Second, to our Chemistry teacher, Miss Houser, the beauty and curls of Helen Horton

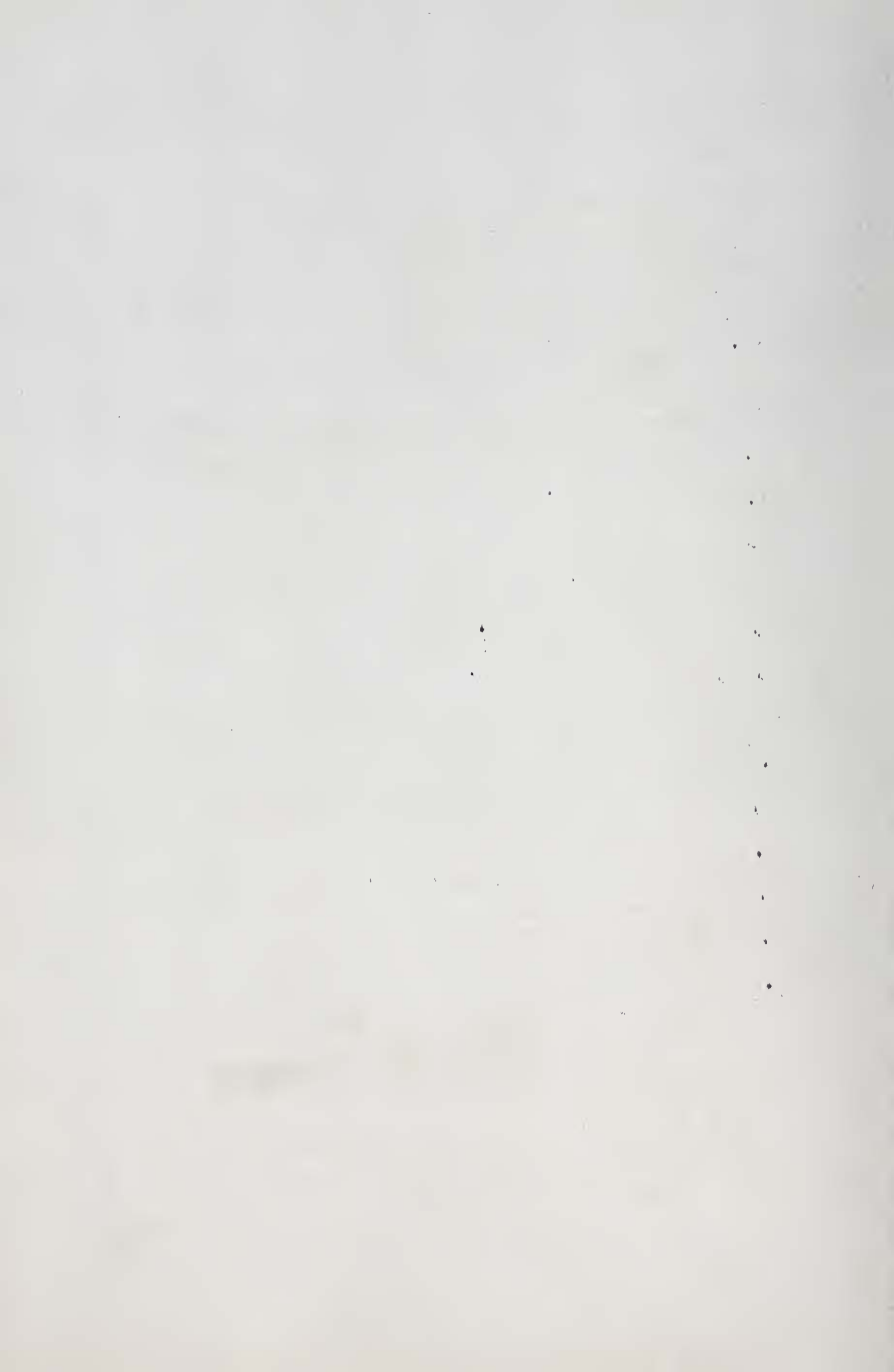
Third, to Miss Kendall and Miss Coltrane twin dresses of Audrey Lynn Vernon and Ethel Bowman.

"Very well, you may stay until nearly dawn, but you must leave then for for I have business." She gave a shrill maniacal cackle.

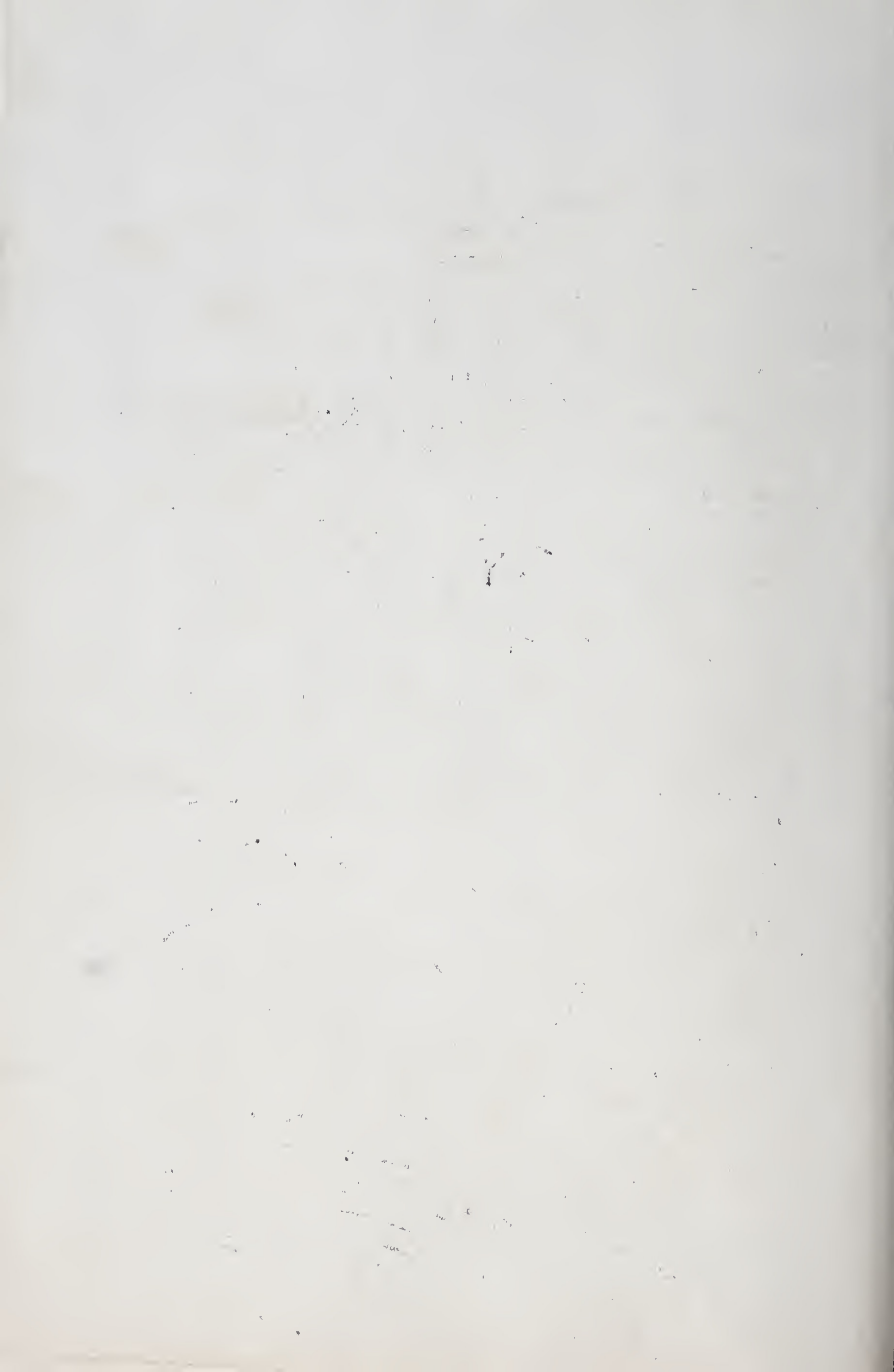
I sat watching her as she mumbled over and over: "Let me see the future." "Let me see the future."
