A LOOK AT PINEY GROVE BAPTIST CHURCH

Piney Grove Baptist Church was organized August 8, 1899, with ten charter members--A. Badgett, Martin Draughn, J. S. Smith, A. H. Snow, M. J. Badgett, L. J. Hemmings, Elizabeth Doss, S. R. Smith, Hulda Draughn, and M. N. Marion.

The first messengers were sent to the new Surry Baptist Association in 1903.

The first state missions offering was taken on the sixth anniversary of the church on August 8, 1905.

The first church building was built during 1909 and 1910.

The first church organ was purchased in 1910 for \$22.50. The first piano was purchased in 1935.

Sunday School literature was purchased from the Baptist Sunday School Board by 1906.

Offering was made for the Baptist orphanage in August, 1907.

The second church building was completed in 1940. Lucille Eads was the first person to accept Christ in the new church. The debt was paid off in December, 1941. Dedication and cornerstone laying services were held the fifth Sunday in May, 1942. The church was torn down in November and December of 1974.

The church pastorium was built in 1960 and was first occupied by Rev. and Mrs. L. E. Myers.

The church constitution was adopted March 23, 1966.

The present church building was begun in March, 1974, and was completed in October, 1974, at a cost of \$125.000. \$70,000 was borrowed from the Northwestern Bank in Dobson.

The first baptismal service was held on Sunday, October 6, 1974. Junior Key was the first person and the first boy baptized; Angela Hewitt was the first girl.

A service of transfer of consecration from the old building was held on Sunday, October 27, 1974. The cornerstone was removed and transferred to the new building along with the pulpit Bible. These symbolized the move of the preaching ministry to the new house of worship.

The first worship service was held Sunday, November 3, 1974, with 160 people in Sunday School.

Jackie Bowman was the first person to accept Christ in the new church. Russell Simpson was the first person to join the church by transfer of letter - November 3, 1974.

Miss Kay Chilton and Mr. Terry Draughn were the first couple to be married in the new church. They were married December 7, 1974.

Mrs. Lucinda Nixon Fowler was the first member whose funeral was held in the new church - January 29, 1975.

CALL YOUR MINISTER

1. WHEN YOU ARE FACING A SERIOUS PROBLEM

Most Ministers have been trained to help people with their personal, family and other problems. The important judgment of a spiritual leader, together with his prayers for Divine guidance, will enable you to face your problems with confidence. Don't allow your problem to get too big for you.

2. WHEN SOMEONE IS INTERESTED IN THE CHURCH

You constantly meet young people and adults who are in your community, and others who have not united with the local church. Put in a good word for your church and tell your pastor about the prospective members.

3. WHEN THERE IS ILLNESS

Your Minister is as near as your telephone. His presence, counsel and prayer will be helpful. Your pastor will appreciate your phone call when you, your loved one or friend is sick or going to the hospital.

4. WHEN THERE IS DEATH

Your Minister should be notified when there is a death in the family. He can give comfort and counse: at this difficult time.

5. WHEN YOU MUST MAKE AN IMPORTANT DECISION

If you are a young person and face a decision about going to college, arranging your course of study, or choosing your life work, make an appointment to see your minister. The viewpoint of your spiritual adviser should be considered.

6. WHEN THERE IS A WEDDING

Your Pastur should be consulted before the wedding day is set. Since you will undoubtedly desire to have one or more conferences with your Minister, it is advisable to contact him well in advance of the wedding.

7. WHEN SOMEONE DESIRES TO BECOME A CHRISTIAN

Happy, indeed, is the pastor who is asked to talk with someone desiring to become a Christian. Tell your Minister about friends of yours who are interested in knowing more about the Christian faith.
