then moved to North Carolina.

Reverend Pattillo was opposed to the Regulators Movement and preached against it (Colonial Records of North Carolina, Vol. 7,

pp. 814-815, 835.).

But he became involved in the American Revolution by being elected a delegate to the North Carolina Provincial Convention which met August 1775, as a representative of Bertie County. He also served on the Committee of Safety. He, with others, signed the petition to the King of England stating that the English Parliament had no right to tax the colonies.

He was chosen Chairman of that convention.

In 1780, Henry Pattillo went to Granville County, North Carolina, to serve Grassy Creek and other congregations. He also supervised Granville Hall, a classical academy at Williamsboro, and taught for several years.

During an illness in 1782, he composed a will (which is deposited in the archives at Hampden-Sydney College in Virginia).

He wrote several manuscripts and compiled a public school geography, Geographic Catechism.

In 1784, the Grassy Creek and Nutbush (Williamsboro) congregations deeded him 300 acres on Spewmarrow Creek in Granville County, on the condition that he continue for life as minister to these two congregations. His home was located about two miles southeast of "Abrams Plains" and about a mile and one-half north of Stovall.

On April 25, 1787, Reverend Pattillo was awarded an honorary A.M. degree by Hampden-Sydney College. Reverend Davies had wanted him to obtain a formal college education, but Pattillo had never done so.

Reverend Pattillo refined some of his more noteworthy sermons and published them in a volume entitled Sermons, printed by James Adams at Wilmington, New Jersey, in 1788, He also published a funeral sermon on General George Washington.

In 1801, Reverend Pattillo was invited to a special meeting in Dinwiddie County, Virginia, and died there in August (see *Raleigh Register*, August 24, 1801). His place of burial is unknown, but it may be on property owned by one of his two sons, Dr. Henry Pattillo, Jr., or Dr. William J. Pattillo, both of whom were living in Mecklenburg County, Virginia, at that time.

Reverend Pattillo, so we are told, was of large frame and had a plain face, but he was filled with wit and had the ability to make listeners laugh. He is described well in W.H. Foote's North Carolina Sketches, published in 1846, pp. 213-226. See also Orange County, North Carolina, edited by Hugh Lefler and Paul Wager, and North Carolina Review, Vol. XLIV. No. 4, pp. 373-391.

The Reverend's home in North Carolina, called "Glebe" has been continuously occupied and is still in an excellent state of preservation. It is now owned by C. Julian Wilson, a descendant of Dr. Goodrich Wilson.

row second.

(3) Jane Pattillo, born May 30, 1760, died January 8, 1826, married Col. Robert Lanier first. She married Capt. Francis Poindexter second. (See article entitled "Jane Pittillo Lanier Poindexter.)

(4) Anderson Pattillo married Catherine Harper.

(5) Mary Pittillo married Samuel Griffin.(6) William Johnstone Pattillo married first

Diana Minor Harper; second, Martha Jones. (7) John Franklin Pattillo married Ann Webb first, and Hariette Pattillo Hyde second.

(8) Mildred (Milly) Pattillo married Orman Kimbrough.

#### THE PATTERSONS

Some family tradition indicates that the Patisons came down to Surry County from Virginia, possibly from around Natural Bridge. Other family members seemed to believe that the Pattersons of this area were descended from Gilbert Patterson who settled first in the eastern part of North Carolina.

According to the Colonial Records of North Carolina, Vol. 4, page 453, Gilbert Pattison (Patterson) was granted 640 acres in Bladen County at a council held at Wilmington on the fourth day of June, 1740. Bladen County, at

that time, extended westwardly across the United States, its western boundary was undetermined. Another tradition is that they came from "Patterson Springs" which is in presentday Gaston County.

This Gilbert Patterson is believed to have been the father of Greenberry Patterson I. Greenberry Patterson I. Greenberry Patterson I obtained land on "Mill Creek" in what is now Yadkin County, North Carolina, on April 3, 1780. He built a mill on North Deep Creek in 1791. Greenberry was probably born about 1740/50 and died in 1798 in Surry (Yadkin) County. He is shown on the 1790 Surry County census with four males over 16, and four males under 16. The 1784 1787 tax lists of Surry County show Greenberry Patterson with 1 male over 16, 5 under, and 4 females. His wife's name was Rebecca.

It is believed that Greenberry Patterson I had at least 12 children. Later cansus records indicate that some of those children were born in Virginia. The children were: Greenberry, John, Joel, Rebecca, James, Benjamin, Mary (Polly), Gilbert, Keziah, Isaac, Jesse, and

Joshua

(1) Greenberry Patterson, born September 15, 1775, in Virginia, died December 19, 1852, in Yadkin County. He is buried in an old cemetery between Boonville and Yadkinville near one of his father's early land purchases, and which property later belonged to Dr. Thad Shore. The name of his first wife is unknown and the names of his children by her. He married on August 24, 1822, in Surry County, Catherine Creson. She died after 1853 for in that year she was allotted the dower lands of her deceased husband, Greenberry Patterson II.

Possibly William, born in 1811, who married Caroline Maynard on February 17, 1833, in Surry County, is a son of Greenberry's. William had children: Samuel (1834); Mary A. (1836); Harrison (1839) who married on January 3, 1867 in Yadkin County, Sarah E. Whitaker; Saluda (1838); William (1840) who was living in the household of Greenberry II in the 1850 census; John (1843); and Greenberry III (1846)

Jane Patterson who married Hugh Bryant on December 26, 1837, in Surry County, may well be a daughter of Greenberry II, as well as Caroline who married John Bryant, Jemima who married Charles Bryant on February 2, 1845, and Mary Pauline who married George D. Brindle. This relationship has not been proven, however.

(2) John Patterson, believed to be a son of Greenberry Patterson I married on November 14, 1797, in Surry County, North Carolina.

(3) Joel Patterson, son of Greenberry Patterson I, married on August 5, 1801, in Surry County, Sarah Harding, born in 1783 in Virginia, the daughter of William and Obedience Hutchens Harding (see article on the William Harding Family). Joel and Sarah removed to Jackson County, Missouri. The names of their children are unknown.

(4) Rebecca Patterson, born September 15, 1777, died October 24, 1837, and buried in the Patterson-Bryant Cemetery previously mentioned, married first on September 9,

1803, In Surry County, Renne Harding, born August 15, 1774, in Virginia, son of William and Obedience Hutchens Harding (see article on Renne Harding Family). Rebecca marries second, in 1814 after the death of Renne Harding, Joshua Creson.

(5) James Patterson, date of birth unknown, died in 1833, married Elizabeth "Besey" Speer. His children were Lewis W., Joe (married Sarah Patterson, daughter of Jesse Kezia, Nancy, James, Greenberry, Rebeccaron B., and Sarah (who married William Carr or Kerr). Aaron and Sarah Patterson Carmoved to Davidson County, Tennessee. The signed a power of attorney to Aquilla Speer connection with the sale of land belonging their father's estate.

(6) Benjamin Patterson married on February 12, 1817, in Surry County, North Carolina Mary Jackson, I do not know the names of his

children.

(7) Mary (Polly) Patterson was a daughter of Greenberry Patterson's, but nothing further

is known about her.

(8) Gilbert Patterson married on April 25 1807, in Surry County, Mary McBride, They removed to Davis County, Indiana. The names of his children are not known to this writer Gilbert was probably named after his grandather. Gilbert was still living in 1855 when signed a power-of-attorney to William Harding to sell land he had inherited from his father Greenberry I.

(9) Kezia(h) Patterson married William Patterson, Jr., son of William Patterson. The marriage bond had no date in the register of marriages found at Dobson, North Caroline

(10) Isaac Patterson died sometime after 1860. He appears in the Yadkin County censu

for that year.

(11) Jesse Patterson, born in 1781, died after 1850, is believed to have been married three times (but possibly there was another Jesse Patterson). He married Nancy Brown or January 13, 1811, Surry County, North Cardina; he married Mary Creson on July 2-1818; and he married Nancy Bohanon on May 30, 1824. Jesse had at least three children Keziah who married Thomas H. Brown and removed to Jackson County, Missouri; Amos C. Patterson, born in 1825; and Nancy M Patterson, born in 1830 (according to the 1850 Surry/Yadkin Census).

(12) Joshua Patterson, son of Greenberry married on December 20, 1819, in Sur County, Mary "Polly" Williams. Joshua dietafter 1874 because on November 16, 1874, he deeded land to his daughter, Elizabeth M Lakey (see Deed Book D, Page 570, records and the second second


