

John Harp Jr. from John Harp Sr. Deed—1843—Deed Book 5 Page 171-172

This indenture made the day of ? In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three between John Harp Sr. of the county of Surry and state of North Carolina of the one part and John Harp Jr. of the county and state aforesaid, son of the said John Harp Sr. of the other part witnesseth that the said John Harp Sr. as well for and in consideration the natural love and affection which he hath and beareth unto the said John Harp his son as also for the better maintenance and preferment of the said John Harp Jr. hath given granted signed enrolled and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant own entroll and confirm unto the said John Harp Jr. his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land being and lying in said county of Surry and on the waters of Hunting Creek beginning at a chestnut on a branch running South ten degrees East ninety poles to a hickory Mullins/Mullices? Corner thence East forty poles to a rock thence North thirty three degrees East one hundred and thirty eight poles to a black oak in Finch's line thence North seventy degrees West ninety poles to a red oak then South ten poles to a white oak on the branch then down the meanderings of the same South forty five degrees West one hundred and sixty poles to the beginning containing and now laid out for seventy acres to have and to hold the aforesaid seventy acres be the same more or less together with every right title privilege and involvement to the same belonging or in any wise opportaining? Thereto and the said John Harp Sr. doth bind himself his heirs and assigns well and truly to warrant and forever defends the aforesaid land and promises to heirs the said John Harp Jr. his heir and assigns forever free and clear from the just claims of all persons whatsoever in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above written.
