Dear Mrs. Camin,

Thank you for your report on the Fesmires. It really is a great help to me in piecing things together. Although the definite proof does not show up right now as to who Walker's father was, I seen enough circumstantial evidence to make an educated guess that it was this Balaam who seems to have died ca. 1801. I think you are right in thinking there must be a connection between Walker Fesmire and the Robert WALKER who deeded him the land, probably his mother's people. Walker had a son named Balaam Walker, and another Fesmire, Balaam F. Fesmire, who migrated to Tennessee, had a son named William Walker. Walker and BalaamF.were most likely sons of Balaam. The fact that Balaam died when the boys were so young (Walker b. 1799, Balaam F. b. 1801) that they didn't remember their father, much less did later descendants remember past Walker and Balaam F.

Incidentally, there is a red-haired gene in both those families, but not in the descendants of John.

Dear Ms. Camin,

I got your address from a journal at the library. I hope you can help me with some genealogical research. I am compiling a history on the FESMIRE family. I am concentrating on the descendants of Martin Fesmire of Chatham Co., NC in the 1790 census. He later moved to Randolph Co., where he probably died. I have done quite a lot of research, and have basically three things I need from North Carolina records:

(1) To search the 1900 Soundex F256 (and 1880, if it exists), to be sure I haven't missed descendants in counties other than Randolph.

(2) To find the father of Walker Fesmire, b. 30 Dec 1799, Randolph Co., NC. I believe he is Martin's grandson, but by which son? Perhaps his father died or left when Walker was young? Martin had sons John and Balaam, possibly others.

(3) To find the father of Martin Fesmire. I believe Martin came from Pennsylvania sometime before the Revolution. I have seen Chatham Co. records that show him there in 1772. I believe this is a dead-end, and don't expect much time to be spent on this. A Cursory look for a will in Randolph County, or a death date in Randolph Co. would be a lat of intermation to me. Records indicate he attended Mount Pleasant Methodist Church in 1988. Any pertinent information about Martin would be appreciated, especially to determine whether William Fesmire of Burke Co. was his brother or son (1990 census). Was William the father of Walker? What happened to William?

Tou might consider information about William to be a fourth question, but I don't really look for an answer to question 3.

Could you give me some idea what your fees might be to research this for me? If you are unable to do this, could you send me the address of someone who could help me?

I have included my father's chart. I am only researching the Fermire line at this time, but I hope the names of the wives night turn up in the process sometime. Thank you for your help. I hope to hear from you

LAND GRANTS. Land grants are kept by the Land Grant Office, Office of the Secretary of State, Administration Building, Raleigh, NC 27603. When writing that Office, furnish full name of grantee and county in which grant was made.

VITAL STATISTICS. Birth/death records were not kept in North Carolina before October, 1913. For copies of birth certificates after 1913 and death certificates beginning in 1930, write Division of Health Services, Vital Records Branch, Box 2091, Raleigh, NC 27602. Give full name of individual, county of birth/death and year of birth/death. For birth certificates give full names of parents, including mother's maiden name. Enclose \$3.00 for each copy.

For death certificates, 1913-1929, write Archives and Records Section, Division of Archives and History, 109 East Jones Street, Raleigh, NC 27611. Enclose a \$2.00 search and handling fee (if you are not a North Carolina resident). The Archives will check to see if there is a death certificate on file. If so, they will notify you and you may then order (on the form provided) a certified copy for an additional \$3.00, paid at that time. Do_not send both payments together.

Birth/death certificate information is available only to self, spouse, parents, attorney, or insurance company.

MARRIAGE BONDS. Marriage bonds were in use in North Carolina from 1741 to 1868. The State Archives now has a master statewide bride and groom index to these bonds. Although this index cannot be reproduced selectively for a family name, the State Archives staff can check it for a specific marriage. Names of parents, age, or other personal information usually does not appear on the bonds. If you wish the State Archives staff to make this search, please write Archives and Records Section, Division of Archives and History, 109 East Jones Street, Raleigh, NC 27611, enclosing a SASE. A \$2.00 search and handling fee must accompany each out-of-state inquiry.

PASSENGER LISTS. North Carolina did not have a great amount of direct overseas immigration. The majority of people came to North Carolina from another colony or state.

Passenger lists for the colonial period are difficult to find. We suggest you read the sections on passenger lists in GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH: METHODS AND SOURCES by the American Society of Genealogists (pp.74-78) and RESEARCHER'S GUIDE TO AMERICAN GENEALOGY by Val D. Greenwood (pp.400-413). A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF SHIP PASSENGER LISTS, 1538-1825, by Harold Lancour may also be helpful. Passenger arrival lists kept by the United States Government are in the National Archives in Washington, D.C. Most are for the years 1820-1945, with many gaps.

Before you begin to look for any kind of immigration record, you should have completely detailed your family back to the immigrant and gathered all available information on the immigrant from all possible sources.
