Members of her family formed a group named "The Windy City Travelers" which allowed her to travel on major trips and take two to three vacations every year. They traveled to various islands and cities where relaxation and fun were the order of the day.

She loved to "island hop," but most of all, she loved to DANCE, whether she had a partner or not.

She also held firm beliefs in justice for us as African Americans and supported several non-profit groups, traveling to Springfield, Illinois to support equal rights. She also participated in many of the activities sponsored by the Department of Aging.

For the last three years, **CHARLOTTE** lived at the Renaissance Nursing Home in Hillside, Illinois. There, she made new friends and had a busy schedule of activities on a daily basis. One of her favorite things to do was attending the church services held there at the home.

After a short but valiant fight, CHARLOTTE'S sunset was on Sunday, February 25, 2007.

she is still our "hero" and she has changed us.


