Suggestion for 1960

1. On day of carnival pick up (or have treasurer) \$5⁰⁰ in change for each room & \$50⁰⁰ for lunch room. - Each room picks up change & prizes at principal's office \$5 change for costumes judging
2. Keep account of expenses for projects & give to chairman or treasurer.
3. Charge 10¢ for projects
4. Put only 1 prize in grab bag - 1 prize per dime
5. When carnival is over - count money & turn in at office - where Halloween chairman & treasurer account
6. Grade mother chairmen are in charge of each room's project - they call grade mothers to take turn working in rooms
7. Have picture for each room to be judged day of carnival
8. Instead of parade - charge 10¢ for ticket to have costume judged. Judges circulate - then call finalists to one room
9. Have cupcakes in dining room to be sold

Suggestions - for 1961

1. Grade mother chairmen - in charge of project in each room - call other mothers to help -
2. One room might take on the project of running a "coat check" room - somewhere near entrance - charge 5¢ per coat - have racks - tickets etc.
3. In 1960 - 12 gross of prizes were used - plus 50 donated theatre tickets - and pencil-favors donated by Bank - We ran short on prizes towards late evening - found some old ones in costume room - (replaced some these now) - Suggest we have 12 to 15 gross of prizes - Best price ever was our price this year from mobile truck delivering to County Fair - Saved freight etc.
4. Pot only 1 prize in grab bags!
5. Charge 10¢ for all projects
6. If prize is hard to win - it should be worth winning -

7. On day of carnival pick up \$120.00 in change — 55.00 for lunch room and 5.00 for each room, 5.00 for costume contest.

8. Have cupcakes in dining room to be sold — \$25.00 sold in 1960.

9. Each room picks up change and prizes in principals office —
1961 prizes can be estimated by dividing ¹⁹⁶⁰ net profit by 10 and each room's box fixed in advance

10. Give each room a shoe box or cigar box for change — mark the amt. of change — and name of teacher on box —. When carnival is over — each room counts money and turns box in to office. Treasurer and Carnival chairman recount and wrap. (Miss Coppedge might help!)
