Descriptions and copies of many of the armorial bearings of the Remi Family are available. The one that is used mostly in the United States was granted to Nicolas Remy, who was ennobled by Duke Charles of Lorraine on August 9, 1583. The motto that appears on all of the crests is "Semper Fidelus"; translation is "Always faithful." Those interested write for further information.

Special acknowledgement is made to Dr. Bonnolle W. Rhamy of Ft. Wayne Indiana, who has spent years in genealogical research of the Remi Family in America. A part of the early history of this report is from his findings.

A very hearty "Thank you" to all who have sent in material and also to you who have purchased copies of this record. ## Early Chronology of the Remi Family

Bible: Ramesis II, the Pharoah of the Oppression and Ramesis III, the Pharoah of the Exodus (about 1320 B.C.) are listed. These Pharoahs undoubtedly had a large progeny, and as mighty Egypt spread her trade and power, no doubt this royal family of Ramses crossed the Mediterranean into Italy and Rome.

Italy: Roman legends ascribe the foundation of the city of Rome at about 752 B.C. to the twin brothers Romulus and Remus, who were abandoned in infancy and were suckled by a she-wolf. Romulus finally slew his brother and became King I. In the years 753 to 510 B.C., the city occupied seven hills whose summits arose 80 to 120 feet above the Tiber River. The Remi had a castle on one of these hills, which was their family seat.

Gaul: According to ancient history, the Gauls inhabited northern Italy (Gallia Cisalpina) and they were of the same race of Aryans, that inhabited Gaul to the north of the Alps in France. Of these the Remi were described as "a people of Belgae in Gaul". There are many references to the Remi tribe in Caesar's Gallic wars.

Rheims: The city of Rheims and the Cathedral of Rheims derive their name from the Latin form Remigus and was named for Saint Remi, b. 437 A.D. and d. 533 A. D., the Bishop of Rheims, who anointed and crowned Clovis, King of France, on Christmas day 496 A. D.

Remi, Saint, Arch Bishop of Lyon, b. 853, d. Oct. 28, 875.  
Remy, Carlier, of the village of Remi, in Artois. Ennobled first 1096.  
Remegio, William and Robert de St., "held hands in Normandy (1179-1223)"  
Remegio, Richard de St., lived in Normandy in 1198.  
Remy, Henry de St. -- his decendants divided into two branches, which bore respectively the names of St. Remy de Valois and St. Remy de Luze. The family spread over Lorraine, Artois, Picardy, Paris and French Flanders and some ten branches were granted Armorial Bearings at different times.  
Remy, Erard de Saint, a liege of Count de Champagne.  
Remy, Pierre of Lorraine, was treasurer to King Charles IV, of France (1322-1328)  
Remi, Canon of Chalons sur Marne, Oct, 1254.  
Remy, Bishop of Chalons sur Marne from 1275-83 vidimus his will Oct. 14, 1314.  
Remi, Saint Etienne, Neufbours (Chalons sur Marne) Nov. 10, 1360. Lease to J.....Remy for a vineyard, for the sum of 15 c.t. de cens a year for life. Saint Lumior en Champagne Mar. 17, 1402.  
Remy, Jehan (Jean), Cavalier of the Duke of Bourgoyne, 1427.  
Remy, Amoury, Cavalier. Paving of the court of the St. Julien Hospital at Lille, May 17, 1432.  
Remy, Didier, Chalons sur Marne, June 10, 1435.  
Remi, Mariette, lived at Ivory 1464.  
Remy, Guillaume---Girardin le Roux, a silk weaver, sold to Guillaume Remi, treasurer of the Catholic School of Marolles, one quarter and a half of a vineyard called Vraudroy, for 18 pounds for the land and 10 sous for the wine, made at Vitry en Perthois and Vaux, Jan. 12, 1460.  
Vitry en Perthois 18 papers, dated June 10, 1493 until Aug. 4, 1511, P. Cuchart, arch deacon of Joinsville, and priest of Vouchleri sold mentioned above to Guillaume Remy, canon of Chalons sur Marne, Oct. 1495. Extract collection of the will of Guillaume Remy, canon, Sept. 10, 1507, willed to the collogo, several inheritances, among others a farm Buisson. Nicolas Gucho, fisherman sold to Guillaume Remy, treasurer of Notre Dame, three-quarters of land located at the outskirts of Vaux in la Baudette, for 11 pounds 10 S.T. for the land and 5 s.t. for the wine. Made at Vitry en Perthois, Saint Eturine, and Marolles, Apr. 22, 1489. Antoine de Combas, priest of Buisson, sold to Guillaume Remy, Priest of St. Eturine de Chatons and treasurer of Notre Dame of Vitry, some land of three-quarters located at Pre de Lisses for 6 l.t. Made at Bignicourt sur Saulx, Aug. 16, 1494.

- Ramee, Nicolas de La, b. 1490--a notable of Leige Fled to Picardie after the capture of Leige by Charles Duke de Burgoyne in 1468 with son Jacques, b. 1485. Jacques had a son Pierre de la Ramee.
- Ramee, Pierre de la (Latin Ramus), b. 1515, in Cuts, Picardie, and was assassinated in Paris on St. Barthelemy day, Aug. 26, 1572. He was a Docteur and Professor of the University of Paris. He wrote many books, created the teaching of mathematics and astronomy, and was a very brilliant man.
- Ramey, Sire de, owned a mediaeval fortress half way between Tours and Amboise in 1560.
- Ramee, Pierre, a personage of Uruffe, 1566-1609.
- Rami, Hector, a recorder of Bouvignee, near Orchies was arrested in 1542, as a heretic and on his refusal to retract his confession of faith was beheaded at Douai. His wife, Mathinotte de Buisoot was for the same crime buried alive.
- Romy, Marie de, Naturalization letters in favor of her, laundress for the Quoon, living in Poissy, in the country of Hainut and married in Franco.
- Romi, Joan Canon of Cambrai 1548.
- Romy, Joan, a merchant at Chalons Sur Marne, m. Nicolo L'Advocat and had a son Joan Romy, a tanner at Charlons sur Marne, who m. Claudino Vaulbours, Apr. 25, 1583.
- Romy, Francois, related to the two Joan Ramys, witnessed the marriage of Joan and Claudino.
- Ramee, La, b. 1570, son of Guillaume de la Ramee, of Paris claimed to be the illegitimate son of Charles VIII, King of France. He was hanged in Paris Mar. 8, 1596. The family had been known in this province since 1329, coming from Chalons sur Marne about 1254, a branch of the ancient house of St. Remegio and were given grants of Nobility in 1583. New Grants were made in 1611 and in 1753. The Lorraine branches have a similar armorial bearing while that of Francis Remy, Lord of Campeau is quite distinct. Ennoblements were made to Nicolas Remy, Aug. 9, 1583. To Thierry Remy, Dec. 1, 1611 and to Gentille Remy (no date).
- Remy, Jacques, married a second time --- Mary ? in Westmoreland Co. V. in 1661.

#### The Huguenots of France

The history of France during the latter half of the 16th century, is taken up with a series of civil and religious wars between the Catholics and the Protestants of that country. Persecution of the Protestants or Huguenots as they were called, began during the reign of King Francis I, about 1535-40. Finally after many wars and uprisings, emanating from these conditions, on Apr. 13, 1598, the famous Edict of Nantes was signed by Henry IV. Louis XIV revoked the Edict on Oct. 23, 1685. Life became unbearable for the Huguenots and they left France in great numbers, some going to Germany, Great Britain, Ireland and later to America. Some, however, emigrated directly from France to America. Practically all the Remy Huguenots were followers of John Calvin and therefore Baptists.

#### Various Spellings of the Name

The fact that the Remi family emigrated from France to different countries, where the name took on a variation of spelling and that many of them couldn't speak English when they came to America and the Clerks wrote the name as it sounded, is probably the reason for the many spellings of the name. The Latin spelling was Remi, Remus and Remegio; the French, Remy and Ramee; the English, Rhomy, Rhamy Rhamo (those in South Carolina still spell their name Rhame). Other spellings such as Ramá, Rome, Ramie, Remmy, Raymey, Raymie, Rainoy, Rhimo, Rhemo, Remay, Reemo, Remy, Ramey and many others, appear in various records. It is believed, however that they all originated in France, and were originally of one family.

#### Interesting notes

Ouida was the pseudonym for the great English novelist, Louisa de la Ramee, who was b. 1839 at Bury, St. Edmonds, England. She was a magazine writer in 1860, but after 1874, she lived in Florence and Lucca, Italy. She died 1908.

"Daniel de Remy, sieur de Courcellesm and the first governor of New France, came to Quebec Sept. 12, 1665." taken from the book, "Four Cents an Acre,"

As early as 1562, Admiral Gaspard de Coligni, French Huguenot leader, formed the design of making America a refuge for his persecuted followers.

Under the Indenture System, men and women colonists were imported as "servants" from England and Ireland. These emigrants to the New World were under contract and bond to work four or five years for the land holder.

William R. Ramey, b. 1755, Washington Co. Va., married Eleanor Harrison, a sister of Pres. William Henry Harrison.

Benjamin Whitfield Remy, b. Apr. 7, 1808, built the first threshing machine, that operated with success. His machine was the forerunner of the International Harvester machines.

"Old records that have been unearthed in this county, (Page Co. Va., dating back 120 years and dovetailing with traditions even longer ago, show that the name Luray had its origin from Lewis Ramey, more than a century ago. Lewis Ramey was a blacksmith who conducted his trade near what is now the center of Luray and in or near the present road leading from the Norfolk and Western RR to the Luray Caverns. The records and traditions show that Lewis Ramey was popular in his day, everybody knowing him as Lou Ramey. In time his name of Lou Ramey, by everyday use, was shortened into Louray and later to Luray, and this was the name conferred upon the little settlement that grew up around the old blacksmith's place of business." -- taken from the Roanoke Times of May 29, 1926.

"I have never heard of any Remy being wealthy. They were hard working, honest, energetic, aspiring, independent and original in thought and action" -- Emma Louise (Reamy) King.

"The Remys as I knew them were honorable, high-minded and most of them were students. I have never heard of any of them being financiers, nor of any of them being on the relief rolls. The old Remy stock are Baptists. Many are stand-offish in their manner. Our family tradition was that the youngest son of a noble family of France, come to America, where titles were not and money depended on ones own efforts. Our family claimed that our name was derived from the Diocese of Rheims in France and that the line went back to Ramesses of the Pharaoh line in Egypt." -- from a member of the Thomas Remy family.

"Col Daniel Reamy, my father, had all of the strong passionate traits of the family and was suspicious by nature. If he thought he could trust a friend he did so with his heart, but let him be deceived once and he never trusted that person again. He hated falsehood and moral cowardice, was stern and uncompromising and insisted on implicit obedience in his home. He dreaded the formation of bad habits by any indulgence but nevertheless manifested deep concern in the welfare of children and assisted his wife in their education." --- Mary Anne (Reamy) Thomas.

"The study of the Remy tribe develops several characteristics. One is that they were strong minded, which is perhaps a polite way of saying that they were hot-headed and opinionated. They were as a rule, naturally of strong physical development, many of them being six-footers and weighing 200 pounds. In features, a square face, with heavy eyebrows and deep-seated eyes. They were farmers, but their sons took to professional avocations. In Egypt, they were rulers and religious heads. In Italy and France, they were nobles, rulers, priest and Huguenots. In America, they were pioneers and in the early days mostly, Baptists. As those pioneers had practically no schooling, because of the lack of schools in the frontiers, they were usually illiterate and when the settlements became organized and they were under necessity of signing deeds and other documents, they made their mark and the Clerk of the Court would write the name as it sounded to him." --- Dr. B. W. Rhamy.

The Remy family was prominent in the early days of Virginia. Several were soldiers in the French and Indian wars, including Daniel Ramie of Augusta Co., Frederick Reme, of Amelia Co., and George Riane of Coochland Co., Va.

#### Revolutionary War:

John Ramey, b. 1753 in Stafford Co., Va., Private enlisted in Culpepper Co. Va. in 1776 under officers Green, Muhlenberg and James Pendleton--was in the battle of White Plains.

Col. Daniel Remie was in the Battle of Kings Mountain, 1780 and fought under Gen. George Washington at Valley Forge and in subsequent campaigns.

Conrad Reamy, Private on the Pa. line 2nd Reg. Muster roll of Lieut. Henry Pierce Mar. 12, 1777.

Lawrence Ramey, served as a private under Lieut's. Magrue, Emason, Markley of the Pa. line.

Excerpts from letters I have received --IRJ

Frank Marion Ramey, lawyer at Hillsboro, Ill., and listed in Who's Who.

"My father James Thomas Ramey, was the son of William Henry Ramey and Sarah Catherine Ramey. My father was born in Memphis, Tenn in 1842. The said William Henry Ramey and wife moved from Fairfax Co., Va. to Woodford Co., Kentucky and later to Memphis, where my father was born." (July 28, 1939)

Mary Grace Ramey and dau. Carolyn Ramey, both of whom are Editors for the Country Gentleman Magazine, Philadelphia, Pa.

"As I only attained the distinction of being a "Ramey" by marriage, I am afraid I can't give you much information about the family. The family with which I am connected is located in Strasburg, Va. My father-in-law, who died many years ago was James Madison Ramey and I believe his father was Franklin Ramey." (Aug. 18, 1939)

J. Alonzo Matthews, Pres. Missouri Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. 5070 Vernon Ave., St Louis, Mo.

"My Ramey line dates back to Abram de Remi, which is the French spelling. Came to America in 1700. Abram was a descendant of Count Raoul de Remi of Picardy, France. They settled near Richmond, Va. and here reared a son Pierre de Remi. Daniel, his son, served in the Colonial Militia under George Washington at Valley Forge. The line comes down to John Ramey who m. Sarah Martin in Ky., moved to Ill. Thomas T. Ramey was owner of Monks Mound near East St. Louis." (Oct. 21, 1939)

J. Alonzo Matthews: "At an early date some of the Rameys emigrated to Ky. locating in Clark Co. Some of my branch also settled in Trigg Co., Ky. My Daniel Ramey d. in Clark Co. in 1806. I haven't the date of his birth. His wife was Rachel and they had a son Daniel, who d. Dec. 25, 1805, who m. a Miss Sally, her second husband was Mr. Woody. John Ramey lived in Caldwell Co., Ky, son of Daniel. William Ramey m. Jane Sanders who was b. 1796 and received a pension for services of William in the War of 1812. He was captured by the British at River Raisin and confined at Ft. Malden until paroled." (Oct. 26, 1939)

Ruby L. Ramey - Jay (Mrs. Earle) 517 E. 3rd St., Salida, Colo.

"I am truly proud of all the Rameys I have ever known. A second cousin, Mrs. Virgie Rice Board tells that our paternal ancestors fled with the Huguenots on account of religious persecution and came to this country. Their characteristics were French. One of the early members of our family edited and published the first religious publication in this country, called the "Gospel Call". My great grandmother was a Prima Donna. My grandfather was Judge James Stephen Ramey of Kentucky, and my father Thomas Winston Ramey, a Christian Minister, was his only son although there were several daughters. My father m. Mary England and their children were: Clara Ann; James Stephen; George Lee, b. 1868 and is now living at 1340 S. Accoma St., Denver, Colo., Ella Victoria; Thomas Winston; Mayo Milton; William Riggs; C.E. (Neil) living at 3950 Hammel St., Los Angeles, Cal., Mary Jessie now living in Vista, Colo and myself. My brother, James Stephen was a composer. Some of his best known publications were "Mother Love", "Sunny Treasure State", "Remembrances of Childhood", "Uncle Sam", "America's Flag", and "Mountain Home Waltz". (Nov. 8, 1939)

Agnes Stevenson-Gardner (Mrs. W. M.) of Russellville, Ohio.

"I have all of the Lawrence Ramey family record. He was an early settler in Brown Co., Ohio" (Oct. 12, 1939)

Julia Brown Asplund (Mrs. Rupert F.) Santa Fe, N. Mexico.

"The immigrant ancestor was probably a "Remy", who with his wife came to Mannachintown, Va., in 1700. Will of Jacob Ramey, Sr., Westmoreland Co., 1721 leaves property to son Jacob. Wife's name Mary. The line as known runs as follows: Jacob Ramey, Loudoun Co., Va. m. Elizabeth Lane. 2. Jacob Ramey, Ky m. Deboza Lee. 3. Lydia Ann Ramey (1800-48) Winchester Ky., m. James Brown. 4. Julia Rosalind Duncan (1822-99) Clarence Mo., m. Cyrus S. Brown, 5. James Duncan Brown (1844-1918) St. Joseph, Mo. m. Martha Lewis. 6. Julia Duncan Brown, Santa Fe., N. M. m. Rupert Asplund." (Nov. 18, 1939)

A. Ramey, 2008 Lindwood, K.C., Mo. -- he came from Ohio and Kentucky.

C. M. Ramey 3408 Garfield, K.C., Mo. -- he was the son of Rufus Ramey, from Benjamin Co., Ohio. He has a sister, Mrs. Sam Hawks, East Circleville, Ohio.

Cora Ramey 1423 Garfield, K.C. Mo. They came from Higginsville Mo. They are colored folks and took the name Ramey from Andrew Ramoy.

Fannie L. Ramey, 803 Cypress, K.C., Mo., Her husband is dead, but he came from the Zackory Mason Ramoy, of Rapahancock, Co., Va. and some of them are from Ky.

Ed Ramoy, RFD 1, Bethel, Ks. His family came from Russell, Ky. His father and brother John are doctors as well as John's son and they have a hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Voyage C. and William Ramey, 6006 Cherry St., K.C. Mo. are brothers and their grandfather was in the Revolution War and they have always lived near Sedalia, Mo. (Aug. 1939)

Sam Ramey, Low Gap, N.C.

"Elijah Ramey was a Primitive Baptist minister and established Fisher's Gap Church at Low Gap, N.C. The original church is still standing". (Jan. 31, 1940)

Samuel Pelly Ramey was also a Primitive Baptist minister.

"John Ramey came over with Lafayette and he and his brothers thus escaped from the assassins for Robespierre". Lafayette came to America in 1779. Robespierre's time was from 1789 to 1794.

1. Elijah Ramey, b. Mar. 23, 1803, near Low Gap, in Surry Co., N.C. In June 1832, he m. Priscilla Jarvis, a sister of Matilda and Pattie Jarvis. Priscilla was born Sept. 11, 1811 and was of Scotch descent. They moved west about 1861, settled first in Missouri. They lived there about a year and owned a farm. They left for Kansas in the night and took only what they could carry in a covered wagon, leaving the crops in the fields, most of their stock and household goods, because men were to be drafted in the Southern Army of the Civil war the next morning. After the war Elijah went back to Missouri, but could never prove title to the farm. When they came to Kansas they settled first near Aubury. They lived in a very small cabin, which had a dirt floor. That winter they all had the measles and nearly died. They then moved to northern Miami Co., Ks., bought land and built a home. He d. Nov. 15, 1881 and she d. Sept. 2, 1891. They were first buried on their farm, but later were moved to the Antioch cemetery.
- 2 (1) Samuel Pelly Ramey, b. July 8, 1833, near Low Gap, in Surray County N. C. In 1855, he m. Sarah Dorcas Hodges, who was b. Dec. 6, 1837, and was the daughter of William H. and Martha (Cunningham) Hodges. In 1857, they moved to Springfield, Mo. and then to Pleasant Hill, Mo., and in 1861, to a farm in Douglas Co., Ks., near Blue Mound, which is about seven miles south east of Lawrence. While they were living there, Quantrill waged his guerrilla war fare on eastern Kansas. On the morning of Aug. 21, 1863, Samuel hitched up the team to go to the field to work, when he heard a great commotion in the direction of Lawrence. He went to the top of a hill and saw a great band of horsemen, about 450, riding from house to house setting fire to them and killing as many of the occupants as they could see. Oil must have been poured on the log-cabins, because they burst into flames almost immediately. He ran back to the house, took his wife, two small children and as much of his stock as he could get together to the woods and hid them. On his return to the hill top, he saw the bank of half-drunk, plunder-laden men coming toward him. He barely had time to climb into the well. There he hung to the slippery wall while Quantrill and his men rode by only a few yards away from the well. We often wonder what would have happened if the men had stopped for water. Shortly after this experience, they moved to Miami Co., near Antioch, bought land adjoining his father's farm, built a house where the five youngest children were born and where Samuel d. May 12, 1905 and Sarah d. June 10, 1915. They are both buried in the Antioch cem.
- 3 (1) Richard Pierrer Ramey, b. Oct. 8, 1857, in Surry Co. N. C. On Apr. 22, 1885, he m. Martha Frances Carnes, b. Feb. 4, 1868. They made their home on a farm  $\frac{1}{4}$  mi. S. of the Antioch Store, where their six children were born. They moved to Spring Hill, Ks., when their youngest daughter was in High School, and later to a farm southeast of Ottawa, Ks., where Martha d. May 6, 1930. He then made his home with his daughter, Elsie until his death, Dec. 3, 1933. They both are buried in the Gardner cem.

The oldest was born in Missouri and the rest on a farm near Spring Hill, Ks. In August in 1862, during the Civil War, he enlisted in Co. I, Kansas Inf. He was connected with the Hospital Corps at Little Rock, Arkansas, where he mustered out June 1, 1865. In 1880, he went to Gardner Township, Johnson Co., Ka. and became

a farmer and stock raiser. He was a pioneer in politics and religion -- at least 25 years ahead of his time. His nickname in Johnson and Miami Counties was "Invincible Dan". He was never beaten in an argument and had the courage of his convictions and was not afraid of God, man nor the devil. He was a personal friend of the late Sen. Peffer, Sen. Curtis and George H. Hodges who was the Governor of Kansas from 1913 to 1915. He was prominent in many lodges: was Master of his Masonic lodge, 32nd degree Mason, Eastern Star, Noble grand of IOOF, Rebecca and Grango. He married a second time at Paola, Ks. on Dec. 22, 1881, Caroline Reeves, who was b. Jan. 6, 1843, in Ohio. To them one son was born. It is no aggeration to say that Caroline Reeves-Ramey was loved by all who know her. During the last twelve years of her life when she was an invalid, due to paralysis, she often said, "Well I never had time to read all I wanted to, before." Daniel Ramey d. Apr. 23, 1915 at Spring Hill and Caroline died July 21, 1921. They are both buried in Gardner cem.

1. Elijah Ramey, b. Mar. 23, 1803, near Low Gap, in Surry Co., N.C. In June 1832, he m. Priscilla Jarvis, a sister of Matilda and Pattie Jarvis. Priscilla was born Sept. 11, 1811 and was of Scotch descent. They moved west about 1861, settled first in Missouri. They lived there about a year and owned a farm. They left for Kansas in the night and took only what they could carry in a covered wagon, leaving the crops in the fields, most of their stock and household goods, because men were to be drafted in the Southern Army of the Civil war the next morning. After the war Elijah went back to Missouri, but could never prove title to the farm. When they came to Kansas they settled first near Aubury. They lived in a very small cabin, which had a dirt floor. That winter they all had the measles and nearly died. They then moved to northern Miami Co., Ks., bought land and built a home. He d. Nov. 15, 1881 and she d. Sept. 2, 1891. They were first buried on their farm, but later were moved to the Antioch cemetery.
- 2 (1) Samuel Pelly Ramey, b. July 8, 1833, near Low Gap, in Surry County N. C. In 1855, he m. Sarah Dorcas Hodges, who was b. Dec. 6, 1837, and was the daughter of William H. and ~~Martha~~ <sup>DORCAS</sup> (Cunningham) Hodges. In 1857, they moved to Springfield, Mo. and then to Pleasant Hill, Mo., and in 1861, to a farm in Douglas Co., Ks., near Blue Mound, which is about seven miles south east of Lawrence. While they were living there, Quantrill waged his guerrilla war fare on eastern Kansas. On the morning of Aug. 21, 1863, Samuel hitched up the team to go to the field to work, when he heard a great commotion in the direction of Lawrence. He went to the top of a hill and saw a great band of horsemen, about 450, riding from house to house setting fire to them and killing as many of the occupants as they could see. Oil must have been poured on the log-cabins, because they burst into flames almost immediately. He ran back to the house, took his wife, two small children and as much of his stock as he could get together to the woods and hid them. On his return to the hill top, he saw the bank of half-drunk, plunder-laden men coming toward him. He barely had time to climb into the well. There he hung to the slippery wall while Quantrill and his men rode by only a few yards away from the well. We often wonder what would have happened if the men had stopped for water. Shortly after this experience, they moved to Miami Co., near Antioch, bought land adjoining his father's farm, built a house where the five youngest children were born and where Samuel d. May 12, 1905 and Sarah d. June 10, 1915. They are both buried in the Antioch cem.

## Early Chronology of the Remi Family

Bible: Ramesis II, the Pharoah of the Oppression and Ramesis III, the Pharoah of the Exodus (about 1320 B.C.) are listed. These Pharoahs undoubtedly had a large progeny, and as mighty Egypt spread her trade and power, no doubt this royal family of Ramses crossed the Mediterranean into Italy and Rome.

Italy: Roman legends ascribe the foundation of the city of Rome at about 752 B.C. to the twin brothers Romulus and Remus, who were abandoned in infancy and were suckled by a she-wolf. Romulus finally slew his brother and became King I. In the years 753 to 510 B.C., the city occupied seven hills whose summits arose 80 to 120 feet above the Tiber River. The Remi had a castle on one of these hills, which was their family seat.

Gaul: According to ancient history, the Gauls inhabited northern Italy (Gallia Cisalpina) and they were of the same race of Aryans, that inhabited Gaul to the north of the Alps in France. Of these the Remi were described as "a people of Belgae in Gaul". There are many references to the Romi tribe in Caesar's Gallic wars.

Rheims: The city of Rheims and the Cathedral of Rheims derive their name from the Latin form Remigus and was named for Saint Remi, b. 437 A.D, and d. 533 A. D., the Bishop of Rheims, who anointed and crowned Clovis, King of France, on Christmas day 496 A. D.

Remegio, William and Robert de St., "held hands in Normandy (1179-1223)"  
Remegio, Richard de St., lived in Normandy in 1198.  
Remy, Henry de St. -- his decendants divided into two branches, which bore respectively the names of St. Remy de Valois and St. Remy de Luze. The family spread over Lorraine, Artois, Picardy, Paris and French Flanders and some ten branches were granted Armorial Bearings at different times.  
Remy, Erard de Saint, a liege of Count de Champagne.  
Remy, Pierre of Lorraine, was treasurer to King Charles IV, of France (1322-1328)  
Remi, Canon of Chalons sur Marne, Oct, 1254.  
Remy, Bishop of Chalons sur Marne from 1275-83 vidimus his will Oct. 14, 1314.  
Remi, Saint Etienne, Neufbours (Chalons sur Marne) Nov. 10, 1360. Lease to J.....Remy for a vineyard, for the sum of 15 c.t. de cens a year for life. Saint Lumior en Champagne Mar. 17, 1402.  
Remy, Jehan (Jean), Cavalier of the Duke of Bourgoyne, 1427.  
Remy, Amoury, Cavalier. Paving of the court of the St. Julien Hospital at Lille, May 17, 1432.  
Remy, Didier, Chalons sur Marne, June 10, 1435.  
Remi, Mariette, lived at Ivory 1464.  
Remy, Guillaume---Girardin le Roux, a silk weaver, sold to Guillaume Remi, treasurer of the Catholic School of Marolles, one quarter and a half of a vineyard called Vraudroy, for 18 pounds for the land and 10 sous for the wine, made at Vitry en Perthois and Vaux, Jan. 12, 1460.  
Vitry en Perthois 18 papers, dated June 10, 1493 until Aug. 4, 1511, P. Cuchart, arch doacon of Joinsville, and priest of Vouchleri sold mentioned above to Guillaume Remy, canon of Chalons sur Marne, Oct. 1495. Extract collection of the will of Guillaume Remy, canon, Sept. 10, 1507, willed to the collogo, several inheritances, among others a farm Buisson. Nicolas Gucho, fisherman sold to Guillaume Remy, treasurer of Notre Dame, three-quarters of land located at the outskirts of Vaux in la Baudette, for 11 pounds 10 S.T. for the land and 5 s.t. for the wine. Made at Vitry en Perthois, Saint Eturine, and Marolles, Apr. 22, 1489. Antoine de Combas, priest of Buisson, sold to Guillaume Remy, Priest of St. Eturine de Chatons and treasurer of Notre Dame of Vitry, some land of three-quarters located at Pre de Lisses for 6 l.t. Made at Bignicourt sur Saulx, Aug. 16, 1494.

- Ramee, Nicolas de la, b. 1490--a notable of Leige Fled to Picardie after the capture of Leige by Charles Duke de Burgoyne in 1468 with son Jacques, b. 1485. Jacques had a son Pierre de la Ramee.
- Ramee, Pierre de la (Latin Ramus), b. 1515, in Cuts, Picardie, and was assassinated in Paris on St. Barthelemy day, Aug. 26, 1572. He was a Docteur and Proffessor of the University of Paris. He wrote many books, created the teaching of mathematics and astronomy, and was a very brilliant man.
- Ramey, Sire de, owned a mediaeval fortress half way between Tours and Amboise in 1560.
- Ramee, Pierre, a personage of Uruffe, 1566-1609.
- Rami, Hector, a recorder of Bouvignee, near Orchies was arrested in 1542, as a heretic and on his refusal to retract his confession of faith was beheaded at Douai. His wife, Mathinette de Buisoot was for the same crime buried alive.
- Romy, Marie de, Naturalization letters in favor of her, laundress for the Quoon, living in Poissy, in the country of Hainut and married in France.
- Romi, Joan Canon of Cambrai 1548.
- Romy, Joan, a morchant at Chalons Sur Marno, m. Nicolo L'Advocat ans had a son Joan Romy, a tanner at Charlons sur Marno, who m. Claudino Vaulbours, Apr. 25, 1583.
- Romy, Francois, related to the two Joan Ramys, witnessod the marriage of Joan and Claudino.
- Ramee, La, b. 1570, son of Guillaume de la Ramee, of Paris claimed to be the illegitimate son of Charles VIII, King of France. He was hanged in Paris Mar. 8, 1596. The family had been known in this province since 1329, coming from Chalons sur Marne about 1254, a branch of the ancient house of St. Remegio and were given grants of Nobility in 1583. New Grants were made in 1611 and in 1753. The Lorraine branches have a similar armorial bearing while that of Francis Remy, Lord of Campeau is quite distinct. Ennoblements were made to Nicolas Remy, Aug. 9, 1583. To Thierry Remy, Dec. 1, 1611 and to Gentille Remy (no date).
- Remey, Jacques, married a second time --- Mary ? in Westmoreland Co. V. in 1661.

#### The Huguenots of France

The history of France during the latter half of the 16th century, is taken up with a series of civil and religious wars between the Catholics and the Protestants of that country. Persecution of the Protestants or Huguenots as they were called, began during the reign of King Francis I, about 1535-40. Finally after many wars and uprisings, emanating from these conditions, on Apr. 13, 1598, the famous Edict of Nantes was signed by Henry IV. Louis XIV revoked the Edict on Oct. 23, 1685. Life became unbearable for the Huguenots and they left France in great numbers, some going to Germany, Great Britain, Ireland and later to America. Some, however, emigrated directly from France to America. Practically all the Remy Huguenots were followers of John Calvin and therefore Baptists.

#### Various Spellings of the Name

The fact that the Remi family emigrated from France to different countries, where the name took on a variation of spelling and that many of them couldn't speak English when they came to America and the Clerks wrote the name as it sounded, is probably the reason for the many spellings of the name. The Latin spelling was Remi, Remus and Remegio; the French, Remy and Ramee; the English, Rhemy, Rhamy Rhame (those in South Carolina still spell their name Rhame). Other spellings such as Rama, Rome, Ramie, Remmy, Raymoy, Raymie, Raimy, Rhime, Rhemo, Remay, Reemo, Remy, Ramey and many others, appear in various records. It is believed, however that they all originated in France, and were originally of one family.

#### Interesting notes

Ouida was the pseudonym for the great English novelist, Louisa de la Ramee, who was b. 1839 at Bury, St. Edmonds, England. She was a magazine writer in 1860, but after 1874, she lived in Florence and Lucca, Italy. She died 1906.

"Daniel de Remy, sieur de Courcellesm and the first governor of New France, came to Quebec Sept. 12, 1665." taken from the book, "Four Cents an Acre,"

As early as 1562, Admiral Gaspard de Coligni, French Huguenot leader, fromed the design of making America a refuge for his persecuted followers.

Under the Indenture System, men and women colonists were imported as "servants" from England and Ireland. These emigrants to the New World were under contract and bond to work four or five years for the land holder.

William R. Ramey, b. 1755, Washington Co. Va., married Eleanor Harrison, a sister of Pres. William Henry Harrison.

Benjamin Whitfield Remy, b. Apr. 7, 1808, built the first threshing machine, that operated with success. His machine was the forerunner of the International Harvester machines.

"Old records that have been unearthed in this county, (Page Co. Va., dating back 120 years and dovetailing with traditions even longer ago, show that the name Luray had its origin from Lewis Ramey, more than a century ago. Lewis Ramey was a blacksmith who conducted his trade near what is now the center of Luray and in or near the present road leading from the Norfolk and Western RR to the Luray Caverns. The records and traditions show that Lewis Ramey was popular in his day, everybody knowing him as Lou Ramey. In time his name of Lou Ramey, by everyday use, was shortened into Louray and later to Luray, and this was the name conferred upon the little settlement that grew up around the old blacksmith's place of business." -- taken from the Roanoke Times of May 29, 1926.

"I have never heard of any Remy being wealthy. They were hard working, honest, energetic, aspiring, independent and original in thought and action" -- Emma Louise (Reamy) King.

"The Remys as I knew them were honorable, high-minded and most of them were students. I have never heard of any of them being financiers, nor of any of them being on the relief rolls. The old Remy stock are Baptists. Many are stand-offish in their manner. Our family tradition was that the youngest son of a noble family of France, come to America, where titles were not and money depended on ones own efforts. Our family claimed that our name was derived from the Diocese of Rheims in France and that the line went back to Ramesses of the Pharaoh line in Egypt." -- from a member of the Thomas Remy family.

"Col Daniel Reamy, my father, had all of the strong passionate traits of the family and was suspicious by nature. If he thought he could trust a friend he did so with his heart, but let him be deceived once and he never trusted that person again. He hated falsehood and moral cowardice, was stern and uncompromising and insisted on implicit obedience in his home. He dreaded the formation of bad habits by any indulgence but nevertheless manifested deep concern in the welfare of children and assisted his wife in their education." --- Mary Anne (Reamy) Thomas.

"The study of the Remy tribe develops several characteristics. One is that they were strong minded, which is perhaps a polite way of saying that they were hot-headed and opinionated. They were as a rule, naturally of strong physical development, many of them being six-footers and weighing 200 pounds. In features, a square face, with heavy eyebrows and deep-seated eyes. They were farmers, but their sons took to professional avocations. In Egypt, they were rulers and religious heads. In Italy and France, they were nobles, rulers, priest and Huguenots. In America, they were pioneers and in the early days mostly, Baptists. As those pioneers had practically no schooling, because of the lack of schools in the frontiers, they were usually illiterate and when the settlements became organized and they were under necessity of signing deeds and other documents, they made their mark and the Clerk of the Court would write the name as it sounded to him." --- Dr. B. W. Rhamy.

The Remy family was prominent in the early days of Virginia. Several were soldiers in the French and Indian wars, including Daniel Ramie of Augusta Co., Frederick Reme, of Amelia Co., and George Riane of Coochland Co., Va.

#### Revolutionary War:

John Ramey, b. 1753 in Stafford Co., Va., Private enlisted in Culpepper Co. Va. in 1776 under officers Green, Muhlenberg and James Pendleton--was in the battle of White Plains.

Col. Daniel Remie was in the Battle of Kings Mountain, 1780 and fought under Gen. George Washington at Valley Forge and in subsequent campaigns.

Conrad Reamy, Private on the Pa. line 2nd Reg. Muster roll of Lieut. Henry Pierce Mar. 12, 1777.

Lawrence Ramey, served as a private under Lieut's. Magrue, Emason, Markley of the Pa. line.

Mary Grace Ramey and dau. Carolyn Ramey, both of whom are Editors for the Country Gentleman Magazine, Philadelphia, Pa.

"As I only attained the distinction of being a "Ramey" by marriage, I am afraid I can't give you much information about the family. The family with which I am connected is located in Strasburg, Va. My father-in-law, who died many years ago was James Madison Ramey and I believe his father was Franklin Ramey." (Aug. 18, 1939)

J. Alonzo Matthews, Pres. Missouri Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. 5070 Vernon Ave., St Louis, Mo.

"My Ramey line dates back to Abram de Remi, which is the French spelling. Came to America in 1700. Abram was a descendant of Count Raoul de Remi of Picardy, France. They settled near Richmond, Va. and here reared a son Pierre de Remi. Daniel, his son, served in the Colonial Militia under George Washington at Valley Forge. The line comes down to John Ramey who m. Sarah Martin in Ky., moved to Ill. Thomas T. Ramey was owner of Monks Mound near East St. Louis." (Oct. 21, 1939)

J. Alonzo Matthews: "At an early date some of the Rameys emigrated to Ky. locating in Clark Co. Some of my branch also settled in Trigg Co., Ky. My Daniel Ramey d. in Clark Co. in 1806. I haven't the date of his birth. His wife was Rachel and they had a son Daniel, who d. Dec. 25, 1805, who m. a Miss Sally, her second husband was Mr. Woody. John Ramey lived in Caldwell Co., Ky, son of Daniel. William Ramey m. Jane Sanders who was b. 1796 and received a pension for services of William in the War of 1812. He was captured by the British at River Raisin and confined at Ft. Malden until paroled." (Oct. 26, 1939)

"I am truly proud of all the Rameys I have ever known. A second cousin, Mrs. Virgie Rice Board tells that our paternal ancestors fled with the Huguenots on account of religious persecution and came to this country. Their characteristics were French. One of the early members of our family edited and published the first religious publication in this country, called the "Gospel Call". My great grandmother was a Prima Donna. My grandfather was Judge James Stephen Ramey of Kentucky, and my father Thomas Winston Ramey, a Christian Minister, was his only son although there were several daughters. My father m. Mary England and their children were: Clara Ann; James Stephen; George Lee, b. 1868 and is now living at 1340 S. Accoma St., Denver, Colo., Ella Victoria; Thomas Winston; Mayo Milton; William Riggs; C.E. (Neil) living at 3950 Hammel St., Los Angeles, Cal., Mary Jessie now living in Vista, Colo and myself. My brother, James Stephen was a composer. Whereas the King's most Excellent Majesty in his most Special Grace and favour hath been graciously pleased for the Greater promotion and propagation of this his Majesty's Colony and Dominion of Virginia, by Act of Assembly, to enact and declare all Aliens coming into this country and here residing, taking the Oath of Allegiance, to be invested with all the rights and privileges of any of his Majesty's natural born subjects within the said Colony and, Whereas by the said Act it is enacted and declared that the Governor and Commander in Chief for the time being in said Colony, by a public instrument under the broad Seal thereof to declare any Alien or Sovereign being settled and inhabiting this Colony have taken the Oath of Allegiance before the Governor and Commander in Chief for the time being to be to all intents and purposes fully and completely naturalized, and the person or persons so approved by and named in the letters Patent to have and enjoy to them and their heirs, the same immunities and rights of and unto the law and privileges of their colony, and as fully and amply as any of his Majesty's natural born subjects of this colony have or enjoy within the same. Therefore I, Sir Henry Chichley, Knight, his Majesty's Deputy Governor and Commander in Chief, do by virtue of the said Act, hereby certify and declare that Jacob Remy, a Natural subject of the French King, hath taken the Oath of Allegiance before me. ## JARVIS

Daniel Jarvis was of Irish parentage and born in New Jersey. He married Nancy Anderson who was also born in New Jersey. Daniel was an active part of the Revolutionary War and after the war he removed to Surry County, NC. He engaged in farming. Born to Daniel and Nancy were John, James, Stephen, Daniel, William and Nancy.

Elephalet Jarvis entered 200 acres on both sides of Fisher River - March 11, 1778.

In 1778 John Jarvis and Eriah Jarvis owned land near Fisher's River.

Jabez Jarvis entered 200 acres in the forks of the Yadkin and Fishers River - March 11, 1778. Jabez entered 400 acres on a branch of Cody Creek - March 11, 1779. Jabez Jarvis - 150 acres in fork of Yadkin River and Fishers River adjoining survey whereon he now lives - May 12, 1779.

John Jarvis entered 300 acres on Fishers River at the mouth of Double Branch - August 13, 1778.

Rezia Jarvis - 200 acres on Fishers River above Big Falls of Fisher's River - August 12, 1778.

From Surry County records, these known Jarvis/Jarvises were in Surry County during 1780 and 1800: Eliphalet, Stephen, Rezia, Jabez, James Daniel, John, James, William and Stephen. Rezia, Levi and Abner were constables at various times in Surry County.
