### Roll Explanation.

The "Roll" on each double page is intended to embrace a period of six months, five Sundays being allowed for each, to meet all requirements. Only one form of Roll is adopted for officers, teachers, and scholars; and the blanks at the top of the page are to be filled out so as to read, "Roll of Officers," "Roll of Teachers," "Roll of Infant Class," "Roll of Bible Class," "Roll of Class No. 1," "No. 2," and so on.

In Class Rolls, place the names of the teachers at the head of the list, between the second and third red lines, but do not include teacher in the addition to ascertain the number present, as this is done in the Roll of Teachers.

The percentage of attendance for each sabbath, or for the month or quarter, may be easily obtained by adding the lines "Present" and "On Roll," and dividing the former by the latter. This may be made an interesting feature of the school by having one or two banners to be placed over the two classes showing the best percentage of attendance.

### Summary Explanation.

Like the "Roll," the "Summary" is ruled to allow five Sundays for each month, but covering a period of only three months on each double page.

Extend from Sabbath to Sabbath the number "Present" and "On Roll," opposite the names of the classes in the left-hand margin, as in the form given. Add the columns "Present" and "On Roll," and place the aggregates in the proper blanks near the bottom of the page, so as to show the "Total Scholars" present and on roll. Fill the blanks for "Officers" and "Teachers" under "Total Scholars" with aggregates taken from Officers' and Teachers' Rolls. These three aggregates added together make up the "Grand Total."

The percentage of attendance of the entire school can be had as in the classes. Scholars transferred from one class to another do not affect the general aggregate of scholars, but only increase or diminish the classes in which such changes occur. The same is true if an officer becomes a teacher or scholar, or a teacher an officer or scholar.

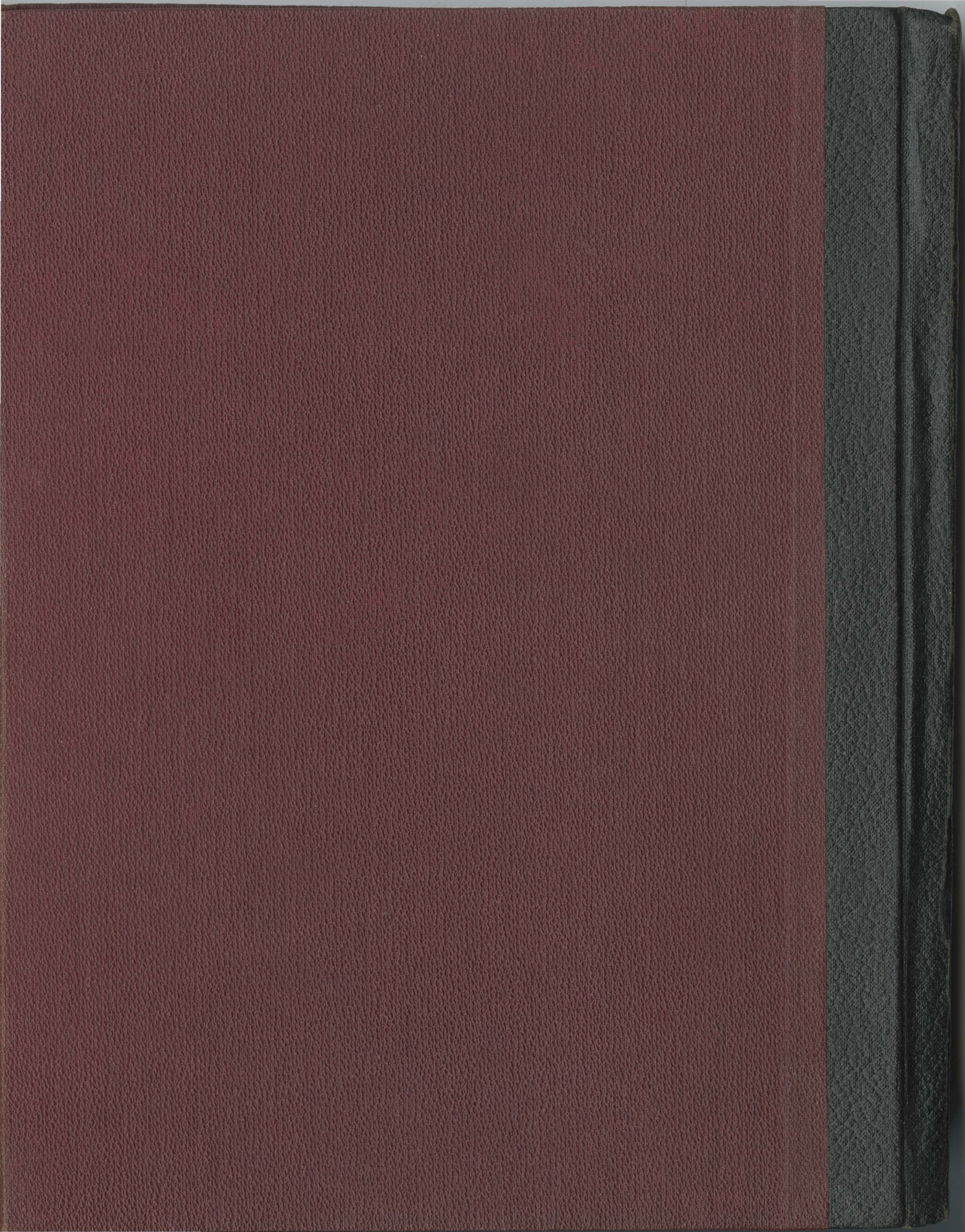

HAVE something quite funny to tell Marian's Church School teacher," said Mrs. Burton to a group of friends. "She has a lovely new fur coat. I commented on it at home and said I wished I had one, too. Marian said, 'Mother, why don't you teach in our Sunday School? Then you would get some money every Sunday and you could buy a coat.'"

"Children do think such funny things," added Mrs. Blume. "I was nine or ten years old before I knew that anything but a penny was acceptable in Sunday School. We sang a song about hearing the pennies dropping and I supposed nothing else could make the right sound."

"Is that what our children are thinking?" asked Mrs. Lauder, who was both a mother and a Church School teacher. "If it is, it is time we did something about it, both at home and in the Church School. Now, why don't we invite more of the mothers, and some fathers, too, and attend the next workers' conference to talk this over? After all, it's our Church School, too."

The Church School superintendent was surprised but cordial to the idea. A number of interested parents were present at the meeting. Mrs. Lauder introduced the subject by sharing the incidents which aroused the mothers, and added: "We want to be intelligent about this. What is the budget of our Church School? What are the offerings used for? What can we parents do to make the sharing of our gifts to the Church School meaningful to our children and to us?"

A statement of income and expenditures was easily given. It was discovered that the per capita giving was low and all the income was

used for necessities such as study and literature materials.

Mrs. Lauder was persistent. "I have been here long enough to know that we need some other things. We need to redecorate. We need more equipment. We need some things of beauty and color. We should be furnishing recreation for some of the groups. We should be sending some of the young people and teachers to institutes and conferences for training. We should be sharing in the church missionary program."

Mr. Ebright, the treasurer, said: "If we could keep up to the good-income days, we would have money for such a program, but just let a rainy day come, or a Sunday bordering a holiday and our income goes to the bottom."

"Yet we have to order supplies for our students whether they attend regularly or not. A number of the children and young people ask for their 'Sunday School papers' after absences," commented Miss Rafke, the literature secretary.

"Do they bring their *absent* pennies?" laughed Mrs. Blume.

"They do not," said Mrs. Lauder. "My little girl doesn't, and the members of my class don't. I never thought of it before, but we are allowing our children to be most unsystematic and careless in regard to their Church School obligations."

"I read somewhere," said thoughtful Miss Enger, the junior leader, "that in their first handling of money children are laying the foundation for their future attitude to it."

"I know a church in Jeffreys that has offering envelopes for the Church School members as

well as for the church," suggested Mr. Ebright. "I understand that the children and young people make pledges and the financial secretary sends statements to the homes each quarter."

"Why not get a report of how they do it?" asked Mrs. Grau.

A month later the group met again. Mr. Ebright had visited the church in Jeffreys. "Two years ago they must have been going on about as we are," he reported. "Someone got the idea of educating for giving and encouraged systematic and proportionate giving through a planned budget. Statements of both needs and income were sent to both the members of the school and the parents. Progress was reported periodically. It worked."

Suggestions came fast. Plans were made at once. In a short time the proposed budget was accepted.

The parents present formed a committee to help the secretary write a letter to other parents. In the letter they suggested that the responsibility be talked over in a family council and that, together, each family decide what each member would pledge.

The first response was encouraging. Mrs. Lauder insisted, however, that education in the meaning of giving must continue. She and Miss Rafke invited the parents to a Church School materials meeting. The teaching materials and the literature which went weekly into the homes were on display. A scrapbook of prayer poems and songs clipped from one year's numbers of the *Picture Story Paper* for primaries so delighted a group of mothers that they requested permission to look over the old materials in the cupboards that they might make

similar booklets. Another group went to a piano to learn the songs the children used. Picture strips of "Christmas Carols" and "Artists From Around the World Tell Me the Christmas Story" from the *Junior Weekly*, made into friezes, drew exclamations of delight. A group of fathers began planning to make things from the pages of "Fun to Make and Fun to Do" in the same paper. *Portals*, *Targets*, and *Classmates* made similar contributions. Vigorous demands of "Why haven't we known about this before?" were heard frequently.

At the end of the first year of the plan the local offerings had increased more than fifty per cent, and ninety-two per cent of the children and young people enrolled were regularly using the envelopes for systematic giving. It was discovered also that only fifteen per cent were using the "World Service" side.

Once more Mrs. Lauder protested. "We have educated for our own giving. We are enjoying the results. But we are not educating for sharing with others."

"The other day at the subdistrict meeting," said Miss Enger, "I discovered that there is a Department of Missionary Education in connection with our World Service. I saw some delightful little worship manuals on World Service activities for the different departments.\* I found them arranged some for twelve and some for six worship periods, including stories of the work, prayers, songs, Bible materials, and suggested activities."

The parents and the members of the Church School were off on a new educational adventure. Again it worked.

During the primary and junior missionary units investigations of the missionary offerings were made. The primary children played train, taking the World Service offering to the national World Service Treasurer, and then traveled to some of the other board headquarters with the make-believe checks and on to the mission lands they knew. The juniors outlined a large chalk map on their basement floor. They elected a national treasurer who seated himself at his desk and divided the World Service dollar to the different boards. There was no lack of messengers to carry the allotments. In turn the "board secretaries" sent the gifts on to the mission stations and schools around the world. There was increase in giving again; this time for the World Service work. Parents commented on the interesting reports brought home and discussed arrangements for allowances and earning money so that the children could make their own gifts.

The recurring units, either in the Group or Closely Graded lessons and the vacation church school texts, on missions and on the use of possessions, were used and emphasized as the needs of the groups indicated.

For variety and enrichment, which is essential with growing persons, there were the illustrated leaflets and pamphlets from the World Service Boards and the American Bible Society. These were used for supervised study, for reports, for scrapbooks, and collections. There were the phonograph records giving stories of missionaries in the cities, in the West, and other places. There were the striking photo enlargements of Africa, of India, of the Highlanders, of the city, and more. There were occasional personal contacts with Christian students from other coun-

tries and returned missionaries. There were visits to a mission, a hospital, an orphanage. There was the wide range of missionary reading books, so delightfully illustrated that one wanted to own them all. There were plays and costume parties and picture studies and festivals and worship. And always there was that awareness of the value of systematic and co-operative giving which continued to grow as study and enrichment and worship were provided.

The parents and teachers discovered that the double envelope system for Church School members was as important as it was for church members. Parents liked them because children carried their offerings more safely. Those responsible for the budgets liked them because the income was steady; rainy Sundays and holidays no more cut into the giving. Teachers liked them because it made possible more effective guidance in churchmanship and social consciousness. The growing persons liked them because they realized they were gearing into an important pattern. The thoughtful supervisor liked them because the boys and girls and young people were learning to accept responsibility, were coming to appreciate Christian co-operation and were experiencing the joys of being co-workers with God.

They discovered also that three things are necessary for the successful continuance of such a plan. First, the education of the parents, so that they may co-operate intelligently and share in the problems that arise. Second, a good system of recording and regular statements to the givers and their parents, preferably quarterly. Third, regular and repeated education.

Mrs. Lauder was right. She spoke for the parents when she said, "After all, it's our Church School, too."

*What Mrs. Lauder and her group of teachers and parents succeeded in doing, you, too, can do. You can begin now to talk with parents and teachers and to discover how much the Church School members know about what happens to their gifts of money.*

*In the next meeting of your Board of Education you can read together the story of what Mrs. Lauder and her workers accomplished. You can begin plans to help the parents and members of the Church School to see and recognize the financial needs of the church and to become acquainted with the friends around the world who, also, are members of the Church.*

*In your workers' conference teachers and other leaders may plan how they will guide their boys and girls to become aware of the needs of the boards and the Church around the world.*
