DELAY OF APPROVAL OF LOAN APPLICATION POSES PROBLEM

On May 1 your Telephone Cooperative announced that a loan application in the amount \$2,500,000 had been submitted to the Rural Electrification Administration for upgrading your entire telephone system to 1-party service and to provide service for 2,480 new subscribers. It would also provide for the construction of a new central office exchange to be located in the Shoals section of Surry County. It appears that there may be a delay in the approval of this loan application as sufficient money has not been appropriated in the 1967 budget for the telephone program throughout the United States. If loan funds are delayed, our conversion to a 1-party system, and the building of the Shoals Exchange will also be delayed. Our immediate needs in the new construction and facilities will be done on a limited scale with our general funds, pending the approval of R. E. A.

This is the problem that confronts your Cooperative. Management is doing everything possible to get our United States Representatives and Senators to support legislation that would provide supplemental financing for the R. E. A. telephone program so that we may continue to upgrade and serve the tremendous new growth in our rural telephone area.
