Thank you for your report on the Fesmires. It really is a great help to me in piecing things together. Although the definite proof does not show up right now as to who Walker's father was, I ~~seen~~ ^{have} seen enough circumstantial evidence to make an educated guess that it was this Balaam who seems to have died ca. 1801. I think you are right in thinking there must be a connection between Walker Fesmire and the Robert WALKER who deeded him the land, probably his mother's people. Walker had a son named Balaam Walker, and another Fesmire, Balaam F. Fesmire, who migrated to Tennessee, had a son named William Walker. Walker and Balaam F. were most likely sons of Balaam. The fact that Balaam died when the boys were so young (Walker b. 1799, Balaam F. b. 1801) that they didn't remember their father, much less did later descendants remember past Walker and Balaam F.

Incidentally, there is a red-haired gene in both those families, but not in the descendants of John.

Dear Ms. Camin,

I got your address from a journal at the library. I hope you can help me with some genealogical research. I am compiling a history on the FESMIRE family. I am concentrating on the descendants of Martin Fesmire of Chatham Co., NC in the 1790 census. He later moved to Randolph Co., where he probably died. I have done quite a lot of research, and have basically three things I need from North Carolina records:

(1) To search the 1900 Soundex F256 (and 1880, if it exists), to be sure I haven't missed descendants in counties other than Randolph.

(2) To find the father of Walker Fesmire, b. 30 Dec 1799, Randolph Co., NC. I believe he is Martin's grandson, but by which son? Perhaps his father died or left when Walker was young? Martin had sons John and Balaam, possibly others.

(3) To find the father of Martin Fesmire. I believe Martin came from Pennsylvania sometime before the Revolution. I have seen Chatham Co. records that show him there in 1772. I believe this is a dead-end, and don't expect much time to be spent on this. A cursory look for a will in Randolph County, or a death date in Randolph Co. would be a lot of information to me. Records indicate he attended Mount

Pleasant Methodist Church in 1798. Any pertinent information about Martin would be appreciated, especially to determine whether William Fesmire of Burke Co. was his brother or son (1790 census). Was William the father of Walker? What happened to William?

You might consider information about William to be a fourth question, but I don't really look for an answer to question 3.

Could you give me some idea what your fees might be to research this for me? If you are unable to do this, could you send me the address of someone who could help me?

I have included my father's chart. I am only researching the Fesmire line at this time, but I hope the names of the wives might turn up in the process sometime.

We regret the necessity of responding to your request by a form letter. However, the ever-increasing volume of mail has made it impossible for us to personally reply to all inquiries.

In response to your request of April 29, 1982

- () We are delighted to hear of your interest in genealogy. Good genealogy is done step by step beginning with yourself and working backwards one generation at a time. We are enclosing our brochure, TAR HEEL TRACKS: GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH IN NORTH CAROLINA, which we hope will prove helpful.
- (X) Birth and death records were not kept in North Carolina on a statewide basis until 1913. Prior to that time, it is necessary to use family Bible records, census records, and various county records, such as wills, deeds, estates records, and county court minutes, to prove family relationships, etc.
- () Most North Carolina records are arranged by county; therefore, you must first determine the county in which your ancestor resided.
- () For people who left North Carolina, the clue to the North Carolina county from which they came is often found in the records of their next county of residence. The records of this county should be exhaustively searched before research is attempted in North Carolina.
- () North Carolina census records on microfilm, 1790-1900, may be borrowed on inter-institutional loan through your local library from the Federal Archives and Records Center at Fort Worth, Texas. Prior to 1850 only heads of households are listed by name--between 1850 and 1900 all persons in the household are named. The 1790 census, the first federal census, has been printed in its entirety and is available in most large genealogical libraries, as well as many public libraries.

I find no reference to Martin Fesmire or anyone of that surname in indexed published abstracts of Randolph County records (deeds, 1779-94; tax lists for 1815 and 1820; court minutes, 1779-82; and marriages through 1820). 1815 TAX LIST OF CHATHAM CO., N.C. includes a John Fesmire - on Flat Creek in Capt. Lane's district near the Randolph County line - but no Martin. There are no Fesmire references in Chatham deed abstracts, 1770-82, or court minute abstracts, 1774 through 79.

Extensive research in original records not abstracted seems to be in order.
I am therefore enclosing the State Archives brochure and a list of researchers.
