This census shows Ezekiel and one other male born before 1784 (who was not listed I this houshold in 1787), with five females (presumably his wife and daughters — two of whom were in the household in 1787 and two who appeared in the household between 1787 & 1790. Since the male born before 1784 was not listed in Ezekiel's household in 1787, I think that he was a nearly grown relative, possibly a brother of Ezekiel.

Judy Stanley Cardwell's FGS for Ezekiel leads to the following predicted 1790 census: Ezekiel Wilmoth 104?.

Thus the census shows an "extra male" and an "extra female" in the household. There are several possible explanations for the pair. They could one of Ezekiel's brothers and a sister or a spouse who are living with Ezekiel. The "extra male" could be any age between 16 & 60, and there is no information about the age of the "extra female", so they could also be parents of Ezekiel or his wife.

Based on the previous census & tax listings for Ezekiel, I would expect to find two males over 26, plus any sons born during the decade (apparently two sons were born). I would also expect Ezekiel's wife, plus 4 females age 11 or older and any daughters born during the decade). There are two adult females, two teenage females, and two females who were under 10. Clearly the "extra adults" who were present in 1790 were both still present and were 45+. They could have been Ezekiel's parents or parents-in-law.

Judy's FGS for Ezekiel leads to the following predicted 1800 census:

Excluding the 45+ couple, the differences are that the FGS has 3 males under 10 (instead of 2 as shown in the census), 1 female under 10 (instead of 2), and 3 females 10 – 16 (instead of 2). This suggests that there may be incorrect birth years given in the FGS – these differences can be reconciled if William were born after the census date in 1800 rather than before, and Elizabeth were born born before the census date in 1790 rather than 1789.

The 1810 census agrees with the 1800 census except for the absence of a 55+ male , a 55+ female, and two females 16-25. I suspect that the 55+ couple were parents or parent-in-law who died during the decade. I also suspect that the female 16-25 was married and left home. (She may have been the Sally who married James Hodges and gave birth to Rozena Hodges in 1808.)

The FGS for Ezekiel leads to the following predicted 1810 census:

The FGS differs from the census in that the census has 1 males 10-15 (instead of 0 male under 10 and 2 males 10-15), 1 female 16 – 25 (instead of 2), and 0 females 26 – 44 (instead of 1). The difference for the males can be explained if William was born in late 1800 instead of 1799. The differences for the females can be explained if the two oldest daughters were married and left

home (or died).

If born in 1761 as shown in the FGS, Ezekiel should have been 51 and thus exempt from the poll levy. His oldest son, Stephen, should have been too young, at 19, to be levied, so this assessment for a poll may mean that Ezekiel was not yet 50, and thus he was born late in the year 1762 or later. Based on the 1810 census, he was born before 1765. His acreage had increased by 72 acres since 1800.

Each name with a \* in between first and last names is not proven in descent, but assumed, with documents to lead one to that assumption.

It is not proven that Ezekiel is in this line. The family was researched and compiled from hundreds of documents and family trees obtained over the years. I have not found one

record that would indicate that they are descendants of William (1) of Jamestown. But the search will continue. Ezekiel might have moved to New Jersey from the James River area, for the records I have found have all been in South Amboy, Middlesex Co., NJ, in Wilkes Co., NC and, around 1790, in Elbert Co., GA. This is where William Wilmoth, Jr. was born in 1759. Later he was found in Wilkes Co., NC. Military records state he was born in NJ and also Ezekiel Wilmoth of Wilkes and Surry Co., NC was born in NJ. As for the other children listed, I have no records of them or their descendants. The fact that her mother, Mary Riggs, was born in NJ has never been disputed. However, most everyone believes that Ezekiel was also from NJ.

While further research is needed, I believe this is the first evidence of where Ezekiel was actually born.

### Notes for Ezekiel WILMOTH

# RANDOLPH HOLBROOK

695

Before there was a Wilkes County, when it was still Surry, the Parish of Saint Jude, there were Holbrooks beside the east prong of Roaring River on Holbrook Mountain, a scenic spur off the Blue Ridge between the east and middle prongs of the river.

Randolph (or Randol) Holbrook, his wife and family, accompanied by William Hargas, evidently a close relative, from Goochland County, Virginia, were among the early settlers, early enough for Surry's 1774 list.

Soon after Wilkes was formed and the land grant office opened in 1778, Randolph filed an entry for 250 acres near his brother John's (See Family of John Holbrook, Senior) on which he had made "improvements" on the east fork of Roaring River, on the south side of a mountain.

Other entries included: John Fugit for land "near the Gap of Holdbrooks Mountain"; George Brewer, "at the foot of a mountain called Holdbrooks Mountain"; and William Hargas, "on top of Holdbrooks Mountain."

Peter Greenstreet's entries, had established the name as Greenstreet Mountain.

By 1785 Randolph's acreage had increased to 410, and in 1787 the number in his household seemed to indicate that in addition to his and Mary's children, Sukey, Robert, Colby, Randall and Larkin, others, of perhaps a previous marriage probably to a Hargas, were living there.

On May 1, 1789 Randolph's daughter Susan, called Sukey, was married to Willis Alexander, son of Angus and Woenifred (Fugate) Alexander, early settlers on Longbottom. The fact that Ralph Holbrook was bondsman indicated a close relationship.

Just thirteen years after the date of his grant, Randolph died without a will very early in 1793 and was buried in an unmarked grave on his plantation. His coffin made locally of walnut lumber cost ten shillings. The sale of his estate brought 169 pounds, 11 shillings and 9 pence. The 28 hogsheads and three tight casks indicated that he was a cooper, a maker of barrels and casks. In Virginia he used hogsheads to transport tobacco to market. Here he could send hides and skins to Salem or Salisbury.

Items brought by his family included: the Bible, the razor, one saddle, the grubbing hoe and "basons" by Colby; 18 hogsheads and one horse by Robert; the loom, the table, a cow and a calf and "met" (meat) by Mary; a saddle by a nephew.

Some valuables went to neighbors: the "slay" (sleigh) and harness to Jasper Billings; the woman's saddle (side saddle) to John Hammons, Jr.; a bed, flax wheel, pair of cards

and grindstone to William Alexander "chist" and oven to Spencer Adams "reep" (reap) hook and a piggin to Ste Caudle; and the churn to Charles Cate.

Of the five children of Randolph and I only Sukey and Colbert (Colbey) were liv Wilkes in 1850. Willis and Sukey Alex had five sons, and Colbert had three son two daughters.

Robert had moved to Surry County an married Frances Cook in 1803. Randal migrated to eastern Kentucky.

Larkin, born about 1780, had an early near Poll Bridge on the northern end of G street Mountain soon moved to Ashe Alleghany) County. He married Sarah ( Sallie) Sheckles, born about 1782. Pendry, who is owner of a trucking business. Their son Michael Reid is a graduate of UNC Chapel Hill and District Manager of Automatic Data Processing Co. in Winston-Salem; twins Jesse Larry and James Garry became ministers, following the tradition of their Caudill ancestors; and Johnny is in charge of mechanics at Hammrey Trucking after his training at Forsyth Tech in Winston-Salem. Hubert Sr. died May 14, 1944 and Minnie died on April 26, 1975.

Dinah born Dec. 1886 married John Marlow. Alonzo Martin born Sept. 5, 1887 married 1. Verta Mae Brown, daughter of George Brown and Myrtle Elizabeth Holbrook and they moved to Maryland. He married 2. # RALPH HOLBROOK

693

The first Ralph Holbrook must have been on the east prong of Roaring River by the time Wilkes County was formed, for it was only two years later, 1780, that he signed a deed of a neighbor, Thomas Walsh. In 1782 he had married Jane. called Jennie, Winfrey, of Surry County, and was listed as head of a household.

According to family traditions, Ralph's brothers were John S. who remained in Virginia and William B., called

Buck, who married Rachel Winfrey, a sister to Ralph's wife Jennie, and acquired land east of Elk Spur. Of the three sisters, Elizabeth married first a Wheeler and second Israel Walters in 1798. They acquired a land grant but sold to William Caudle in 1801 and heeded the call to eastern Kentucky. The second sister married Joseph (?) Pruitt, a veteran of the Cherokee expedition and the Revolution. The third married a Caudle.

In 1793 Ralph served as administrator of the estate of William Hargas, acquired his home and lived in a house beside the road — the first road to the county courthouse, which passed from Elk Spur, ''crossing the east prong of Roaring River above William Hargas.''

On the 340-acre plantation Ralph worked as a cooper with one slave in 1800 and three by

He and Jennie had five sons: Lewis, who died young; Caleb; Ambrose; Winfrey; and John. In 1809 when Ralph wrote his will they were expecting another. Ralph provided for it: "If it be a daughter... I will my Negro Tamer Girl. If it be a son I will that it share equal with the other four sons." (Lewis had already died).

And so it was — another son, and another Ralph, born six months after the first Ralph died and was buried in an unmarked grave on the plantation.

In this inventory of 1808 there were a Bible, a Testament, a hymn book and two spelling books; feather beds, a looking glass, smoothing irons, besides all the paraphenalia for spinning and weaving; ten imported Delft plates, plenty of pewter (15 plates, 20 spoons, "basons" and dishes; glass tumblers, earthen porringers, Dutch ovens and a set of tea ware; two horses, four "slays" (sleighs) and harness and more and better tools than Randolph: a broad axe, cutting and drawing knives, sickels, weeding hoe, ½ bushel measure, a "lanthorne" and a still with four mash tubs.

Two of Ralph and Jane's sons, Ambrose and Winfrey, migrated to eastern Kentucky and married there, Ambrose to Nancy (Elam) and Winfrey to Betty (Walters), a first cousin, daughter of Elizabeth and Israel. Ambrose and Nancy were parents of Dr. Campbell Holbrook, who returned to Wilkes to marry Fannie, his cousin.

Caleb married Mary (Winfrey) and lived at the homeplace. He died in 1839. Their daughter Elizabeth married Austin Yates, a brother of the wives of the Twins. One son Pattison was married to Wadie Pruitt and the other, Winfrey, to Malissa Bauguess.

John married Jennie Bauguess, daughter of Robert and Mary (Sparks) Bauguess. He was a hatter, and made hats from beavers he trapped. Their daughter Sallie was married to Henderson McGrady. She was at the Hugh Stokes school in 1850 when census was taken. Lewis married Letitia Johnson and Elizabeth to Leander Johnson, Jr.

# THE SECOND RALPH HOLBROOK

694

The second Ralph Holbrook, born October 3, 1808, on the east prong of Roaring River, never knew his father, the first Ralph Holbrook of Wilkes, for he had died six months earlier. But his mother, Jennie, lived until 1854.

In 1815, when Ralph was seven years old, school was held at Elk Spur by Washington Walsh, the son of a neighbor, Thomas Walsh.

When Ralph married on February 13, 1834, Nancy (Spicer), born October 13, 1815, to Joseph and Jane (Bauguess) Spicer, their address was Wilkesborough. Their settlement was a "place called Trap Hill," but the post office was not opened until three years later, when a weekly mail service was available as the carrier on foot spent a night in their home on his way from the county seat to Mouth of Wilson, Virginia.

Ralph was one of the first school committeemen, with Jonathan Gentry and Joel Pruitt, in 1841

His agricultural report for the 1840 census included four slaves, three horses, fifteen cattle, nine sheep, thirty-seven swine but only five poultry; his crop production ranged from 370 bushels of corn, 40 of potatoes, 25 of wheat to small amounts of oats, rye, flax and hemp.

About this time he sold a few acres to the Siamese Twins, who had chosen Trap Hill as their home. They asked Nancy to supervise their slaves as they prepared the "infare" and to welcome the brides.

Ralph and Nancy were consistent, loyal members of the Old Roaring River Baptist Church from the time they joined, he in 1829 and she in 1839. He officiated as a deacon 54 years and served frequently as a messenger to the annual association. On August 26, 1882, he was a trustee of the church when he, his son J.S. and Leander Johnson, contracted with the public school committee of district #25 for the school to use the church house and two acres "as long as needed for school purposes."

Between 1835 and 1860 Ralph and Nancy Holbrook had 10 children and eventually 62 grandchildren and 56 great-grandchildren. Their children were Hardin Spicer (1835-1935), who was married to Nancy Dawson Bryan, daughter of J.Q.A. and Martha (Bryan); James Monroe (1836-1887), who married Elizabeth Spicer, daughter of Hardin and Martha (Johnson); Martha Jane (1839-1932), who married Joshua Spicer, son of Hardin and Martha (Johnson): Joseph Samuel (1842-1920), who married Frances Alexander, daughter of John and Mary (Thompson); Ralph Calloway (1846-1938), who married Sarah Ann Holbrook, daughter of William and Sarah (Sparks); John Winfrey (1849-1938), who married Sarah Jane Caudill, daughter of William and Frances (McGrady; Joshua N. 
