Know Ye, That we, for and in consideration of the sum of twelve and one half (12 1/2) cents for every acre hereby granted, and

paid into the Treasury on 22 day of August 1884, by Hillary Barker

have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Hillary Barker

a tract of land containing six and one half (6 1/2) acres, lying and being in the County of Surry, adjoining his own

lands, Fountain Gerralds & others. Beginning on a chestnut Gerralds corner N. crossing a small branch including the Spring to a spanish oak 15 chains W. to a chestnut in his old line 5 chains S. with said line to a chestnut 15 chains E. on his line to a chestnut 5 chains to the beginning &

as by the plat hereunto annexed doth appear, together with all Woods, Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said land belonging or appertaining, **TO HOLD** to the said Hillary Barker heirs and assigns forever.

Yielding and paying to us such sums of money yearly or otherwise, as our General Assembly from time to time may direct, and promising obedience to all acts of the General Assembly now existing, or hereafter to be enacted, concerning the passage of fish in the waters of said premises: **Provided, always,** That the said Grantee shall cause this Grant to be registered in the Register's office of our said County of Surry within two years from the date hereof, otherwise the same shall be void. Entered 30 June 1883
