First Generation

 Albert Harvey Jarrell was born 6 Apr 1835 in Rockingham Co., NC. He died 27 Feb 1923 in Patrick Co., VA and was buried in Salem United Meth. Ch. Cem..

Albert H. Jarrell married Jane Tickle on 11 Mar 1858 by A. Simmons (JP) in Surry Co. Bondsman was Ellis F. Jarrell (brother of Albert). (information from his marriage bond)

In the 1860 Surry Census Albert and Jane Jarrell had only one son, age 1 born in NC. His name was William.

Albert enlisted in the Civil War 5 Sep 1862 in Wake Co., NC. He was captured at Fredericksburg, VA 3 May 1863 and exchanged at City Point, VA 10 May 1863. Present or accounted for until captured at Kelly's Ford, VA 7 Nov 1863. Confined at Point Lookout, MD until paroled and exchanged at Aiken's Landing, VA 18-24 Feb 1865. (information from Reavis Lyons)

Albert H. Jarrell, Private, resided in Rockingham County and enlisted in Wake County at age 27, Sept. 5, 1862 for the war. Captured at Fredericksburg, VA, May 3, 1863, and exchanged at City Point, VA, May 10, 1863. Present or accounted for until captured at Kelly's Ford, VA Nov. 7, 1863. Confined at Point Lookout, MD until paroled and exchanged at Aiken's Landing, VA Feb. 18-24, 1865. (North Carolina Troops: 1861-1865)

Albert Jarrell (Civil War - Second CO A, Second Reg. NC Troops. Last Company raised in Surry Co., NC.)

1870 Surry Co. Census - Albert Jarrel, age 35, labour, b. NC, Jane, age 34, keeping house, b. NC; William, age 10 b. NC; Charlie, age 4 b. VA; John, age 8 b. NC; Elizabeth, age 2 b. VA.

Albert Jarrell applied for a pension in 1903.

In the 1920 Patrick Co., VA census Albert and Jane were living with Elizabeth and Milt Wilson. Albert was 84 and Elizabeth was 83. (per Shelby Puckett)

Albert Jarrell's funeral home record is dated Feb. 27, 1923. The order given by his son J. B. Jarrell. His residence at the time was The Hollow, VA, Patrick Co., VA. Funeral Service at Salem Church. Dunbar is the Clergyman. Religion is P. Bapt.. His occupation was farmer. He was 87Y 10M 21D. The price of his casket in 1923 was \$55.00, outside box \$5.00, Burial Robe \$12.00, hearse \$20.00. Total bill of \$92.00 was paid by cash March 1, 1923.

Albert married Jane Tickle, daughter of Solomon Tickle and Elizabeth, on 11 Mar 1858 in Surry Co., NC. Jane was born 1835 in NC/VA. She died 1931 and was buried in Salem United Meth. Ch. Cem..

Jane Tickle Jarrell's father Solomon Tickle left a will dated 25 Feb 1888 (WB 6, p. 281). She was named in his will as wife of Albert Jarrell. Her brothers and sisters were Linsy Tickle, James Tickle, John Tickle, Polly Dunbar (wife of William Dunbar) and Mandy Donnally (wife of Andrew Donnally), Ellen Tickle.

Jane Tickle Jarrell's grave marker shows her birth date as 1837. Buried at Salem United Methodist Church Cem.

Mary married Alonzo Shelton, son of C. Shelton, on 24 Dec 1902 in Hollow, VA.





WILL OF SOLOMON TICKLE. 25 Feb 1888. My executor shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends and shall pay all expenses together with all my just debts out of the money that may come into his hands as a part of my estate. My beloved wife Elizabeth Tickle so long as she remains my widow gets all the tract of land whereon I now live containing 50 acres adjoining Sam Brown on the south, James Tickle on the west, and Nils Brown on the east. My wife also gets \$50 out of my other tract of land containing 50 acres known as the Thomas Hodges tract. My executor shall sell said acres of the Thomas Hodges land on a six months credit and pay to my wife the above named \$50 and the remainder is to be equally divided among my five named children -- Jane Jarrell wife of Albert Jarrell, Linsy Tickle, James Tickle, John Tickle, Polly Dunbar wife of William Dunbar, and Mandy Donnally wife of Andrew Donnally. My wife also gets all my stock of cattle, hogs, sheep, bees, all my household and kitchen furniture, farming tools, wagon, all other personal property, all the provisions and the growing crop that may be on hand at my death. At the death of my wife Elizabeth, my daughter Ellen Tickle gets all my land I have willed to my wife and everything else willed to my wife provided she (Ellen) takes care of her mother and comfortably supports her so long as she lives. Executor: trusty friend Ellen Tickle. Witnesses: J H Nation and John F Johnson. Proved by John T Johnson. Probate 6 Oct 1888. (Surry Co., NC Will Book 6 - 1867-1901)

Joseph William Jarrell was 23 when he married Margaret (age 19) at Green Hill by F. Miller (JP). He lived in Patrick Co., VA and Margaret lived in Surry Co., NC.

Buried in Salem United Methodist Church Cem., Surry Co., his death date was typed as 1951 rather than 1947.

His birth date came from the 1900 Patrick Co., VA census.

G. Milton Wilson (age 24) married Betty Jarrall (age 25) in Patrick Co., VA. Performed by R. S. Collins, Minister.

Siblings of G. Milt Wilson were Frances Wilson who married James Samuel Martin, Sheralda who married John Edward Dellenback, Minnie who married an Estes, and Ellen who died young. (from Shelby Puckett)

Daughters Ethel and Fannie taught school. Ethel taught more years than Fannie. Neither of them ever married. (from Shelby Puckett)

Milton Wilson lived in the old Jarrell homeplace near Laurel Hill, Ararat, VA with his two daughters Fannie and Ethel. They never married and were school teachers and lived in the house until they died. Milton's relatives took care of them and ended up with the property which was sold to the current owners. Milton always kept the house in tip top shape when he was alive. It is not known for sure if Milton and his wife Betty lived in the house with Albert H. Jarrell and inherited it from him.

George and Elizabeth had the following children:

Birth and death date from Shelby Puckett. Shelby said, "That Ethel was her 4th grade teacher and I loved her. When my Aunt Mae Inscore was in the nursing home in Stuart, Miss Ethel came there, also. I saw her every day I went to visit, but by the time she came there, she didn't know me."

22 F ii. Fannie Jane Wilson was born 14 Feb 1905. She died 12 Sep 1992.

Birth and death dates came from Shelby Puckett.

- 6. James (Jim) Booker Jarrell (Albert Harvey) was born 5 Sep 1871 in Patrick Co., VA. He died 22 Apr 1965 in Forsyth Co., NC (Winston-Salem) and was buried in Pilot Mt. City Cem., Surry Co..
 - J. B. Jarrell was age 33 when he registered to vote 14 Oct 1904 in Mount Airy Township of Surry County, NC. Albert Jarrell was listed as his ancestor. (from the Grandfather Clause book)
 - J. B. Jarrell, blacksmith, lived at 207 Church Street in 1913-1914 Mount Airy Directory.

James Booker Jarrell was pictured in a local newspaper article on September 6, 1962. He was still active and a gardner at age 91. He lived in Pilot Mounain and was a former Pilot Mounain mayor. The article stated he didn't even have icing on his cake as he celebrated his 91st birthday. He wanted it that way. His favorite cake is pound cake-plain. He keeps active by growing a large vegetable garden and flowers. Gladioli are his favorite garden bloom. Growing orchids has been his hobby for years. At one time he had more than 30 plants which "bloomed fine" in a hothouse. Now that he no longer has the hothouse, he keeps only eight orchid plants. He also spends some of his time reading. He was born in Patrick Co., VA and moved to Mount Airy when he was a young man and lived there 30 years before coming to Pilot Mountain. In 1892 he married Ella Bell Scales. She died in 1931. He has one daughter, Mrs. Glenn Stone, with whom he makes his home, two grandchildren, Mrs. Dell Bargy of Burbank, CA and James Stone, a sophomore at the Univ. of NC and two g-grandchildren. After working with a Mount Airy furniture manufacturer, Jarrell moved here in 1925 at the age of 53. He dealt in country produce, principally eggs and chickens. He also bought rabbit hides from local farmers and sold them to manufacturers who turned them into hats and fur garments. "I could sell live rabbits for 25 cents each" said Jarrell, "and 25 cents was worth more than \$2 now." For approximately 30 years he operated a grocery store where the Pilot Mountain Fire Department now stands. He retired eight years ago. He served two terms as mayor of Pilot Mountain and also filled part of another mayor's term. He has been a member of the Methodist church for 72 years. (information from a newspaper article)

James Booker Jarrell died at age 93. He was a retired grocery store merchant and former mayor of Pilot Mountain. Buried in Pilot Mountain City Cemetery. (Mount Airy Newspaper article)





In a history of the Mount Airy Wesleyan Church, Ed Jarrell, husband of Lillie Jarrell, is mentioned as coming to the rescue and signed a note for the church. (The church needed \$600 for the building.)

William Edward Jarrell died at Northern Surry Hospital at age 67 of coronary thrombosis with infarction. He was a merchant and in WWI.

Her dad became ill in October 1983. She and her husband walways went back to Daytona Beach for his birthdays in June and had been there for his 85th birthday in June of 1983. They had no idea that there was anything wrong with him at that time. They got a called in October 1983 that he was ill. Her sister told her that she would have to come there because she couldn't handle any of the problems. Margaret went and stayed a week. Her dad knew he had to have surgery but delayed it until his pneumonia shot kicked in. Margaret returned to CA, got her work in order and obtained a leave of absence from the Corps, and returned to Florida in November. He had surgery Thanksgiving week of 1983. The moment she saw the doctor's face after the surgery, she knew things were really really bad. He had colon cancer which they removed and repaired but he also had cancer of the liver. He wanted to stay at home until the end and asked if I could help him. She stayed in Florida from November 1983 until June 1984. He passed away April 10, 1983. Margaret's husband retired from the Marine Corps and got there in February of 1984. He was able to help with Daddy until the end, for which she was so thankful. After her daddy passed away, Frances wanted to put

momma in a home where they let three or four old people live but I disagreed feeing that a place like that was inappropriate for my mother. When I talked with her, she said she wated to return to California with Margaret. Margaret had to be back to work the middle of June so she flew back and returned to work. Her husband stayed in Florida and flew her momma to CA then he returned to Florida and moved the things which momma wanted to bring to CA. That's the short version. The long version would bore you to tears and have me in tears. Margaret's husband stayed at home with her mother but her health continued to decline until she had to be put in a convalesant hospital in Laguna Beach on Valentine's Day in 1985. They took her to every possible type of doctor who ran all possible types of tests but were never able to determine what was wrong with her. Margaret felt that her mother just lost all will to live after her husbaband passed away. They had been married for over 57 years. Her mother passed on Nov. 7, 1985. Ben A. Jarrell, a retired farmer, born in Patrick Co., VA, age 93, went to Central Academy. His hobbies are hunting, fishing and beekeeping. He was the son of Joseph William and Margaret Terry Jarrell. The family farmhouse was filled with eight children, three sisters, himself and four brothers. He went to a one-room school called the Greenwood School until he was ten. When he was ten, he went to the two-room J.E.B. Stuart School. Growing up he hunted rabbits, possums and dated a lot of girls. He liked to fish and pick chinquapins. When he was 17, he discovered a money-making pastime-beekeeping. He paid \$50 for 11 stands. When the Patrick Co. school system ran out of grades for Ben, he went to private school at Blue Ridge Academy. He later had to drop out after a schoolmate pushed him off a dormitory porch and shattered his knee. He took blood poisoning and was

off a year. By then, he'd lost interest in books and school - at least for a while. He saved his money from working in tobacco to pay the \$6-a-month tuition at Central Academy. He was on a scholarship and he had to do a lot of work to go that cheap. He cut wood for the girls' dormitory and fed the hogs for the school. While attending Central Academy he met Alma Hancock who was a fellow student. He first saw her at graduation one year, then had to wait until the next year to meet her. They dated all through school. As the end of the school term neared in 1924, however, he was afraid that they might have to overcome parental objections to marry. They opted to elope. He didn't want to leave school without getting married. He got his brother to see the register of deeds and see if he would issue them a license under the circumstances. He told his brother if they could get a license, to send him a telegram saying "come home." When he got the telegram, he knew they could get the license and he told the teacher he was going to the doctor and went and got the license. On the night of April 28, the plans were ready. He had a brother and a friend to help him get a ladder to the second floor of the girls' dormitory. Another friend was waiting with a car to bring the couple to Mount Airy. Alma had to make her escape from another girl's room after nearly being caught by a teacher. Ben carried Alma to his brother Ed's house, he was married. He went to another brother's for the night. The next morning they got married by the justice of the peace. They lived with his parents for a time, then rented a house nearby and continued to help on the farm. They soon moved to Floyd County to be near the Hancocks and went from tobacco farming to raising pigs and cattle. In the fall he bought an old Model-T car and transferred it into a vehicle to haul pigs to make some extra money. He bought pigs for \$3 to \$5 and sold them for \$7. The couple were living in Floyd Co. when their two oldest sons, Eric and Tommy, were delivered by a midwife. Ben had typhoid fever two times while living in Floyd Co. The first time he was 12. Both times he was laid up while the fever ran its course - 21 days of fevers higher than 102 degrees. People died of typhoid back then. At the beginning of the Depression with two small sons, the Jarrells moved to Mount Airy and rented a house on Worth Street while Jarrell cut curbing at the local quarry. He built a four-room house on borrowed money. The house was painted white and was always called "The White House." They lived there for a time before losing it as the Depression deepened. When they lost their home, they had four children and a cow. They moved to an orchard five miles north of Stuart, VA where Jarrell worked for \$9 a week. They stayed there almost a year. At the end of that time, Ben brought his family back home. They moved in with his parents and stayed until able to rent another house. This house was a "three-room shack" on a farm near his father's. He lived there and tended his dad's farm. The man that owned it wanted to sell it. His father had priced it once for \$65 an acre. Bbut he ask Ben if he would give him \$5 an acre for it. Ben gave him \$5 an acre for it in 1933. Ben said when he bought that house, if he had sold everything he owned, including the cow, it wouldn't have brought \$50. The next year, tobacco allotments were handed out for the first time based on what tobacco had been raised on land in previous years. He planted an acre and four-tenths the first year and it brought \$515. He did the same the next year and it brought \$515. He paid for that place the second year. They lived in the house some time and built a new seven-room house right beside it for \$1,300. He had to borrow the money and they lived in it for five years. A better home wasn't the Jarrells' only building project while they lived in Patrick Co. They also started the Willis Gap Church even before they got around to building their new home. They didn't have a church to go to. Alma wanted a church and he wanted a church. They had preaching in a man's house and they decided to build a church from that. They were Methodists but everyone they talked to wanted a Baptist church, so they had to change. Alma walked house to house soliciting money. Neighbors donated the land and timber for the church and the monetary contributions were used to pay the carpenter. When they got the church built, they didn't have any music. Alma bought an organ and learned to play it and she led singing and taught Sunday school. Ben was a charter deacon and charter member. They had to walk two miles to church and each one of them would carry a baby because they didn't have a car. In 1947 the family picked up for one last move, this one to Surry County, NC. He bought a farm on Racetrack Road with a six-room house he had built there. On the farm he raised tobacco and miled cows. He bought his first Ford tractor in 1949, then traded it and \$1,000 for a new model in 1955. He and Alma became active members of Antioch Baptist Church where he served as a deacon and Alma taaught Sunday school for 35 years. He also joined the Round Peak Masonic Lodge and earned his 25-year pin there. They had been married 68 years when she died in February 1993. He said, "We never thought about getting a divorce. She was a wonderful woman, and I loved her very much. My preacher said I've been left here for a reason." Ben said that he'd outlived many of his peers. (from the Ben Jarrell Profile in The Mount Airy News in Feb. 1995)

Ben and Alma enjoyed playing rook and rummy through their years together.

Ben A. Jarrell, age 95, of 165 Race Track Road, Mount Airy died Sunday, April 20, 1997 at Northern Hospital of

Surry County. He was a member and former deacon of Antioch Baptist Church, a member of Round Peak Masonic Lodge #616 A.F. & A.M., attended Central Academy High School and was the last one of eight children. Funeral services were held Tuesday, April 22 at 2 p.m. at Antioch Baptist Church conducted by Rev. Quinten Madden, Rev. John D. Bowman and Rev. Gary Bainton. (information from his obituary)





For Ben Jarrell, the past is as fresh a memory as this morning, though his past reaches back to 1901 and his memories span almost a century.

Slowed some by diminished hearing, blindness and the loss two years ago of his beloved wife Alma, Jarrell is still free to wander through the past and easily recounts events from his childhood in Patrick County, Va., Depression years in Mount Airy and raising nine children while working the land.

Born May 26, 1901 in Patrick County, Jarrell was the son of Joseph William and Margaret August Terry Jarrell. The family farmhouse was filled with eight children, Jarrell having three sisters and four brothers.

"I went to a one-room school called the Greenwood School until I was 10," he said. "We were supposed to go five months for a school year, but sometimes the money ran out and we'd only go three. When I was 10, I went to the two-room I.E.B. Stuart School."

Growing up, he said, "I rabbit-hunted and 'possum-hunted and dated a lot of girls. And I used to like to fish and pick chinquapins."

At age 17, Jarrell discovered a money-making pastime — beekeeping. "I bought a bee yard," he said. "I paid \$50 for 11 stands. I always kept bees up until about four years ago when I went blind. I used to be able to see a honeybee at 50 yards, or further if it was flying into the sun. I've always been crazy about bees."

Jarrell abandoned his mission to help track the rabid dog, and they soon found his tracks. "There was snow on the ground and we could see the dog had went toward my house. I was keeping sheep then, and I was just sure he'd got in my sheep. But he came to a board gate that he couldn't get through and he had turned around and was coming back.

"When we saw him, he was running toward us, and the boy shot him, but he didn't fall; he kept on coming. It was a single-barrel gun and he had to reload and the dog was coming at me. There was a log across the creek nearby and I jumped on that log. When the dog jumped for the log, it fell, and that (boy) shot it again

before it could get up."

Jarrell had typhoid fever for the second time while living in Floyd County as well, he said. The first time, he was 12. Both times he was laid up while the fever ran its course—21 days of fevers higher than 102 degrees. "Back then they didn't know how to treat it—people died of typhoid then," he recalled.

At the beginning of the Depression with their two small sons, the Jarrells moved to Mount Airy and rented a house on Worth Street while Jarrell cut curbing at the local quarry. He built a four-room house on borrowed money. The house, painted white, was always called "The White House," Jarrell said, and the family made payments on it and lived there for a time before losing it as the

He hired a neighbor with a stump puller to take care of the old house. "He pulled it up in the field and we turned it into a chicken house."

A better home wasn't the Jarrells' only building project while they lived in Patrick County, however. They also started Willis Gap Church, even before they got around to build-

ing their new home.

"We didn't have no church to go to," explained Jarrell. "(Mrs. Jarrell) wanted a church, and I wanted a church. We had preaching in a man's house, and we decided to build a church from that. We were Methodists, but everyone we talked to wanted a Baptist church, so we had to change."

Jarrell said his wife was largely responsible for making the church a reality. "She walked house to house soliciting money. People gave their promise, some for \$2, some for \$10. She walked all over that place."

Other neighbors donated the land and timber for the church, and the monetary contributions were used to

pay the carpenter.

"When we got it built, we didn't have any music," Jarrell said. "My wife bought an organ and learned to play it, and she led singing and taught Sunday school for I don't know how many years. I was a charter deacon and charter member.

"We didn't have no car, so we had to walk about two miles to church and each one of us carry a baby," he

recalled.

The family had been living in its new house for two years when the final member of the family was born. By then the oldest son, Eric, was on when they lost their house in town, the couple had four children and a cow, he said. They moved to an orchard five miles north of Stuart, where Jarrell worked for \$9 a week. They stayed there almost a year.

At the end of that time, Jarrell brought his family back home. They moved in with his parents and stayed until becoming able to rent another house. This one was a "three-room shack" on a farm near his father's, and Jarrell lived there and tended his dad's farm.

"The man that owned it wanted to sell it," Jarrell said, "and his father had priced it once for \$65 an acre. But he came up to me in Mount Airy one day and said, 'Will you give me \$5 an acre for it?' It kind of scared me. I think the Lord had a hand in me getting that farm. I gave him \$5 an acre for it in '33.

"When I bought that house, if you had sold everything I owned, including the cow, it wouldn't have brought \$50," Jarrell said.

The next year, tobacco allotments were handed out for the first time based on what tobacco had been raised on land in previous years. "I got an acre and four-tenths. Some people lied and got more, but that was all I got. I planted an acre and four-tenths, and that first year it brought \$515. I planted the same the next year, and it brought \$515. I paid for that place the second year."

Jarrell added that the family continued to grow and to live in the small shack. "We lived in that house I don't know how long. Then we built a new seven-room house right beside it for \$1,300. I had to borrow the money and we lived in it for five years."

War II.

In 1947, the family picked up for one last move — this one to Surry County. "I didn't want to leave the house," said Jarrell. "But there were no roads, and we couldn't get in and out with the car once we got a car. So we decided to sell it and get another place."

Jarrell bought a farm on Racetrack Road, and still owns about 40 acres of it along with the six-room house he had built there. On that farm he raised tobacco and milked cows. He bought his first Ford tractor in 1949, then traded it and \$1,000 for a new model in 1955.

He and his wife became active members of Antioch Baptist Church, where he served as a deacon, and Mrs. Jarrell taught Sunday school for 35 years.

Jarrell also joined Round Peak Masonic Lodge, and earned his 25-year pen there.

The final Jarrell child, Aleene, left home in 1965, and Jarrell retired that year as well, he said. He had more time, once again, for the fishing and hunting he enjoyed as a boy.

He also had time for travel, but said he never did much of it, although he and his wife did get around Surry County.

The Jarrells were married 68 years when she died in February 1993, he said. "We never thought about getting a divorce. She was a wonderful woman, and I loved her very much.

"My preacher said I've been left here for a reason," said Jarrell, adding that he's outlived many of his peers. "He said the Lord still had work for me to do."

In the profile of Dr. W. Eric Jarrell Nov. 3, 1991 his occupation is physician, age 65, born in Floyd, VA. He has a B.A. in Psychology from the University of VA in 1950 and Doctor of Medicine from the Univ. of Virginia Medical School in 1954. His hobbies are woodworking and photography. He is married with two daughters and a son. He enjoys making small tables and chests for his home. He spends much of his free time in his workshop. He came from a large family, eight siblings consisting of six brothers and two sisters. He was the oldest which presented him with quite a bit of responsibility. He grew up during the Depression on a Virginia farm. They raised tobacco and the food they ate. He helped with the chores, caring for the tobacco, feeding the livestock. The farm was the

family's sole means of support. The family income was very low and his family was unable to help him through college and medical school. When he was in the Navy he decided to become a doctor. He was drafted and served 2 1/2 years as a hospital corpsman during WWII. Besides dispensing aid to sailors, he also was stationed in China to do the same for Marines, who had no medical corps. Jarrell worked temporarily in dentistry which he found at the time to be a limited field. This further convinced him to become a doctor. After returning to the States, he enrolled at the Univ. of VA. Between the G.I. Bill, the Virginia Rural Medical Scholarship and a rather interesting part-time job, he was able to pay his tuition. He drove a bus for Trailways for six years while he was in medical school. He drove on weekends, holidays and summers.. He drove the bus until he began his junior year of medical school. He ended up driving 150,000 miles for them, he said. He and his wife Jewel married in 1953. He had a year of medical school to go. During his final stretch of schooling, he worked for Dr. A. M. Gates in Ararat, VA during the summer. His duties included helping in the office and making housecalls. After Gates died in July 1955, the locals asked Jarrell to return to Ararat and serve as the community physician and in September 1955 he arrived. He stayed there for three years. When Norther Hospital of Surry County opened in 1957, Jarrell was on its first board, a position he still holds and he was chief of staff in 1965. In 1958 he moved his practice from Ararat to Mount Airy on North Main Street.. In 1978 Dr. Jarrell won the Distinguished Patrick Countian Award. Dr. Jarrell said he delivered about 3,000 babies before he quit delivering in 1974. However, nine years later, he did deliver his oldest granddaughter. Doctor Eric Jarrell, age 72, ended his long medical career of 43 years in November 1998. Dr. Jarrell finished his career at the Jarrell Family Practice on North Main Street, Mount Airy. He was on the staff of Northern Hospital of Surry County since the hospital opened in April 1957. Dr. Jarrell said he was retiring in order to relax after a lifetime of hard work. He siad, "I'm tired, and I'm way past retirement age, and I want to have some free time. I have a lot of hobbies. I do woodworking, build furniture and grandfather clocks. I plan to spend a lot of time in my woodworking shop. I do a fair amount of photograph and I'm planning to travel some. And my paramount priority is to visit my grandchildren." (The Mount Airy News November 16, 1998)

Dr. Eric Jarrell was pictured in The Mount Airy News March 31, 1999 as a member of the new Mount Airy Community Foundation. Local Leaders formed this foundation who were interested in building the charitable resources of the Mount Airy region. The Foundation's purpose is to help individuals and organizations build endowment funds for a wide variety of charitable purposes.

Dr. Eric Jarrell celebrated his 80th birthday with his family with a dinner at Cross Creek Country Club on March 10, 2006. On March 14, 2006 friends gathered for dinner with Dr. Jarrell at Cross Creek also. He expressed appreciation to each of them for being there and his gratitude that poor physical health had not impeded his ability to recognize the value of this very special event.

Dr. Wilburn Eric Jarrell, 83, of 700 Country Club Road, Mount Airy, passed away at his home. Dr. Jarrell was a family physician, retiring in 1998 after 43 years of doing what he loved best, improving patients' health. He was proud of his military service, having served as a pharmacist mate 3rd class at Iwo Jima and Okinawa during World War II, where he witnessed the raising of the flag in Iwo Jima. He also served with the First Marine Air Wing, Headquarters Squadron in Tientsin, China. Upon completin of duties, he entered the University of Virginia for undergraduate studies and in 1954 received his medical degree from the University of Virginia Medical School. Dr. Jarrell was a past member of the American Academy of Family Physicians, a lifetime member of the North Carolina Medical Society, the American Medical Association, and the Surry-Yadkin Medical Society. When serving as a member of the staff at Northern Hospital of Surry County, he helped design the hospital's first Coronary Care Unit, initiated the establishment of the Medical Examiner's system in Surry County, and served the county as its first Medical Examiner. Upon certification, he became a member of the American Association of

Medical Review Officers. He was an original member of Surry Medical Ministries and upon retirement assumed the position of Interim Director of the Surry County Health Department. Dr. Jarrell also held the position as adjunct professor at East Carolina Medical School. In 2004, he was proud to be inducted into the Thomas Jefferson Society at the University of Virginia. Raymond C. Eaton, age 37, of 191 Reynolds Oak Drive in Axton, VA surrendered to law enforcement officers during March 2000 after firing shots at Henry County sheriff's deputies. His mother Claudine Eaton of Crystal River, FL said she asked neighbors to warn local officers that her son had received a shipment of explosives. They were told the day of the standoff but not before. They searched but did not find any. The standoff lasted nearly nine hours. Police used tear gas to flush Eaton out of the house. No one was injured. His mother said he was not a criminal but he's mentally ill and needs help. He was diagnosed with paranoid schizophrenia in late 1992 in Martinsville and has been receiving social security benefits for his disability since 1993. Raymond attended Druid Hills Elementary School and Martinsville High School before he dropped out of school because his illness was getting worse. He spent a few years at the former Glade Valley School in Sparta, NC which treated young people with psychological problems. He had been a private mental facility in Roanoke and another at Danville's Southern Virginia Mental Health Center. His older sister Mary Bainton of Columbia, SC said Raymond has a talent for woodworking and using his hands. He was an artistic young man who saw beauty in many things until he got sick. The family tried to get help for so long, they hope the legal system will evaluate him and get him into a hospital. Eaton has refused treatment because he thinks nothing is wrong with him. It's easier to help help for a child than for an adult she said. (information from a newspaper article March 22, 2000)

Friends of Eaton say he is a loner who needs help. Kevin Booth said he used to live near Eaton and has known him for about 20 years but had not seen him since Booth had moved about a year ago. Booth helped build parts of Eaton's house. The house Eaton was living in is at the end of a hilly, quarter-mile dirt path leading off the end of Reynolds Park Drive and was built with his own hands with help from friends. The building is not yet complete and the front door remains about eight feet off the ground. Before building the block house, Eaton was living in a shack on the property and before that, a tent, Booth said. He lived in the tent for about a year, hunting for most of his food on the 10 acres where he lives. He didn't ask for a whole lot, Booth said. He moved there about five years ago after he returned from Key West where he lived on a sail boat for about a year. Eaton reads a lot and has many interests such as history, firearms and scuba diving. He often went to the library. He also was concerned with

local government issues. Booth said he recalled one time when Eaton's car, a Nissan 300 ZX, broke down. Eaton read a manual on how to repair automobiles. He tore the entire car apart and fixed the problem and put the car back together right there in his drive way. Another friend Mitchell Walsh said he and others tried to get help for Eaton abut three years ago but authorities said there was nothing they could do unless Eaton posed a danger. So he got worse and people quit going to see him. Booth's sister Amy Booth said, "He's a good ol' guy who likes to do things his way.. he just wanted to be left alone..he never harassed anyone sand he didn't want to be harassed." Eaton was charged with two counts of attempted capital murder, two counts of using a firearm in the commission of a felony and two counts of feloniously damaging property. 



Sailor Remembers Nagasaki Visit

A half-century has passed. Carl K. Anderson and his wife of 50 years, Era, live in their comfortable home at 2826 Riverside Drive, have done so for years.

But in addition to their memories of a lengthy, happy marriage, the couple shares other memories,

Such as recollections of a time when the world was engaged in its second "War to End All Wars."

Carl Anderson was a sailor in the U.S. Navy.

If his memories of those times ever need jogging, his home provides the spur — a picture of the vessel on which he served, the USS Schmitt, and the framed flag that proudly waved above that U.S. ship as it steamed into Nagasaki, Japan, only a few short weeks after the U.S. had used its atomic bomb for the second

time — Hiroshima was the first target — and World War II ended,

Anderson was only 17 when he joined the Navy.

The son of the late Mr. and

Mrs. James T. Anderson of Claudville, Va., he attended Francisco School, both the elementary and high school, in the edge of Stokes County, nottoo far from Westfield.

Like so many other young men in the early 1940s, Anderson called a halt to his school career to begin another, one a great deal more dangerous — helping wage war against Japan and Germany.

and Germany.

"It was in March 1943 that I entered the Navy," Anderson recently recalled. "I joined in Raleigh.

"I was 17 and World War II was going on," he said. That was reason enough for joining the Armed Forces.

He took his boot camp — it lasted eight weeks — at Bainbridge, Md. From there, he went to Norfolk, Va. where he underwent seamanship training for about three weeks.

From Norfolk, he went aboard the USS Schmitt APD 76, his home away from home during his service career, a duty that lasted for very nearly 33 months. The Schmitt was commissioned July 24, 1943 and made its first voyage on Oct. 19.

"We made 18 crossings to Europe. Africa and South America, Ander-

son mused.

"We left Europe (for the U.S.) in November 1944 and I received a

30-day leave."

It was during that leave, on Jan. 30, 1945, that Carl and Era Anderson were married. They had been dating

for almost two years.

After his marriage and return aboard the Schmitt, Anderson went to the South Pacific, via the Hawaiian Islands and was a part of the invasion of Borneo, "probably the last invasion of World War II," Anderson recalled.

"We invaded Borneo, putting ashore the Australian Marines.

"Aboard the Schmitt was an underwater demolition team. We blew up obstacles in the channel so the invasion forces could land."

The Schmitt led the first 17 waves of landing craft to the beach at

Balikpapan on July 1.

The vessel had screened the bombardment missions between June 23 and 28 and the UDT personnel carried out night reconnaissance operations. The ship left Balikpapan on July 3.

From Borneo, Anderson and the Schmitt came back to the Hawaiian Islands and then returned to the United States, where the UDT personnel disembarked at Oceanside, Calif. While the ship was under repair, from Aug. 4 to 18, the war in the Pacific came to an end.

"When the war ended, we immediately went back to the Hawaiian Islands and picked up another UDT

(underwater demolition team).
"From there," he continued, "we went back to the central Pacific, the Philippines and up to Okinawa, then

to Nagasaki, Japan.

"We took a underwater demolition team into the second largest naval station in Japan, Sasebo.

Sasebo is 30 miles from Nagasaki. When the Americans entered Sasebo on Sept. 27, 1945, it was about a month after the U.S. dropped the atomic bomb on Nagasaki. That was the second one; the first was against Hiroshima.

"Everything was kamikaze, everything was suicidal," a member of the team of underwater demolition

experts once recalled in a newspaper interview. They expected to be killed as their ship entered the harbor, he

The Schmitt was a test ship, the underwater demolition expert said. "Day and night, every moment we were there, every member of the crew was on guard and all the guns were ready to fire."

The Schmitt was one of three ships ordered in to clear the way for troop ships after the Japanese announced

their surrender.

"That is where I got the flag. We were the first U.S. ship into Sasebo, to check it out. The flag flew aboard the USS Schmitt.

"The flag is encased in a big frame on a wall in my living room. This flag

did fly at Nagasaki.

No one knew the after-effects of the atomic bomb, the radiation effects. But Anderson recalled, "Our watches stopped and electric motors had all sorts of problems.

"It was caused by radiation, which we knew very little about.' "After we came back, there was a

high rate of cancer among the crew. Anderson did not escape unharmed, either.

"I have had cancer...in 1990, I don't know if that caused it or not."

While in Sasebo, the Schmitt carried out four days of beach reconnaissance, followed by two additional days on nearby islands.

Anderson was discharged from the Navy in November 1945.. "I did a number of different jobs, but would up in construction, in the building business," he said. "I am now retired."

In 1955, Anderson and his shipmates had a reunion. The man in charge of communications had the Schmitt flag, Anderson said.

"We went 36 years without a reunion. Era and I worked on it and the reunion was held in Greensboro.

"This man, in gratitude for us helping get the reunion up, gave me this flag...'

Anderson's ship, the USS Schmitt, was named for a Navy chaplain, the first Catholic chaplain to die in World War II.

Schmitt died after saving the lives of 12 men when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor. He received the Navy and Marine Corps Medal posthumously for his courage and selfsacrifice.







Dr. W. Eric Jarrell likes to work with his hands. He proudly shows off the small tables and chests he has crafted of cherry and walnut to visitors. The furniture is placed throughout his spacious home - although he notes he has a hard time hanging onto his creations.

When his children make their annual holiday visits, they always seem to take something back with them.

Jarrell encourages this, since he spends much of his free time

in his small workshop.

"My wife calls herself a shop widow," Jarrell says.
When talking with Dr. Jarrell, one becomes immediately aware
of the restless spirit that drives him. His frequent habit of tapping his fingers or the alert way he responds to questions (reel-

ing off names and dates without hesitation) add up to a man who is always thinking.

"I come from a large family; eight siblings — six brothers and two sisters. I'm the oldest, which presented me with quite a bit of responsibility," Jarrell said. "When I was growing up, things were pretty tight. I grew up during the Depression on a Virginia

"We raised tobacco and the food we ate. ... I helped with all of the chores, caring for the tobacco, feeding the livestock ... the farm was the family's sole means of support. Of course, our income was very low and my family was unable to help me through college and medical school," he said.

But it was the Navy that finalized Jarrell's decision to become a doctor. He was drafted and served 2½ years as a hospital corpsman during World War II.

Besides dispensing aid to sailors, Jarrell also was stationed in China to do the same for Marines, who had no medical corps It

China to do the same for Marines, who had no medical corps. It was here that Jarrell worked temporarily in dentistry, which he found (at the time) to be a limited field. This further convinced him becoming a doctor was his goal,

"I enjoyed my service years thoroughly, otherwise I would not Jarrell said

After returning to the States, the young man immediately prolled at the University of Virginia to begin his studies.

Between the G.I. Bill, the Virginia Rural Medical Scholarship and a rather interesting part-time job, Jarrell was able to pay his tuition.

"I drove a bus for Trailways for six years while I was in medical school. I drove on weekends, holidays and summers ... I was hired as an experiment the company was holding to see if students from the university could help them during their busiest times," Jarrell revealed.

"I kept driving until I began my junior year of medical school. ... I enjoyed it. It was good pay and they paid us the standard rate per mile. ... I ended up driving 150,000 miles for them," the

physician continued.

The early 1950s also brought marriage into Jarrell's life. He and his wife Jewel were wed in 1953. Jarrell had a year of medical school to go, but says that "everything worked out fine" for the newlyweds.

The only delay came when Jewel became pregnant and had to take some time off from school, graduating later than her hus-

band in 1956.

During his final stretch of schooling, Jarrell worked for Dr. A.M. Gates in Ararat, Va., during the summer. His duties included helping in the office and making housecalls.

After Gates died in July 1955, the locals asked Jarrell to return to Ararat and serve as the community physician.

"They knew me, I knew them, and in September (1955) I arrived. I stayed there for three years to fulfill the obligations of the Virginia Rural Medical Scholarship I had received ... and this was before the new hospital opened, so I delivered babies in the home," Jarrell said.

When Northern Hospital of Surry County did open in 1957, Jarrell was on its first board — a position he still holds, and he was chief of staff in 1965. In 1958, he moved his practice from Ararat to Mount Airy on North Main Street, where it remains

today.

"I had moved to Mount Airy in June of 1956 and was living here and commuting to Ararat. I knew I wanted to move to Mount Airy to get closer to the hospital - but I still kept a large Virginia practice. One reason I located on the north side of town was so I would be convenient for my Virginia patients,"

the doctor stated.

Jarrell remains well-known in Patrick County, and in 1978 won the Distinguished Patrick Countian Award.

But when he first moved to Mount Airy, all local primary-care physicians were required to take a turn in the hospital emergency room. The doctors rotated the shifts, with each one covering at the hospital one day out of eight and on every eighth weekend.

"It didn't seem like a hard schedule, but when you were in there, it was rough!" the physician remembered.

Over his long career Jarrell has experienced firsthand the many

advances in medicine.

"Things have changed a lot. We have much better diagnostic equipment today and because of the new advances - even at a community hospital of this size we have the same diagnostic expertise as a larger medical center," Jarrell said, "Today, the

doctor is capable of making a more accurate diagnosis."

Another change the years have brought to medicine gives Jarrell much less satisfaction: "Today's doctor has to do an enormous amount of paperwork to comply with government regulations. That's the bad part of medicine today — paperwork."

Jarrell says he still has people walk up to him and remark, "I heard you're retiring." This is both an amusing and frustrating phrase for the veteran physician, since he has never announced his retirement and has no intention of doing so in the immediate

"I hope to practice medicine as long as I feel I have something to offer the public in the line of medicine," Jarrell said.
"If medicine gets to where I do not enjoy it, I might retire,

but right now I thoroughly enjoy my medical practice."

And, when Jarrell does retire, he certainly will not want for hobbies to keep him busy. Besides his woodworking, he is fascinated with photography, and has won awards for his elegant black-and-white work.

He also has trophies and photos brought back from Canada and other foreign spots where he used to travel with other local

physicians in search of big game.

Mounted heads of a mountain goat, a caribou and a stone

mountain ram are in his den, along with two small grizzly bear

Today, Jarrell says he has changed his attitude about hunting and no longer is involved in the sport.

In photographs hanging in the house, Jarrell is always wearing

a crew cut.

Why he used to wear his hair so short is a story in itself.
"I wore a crew cut because my hair was pretty wild and would stick up in all directions. I couldn't do anything with it—and when you get a call at 3 a.m. to come down to the hospital because someone has gone into labor, you don't have any time for primping," Jarrell said with a small grin.

'I delivered about 3,000 babies before I quit delivering in 1974. However, nine years later, I did deliver my oldest granddaughter. Dr. Waters set in with me. My daughter wanted me to deliver her first baby and I would have delivered her second, but

she wasn't living here," he added.

Jarrell is also quite proud of a set of full-term triplets he delivered on schedule in 1961 — the only set of triplets full-term or otherwise to be delivered in Northern Hospital of Surry County.

"As far as my philosophy about medicine, I believe any physician that is practicing should make an effort to stay on top of all recent developments," the doctor noted. "And, I've never been too proud to refer someone to a consultant or specialist.

"If I had a particular motto about an occupation or a hobby or anything, I guess it would be, 'You should never settle for mediocrity in whatever it is you are doing," the physician concluded.

This interest in her children led Jarrell to be involved in the organization of the Mount Airy Concert Organization, a precursor to the Surry Arts Council. "I had attended concerts all my life, and the road from here to Winston-Salem was so crooked that I was determined to have concerts here."

She and others interested in music worked together and arranged the necessary financial support to bring well known artists such as Maria Van Trapp and the Vienna Choir Boys to Mount Airy over a six-year period.

From there, Jarrell branched out to service on the Mount Airy Public Library board. She was a member of the board when the plan for the new library with its passive solar system was visualized, and when it became a reality. She is now on the Northwestern Regional Library board as well as the local board,

During the last 22 years, she has become a "seasoned trustee" at Surry Community College, which along with library and the concert series she lists among her proudest accomplishments.

"I became interested in the college stepfather, Haywood Merritt Sr. He

believed our community college could have a far-reaching effect on our area, so I accepted an appointment to the college board.

"True to his beliefs, the campus has grown and student enrollment has grown, and we all reap its benefits. We really grew in a positive direction, largely because we had the wise leadership of Dr. Swanson Richards (former SCC president.) It is a vital resource beyond high academic education.

"It is vital to remember that young people are our greatest resource and an investment in education offers the greatest return on our investment. either as parents or business and community leaders.

Jarrell said her continuing in-volvement with the library board and community college is almost like an extended family. "We have a friendly relationship. We may disagree, but in the end we give our united support to a goal.

"What I feel is important for my the things I try to get involved in.'

Despite her many outside interests, Jarrell said her family has always come first, "If my children need me, I'm there.

She says they were the impetus for many of the things she became involved in during their youth. "I realized a number of these things were vital to the development of my children. I knew that I needed to provide outlets and activities that were productive for them."

Jarrell lost one child, Eric Jr., who was killed in an automobile accident while a pre-med student at Duke University, a tragedy she doesn't dwell on. "That was the most devastating thing that ever happened to our family," she said. "It probably made the family stronger. I know it made all of us treasure life more and put our priorities in order.

"I think I probably face hurdles a little easier, too, I know I can handle anything if I faced that."

Jarrell continues to be an active part of the community and says she is happy to see her family's values continuing in another generation.

"My four grandchildren are an absolute joy. Sometimes I wonder what kind of job I did with my children, but when I see my children teaching family values and being active in the community to their own children, then that gives me the greatest satisfaction."

She said her husband has always at the encouragement of my late * been supportive of her efforts, which is vital. "He knows how important it is to do things for the community. He is busy with his practice and his woodworking hobby, and I chose to be productive with my time.

Jarrell said that she has no plans for retirement from her activities.

"I just always wanted to do. As long as I think I'm making a contribution, I'm going to do it and work at it diligently. I'll continue to do what I do as long as I have the physical health and mental faculties to do it."

involved in drug and alcohol testing," a spokesperson for the organization said.

The medical review officer is an integral part of drug testing programs mandated by federal governmental agencies, such as the Department of Transportation and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission as well as aviation and railroad agencies, Jarrell said.

Industry is also heavily involved in setting up drug testing programs, he said

The medical review officer determines the validity of drug test results.

"For a drug program to work properly, it is essential for an MRO to have a working understanding of the legal and technical issues involved," the long-time, local general practitioner said.

As a certified member, Dr. Jarrell will be listed in the AAMRO Registry, a national publication distributed to federal agencies, industries and busineses.

According to the AAMRO, "The medical review officer balances the protected rights of the tested individual and the compelling concerns for health and safety in the workplace and for drug deterrence. It is a new area of practice which involves physicians with diverse backgrounds."

The American Association of Medical Review Officers is independent of present medical membership groups and is designed to provide training and certification for physicians in different specialties.

Doctor Ends Long Career

For Dr. Eric Jarrell, the highlights of his 43-year medical career have been as varied as delivering the first multiple births born at Northern Surry Hospital, serving as chief of staff of the hospital 33 years ago, and practicing as both a rural and city general practitioner.

Jarrell, 72, has been on the staff of Northern Hospital of Surry County since the day the hospital opened in April, 1957, making him "the only remaining original staff member." He retired from his work as a general practitioner at 5 p.m. Friday, leaving his office in Jarrell Family Practice at the Aegis Family Health Center on North Main Street.

Dr. Jarrell was born March 14, 1926, in

Floyd, Va. He graduated from Blue Ridge High School in Ararat, Va., in 1943. After spending one semester at Bravard College, he was drafted into the military, and served in the naval medical corps for slightly more than two years, during which time he was involved in two campaigns, Iwo Jima and Okinawa.

Jarrell had originally planned to attend dental school, but after being in the military's medical corps and spending time with the patients, he decided to attend medical school.

He returned from the military in 1946, and enrolled at the University of Virginia, earning his bachelor's degree in 1950 and

subsequently enrolling in UVA's medical school. Following his graduation from medical school in 1954, Jarrell took a rotating internship at UVA's hospital in 1955, and then started work in Virginia, doing rural medicine. His start of work in Virginia followed the death of a Patrick County doctor whom he replaced

"When Dr. Gates died, the people just panicked, because we didn't have a hospital here," Jarrell said, "The hospital had burned. They panicked for a doctor, and they helped me move down, which I did, so I don't regret. I still have a lot of Virginia patients that patronize me here, patients that I saw

back in 1955 actually."

Jarrell worked at a private office as a general practitioner in Ararat, Va. from Sept. 1, 1955 until Oct. 1, 1958, following two months of practice in

Monterey, Va.

"The local physician died at Ararat the day I opened practice at Monterey, and I was not as busy as I wanted," he said. "The people were begging me, and calling and pleading with me to come back to Ararat to take over Dr. Gates' office. That's what I finally did." Dr. Jarrell had worked with Gates as a student extern in 1953 and was able to fulfill the requirements of his Virginia Rural Scholarship by working for the three years he did in Ararat.

After practicing in Ararat, Jarrell moved to Mount Airy in 1958, continu-

ing a general medical practice, along with obstetrics.

"In general practice, you are usually the first doctor that assesses a patient," he said. "If it's something you can treat, you can do it. If you feel like they need a special consultation, you try to pick the correct one and give that doctor all the information about the patient. You refer the patient for consultation."

Dr. Jarrell also did obstetrics for 24 years, ending in 1974, delivering babies. By the time he quit obstetrics, he had delivered 3000 babies. When his granddaughter was born in 1983, it had been requested that he deliver her, with an obstetrician "sitting in" with him as he performed the delivery.

He said there have been many advances in medicine and technology

over the course of his career.

"When I went to medical school, doctors were taught to do most of their diagnosis, with sight, touch and the ears," he said. "You listened, you looked and you felt. The (physicians) of today rely a lot more on technolo-

gy and laboratory work, MRI's, CAT scans, those things.

"Back then, we did laboratory work, we had X-rays, but we didn't have MRI's or CAT scans, and we didn't do cardiac catherizations. So medicine has advanced an awful lot. I feel like the old physicians, in that era, probably were better at physical diagnosis than the newer generation, but of course that's questionable."

Dr. Jarrell said he is retiring in order to relax after a lifetime of hard

work.

"I'm tired, and I'm way past retirement age, and I want to have some free time," he said. "I have a lot of hobbies. I do woodworking, build furniture and grandfather clocks. I plan to spend a lot of time in my woodworking shop. I do a fair amount of photography; I'll pursue that some, and I'm planning to travel some. And my paramount priority is to visit my grandchildren.

vides us with administrative, accounting, legal and financial assistance. This support enables us to concentrate on developing and eventually expanding our local resources."

People may start endowment funds through the Foundation for any charitable cause for as little as \$5,000. These funds will be invested and 5 percent distributed from the income each year, and additional earnings will be added back to the principal. An annual fee of one to one and one half percent, depending on the complexity of the fund, will cover investment and management services. The Foundation has trust agreements with all of the major banks and financial institutions in North Carolina; the donor of each fund may choose the asset manager.

The first meeting of the Foundation's board of directors recently took place and established the Mount Airy Unrestricted Fund. An unnamed donor contributed the initial \$7,500 to this fund and challenged the board of directors to match this gift by the end of 1999.

"This fund is the beginning of our grant-making endowment," Adams said. "We are confident that we will meet the challenge during the coming year."



Jarrell Dies In US 52 Wreck

Funeral services were held Monday for Wilburn Eric Jarrell Jr., 19, of Mount Airy who died in a single car wreck Saturday night on US 52 in Stokes County.

Jarrell, a 1972 graduate of Mount Airy High School, compiled an exceptional record in academics and athletics. He was a student at Duke University.

According to the report of Highway Patrolman T. J. Badgett, the accident occurred about 11:45 p.m. north of the King and Tobaccoville exit on US 52.

Mary Bainton of Columbia, S.C., Raymond Eaton's sister, said the neighbors told her the labels on the boxes clearly stated that they were explosives.

Cassell said officers were told about the explosives by neighbors on Monday, the day of the standoff. but not before.

"We searched for explosives and found none," Cassell said. "A team of our people and (Virginia) state police searched for that,"

The only thing officers found was a magazine showing how to make explosives, he added.

Eaton remains in the Henry County Jail without bond, Cassell

He has been charged with two counts of attempted capital murder, two counts of use of a firearm in the commission of a felony and two counts of feloniously damaging property, the sheriff's department

Claudine Eaton said her son isn't a criminal, but he's mentally ill and needs help. She said her son was diagnosed with paranoid schizo-

phrenia in late 1992 in Martinsville, and has been receiving social security benefits for his disability since

"So there was documentation that he is severely mentally handicapped," Eaton said.

He attended Druid Hills Elementary School and Martinsville High School before he dropped out of school because his illness was getting worse, his mother said.

Eaton spent a few years at the former Glade Valley School in Sparta, N.C., which treated young people with psychological problems.

He has been hospitalized a few times over the years, his mother said She recalled stints at a private mental facility in Roanoke and another at Danville's Southern Virginia Mental Health Center.

Bainton described her younger brother as a lovable child until he started getting sick. Bainton said her brother thinks he's the incarnation of religious figures, including Jesus Christ, that the government is trying to harm him; and that the family owned all of England at one time.

Eaton had a talent for wood-working and using his hands. He was an artistic young man who saw beauty in many things until he got

sick, Bainton said.

"We had begged the authorities to get him help," she said. "I hope the legal system will evaluate him and get Raymond into a hospital."

The Eaton family claims that law enforcement and mental health officials have been sympathetic, but have told them that until Eaton hurts himself, or someone else, there's little they can do to help.

Bainton recalled an incident a few years ago where her brother was evaluated at the Memorial Hospital of Martinsville and Henry County after he shot up his Axton residence. She said her brother has the ability to be lucid for about 30 minutes, but then his personality reverts back to its paranoid-delusional state, she said.

"We would like people to know that we tried to get help for so long," Bainton said. "People with his type of illness can do things like this."

Cassell said Eaton "probably" has mental problems, but he has been rational since he was arrested.

"I've seen no signs of delusions," the sheriff said. "He has been fairly rational since he talked to us.

Eaton said her son refuses treatment because he thinks nothing is wrong with him. There have been

these when the family didn't know where Eaton was living, but found at later he had moved to Key West, Ha., the family said.

"It's easier to get help for a child tan for an adult," Bainton said. "It sems the system is set up to protect the rights of the mentally ill to be nentally ill if they choose."

The Eaton family had lived in the Martinsville area for many years. Elton's father, Raymond Sr., was pincipal of Joseph Martin Elementary School from 1954-1981 and Clearview Elementary from 1981-1992, city school officials said. He didd in 1982, Bainton said.

The standoff started as two Henry County sheriff's deputies were attempting to serve two misdemeanor Franklin County warrants. Shots were fired at the deputies poice cruisers about 8:30 a.m., the sheriff's department said.

Nearly nine hours later, police used tear gas to flush Eaton out of the home. No one was injured.

Bainton said she had feared for years something like this would happen. She is grateful that no one was hurt, she said.

"Our fear has been that we would pick up the paper and read that he has shot 20 people," Bainton said.

Friends: Eaton a loner who needs help

Now, he's being held in the Henry County jail, and people who know him are quick to say he needs help, not a cell.

Eaton for about seven years. Ward said her husband, Mark Wingfield, has known Eaton all of his life and the last time they saw him four years ago. Eaton helped them with plumbing at their house near Leatherwood.

Before building the block house, Eaton was living in a shack on the property and before that, a tent, Booth said.

He lived in the tent for about a year. He hunted for most of his food on the 10 acres where he lives near Axton. Eaton is a "real woodsy type person" and didn't ask for a whole lot, Booth said.

The property is off the southwest side of Virginia 650 in the Iriswood District of Henry County and is owned by Eaton's mother, according to a deed in the Henry County Circuit Court Clerk's office.

Eaton moved there about five years ago after he returned from Key West, where he had lived on a sail boat for about a year, Booth said

Eaton reads a lot and has many interests such as history, firearms and scuba diving, among other topics, according to Booth. He became absorbed with whatever he was focused on at the time, he said, adding that Eaton had stacks of books in his house on different topics and often went to the library.

Eaton also was concerned with local government issues.

Iriswood District Supervisor Paula Burnette said she met Eaton several years ago when he called her to discuss the possibility of having the paved portion of Reynolds Park Drive extended to his property. The road was on the county's list as a rural edition so Burnette went to Eaton's house to discuss the paving.

Burnette recalled having a "decent conversation" with Eaton, not only about the road but also about other county issues, including a potential landfill site in the Iriswood District.

The site, near the water treatment plant on Beckham Church Road, was selected as a possible location for a landfill in 1992-1993, Burnette said.

"He was fairly knowledgeable about it (the landfill issue) and he knew the pros and cons," she said. Eaton was opposed to having the landfill at that location and was somewhat of an activist on the issue, she said, Ultimately, the county scrapped the site.

Burnette said she never felt threatened during her visit with Eaton

"He called about a normal county inquiry and that's what we talked about," she said.

Eaton is one of those people "who is very understanding of anything he reads," Booth said. For instance, he recalled one time when Eaton's car, a Nissan 300ZX, broke down. Eaton read a manual on how to repair automobiles and then tore the entire car apart. He fixed the problem and put the car back together, "right there in his drive way," Booth said.

"There is a fine line between genius and crazy ... and some teeter in between," Booth said.

Another friend of Eaton's, Mitchell Walsh, owner of Walsh's Chicken on Starling Avenue, echoed Booth's comments. He said he hasn't spoken with Eaton for about nine months but, like Booth, Walsh said he has known Eaton for about 20 years.

Walsh said Eaton's illness became progressively worse in recent months, making it more and more difficult to hold conversations with him Eaton would have lucid moments, Walsh said, but then would veer off and be difficult to follow.

Walsh said he and others tried to get help for Eaton about three years ago but authorities said there was nothing they could do unless Eaton posed a danger.

"So he got worse," Walsh said, and people quit going to see him.

Eaton is a nice, intellectual man and he refused treatment for his mental illness because he thought that he was fine, Walsh said. He thought it was everyone else who needed treatment, he added.

"Jail won't do him a bit of good." Walsh said.

Amy Booth, of Henry County, Kevin Booth's sister, said she knows Eaton through her brother. She hasn't seen Eaton in about two years but that's not unusual, she explained. Sometimes six months would pass and she wouldn't see or hear from Eaton. Then he might show up at her store, Martinsville Mercantile, three days in a row to visit, she said.

"He's a good ol' guy who likes to do things his way ... he just wanted to be left alone ... he never harassed anyone and he didn't want to be harassed." Booth said, noting the many "no trespassing" signs posted around his property.

Eaton is a "good fella. He just does his own thing ... he's just Raymond," Booth said in a maudlin voice.

Booth commended Henry County Sheriff Frank Cassell for handling the standoff the way he did and getting Eaton out of the house alive.

"I know Raymond didn't leave him (the sheriff) with a lot of choices," she said.

Eaton's family lived in the Martinsville area for many years. His father, Raymond Sr., was principal of Joseph Martin Elementary School from 1954-1981 and Clearview Elementary from 1981-1982, city school officials have said.

Area educators remember the family as a typical one and Ralph Shank, former principal of Druid Hills, said both Raymond Sr. and his wife, Claudine Eaton, were avid golfers.

"He (Raymond Sr.) was a real good man," Shank added.

Harold Cumberledge, a retired Martinsville educator, said he knew the Eaton family "reasonably well."

He knew they worried about their son and that Raymond Sr. was one of the most dedicated elementas ginia State Police officers.

Eaton has been charged with two counts of attempted capital murder, two counts of using a firearm in the commission of a felony, and two counts of feloniously damaging property stemming from Monday's incident, according to Vikram Kapil of the public defender's office. Kapil will represent Eaton

in court.

Eaton is being held in the Henry County jail without bond, Kapil said. A preliminary hearing has been set for May 11 at 915 a.m. in Henry County General District

Court, he added.

No one was hurt in the shooting or standoff and Eaton's mother said if her son had wanted to hit one of the officers, he would have. He is an excellent marksman, she noted, and shooting targets on the property confirm that "He wasn't trying to hurt anyone; he just wanted them to go away," she said.



Normally, everybody sday starts around 6. The children get up and get ready for school, and they're responsible for their own rooms. Sometimes they have to be reminded, but they're trying.

We have a light breakfast usuallyjust cereal and milk, and then we gather before Adrian goes off to work, and the children gooff to school. We have just a few minutes to read some Scriptures together or recite one that we've memorized, and then have morning prayer together before they go off. That's a nice way to start the day.

Having my first child was a big responsibility. I was nervous preparing for this little person to come into our lives, and an older lady, who was a friend of mine, said, 'The instructions come with the package,' and that put my mind at ease a little bit. With each child, the older ones have been able to help. Our children are real good to pitch in and run and get things for me.

Adrian takes the older children to school, and it's just Adam and me here and the three dogs, and we kind of go through the morning routine. I like to get everything cleaned up before I start anything else. I feel better when the house is organized.

We spend a little time straightening the house and finishing the laundry and we'll maybe spend a few minutes reading together. And then some mornings we'll go downstairs to the family room, and he'll ride his green tractor around or watch a video, and I'll get a little paperwork done. Some mornings we go out and do errands, do some shopping, or a doctor's appointment, or sometimes there are some school activities to attend. I think that's

important—to support the children at school. I don't do everything, but I try to go to the science fair or the spelling bee, or PTO meetings and parties, anything they're involved in.

It's called Family Home Evening, and every Monday night we have family time together. We have four responsibilities that we alternate. We have an opening song and prayer, an activity and a lesson, and a closing song and prayer and refreshments.

Adam and I worked together last spring on a lesson about nature. We did a little poster with birds that we'd seen in the spring, and we read a little poem. After our lesson on some topic—it might be faith or it could be better communication in a family, or family unity—we'll have a lot of fun just spending a few minutes playing Win, Lose or Draw on the chalkboard, guessing what everybody has drawn. Sometimes it's a board game.

In the summer we've gone out in the yard and played kickball or tag or something like that. It builds a lot of togetherness and helps us learn more about each other and learn more about the things that are important to us.

Sometimes it's hard to make sure you've got everything in balance and that you're focused on the right things. The most important thing is spending time with the family, but I also have other responsibilities, so I hope we have a balance in that. In the afternoons, I pick up the children at school, and once a week or sometimes once every two weeks, we'll go by the library, and then we come home and have after-school snack.

We've gotten in the good habit of starting homework early so then they

have that done and out of the way, and they can spend time doing other things. They don't always get it done right after school because there's a day during the week when they have lessons. Kristen has piano, and Ethan takes out.

the afternoon, and Adrian gets home I'll start supper sometime late in around 6. We do try to eat supper together most every night. That's that we're going to have our evening meal together. Some meals are more successful than others. I remember pretty much something we count on, one night I had fixed an especially nice meal, and we were just sitting down to the table when one of the children threw up. That kind of put a damper on the meal. A small child makes a meal lively, too. When the children were smaller there'd be food on the table around their plates, and food on the wall behind and food on the floor, and it kind of looked like the meal just exploded.

Adrian does help with the children. He's very sensitive to the needs of our family. He has a lot of responsibilities, too, but he is really good to support me, to spend time with the children and to help around the house. He can pretty much do anything.

Early in the pregnancy, I was really sick, and we came upon this sourdough bread-starter recipe, and we wanted to make the bread. I didn't really feel like being in the kitchen very much, so he learned to make bread. He's doing an excellent job at it, and I don't really feel a need to step in and take that responsibility away from him.

We strive for a bedtime of 9 o'clock. In years past, we have said 8 o'clock is bedtime, but 9 o'clock is what we shoot for. Here lately it

doesn't seem like we've achieved that goal as often as I would like, but that's what we try for anyway. Adrian and I are usually up after them finishing up some work that we need to take care of.

I have a degree in elementary education. I'm certified to teach grades K through four, so I could be out earning a living.

Sometimes I cringe a little bit when somebody says, 'Do you work?' Of course, I know what they mean. I usually say, 'Well, not outside the home.' I miss talking to adults. There have been times when Adrian and I were riding in the car without the children, and I'd catch myself spelling a word out loud to him or I'd say something like, 'See the cow.'

I know staying at home with the children is not something everybody chooses or that everybody can do. They are not able to for some reason, but, for me, I think it was the right choice, and I value the contribution I make to my family.

A lot is said about quality time, and I think that's important to spend quality time with the children, but I think quantity time is also important—that we need to be withour children as much as we can. I love being a mother. I love being their mother.

It surprises me how fast they're growing. I look at them, and I can't believe how fast the years have gone by. I think I have a lot of blessings. I've got a wonderful husband, and he supports me, and my children are good children, and they're trying hard to do what's right. I don't know what's going to happen tomorrow or what

challenges we might face in years to come, but I feel grateful for the family I've got right now.



HUSBAND - Fountain Jarrell

Fountain Jarrell is believed to have been born ca. 1801 in VA. Some researchers say Rockingham Co., VA. It is not known when he died or where he is buried. He would have died after 1873 and possibly after 1884. Fountain Gerralds is mentioned in a deed of Hillary Barker from the State dated 22 Aug 1884. At this time his parents are unknown.

Ben Jarrell told Wilma Hiatt that Fountain Jarrell came from Rockingham Co., NC. His family owned a big plantation there and that there was a family argument on dividing the land and he came to Surry Co., stayed awhile and went back to Rockingham Co. On the way back he was shot at so he came back to Surry and never went back to Rockingham Co. Ben said they had a lot of servants at the plantation.

Fountain Jarrell married Fanny Jarrell in Rockingham Co., NC on Dec. 25, 1821; Bondsman was Garland Jarrell; Witness was R. O. Galloway, Jr. (copy of marriage bond available)

Some family members say Fountain and Fanny had children Molly, Travis and George but no documention has been found to verify this. They have not been listed as children.

Probably all of their children were born in Rockingham Co., NC. Granddaughter Julia Fannie Jarrell (listed in the 1850 census of Surry Co.) was probably born in Surry Co. Family members say she was the illegimate daughter of Nancy Fountain Jarrell. Julia (July) Fannie Jarrell was listed as a Tolbert when she married.

Deeds found in Rockingham Co., NC were as follows:

A Deed of Trust No. 1837 in Rockingham Co., NC from Zachariah & Fountain Jarrell to Lloyd Waters of 2nd part and Reason Waters of 3rd part dated 21 May 1837. Zachariah and Fountain are indebted to Reason Waters in the sum of \$210.00. If debt and interest not paid by 15th day of November next, 237 acres of land adjoining Charles Galloway and John M. Boatright and others where Fountain Jarrell resides with all the ensueing crop of corn fodder, wheat, oats and tobacco of Zacheriah Jarrell to be sold at public auction. And if any residue from the said sale shall apply to the payment of a bond which Reason Waters holds against Zacheriah Jarrell for \$550.00 dated 14th day of August 1837. Signed by Zacheriah Jarrell, Fountain Jarrell, Lloyd Waters and Reason Waters and witnessed by James N. Moore. (copy of deed available)

A Deed of Trust No. 1864 in Rockingham Co., NC between Zechariah Jarrell, Miles D. King and Reason Waters. Jarrell indebted to Reason Waters in the sum of \$90.00 as referenced to a bond dated 10 Aug 1838. (copy of deed available)

A Deed of Trust No. 1873 in Rockingham Co., NC between Fountain Jarrell and Zacheriah Jarrell and R. P. Williamson dated 30 May 1838. Fountain Jarrell is indebted to R. P. Williamson by a note of ten dollars. (copy of deed available)

Fountain is mentioned in the deed dated 10 Aug 1838 from Zechariah Jarrell to Miles D. King, Trustee.

A Deed No. 2132 in Rockingham Co., NC from Zacheriah and Fountaine Jarrell to Josiah Bullington is dated 30 Jan 1840. Sold 417 acres of land for \$417.00 - Boatrights corner in William Roaches line to Galloways corner east with said Galloways line crossing four branches to Galloways corner to Coleby Jarrells old corner thence south with Coleby Jarrels line to Thomas Roaches corner. (copy of deed available)

A Deed of Trust No. 26453 in Rockingham Co., NC from Fountain Jarrell to Josiah Bullington and John W. May trustee is dated

18 Jun 1844. Jarrell indebted to Bullington in the sum of \$25.00 as referenced to a bond dated 1 Jan 1844. (copy of deed available)

A Deed of Trust No. 83 in Rockingham Co., NC from Fountain Jarrell to Pendleton Ratliff is dated 16 Apr 1845. Fountain Jarrell indebted to Josiah Roberts for \$8.00. (copy of deed available)

It is believed that Fountain arrived in Surry Co. sometime between 1845 and 1847. He arrived in Surry Co. with his wife, three daughters and five sons. His name in some of the Surry Co., NC records list him as Gerald rather than Jarrell.

A deed was dated in Surry Co., NC 24 June 1850 between Fountain Jarrell and Thomas F. Prather and John Hamlin (Book 6, Pg. 346). It appears that Fountain was always indebted to someone, either in Rockingham or Surry Co. After arriving in Surry Co. he is indebted to John Hamlin for \$37.30 and bearing interest from the 21st of Jan 1850 and to St. Clair McMickle in the sum of \$17. 00. (copy of deed available)

In the 1850 Surry Co. census he was a farmer and lived in Fish River District of Surry Co. One of his daughters was listed as Ann E. Jarrell. Family members say that she later changed her name to Nancy Fountain Jarrell. Julia F. Jarrell (age 1 1/2) is listed in this household in 1850 also. (This is how the story goes as told by Guy Tolbert to Dianne Amburn Holder in Sept. 2002. Julie Fannie Tolbert was really a Jarrell but when she got married she used the name Tolbert. James M. Tolbert had an affair with Ann Evaline Jarrell who was the dau. of Fountain and Fannie Jarrell. After Julie Fannie was born Ann Evaline changed her name to Nancy Jarrell and married William Earp Seal. Then James M. Tolbert married Mary (Polly) Mathews. Julie Fannie (Jarrell) Tolbert married John Samuel Amburn. When Julie died he married her sister Betty Tolbert. Betty had an affair with ____ and gave birth to Susie Litisha Amburn before she married John Samuel Amburn. Susie Litisha Amburn married Ben Jarrell. Sid Tolbert was not a Tolbert but a Martin.) (Wilma Hiatt does not think Nancy changed her name to Ann Evaline. If Nancy married in 1849 and left the household. Why would Ann E. be listed in the 1850 Surry census?)

A deed in Surry Co. dated 2 Sep 1851 between Fountain Jerrell and Daniel L. Jones, Thomas Davis and Drury Davis indicates the same. Fountain is indebted to Thomas Davis and Drury Davis for \$82.50 with interest from the 1st of Jan of 1851. (Book 7, pg. 296). (copy of deed available)

A deed of trust dated 13 Jul 1852 from Fountain Gerald to Elisha Banner and Charles Whitlock in Surry Co. Fountain is indebted to Charles Whitlock for \$185. (copy of deed available)

A deed of trust dated August 1853 from Fountain Jarrel to Ice Snow and Charles Whitlock. Fountain is indebted to Whitlock for \$155. (copy of deed available)

A deed of trust dated 27 Jul 1854 from Fountain Jerrall and William Seal to Ice Snow, Charles Whitlock and W. M. Freeman in Surry Co. Jerrell and Seal indebted to Charles Whitlock and W. M. Freeman for \$190. (copy of deed available)

A deed of trust dated 18 Jun 1855 from Fountain Jarrell to James Weaver, Felix Johnson, Phillip Purkins and Nancy Whitaker. Fountain is indebted to Johnson for \$181, Phillip Purkins for \$29.27 and \$14.61 and \$14.76 and indebted to Nancy Whitaker for \$2.12. (copy of deed available)

A deed of trust dated 23 Jun 1856 from Fountain Jarrell to West M. Freeman and Patrick F. Hopper for the sum of \$180. Jarrell is indebted to P. F. Hopper in the sum of \$180.00. (copy of deed available)

Family members have always said that all of Fountain's sons fought in the Civil War.

On 6 Feb 1865 Fountain Jarel was granted from the state of NC 146 acres on the waters of Fish River for the sum of fifteen cents. (No. 3061) (entered 12 Sep 1864). (copy of grant available)

On 6 Feb 1865 Fountain Jarrell was granted from the state of NC sixty acres on the waters of Fish River for the sum of fifteen cents (no. 3060) (entered 12 Sep 1864). (copy of grant available)

In 1870 Fountain is listed as 70 years old, a farmer, and born in VA. Value of his property was \$400.

A deed dated 22 May 1873 shows 146 acres sold by Fountain Jarrell to (son) Rufus A. Jarrell in Surry Co. in consideration of the lifetime maintenance of himself and his daughter Peachy. (copy of deed available)

According to descendants of Fountain Jarrell, he was a horse trader. He would swap with just about anybody he met if they would swap with him.

Fountain once had a corn on his big toe that had been bothering him for years. He had been gone about two weeks and told his wife to go get him the wood chisel and the mallet. He pulled off his shoe and sock and put his foot on the chop block. He put the chisel to his toe and hit it with the mallet and his toe flew off. He picked up his toe and threw it to his wag called Watch. His wife got soot and put it on his foot and it never got infected. (story told by Tommy Jarrell and written by Reavis Lyons)

On Sept. 4, 1873 when his son Rufus married, Fountain was still living. He probably died after that date and before 1880. He is probably buried in the Jarrell Cemetery along with his wife Fanny and their daughter Peachy where his son Rufus is buried. The Jarrell family cemetery is located off the Dan Calloway Road which is off the Casper Stewart Road off the Old Lowgap Road in Surry Co.

WIFE - Fanny (Francis) Jarrell

Fany Jarrell, age 71, is keeping house in the 1870 Surry Population Schedule. She was born in VA according to the Schedule. Fany was dead 4 Sep 1873 when son Rufus married. Her parents are unknown at this time.

CHILD 1 - Peachie W. Jarrell

Peachy Jarrell, age 47, was keeping house in the Fountain Jarrell household in the 1870 Surry Co. Population Schedule. She was the only child in the household at that time. John Ambern, age 22, and July Ambern, age 22, and Sarah Martin, age 21, were in the household. Josie Seal said that Peachie couldn't talk plain. She would have died after 22 May 1873. She never married. She was not listed on the 1880 Surry Co. census.

CHILD 2 - Mariah Jarrell

Some researchers say she was buried in Rockingham Co., NC.

Mariah Jarrell and John Tuttle were married by B. F. Scott, JP. She was 36 when she married John Tuttle per Reavis Lyons.

Mariah and John moved to Stokes Co., NC. They returned to Surry Co. Mariah looked after her sister's (Nancy Fountain Jarrell Seal) children after Nancy killed herself.

John Tuttle, age 73, farmer, b. NC, \$900R/\$300P, Mariah, age 46, keeping house, b. NC; Baley Seal, age 17, farm laborer, b. NC; Isabela, age 22, keeping house, b. NC - 1870 Surry Co. Population Schedule. Fountain Jarrell, Mariah's father, was listed as living next door.

CHILD 3 - Nancy Fountain Jarrell

A family researcher says Nancy Fountain had an illegitimate daughter before she married. There was a Julia F., age 1 1/2 years old, b. NC, in the Fountain Jarrell household in the 1850 Surry census. Nancy married Wm. Seal in 1849 and is not in the Fountain Jarrell household. When Julia married she used the name Julia Tolbert. Julia Tolbert married John Samuel Amburn. Amburn was born 29 Aug 1849 and d. 3 May 1920 in Surry Co. and buried at Zion Hill Cem.) There were three other unmarried Jarrell daughters in the household in 1850 that could have been old enough to have had a daughter.

Nancy Fountain Jarrell married William Earp Seal (1823-1867). See Article 612 in "The Heritage of Surry Co., NC, Vol. I". Not sure if she married in Surry Co., NC.

In the 1870 Surry Co. Population Schedule, Nancy Seal, age 39, is keeping house, born in NC, real estate valued at \$100 and Personal valued at \$100. Rhoda, age 51, born in VA, is in household along with Jane, age 43, born NC, Frank, age 15 born NC is a farm laborer, Sarah is 13, born in NC, Lucinda, age 11, born in NC, Martha, age 8, b. in NC, and William, age 5, born in NC.

In the 1880 Surry County Population Schedule, Nancy F. Seal, age 50, is widowed and died in May 1880. She committed suicide. She had lived in Surry Co. 30 years. Lived in the Dobson Township. In the household was son William Seal (15) single, farmer, b. NC; Sally F. (23) sister, single, keeping house, b. in NC; Betty M. (17) sister, single at home, b. NC and Mariah Tuttle (59)

CHILD 3 - Nancy Fountain Jarrell (Continued) widowed aunt b. NC.

On Becky Fleming's trip to Surry County in June 2003 she spoke with Lizzie Seal (age 93) about Nancy Jarrell Seal's suicide. She stated that it has been told that she had tried to commit suicide a few days earlier for they found a knife in her bonnet. The only reason they knew that she had jumped in the well was because they found her black cape hanging on the well post. Nancy always wore a black cape over her dresses.

In the Coroners Report, State of NC, Surry County it stated, At a jury of inquest held over the dead body of Nancy F. Seal by F. F. McGuffin, coroner of said county, on the 11th day of May 1880, to wit, J. R. Lewellin, foreman... William Mitchell, J. R. Woltz, James Nations, Thomas Evans, J. S. Gillaspie, Henderson Bennet, A. A. Kerr, Ice Snow, R. A. Freeman, Wiley Nations, F. Y Pase.... The following witnesses examined, to wit, J. W. Seal, M. E. Seal, C. H. Stone, Mary Seal. We the undersigned jurors having been sworn and inpanneled, having examined the dead body of Nancy F. Seal and heard all the evidence obtainable we the jury say for our verdict that the said Nancy F. Seal came to her death by intentionally throwing herself into the well, given under our hands and seals this 11th day of May 1880. (signed by foreman and jurors)

Nancy Fountain Seal is buried in the Antioch Church Cemetery, Mount Airy. She and William were first buried in the Johnson Cemetery which was located three miles west of Mt. Airy off H. 89. Nancy was later moved to Antioch. They are buried in the farthest upper right hand corner of the cemetery.

CHILD 4 - Ann E. (or Molly?) Jarrell

Per the 1850 Surry Census Ann E. was 22 years old. Family members say a dau. Molly was born to Fountain and Fanny. She either married, died or moved away as she is not listed in the 1860 Surry census. No other information is available.

CHILD 5 - William R. (Bill) Jarrell

William R. Jarrell is shown in the 1850 Surry census, age 17 (born c. 1833) b. NC. Supposedly he was in the Civil War along with his other brothers. No other information is know of him. He does not show up in the 1860 Surry census record.

Jarrell ListServer states he married before 1850 and he was living in 1850 in Surry Co. And that he was born in Rockingham Co., NC.

CHILD 6 - Albert Harvey Jarrell

Albert H. Jarrell married Jane Tickle on 11 Mar 1858 by A. Simmons (JP) in Surry Co. Bondsman was Ellis F. Jarrell (brother of Albert). (information from his marriage bond)

In the 1860 Surry Census Albert and Jane Jarrell had only one son, age 1 born in NC. His name was William.

Albert enlisted in the Civil War 5 Sep 1862 in Wake Co., NC. He was captured at Fredericksburg, VA 3 May 1863 and exchanged at City Point, VA 10 May 1863. Present or accounted for until captured at Kelly's Ford, VA 7 Nov 1863. Confined at Point Lookout, MD until paroled and exchanged at Aiken's Landing, VA 18-24 Feb 1865. (information from Reavis Lyons)

Albert H. Jarrell, Private, resided in Rockingham County and enlisted in Wake County at age 27, Sept. 5, 1862 for the war. Captured at Fredericksburg, VA, May 3, 1863, and exchanged at City Point, VA, May 10, 1863. Present or accounted for until captured at Kelly's Ford, VA Nov. 7, 1863. Confined at Point Lookout, MD until paroled and exchanged at Aiken's Landing, VA Feb. 18-24, 1865. (North Carolina Troops: 1861-1865)

Albert Jarrell (Civil War - Second CO A, Second Reg. NC Troops. Last Company raised in Surry Co., NC.)

1870 Surry Co. Census - Albert Jarrel, age 35, labour, b. NC, Jane, age 34, keeping house, b. NC; William, age 10 b. NC; Charlie, age 4 b. VA; John, age 8 b. NC; Elizabeth, age 2 b. VA.

Albert Jarrell applied for a pension in 1903.

Ellis Franklin Jarrell was of English descent per Lola Jarrell Collins.

Ellis F. Jarrell was bondsman for Jeremiah Shropshire and Dicy F. Lewis 22 Feb 1858.

In Deed Book 10, page 340, Surry Co., NC is a deed from William Haymore Esquire High Sheriff of Surry County and Ice Snow transferred to Ellis F. Jarrell. By virtue of a venditioni impersonas issuing from the County Court of Surry against the property of Davies N. Anderson for the sum of \$100 with interest and cost of suit which said sum was recovered by Ice Snow and whereas the said venditioni inpersonas aforesaid commanding him to expose to sale 200 acres of land to satisfy to Ice Snow... (copy of deed available)

Ellis F. Jarrell was listed in the Surry Co. 1862 Tax List. He owned 200 acres of land, valued at \$300 in the Beever Dam location.

Ellis Jarrel, age 27, married and his brother Wesly Jarrell, age 20, single are listed on the 74 Regiment NC Militia, Surry Co. on the 8th day of July 1862, A. Dunnagan Colonel. (copy available)

Ellis F. Jarrell, CO D 37 Batt VA Cavalry - Ellis enlisted at Independence, VA 2 Aug 1862 in CO D 37 Battery of Virginia Cavalry. He was active in the battalion until he became ill. (from the book, "Surry County Soldiers in the Civil War) (Co. D. was organized 2 Aug 1862, Capt. L. W. Brown's Co.)

In the book "36th and 37th Battalions Virginia Cavalry" by J. L. Scott is a history of the Battalion. It states Ellis F. Jarrrell was born July 15, 1836. Enl. in Independence, Aug. 2, 1862, in Co. D. Absent, sick on undated roll. Died July 2, 1923, buried in Ivy Green Cemetery, Surry Co., NC. A photo of Co. A 37th Battalion VA Cav. Reunion, Rocky Mount, VA on Aug. 11, 1909 is pictured in the book.

Josie Seal said that at one time Ellis' son Sid had Ellis' saddlebags that he used in the Civil War and that Evie (Sid's wife) had a button that came off Ellis' uniform but it is not known what happened to them.

The Civil War Diary kept by Ellis Jarrell is at the Mount Airy Regional Museum. Some of the pages are missing. (a copy is available)

Freeholders William Golding, John R. Greenwood and D. M. Holder were appointed by Hasten Beamer one of the Justices of the Peace for and in Surry County by act of the Legislature of the State of North Carolina notified the 22th of August 1868 allotted and set apart unto Ellis Jarrell applicant for home stead a certain track or parcel of land in the County of Surry ...containing two hundred acres valued at \$200.00 and also his interest in the tract of land where Jarrel now lives valued at \$200.00 and personal property (personal property listed). Registered 15 Jan 1869. (copy from the NC Archives is available)

Ellis Jerril was listed as a farmer in the 1870 Surry Co. Population Schedule. The value of his real estate was \$600 and his Personal Property was \$200.

Indenture made and entered 3 Mar 1879 between E. F. Jerrell and wife Nancy Jerrell of Surry County and Forrester Booker and John Greenwood. Jerrell is liable to Booker as security for him in the sum of \$500, tract of 200 acres, two head of cattle, 18 head of sheep, 6 head of hogs 1 two horse wagon, one five year old mare... (Book 17, page 452) (copy of deed available)

In the 1880 Surry Co. Census, Ellis Jarrell and Solomon Center were neighbors. Solomon Center (Senter) was Nancy's brother.

A deed was made 10 Nov 1883 to Ellis F. Jarrell from Anderson Arnold and Mary E. Arnold of Surry for \$23 for a track of land

M. Holder, J. R. Greenwood and others known as the Senter land. Signed by Holland (her mark) Senter and witnessed by D. M. Holder and H. E. Jarrell (son of Ellis Jarrell). Registered July 16, 1886. (copy of deed available)

A deed was made on 31st day of March 1891 from E. F. Jarrell and wife Nancy Jarrell to son H. E. Jarrell for a track of land lying and being in the County of Surry on Elis Creek and known as the Ben Harris land adjoining the land of John Moore, Daniel Wood and others containing forty six 1/2 acres. (copy of deed available)

A deed was made on 31st day of March 1891 from Ellis Jarrell and wife Nancy Jarrell to son H. E. Jarrell for a track of land adjoining the lands of D M Holder and others being part of the John Senter lands containing 2 1/2 acres. Registered April 11, 1891. (copy of deed available)

In 1900 Cora E. Moore (dau. of Fannie and J. T. Moore) was living in her grandfather's household (Ellis Jarrell). She was age 16.

A deed dated 30 Mar 1901 by E. F. Jarrell and Nancy Jarrell of Surry to H. E. Jarrell of Surry for \$70.50 for a tract of land in Surry Co. containing 28 1/2 acres adjoining lands of John H. Moore and G. D. Holder beginning at Senter's old corner.... Witnessed 30 Mar 1901 by T. D. Golding, JP. Registered 8 May 1901. (copy of deed available) (39-109)

E. F. Jerrell's Soldier's Application for Pension was dated 28 June 1901. He was age 64 and resident of Round Peak. He enlisted in the Civil War in Co. D, 37th Bat, VA State Troops in August 1862. While in said service in the state of Md. he had neuralgah (sic) which effected his eyes and has suffered with neuralgah ever since and now incapacitated to perform manual labor at least 3/4 of the time. J. R. Greenwood of Round Peak appeared saying he is acquainted with E. F. Jerrell and signed as a witness. Also appearing was John R. Woltz (physician in good standing) said he had carefully and thoroughly examined E. F. Jerrell. Physician stated Disease of eyes which renders him almost blind-nevousness. General debility on which incapacitates him from performing labor more than 3/4(?) of the time. (copy of application available)

Ellis F. Jarrell was age 66 when registered to vote 18 Oct 1902 in NC in the Stuarts Creek Township. No ancestor was listed that would have voted in 1867. (from the Grandfather Clause book)

A deed dated 8 May 1907 by Ellis F. Jarrell and wife Nancy Jarrell of Surry to Hiram E. Jarrell of Surry for \$325 for a tract of land in Stewarts Creek Township containing 53 1/2 acres adjoining lands of H. E. Jarrell, G. D. Holder, J. R. Greenwood and others and known as the John Senter land beginning in Low Gap road at ford of branch... Witnessed 28 Jun 1907 by Richard A. Snow. (copy of deed available) (50-139)

A deed dated 26 Jun 1907 by E. F. Jarrell and wife Nancy Jarrell of Surry to S. F. Jarrell of Surry for \$269 for a tract of land in Stewarts Creek Township containing 56 acres adjoining lands of J. R. Greenwood and Coalston land. Witnessed 26 Jun 1907 by T. M. Scott, JP. Registered 23 Apr 1908. (copy of deed available) (51-68)

A deed dated 26 Jun 1907 by E. F. Jarrell and wife Nancy Jarrell of Surry to R. W. Jarrell of Surry for \$203 for a tract of land in Stewarts Creek Township containing 56 1/2 acres adjoining lands of J. R. Greenwood and H. E. Jarrell. Witnessed 26 Jun 1907 by T. M. Scott, JP. Registered 4 Mar 1911. (copy of deed available) (58-23)

A deed dated 26 Jun 1907 by E. F. Jarrell and wife Nancy Jarrell of Surry to L. F. Jarrell of Surry for \$203 for a tract of land in Stewarts Creek Township containing 56 acres adjoining Sarah Gardner and John H. Moore. Witnessed 26 Jun 1907 by T. M. Scott, JP. Registered 4 Mar 1911. (copy of deed available) (58-24)

In 1910 Ellis Jarrell and wife Nancy lived on the Lambsburg and Dobson Road in Stewarts Creek Township beside his son Sid and his family.

Mr. E. F. Jarrell, a veteran of the Civil War and resident of Round Peak, was greatly but pleasantly, surprised Friday morning

July 15th by seeing 150 of his relatives, friends and neighbors coming in with baskets, boxes, etc. filled with the good things of this life, enough to fill a table 30 feet long, 40 inches wide. Mr. Jarrell enjoyed himself very much and hopes to live to see many more of such birthdays. He was 74 years old, had 4 sons, 37 grandchildren and one brother, Mr. R. A. Jarrell. There were four veterans present, Mr. E. F. Jarrell, R. A. Jarrell, Mr. J. R. Greenwood who entertained the crowd telling war stories, etc. The writer never saw a crowd enjoy themselves better. (information from "The Mount Airy News" (Round Peak News) dated 21 Jul 1910)

The 1911(March 1) will of Ellis Jarrell stated for his executor, son H. E. Jarrell, to give his body a decent burial, pay funeral expenses and debts. His wife was given all personal property for her natural life and was to receive rents on his real estate. To Cora Moore and Jesse Moore, heirs of Fannie Moore, five dollars each. If any residue of his estate was left it was to be divided equally between his four sons, H. E. Jarrell, R. W. Jarrell, L. F. Jarrell and S. F. Jarrell; and one daughter, Rebecca C. Jarrell Bobbitt. Witnessed by T. D. Golding, R. A. Snow

In 1915 he was living in Amelia, VA with his son Richard Walter Jarrell. On February 4, 1921 (a little more than two years until his death) Ellis and Nancy Jarrell are living in Amelia, VA writes a letter to their granddaughter Lou Jarrell living in Toast (Surry Co., NC). In this letter Nancy states her health is better than it was when she was at Sid's (Sid Jarrell, her son living in Surry Co.). She said she could go to her room, undress and go to bed without any help and get up in the morning, dress and come in the other room to the fire, can walk through one room to the kitchen but have to be fed. She can walk around the house and on the porches also go out in the yard sometimes. She also said that she had bad news to write. Dick (her son) is in trouble again over stilling, drinking and mistreating his family. He is at Richmond in the penitentiary. She hasn't seen him since January the 2nd. She stated she got two boxes of apples, one box of cake, one night cap, all the candy and oranges she could eat for Christmas. She would be proud to get some pieces of your (Lou's) dress to put in her quilt she is making. She states she doesn't like living there and wants to be in her home country, it doesn't seem like home there. (copy of letter available)

Ellis F. Jarrell was blind at time of death. He had cataracts. He is buried at Ivy Green Baptist Church Cemetery in the Round Peak community of Surry Co. This notation is on his grave marker "CO D, 37 VA CAV. C.S.A."

Ellis F. Jarrell was 86 years old at the time of death. He died of tubercular pneumonia. He was employed by his father Fountain Jarrell. Date of birth was 15 Jul 1836 NC. Informant on his death certificate was H. G. Jarrell. Dr. John L. Woltz was doctor to sign certificate of death. Buried at Ivy Green Cemetery July 14, 1923. (copy of death certificate available)

In the Moody Funeral Home record of death of Ellis F. Jarrell dated July 13, 1923, the order was given by H. G. & B. F. Jarrell, charged to S. F. Jarrell, date of funeral was July 14, 1923. He lived at Rt. 3, Mt. Airy and died at Stewarts Creek and funeral services were at Ivy Green at 2 p.m. by W. H. Atkinson. His physician was Dr. Woltz of Mt. Airy. Cause of Death was labor pneumonia and he died July 12, 1923 at 11:20 p.m.. He was a farmer, married, born July 15, 1836. He was 86 Y, 11 M and 27 D old. His father was Fountain Jarrell. Funeral charge was \$60.00. (copy of record available)

CHILD 8 - Ruffus Austin Jarrell

In the Cemetery Records of Carroll County, VA, an unknown cemetery located on Rt. 896, the Old Flour Gap Trail, there are nine graves marked by fieldstones, one is for a sister of Rufus Jarrell. The cemetery is in Claudia Lyons Bowman's yard in Carroll Co. The road is now named Lyons Hollow Road. Family members said that the Jarrell's lived in that area before moving into NC.

Rufus Jarrell was 25 and Susan Terney 30 at time of their marriage.

Ruffus Jarrell was deeded land from Fountain Jarrell on 22 May 1873 in Surry Co., NC.

A mortgage deed dated 31 May 1878 was made from Rufus A. Jarrell and wife to Felix Johnson.

1880 Surry County Census: Rufus Jerrell, age 40, farmer, b. NC; Susanah, age 41, keeping house, b. NC; Mary, age 20, stepdaughter, works in house, b. VA; Daniel (David?), age 15, wife's son, works on farm, b. VA; Charles A., age 5 (no relationship given), b. NC; Benjamin F., age 1 month, born May 1880 NC, no relationship given.

This deed made this the 17 day of March 1896 between R A Jarrell and Susan his wife of the County of Surry and State of North Carolina of the first part and the School Committee of No 10 District of said county of other part witnesseth: that for and in consideration of the sum of six dollars and fifty cents paid in hand to us by the said School Committee of said district. The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. We do hereby grant bargain and sell unto the said School Committee of said district and their successors in office a certain track or parcel of land situated lying and being in the County of Surry and State of North Carolina on the waters of Little Fishers River adjoining the lands of R A Jarrell and J M Vaughn and bounded as follows..... containing 84 1/2 rods more or less. To have and to hold the same for the use and benefit of the free public school of said District for the white race. And we do hereby convenant and agree to bind ourselves to warrant and defend the right and Title to the same against the claims of any and all persons. In witness whereof We have herunto set our hands and seal the day and date above written. Signed by R. A. (his mark) Jarrell and Susanah Jarrell. Registered April 3, 1900. C. H. Haynes, Clk. 1900 Surry County Census: Ruffus Jarrell's son Ben (age 20) was a farm laborer in household and Maggie Jarrell (granddaughter b. March 1897 NC). Susie Amburn b. Feb 1882 (age 18, single was servant/housekeeper) in household and Minnie G. Snow b. Sep 1887 (age 12) NC was in household as adopted daughter. Ruffus wife Susanah listed as age 27, had four children with only three living in 1900.

Rufus Jarrell was a charter member of the Round Peak Masonic Lodge, No. 616, established 20 Jan 1915 located upstairs of the Ivy Green Church. The Ivy Green Church blew down in 1929. The church did not have any insurance, but the Masonic Lodge did, so the Masonic Lodge with the insurance that they got with a lot of help from neighbors rebuilt the Ivy Green Church. The church had an upstairs to it and that is where the Masonic Lodge held their meetings until they built across the road from the Ivy Green Church in 1965. All of the locations were owned by the Jarrell's family at one time. (per Reavis Lyons)

Rufus married Susan Sandifer first. After her death he maried Susan Turney, who made music. Susan eventually passed her playing to her sons Ben and Charlie. Julie Lyons said, "Susan could pick a banjo or play a fiddle. They said she could sing to beat anything you ever heard. She was a tall woman. I'll bet she was six feet tall, just about. That's where Papa (Ben) and Uncle Charlie got their height, because Grandpap was a short man." Sam Fortner (1839-1935) CSA veteran, was a neighbor of Rufe Jarrell, which was also Tommy Jarrell's old home place at Round Peak. Robert Sykes' sister Rene (1902-1988) owned the photo of Sam Fortner taken at the Jarrell homeplace about 1920. Paul Sutphin at age nine said he attended the funeral of fiddler and banjo man Joe Lowe (1862-1927) at the old Rufe Jarrell graveyard. Boyd McKinney said his grandfather Pet McKinney would go over to old man Rufe Jarrell's, who bought apples and made brandy all his life. He would go over there and mess around. Charlie Jarrell and him probaby played together some. ("Strings of Life")

Ruffus A. Jarrell was a retired farmer. He was 81 at the time of death. He died of paralysis. He is buried in the Jarrell Cemetery in Surry Co. in the valley below Fishers Peak (off the Dan Calloway Road). He was a widower at the time of death. He died in Surry Co., Stewarts Creek Township, Informant was B. F. Jarrell. (information from the death certificate, #346)

Rufus Jarrell was buried with his first wife buried on his left side and his second wife buried on his right side. He and his 1st wife did not have any children. He and his 2nd wife had two sons.

Ruffus A. Jerrell, Private, resided in Surry County and was by occupation a farmer prior to enlisting in Surry County at age 22, March 18, 1862 (in the Civil War). Wounded in the left leg at Ox Hill, Virginia, September 1, 1862. Reported absent wounded through October 1862. Listed as a deserter in January-February 1863. Returned to duty on an unspecified date. Wounded in the left eye and/or both arms at or near Jericho Mills, VA, on or about May 23, 1864. Returned to duty in November-December, 1864. Deserted to the enemy on or about February 24, 1865. Confined at Washington, DC until released on or about February 27, 1865 after taking the Oath of Allegiance. (Volume VIII, CO. A, 28th Regiment N. C. Troops)
