The retainage to represent final payment which is to be paid within 30 days after completion of work.

The Contractor further agrees that if the Owner gives permission to complete the entire structure as set forth in the plans and specifications as drawn up by K. A. Maulsby P.E. during the early construction of Alternate Bid #1 the complete bid will be (\$46,897.00) Forty Six Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-Seven Dollars.

Mr. Fred Patterson, Chairman of the Board of Deacons, presented the following recommendation of the Deacons: "We recommend that the lower floor of the Church building be used by the Head Start Program and that a liaison Committee be appointed to help co-ordinate the use of the lower part of the building." After being discussed, motion was made, seconded and approved the recommendation as presented. The Church appointed a liaison Committee consisting of Mr. Clifford Scott, Mr. Jasper Cook and Mr. Charles Jackson.

Mr. Jimmy McNeill, Chairman of Mission of the Church Committee, presented the following recommendations dealing with some of the problems of poverty:

(1) We recommend that the Mission of the Church Committee be authorized to approach local organizations to form a study group for the purpose of making a comprehensive study of the needs of low-income families in our Community. The group would study such needs as housing, religion, recreation, nutrition, clothing, education, etc. The group would be composed of representatives from

the churches, clubs and other organizations in the Community. The group would co-ordinate the efforts of local organizations in a combined attack on poverty.

(2) The Committee recommends that the Church sponsor a youth recreation program for children from low-income families. One phase of the program would be recreation for youth in grades 4-6. Arrangements could be made with local school officials for obtaining the elementary school gym on Saturday mornings during the winter. In warmer weather the school playground could be used. The program would begin as soon as possible and continue through May. Equipment and supplies for the program could be obtained from the Community Action Program and the Mission of the Church Fund. A director and a supervisory committee would be appointed by the Mission of the Church Committee.

The second phase of the program would be recreation and activities for grades 1-3 from low-income families. This program would be held at the church on Saturday mornings beginning as soon as possible and continuing through May. A director and a supervisory committee would be appointed by the Mission of the Church Committee.

(3) We commend Marla Hartman for her tutoring with children and recommend that the

Church give her \$10.00 per month for January through May to be used for the needs of the children with whom she works. The money would be taken from the mission of the Church Fund.

Each recommendation was discussed thoroughly and all were approved as presented, except No.

(3) was amended to give Miss Hartman up to \$10.00 and more at the discretion of the mission of the Church Committee from January through May.

Mr. Williams read a letter from Rev. Charles Howell, Chairman of Mission Committee of the Association, in regard to sending Rev. Oren Bradley to Japan. The Church approved to give \$25.00 toward this project and to accept and contributions.

The pastor discussed Association in World Mission Conference, sponsored by the Association, to be held April 5-10. Motion was made, seconded and approved for our Church to participate.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Mr. Aud Patterson.

Mr. Fred Patterson, Chairman of Covenants and Constitution Committee, presented to the Church, Sections VIII, IX and X of the new Constitution, recommended by the Committee and moved that they be adopted by the Church. After being fully discussed, the Church approved that they be adopted.

Mr. Clifford Scott asked that the Church make a resolution, showing appreciation to the committee for the excellent work they did on the Constitution.
