BY LAWS Section 1

This organization shall be called the Garden Gate Club.

Section 2

The object of this club shall be to study the culture of flowers, exchange ideas and to increase interest in gardening.

Section 3

A. The officers of this club **shall** be President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer.

B. Officers shall be elected alphabetically at the March meeting and shall serve one year. They shallbe installed at the June meeting.

C. Vacancies in any office shall be automatically filled alphabetically.

D. The affairs of the club shall be managed by an executive board consisting of the officers.

Section 4

A. Qualifications for membership shall be an active interest in gardening.

B. Total membership shall not exceed twenty-five.

C. All applications shall be made through the executive board in writing. If passed by the board these names shall be presented to the Club for election, at any time during the year, they shall be voted on by ballott, after being tabled for one month. A majority shall be sufficient to elect.

Amendment: If no applicant (when there are more applicants than vacancies) gets a majority of votes on the first voting, then the two applicants receiving the largest number of votes would be voted upon. The person then receiving a majority would be blected to the club, after being tabled for a month. The remaining applicants would be given first choice when and ifeanother vacancy occured.

Section 5

B. Three consecutive unexcused absences constitute a resignation after reminder has been sent by the Secretary.

C. Absence from the City or illness in the family constitute an excused absence, notice of this excuse must be sent to the Secretary or to the hostess prior to the meeting.

Section 6

Meetings shall be held on the third Monday of each month from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m. Other meetings shall be called by the President to meet the needs of the Club.

Section 7 The dues of the Club shall be \$2.00 per year, payable in April of each year.

Section 8

These by-laws may be amended at any meeting by a majority of the club membership, provided notice of intention to amend shall have been given one month before.
