Thank you for your letter dated February 18, 2004 regarding Thomas and Clarrisa (Clary) Nelson. We did not find any family information in our family files. Death records were not kept in NC until 1913. A will for Thomas Nelson was not found in Surry County. A will for Joseph Nelson in Stokes County dated 1 Jan 1804 and probated June Term 1804 does not list a son Thomas.

Since Thomas and Clary Nunn(s) Nelson married in Stokes County, NC 21 Jan 1810, we looked in our books on Stokes County. We found these families in Stokes County in the 1840 census: A. F. Nelson, Clary Nelson, Elijah, Elisha, Joseph, Leroy, Martin and Riel Nelson. Clary Nelson's husband Thomas must have died before 1840. Clary Nelson was not listed in the Stokes County census for 1850.

Thomas Nelson was listed on the 1815 Stokes County, NC Tax Lists in the Quaker Gapp District. There was a will abstract for Elizabeth Nunns dated 26 Aug 1828 listing a dau. Clara Nelson. We have enclosed a copy. We also enclosed a family history on the Nunn family that was found in the book, <u>The Heritage of Stokes</u> <u>County.</u>

We suggest you write The Genealogy Society of Rockingham and Stokes County, NC, P. O. Box 152, Mayodan, NC 27027-0152 for information during 1820-1860.

They were living in the same area (Mount Airy Township) as the Jesse Ceasar (Seazer), Joseph Banner, Albert Banner, and Martin Banner families. My name is Carolyn (Peggi) Thompson. I am researching my family history and am contacting your organization as a resource for information on relatives who lived in Mt. Airy Township, Surry County, North Carolina. Information regarding your organization was forwarded to me by the office of Dennis W. "Bud" Cameron, Register of Deeds, Surry County, North Carolina, as a possible resource for assistance. I am particularly interested in the surnames *Nelson, Banner, Seazer and Bingman.*

My Great-Grandfather was *Joseph Franklin Nelson*. Joseph was *born August 30, 1867; he died March 18, 1935 in Champaign, Illinois*. His death certificate lists: his place of birth as Mt. Airy, North Carolina, mother's name unknown, father's name, Elic Nelson. In researching U.S. Census information for Mt. Airy Township, Surry County, North Carolina, I was able to locate Joseph in the 1880 U.S. Census living in the household of Sallie Nelson, a Black female, age 60. Sallie was listed as Joseph's mother with birthplace of both she and her parents in Virginia. Included in the household were Henry, age20, mulatto, and David, age 18, mulatto. Joseph was listed as age 12, mulatto. All household members and their parents were listed as having been born in Virginia.

Information Regarding Specific Individuals of Interest.

Sallie Nelson. Although it is possible, due to her age at the time of the 1880 Census, I am not sure if Sallie was actually Joseph's mother (she would have been age 48 at the time of his birth) or was his Grandmother, an aunt or other female relative. In the 1900 U.S. Census for Mt. Airy Township, Surry County, North Carolina, I found Sallie living in the household of a Nancy Bingman. Her relationship to Nancy was listed as mother. She (Sallie) was listed as age 83 with year of birth 1816. Census information reflects that both Nancy and Sallie were widows and that Sallie had given birth to 9 children with 3 still living. I am hoping to find more information on Sallie's relationship to Joseph and the names of her children (both those deceased and those living at the time of the census).

Henry Nelson. The only information I have been able to find on Henry is that he was living in Sallie's household at the time of the 1880 census and he was listed as her son. His name is listed

as a witness on both records of marriage for his brother, David.

David Nelson. David Nelson married a Francis Seazer on July 23, 1882. I assume she died because on November 24, 1887, he married a Lizzie Banner. I was able to find a listing for David in the 1900 U.S. Census for Mt. Airy Township, Surry County, North Carolina. He was living on Rockford St. and his household included Lizzie and three children: Iris, May I(da) and Walter.

Joseph Nelson. Sometime between June 28, 1880 and 1888, Joseph moved to Champaign, Illinois where he married my Great-Grandmother, Estella Belle Anderson on October 9, 1888.
