Crispen Shelton's first deed in Essex County.

The justices, sheriff and vestrymen were usually the more prosperous men on the county in which they lived. The first counties in Va., were formed in 1634, prior to that time and in some cases for many years afterward in certain sections the churches, parishes etc. exercised the functions of government.

A Shelton history in coonecticutt was in error in stating that Daniel of Conn. had a brother in Richmond, Va. in 1680. There was no Richmond, Va., at that time, and probably no settlement at the falls of the James except the plantation of Thomas Stegg, uncle of Wm. Byrd I, of Westover.

Lancaster County Christ Ch. Psh on both sides of the Rappahanock. Ralph Shelton was listed in that psh. as a processioner.

Samuel Shelton in Barbadoes by 1678. None in Va., prior to 1700.

Va. Land Patents, Vol. I, Page 653 Wm. Chapman states that he brought over a Richard Shelton in 1638. Possibly same who was later in Conn.

Lancaster Deed Book Vol. II Page 191 Thomas Shelten witnesses power of attorney.

An Armistead geneology states that Wm. Shelton md. one of the Armistead family. An later we find Crispen and Lettice Shelton having a son Armistead.

On Sept. 3, 1711 Mary Shelton gaves bond in Exexasters Middlesex as adm. of Thomas Shelton. (Vol. for 1703-20, Page 206)

There is no further record of this Thomas, but Ralph and Mary Shelton had a son Thomas born in 1707. It is not known who this Ralph Shelton md., but there is one statement that Ralph Shelton married a Mary Gower (?)

Rev. Samuel Shelton, son of Wesley, grandson of Armistead, great-grandson Crispen, went to Stokes County and later to Kentucky.

One of witnesses to Ralph's will in 1733 was Abraham Weeks, who had a wife named Lettice. COULD BEEN LETTICE WEEKS, DAU. OF ABRAHAM THAT CRISPEN MARRIED, SINCE ABRAHAM NAME ALSO COMES DOWN IN SHELTON FAMILY.

Middlesex-Law suit Oct. 3, 1752 between Josiah, Thomas and Micajah Shelton, orphans of Thomas Shelton. Micajah followed his uncles to Amelia County.

Mary Shelten, widow of Ralph, zxzx md. second a CDark. Her will probated Aug. 27, 1770 in Pittsylvania.

4. Crispen Shelton, b. April 1, 1713, md. Letitia (Lettice) possibly a Weeks (could have been a Corbin). moved to Amelia from Middlesex in 1743. Bought land July 4, 1743 from Matthew Stuart, of Prince George County. 620 a. on s. bank of Little Nottoway and Rocky Creek (this was later in 1789 in Nottoway Cty.) He later sold 155 a. to Henry Buford, formerly of Middlesex. This deed was witnessed by Ralph (Jr.) and Benjamin Shelton, evidently his brothers, who had followed him to Amelia. (Amelia DB II 324). Crispen was a vestryman in Raleigh Psh., Amelia County, but on June 12, 1752 he was sworn as a vestryman in Netteway Parish. Sept. 24, 1753 Crispen took the oath as a Lt. of militia in Amelia (ORDERS FOR 1753, Page 229) Reference was made in county records to Shelton's "rolling road" over which he rolled tobacco to market on the James River at Petersburg or Osborne's. Ralph Shelton (evidently bro. of Crispen) was in Amelia Militia in Fre. and Indian War (HENNING VII). Crispen's sons were in local militia against Cherokee Indians. Crispen still lived in Amelia in June 1766, but he soon removed to Halifax, where he pxxxbxxxxx onzxax had purchased on March 15, 1762 (being listed then as of Netteway Psh., Amelia Cty) 620 a. on Buck Branch of Panther Creek. Witnesses were Edward Coleman, John Payne, Richard Ellis, John Winn and Gabriel Shelton, Lewis Shelton and Samuel Smith. (HALIFAX DB 44-46) Next on Sept. 14, 1765 he bought from Edward Wade and wife, Mary, 144 A. on North Fork of Panther Creek. Witnesses included Abraham Shelton and Beverly Shelton. (HALFFAX DB. V-304) Aug. 15, 1764 Crispen was granted 1,315 A. on Panther Creek in Halifax (LAND PATENTS XXXI-389). In 1782 he had 38 negroes and 10 horses and 38 cattle (TAX LISTS 1782). Before leaving Amelia he gave land to sons:

Sept. 15, 1765 -- 300 a. Buck Creek to Abraham Shelton. (HALFFAX DB V-306)

Next day he gave son Gabriel Shelton 314 a. of same.

Next day he gave Lewis 291 A. on Dry Branch. (HALFFAX DB V-510)

He held som lands in Amelia as late as 10 years after his removal to present Pittsylvania. A deed dated Oct. 20, 1777, he was selling land in Amelia--362 a. on Whetstone Creek in Amelia to Peter Lumkin. (PITTS. DB XIV-Page 185) It was his former home site in Amelia, evidently held for sentimental reasons or as a place to return to if desired.

NOTE: The first county seat of Pittsylvania was at Callands.

Most of the Sheltons held to the old Episcopal or English church for

On the Expedition against the Cherokees in 1773 the Journal of the H. of B. shows Daniel Shelton, Abraham Shelton, Crippen Shelton, Gabriel Shelton, Beverly Shelton and Armistead Shelton, all paid for services. (DAC LINE) In 1780 Crispen Shelton was sheriff of Pittsylvania County. He was then quite old. By 1789 grandsons of Crispen were appearing in public records. When the Masons wre formed in Pittsylvania in Sept. 15, 1768 among those present were Crispen Shelton (a first member), Tavener Shelton, Wm Shelton, Frederick Shelton and Leroy Shelton. Crispen Shelton's will was made February 17, 1794. He listed 13. Abraham, who md in 1760 Chloe Robertson, d. of Henry and Ann R. Robertson, of Amelia. 14. Gabriel 15. Lewis 16. Beverly 17. Spencer 18. Armistead 19. Vincent ZXXX GRANDSON Crispen, son of Abraham 20. Elizabeth (Shelton) Hunt 21. Jane Todd. who md. into family annesters of Mary Todd Lincoln 22. Susanna (Shelton) Dickerson, md. Griffith Dickerson, of Hanover Cty., a Baptist minister. ALSO LISTED WIFE Lettice. 13. Abraham Shelton was qualified as cast. of militia at May term 1768 in Pittsylvania. On June 23, 1769 he qualified as deputy sheriff. He took oath as major of militia at April Court 1782. He was a county justice from a young man. Also a vestryman of Cambden Psh. In Campbell County Order Book I, Page 25, May Court 1782 one John Fitzpatrick stated that he furnished Abraham Shelton, commisary of Provision Law in Pittsylvania Cty. 2,000 pounds of beef. At the March Term 1782 in Pittsylvania Cty., Abraham Shelton claimed payment for 400 pounds of beef for troops. Crispen claimed pay at same time for 1,450 pounds of same. Abraham Shelton was sheriff again in 1787, He died within the year, for a petition to the legislature dated Feb. 1, 1789 refers to Col. Abraham Shelton, decd., late sheriff. His will was dated June 27, 1788 and mentions a. Lettie b. Ann c. Jane d. Abraham d. Crispen

Wesley, the son of Armistead '18f above) is said to have been born in Pittsylvania County in 1794. Rev. Samuel Franklin Zazkor Shelton md. in 1843 in Pittsylvabia to Pamelia Clemants Gregory, daughter of John Keats and Elizabeth (Corder) Gregory. Elizabeth waw a daughter of Shadrack and Nancy (Pigg) Corder.

Christ church Psh. Records and Middlesex Records show that Ralph and Mary had a son Ralph II, born 1709 who went with his brothers to Amelia and later to Henry County, where he settled on Leatherwood Creek. His brother James settled near him (LAND GRANTS XLI -131) he patented 500 a. on Beaver and Snew Creeks, branches of Leatherwood Creek. Benjamin Shelton, another brother, had a patent by Governor Francis Fauguier for land on Little Nottoway (PATENTS XXXIII-550) March 28, 1759. Later in Pittsylvania records. It seems that all sons of Ralph and Mary went west except Thomas, who died in Middlesex.

NOTE: There was a Ralph Shelton mentioned in connection with Patrick Henry line in Hanover, but he was son of Sarah (Shelton) who md. a Gissage and later Joseph Bickley. No definite connection, but she was probably a Shelton to start with and perhaps sister of Thomas, father of Ralph of Middlesex.

## SHELTON DATA FROM MEDIA RESEARCH BUREAU

The name of Shelton is of local origin and is derived from the residence of its first bearers in the parishes of that name in the counties of Norfolk, Nottingham and Bedford, England. Of these the Norfolk line appears to have been the parent stock of the greater number of the Sheltons of Great Britain. The name is found in ancient English and early American records in the various forms of Shellton, Shelltone, Sheltone, Shelten, Sheltan, Sheltun, Sheltun, Shelton and others. The latter spelling is most generally used in America.

Families bearing this name were to be found at early dates, not only in the counties of Norfolk, Nottingham and Bedford, but also in Suffolk, Cambridge, Warwick, York, Worcester, Stafford, Cornwall and Leicester. They were also seated in the city and the vicinity of London and also in Dublin and other parts of Ireland. They were largely of the landed gentry and yeomanry of the British

Isles.

Among the earliest records of the family in England are those of Zahazad John de Shelton, of County Norfolk, in the latter eleventh century, who was the father of a son named John; those of Nicholas de Shelton, of Norfolk, in 1215; those of Thomas Shelton, of Leicestershire, in 1327; those of Ralph de Shelton, of County Norfolk, who was knighted in 1346 and married Jean, daughter of John de Plais; those of Thomas Shelton, of County Cornwall, about 1413; and those of Sir John Shelton, Knight of the Bath and high sheriff of Norfolk in 1504.

This Sir John married Ann, daughter of Sir William Boleyn, Earl of Wiltshire, and Lady Margaret Butler, and had issue by her if Sir John, Gabriel, Amy, Elizabeth, Thomas, Ralph, Margaret and Mary, of whom the first married Margaret, daughter of Sir Henry Parker, Lord Morley, and had issue by her of Sir Ralph Shelton, high sheriff of Norfolk in 1571, who probably had no issue by his first wife, Mary, daughter of Sir William Wodehouse. He was father by his second wife, Anne Barrow, whom he married in 1558, (some historians contend that the first two children were by his first wife) of Thomas, Sir Ralph and Henry. Of these, the first married Elizabeth Flowerdew, and was the father of Sir Ralph and others; and the youngest, Henry, married Elizabeth, daughter of Thomas Jermyn, and had a son named Maurice, who resided in the County of Suffolk and married Martha Appleton, who gave him at least three children, John (who left only female issue), Martha and Henry. The son Henry was the father in the latter part of the seventeenth century, of by his wife Hester Churchman, of Maurice and Henry, of whom the first married Arabella Duke, and was the father by her of Maurice, Henry, Charles, Edward and Arabella.

Other early records of the family in thr British Isles are those of John Shelton, Mayor of Dublin in 1537, who was the father of two sons, John and Henry: those of Richard Shelton, who married Jane Hollingsworth, in London in 1561; those of Exward Francis

Shelton, of Worcestershire, in the year 1621.

About the end of the sixteenth century a Henry Shelton was living at Birmingham in Warwickshire. He married Elianor Simonds, by whom he was the father of a son named John, who married Barbara, daughter of Walter Stanley, of Staffordshire, and had issue by her of Robert and Sir Richard. Of these Sir Richard was solicitor general to King Charles I, but he died in 1647, leaving no issue by his wife, Lettice, daughter of Sir Robert Fisher. Robert, the first son of John Shelton, of Warwickshire, married Mary, daughter of Edmund Temple, and had at least one son, named John, who had not issue by his wife, Elizabeth Holland, of John, Mary, Phoebe, Anne, Catherine and Barbara.

Although it is not definitely known from which of the many lines of the family in Great Britain the first emigrant to America was descended, it is recorded that the Sheltons were among the earliest

English settlers in the New World.

According to some family historians, the first of the name to come to America was Sir Ralph Shelton, son of Thomas and Elizabeth Flowerdew Shelton, of County Norfolk. It is more probable however that Sir Ralph never came to this country, although he was undoubtedly a member of the London Company, which which a charter was granted in 1611 for lands in Virginia. Sir Ralph is believed to have been the father of a son ZNEMZ James, who came to America sometime before 1724 and settled in Virginia.

This James Shelton, of Virginia, is said by family historians to have been the father of John, James and others. James Shelton, who was living in Hanover County and York County, Va., in 1663, was probably the son of the first James in this country. He became the father of John, Reuben, James, Peter, Ralph, William, Daniel, Susannah and others, whose names are not in evidence.

John, the first of the last-mentioned sons of James Shelton, resided at "Rural Plains" in what is now Hanover County, Va., and by his wife, Jane, he was the father of Sarah, Mary, Elizabeth, Thomas, John and others. The John, of "Rural Plains" died about 1708.

Of the other sons of James Shelton of Hanover and York

Of the other sons of James Shelton of Hanover and York Counties, Reuben had a wife named Elizabeth but is believed to have left no issue.

James, the next son, probably resided in Essex County, Va., where he left issue by his wife, Mary Bathurst, of at least one son, Bathurst Shelton.

Peter, son of James, of Hanover and York Counties, tec balipxedztoxhavezkeenxidemticalxwith removed to Middlesex County, Va., and was married in 1684 to Susannah Jaxon or Jackson, by whom he was

the father of Peter, Ralph and others.

Ralph, son of James of Hanover and York Counties, is believed to have been identical with that Ralph Shelton, who resided in Middlesex County, Va., before 1707 and left issue there by his wife Mary, of Thomas, Ralph, Crispin or Crispen, Reuben, Catherine, John, Benjamin, James and Daniel. It is interesting to note, however, that some historians believe this Ralph to have been the first of his line in America.

William, son of James of Hanover and York Counties, had land in the Counties of Gloucester and Work in Va., abd was married in 1698 to Hannah Armistead, but the names of his children are not in evidence.

Daniel Shelton, son of James of Hanover and York Counties, is asserted by some writers to have been the same Daniel who settled in Connecticutt, but this is not certain.

A Richard Shelton, who may have been another son of James of Hanover and York Counties, although this is purely conjectural, was resident in Fauquier County, Va., and left issue there of one daughter, Jane, and other children whose name are unknown.

Other early records of the family in the South include those of Fr. Shelton, probably Francis, who settled in Charles City County, Va., in 1638; those of Richard Shelton, who settled in Charles City County, Va., in 1638; those of Fra. Shelton, probably Francis, who resided in Westmoreland County, Va., in 1654. The records of those families are only fragmentary.

About 1680 two brothers Daniel and Richard Shelton came to New England, probably from Yorkshire, England, and settled in Connecticutt, whence Richard later removed to Virginia. It is possible that the two brothers were of the afor ementioned Virginia

line, but there is no proof for this.

Daniel, the elder of the two New England settlers, made his home at Stratford, Conn., was married in 1692 to Elizabeth Wells or Welles, by whom he was the father of Elizabeth, Sarah, Joseph, Daniel, Thaddeus, Samuel, James, John (probably died unmarried) and Josiah, from whom most, if not all, of the New England Sheltons are descended.

Joseph, eldest son of the immigrant Daniel, was the father by his wife, Mary Hollister, whom he married in 1726, of Joseph,

Ann, Elizabeth, Mary, William and Esther.
Daniel, second son of the immigrant Daniel, had issue by his wife, Mary Hubbell, ofz whom he married in 1727, of John, Nathan, Abijah, Ebenezer, Abigail, Sarah, Mehitabah, Phebe, Mary and Anah or Anna.

Thaddeus, third son of the immigrant Daniel, was married in 1733 to Esther Hollister, and had issue by her of an only son,

Daniel, who left numerous progeny.

Samuel, fourth son of the immigrant Daniel, resided atk Huntingdon, Conn., and had issue by his wife, Abigail Nichols, whom he married in 1735, of Mary, Daniel, Samuel, Elizabeth, David, Abigail, Joseph, Andrew, Sarah, Ann, Josiah, Philo, Isaac and Agur.

James, fifth son of the immigrant Daniel, also made his home at Huntingdon, Conn., and he married Anna Wheeler. Their children were Hannah, Anna, Elisha, Elizabeth and two other daughters, who died in infancy.

Josiah, seventh and youngest son of the immigrant af Daniel, married Eunice Nichols in 1737 and had Charity and Eunice.

Among those of the name who fought in the Revolution were Captains David, Eliphaz, James and Clough Shelton, of Virginia; Lt. Colonel Thomas Shelton, of Virginia; Armistead, Andrew, Jesse, Henry, Joel, John, Midley, Joseph, Samuel, Peter, Stephen and Wilson Shelton, also of Virginia; Barnabas Shelton, of Connecticutt; David and Richard Shelton, of Mass.; and others from various states.

The most andient and well known of the coats of arms of the English family of Shelton, which sometimes varies, is that described in Burke's "General Armory", 1884.

Checking over Shelton notes you sent me will tell about Don D. Shelton:

Ralph and Mary were parents of Crispin born 1713 in Middlesex County.

Crispin married Lettice, moved to Amelia-later Nottoway, thence to Pittsylvania while still Halifax, they had son Armistead married a cousin Susan Shelton, had a son Wesley married Emily Haden first and had sons Samuel, Dr. John, Augustine to Wythe County; Samuel was Methodist preacher, moved to Stokes Co., N.C. after 1865 then to Kentucky. Wesley married a second time Wood and Don was their son hence a younger half brother of Rev. Samuel who married Pamelia Clements Gregory 1840 in Pitts. Co. Both of Wesley's wives were from Bedford County. The Haydens had moved there from Married Fluvanna County as I have most of all of this.

Rev. Samuel had issue: Erasmus Archer, Raleigh Harvey, John Wesley, George Emory

Fletcher, Isabel and Emily Haden who married Joseph Fothergill.

I did this work for relatives of my husband some time ago so know it is right. The Old Crispin was quite wealthy according records as well as prominent in the counties where he lived, seemed well educated for his time. No record of sir name of his wife Lettice but still may find it. His father was not wealthy so property must have come through Lettice which was a name in Corbin and Weeks families both wealthy families. However there is no proof of relationship so far found.

Dear Linda:

I was real happy when you called long distance some days ago to talk to me about the coats of arms which you would like to have me do. I will be delighted to do them for you, and I am writing to check just how many you want me to draw and paint for you.

As I understood from your telephone call and from your leter and lists which you mai;ed to me, you would like for me to do a Martin design and a Shelton design for you and your husband. Then you wanted me to do a Collins and a Shelton coat of arms for Glenn Collins and his wife (a Collins design for Glenn Collins himself and a Shelton design for Colleen Shelton Collins). Just her I would like to know whether Colleen Shelton Collins is a sister of your father Bruno Shelton? Then I understood that you wanted me to do another Shelton design for you brother whom you listed as Wallace Leon Shelton.

That would make a total of five coats of arms altogether, and as I told you they would be \$10 each, a total of \$50 for the five of them together. In addition there would be charges for the mailing by insured parcel post, but that total for all five of them would be less than \$5. I always wrap the arms very secrurely and insure them against damage, and I always send them by first class mail to make sure of a rapid delivery.

AND RIGHT HERE I WANT TO INFORM YOU THAT I NEVER WANT TO BE PAID UNTIL AFTER I HAVE FINISHED THE DRAWING AND PAINTING. I NEVER WANT PAY UNTIL THE JOB IS DONE AND DELIVERED, FOR THERE IS ALWAYS A CHANCE THAT SOMETHING WOULD DELAY OR PREVENT THE JOB BEING FINISHED.

I was interested in the family data for the Shelton's, the Hill's, the Martin's and the Collins in you letter, and I just want to tell ylu I have been working on various families in Stokes, Surry and Patrick Counties for over 40 years. As a result I have quite a bit of information on the various families, and I have worked some family tree diagrams that furnish quite a bit of information in the regard to the Wikksx Martins going back 11 generations from Richard Martin, and I think you will be interested to see the lineage extending back behind the time of Col. Jack Martin of Rock House fame. You will note that Rock House Jacj's parents were Joseph Martin back up in Virginia, and that Joseph's wife was a certain Ann Sandage. Coming down to Rock House Jack's son named Joseph Martin, you will note that his wife was a certain Christina Lyon, and I have diagrammed her descent back for seven generations through the Lyons family all the way back into England. I have tried to fill in all the Martin Wives that I had in my records, but I could not fill in the names of the wife of James Austen Martin, and I could not fill in the name of the wife of William Martin. in other words, I hope that you can tell the name of Richard Martin(s mother before she married James Austen Martin, and I hope that you can fill in the name of thex Richard's grandmother Martin, in other words the name of the woman who became the wife of William Martin. You will note that I was able to furnish a few dates of births, deaths or marriages as I went back on the Martin lineage.

IF YOU ARE ABLE TO TELL THE NAME BEFORE MARRIAGE OF THE WIFE OF JAMES AUSTEN MARTIN, THEN I SURELY HOPE YOU CAN NAME HER FATHER AND HER MOTHER (THE GRAND PARENTS OF RICHARD ON HIS MOTHER'S SIDE. ONCE I GET THOSE TWO NAMES, IT IS POSSIBLE THAT I CAN FIND NOTES THAT WILL CARRY THE LINEAGE ON FURTHER.

I now take up the diagram of your own family, going back on you Shelton lineage with some added information and also taking up the Material in regard to the family of your mother, Mabel Francis. My wife, who was June Stone, always thought a great deal of Mabel when they were girls.

I have done a family tree diagram on both your Shelton and Francis lines, placing your name as the starter, and then moving back to your

father and mother. I started the Shelton lineage at the top of the page with the name of Bruno Shelton, and you will see that I left blanks where you could fill in the dates of his birth and marriage. I am presuming that Bruno is still living, but if not then you could fill in the date of death. Going back from Bruno, I diagramed his mother and father's name. The gave me the name of Elmer Shelton as Bruno's father, but you did not list Bruno's mother. I had StokesCounty recorss which shewed that Elmer Shelton married Josie H. Simmons on Jan. 28, 1912. However, I need birth and death dates for Elmer and Josie (that is if either or both happens to be dead). Of course you gave me the parents and grandparents and grandparents and grandparents going back from Elmer. Hisparents were James William Shelton and Pandora Wright, and the next generation was Willism Franklin (Long Frank) Shelton and Elizabeth (Betsy Owens. The Census records showed me that James William was born in 1869, and it showed that William Franklin Shelton was born in 1838, and Betsy Owens SShelton was born in 1842. I had records in my files that showed the parents of "Long Frank" Shelton were James Shelton and Abby Cox. Ty records also showed that the parents of Betsy Owens were Housan Owens and Ruth Collins, who were married on Jan. 24, 1833. This carried your own Shelton lineage back six generations, and maybe you furnish information as to the parentage and background for Josie H. Simmons and Pane and Pandora Wright. I'll give you a tip just here that if either of them died after 1913, then the death certificates for Stokes County at Danbury will show the names of their parents.

You will also find your Brancis lineage on the same page with your Shelten lines. I started the Francis line-up with Mable Francis (date for her were not available), and then I carried the Francis line-up back to her parents, Robert F. (Bob) Francis and his wife, who was Mildred Hill. I happened to have in my files a full newspaper write-up of Bob's death in 1951, and that story gave the name of his wife and also listed the names of all their children, among them Mable Shelton. Notice I filed in Bob's birth and death dates, but I did not have the date of their marriage. Maybe you can fill out something on the parents and other ancestors for your Grandm Millie Hill Francis. I was able to line up five generations back from Bob Francis, and that's seven generations back for you yourself. Actually, there is quite a lot of Francis family history up in Virginia. It would mean a great deal to your lineage if you could determine the names of both the father and mother for Josie H. Simmons and for Millie Hill, for that would round out all of your own great-grand-parents of all names.

And now, I wamt to tell you about very special type of chart that do ever so often with the family coats of arms, and I am the only one whom I have ever known in all mh heraldry work years who could do such a chart. The project I am talking about is a multiple family chart which includes back through the four grand-parents for both a husband and wife. The chart is munkament on rippled white matboard which is 22 inches high by 32 inches wide. In the cencer is an oval title design of gold and black which shows the names of the husband and wife for whom the chart has been done. Then on each side of the center title there are two brief family tree diahrams which show the husband, hie two parents and his four grandparents on one side of center, and then on the other side is a family tree diagram for the wife, her two parents and her four grand-parents. Then grouped around the family tree portion of ghe chart, there is placed eight family coats of arms in absolutely full color. Each of the eight coats of arms is 4 inches wide by 6 inches high, and it absolutely shows every item which you have already seen on the full size designs that Sara Lou has for her families. Along with such an eight-design chart, I always do a full ten page booklet of single-spaced typed information which takes up each family and tells about it origin and a portion of its history and also includes an absolutely complete description of each of the eight coats of arms, telling where it originated and what every item on the coat of arms means.

You may not be in the least bit interested in one of these rather alaborate charts with the eight coats of arms, but I have done a goodly number of them. However, I have never done such a chart for anyone in Stokes County so far. I do the eight-design chart with the ten-page single-spaced typed booklet of historic stuff for even \$100. That may be more than you would be interested in investing, but you would not have to pay the \$100 until I had been able to finish the entire job, and I belive you and your husband would like it. However, if you think it too much and if you are no interested,

forget it and let me go ahead and do the individual coats of arms which you have already told me to do. I am surely not trying to oversell you on this elaborate idea, but the eight-design chart really makes a very elaborate decoration for the center of your parlor or den. And, just in case you may be interested, we already have the information that you need for you side pf the family, and we have your husband's Martin data. All extra we would need is the names of his Grandmother Martin (nzme bfore marriage) and the names of Richard's grandfather and grandmother on his mother's side of the family, including of course the name of his mother before her marriage. I am attaching a diagram of the chart to this letter.

And now, I turn my attention to Colleen Shelton Collins and her busband, Glenn Collins. You gave me the name of Glenn's father, his grandfather and his great grand-father, but you did not give me any of the dates for either one. I found in my records that Glenn's grandfather Elisha Collins married Tressie George, but I do not know who Glann's mother was nor do I know the name of his great-grandmother who was the wife of William Collans. I figure that that appecial branch of the Collins family was over in Patrick County. I seem to think that Collen herself may be a mistary of known cousin of Bruno, but I have not exactly figured out the line-up for her. Thou can let Colleen see the this letter and the diagrams which I am sending, and if she and Gleen should by any chance be interested in one of ghe eight-design charts, then all they would need to know would be to fill in a diagram back through the four grand-parents of each of them. I noticed that Sanders Odea Shelton married a Hill from Colorado, but I think Colleen would know the background of Mary Addie Hill through her parents. By, the way was Mary Addie Hill related in any way to the Hills of Stokes and Patrick.

Once more I say that I am not trying to oversell you or Colleen. I am just telling you what is possible in this stuff. If neither or you chould be interested, then I'll get to work on the five designs you have already requested and we'll forget the idea of a chart.

I have enjoyed being in touch with you.

I received your letter with the data concerning the various coats of arms that you would like for me to do, and I will be delighted to do them for you, but I am just checking with you as to exactly how many you want me to do do.

As I understood your letter you would like for me to do firt of all a Martin design and a Shelton design for you. Then you wanted me to do a Collins and a Shelton (one of each for Glenn Collins and his wife named Colleen Shelton Collins. Amd I right in thanking that Collen Shelton Collins is a sister to Bruno Shelton, who is you father: Then, I got the understanding that you would like for me to another Shelton for you brother named Wallace Leon Shelton?


Thatwould make five coats of arms altogether if I have the right understanding; and as I told you the coat will be \$10 for each one, making total of \$50 for the five of them. In addition there would be the charges mailing them by insured pail, so that they would not be damaged. HCWEVER, I DO NOT WANT WOU TO SEND ME THE PAY UNTIL I GET THEM DONE. I NEVER LIKE TO RECEIVED THE PAY UNTIL I HAVE FINISHED THE JOB.

And now I want to tell you about a very special type of work that I do with the family coats of arms, and I am the only one that I have seen do this type of project. It is a multiple-family chart which I do for a husband and wife, which portrays the family designs for the four grand-parents of the husband and the four grand-parents for the wife; all eight arranged on a rippled whive matboard and grouped about a sort of family tree outline which appears in the center. The entire chart is 32 inches long and 22 inches high.

I have done quite a number of thse large charts, and just as I said about the single designs, I never want to be paid until I finish the job, for som ething could always happen to block the work.

And as a matter of fact, I would appreciate (even if I only do the five single designs) if you could list the maiden names of the wives for each of the men you listed in you letter. I checked my own records for a good many of the families that you mentioned, and I found some information that I thought you woulr like.

I am typing in some added bits from my own records just below for several of the couples. I guess that you know that Manmon Hill, who married Mary Fulkerson was from Henry County. Also James Reston Hill was born in Virginia in 1792, and Sophronia Leake was born in 1806.

Dear Linda:

At long last I am finished with the coats of arms for you and Richard and for your brother, and also for Glenn Collins and Colleen. I am mailing all five of them in one package, for it will be cheaper to mail them in one package rather than sending one package to you and Richard and a secondpackage to Glenn and Colleen. I always try to wrap the packages safely for mailing and always aend them by first class mail and insured to help prevent damage to any of the designs. Since the packageing and the postage and insurance is quite expensive I have to add charges for the mailing.

In this case, with five of the coats of arms making a sizeable package, it will benesessary to add \$3 to the charges. Each of the five coats of arms is \$10, making a total of \$50 for the designs, plus \$3 mailing charge, and the total charges will be \$53. Of course three of the designs are for you and Richard and for your brother, so your part will be \$30. Theke two designs for Glenn and Colleen will be \$20. Then you and Colleen can just work out the split on the extra mailing charges, and I amd sure that it will not be enough to really hurt either of you.

I really enjoyed doing them for you folks, and I hope you will all like them. I am sorry it took me so long, but June (my wife) has been quite ill with a high blood pressure problem this summer, and I have had to help out so much with the household chores. She is much better now, and I am hoping that we may be able to come up to the Westfield and Francisco area before twoo long.

Colleen wrote me that she teaches, and that Glenn is also connected with the schools. I do not recall what kind of work you said that you and Richard do. Anyway I hope to see all of you if and when we get in that area.
