Re: Research in North Carolina.

Dear Ms. Camin:

I am responding to your ad in the Genealogical Helper for research in North Carolina. I will try to outline the known information and what I need to accomplish, and ask that you give me some idea as to whether you think you can be of assistance, and what approximate costs might be. I know that the exact cost cannot be determined, but would to know your rate, and what you think might be involved. I have worked with researchers in England and the U.S., and have been doing it myself for a number of years, so I know better than to expect the impossible in researching.

I am trying to locate one William Bain in North Carolina. I'm enclosing some pages from a family "history" I recently quickly compiled for a family reunion (pardon lack of documentation, but I do have it and it will be added to the final version). I think you can see from the enclosed where my problem lies.

If the William Bain who arrives in Savannah, GA, aboard the ship from Scotland, in 1776 is my William Bain, then I need to document his whereabouts from that arrival until 1829 when he deeds part of his land from his 1810 land grant in Blount Co, TN, to his son, William Jr. I have found a William Bain in the 1800 Cabarrus Co, NC census, but the ages of the household do not correlate with the approximate ages of Senior's sons. I do not have any clues as to Senior's wife's name. The only unusual name passed down for generations is Dialphia/Dielthe, but this appears to come from the line of William Jr.'s wife's family.

For reference, there is another William Bain from Scotland who arrives in North Carolina close to the time our fellow supposedly arrived, but he is a merchant and not a weaver as family history has our fellow, and older than I think our William was.

I feel very positive that the older male in the William Jr. household in 1830 Blount Co, TN census is William Sr. The father of Jr.'s wife does not come to live with them until 1835-6, according to court records filed in the 1850's in McMinn Co, TN.

I have checked the court records for Chatham Co. (Savannah), GA, hoping to find some record of the indenture of William Bain, arriving there in 1776 (ship docked 20 December 1776 per Georgia Gazette newspaper). I did not have any luck with this search. Also, in reading the newspaper there was no mention of passengers from this ship, or any other for that matter. I have written to Britain to determine if it is possible to find indenture records for Messrs. Jonas Brown & Company of Whitby, who are named on the top of the passenger list enclosed.

I will be traveling to Scotland again this coming April-May, and have a niggling hope of being able to tie these ends together so that I can travel to Wick, Caithness,



THE WILLIAM BAIN FAMILY
OF SCOTLAND, NORTH CAROLINA AND TENNESSEE

There has been a family chart of our Bain family put together by two Bain men, which has helped tremendously in the research done so far. Without benefit of written family records, these two men, William Bain and John Bain (sons of Jacob Anderson Bain, 1851-1930), put in writing the details of their heritage handed down for four generations of this Bain family in America. To the point I've reached in my research, I have been able to document much of what they have given us.

We start our story with a young man named William Bain arriving from Scotland. The family history says that William's trade was as a weaver, and he arrived as a British soldier with his brothers during the time of the American Revolution, around 1776 or so, and decided he ought to be fighting with the Americans, rather than against. I have not been able to substantiate this yet. But, one part of the family history has led me to another possibility which could well be our William arriving in America.

On 25 September 1775 the ship named Marlborough, departed from the port of Kirkwall, on the Isle of Orkney at the most northern tip of Scotland (see Exhibit A - map of Scotland). This ship carried passengers from Orkney Isle and the Scottish mainland county of Caithness. These passengers were indentured servants, most of whom were indenturing or "contracting" themselves as workers to an employer for a period of four to seven years at no salary to reimburse their employer for their transportation costs. If you look at the passenger list (Exhibit B), number 31 is one William Bain, age 26 years, his employment as "weaver," his home the City of Wick in Caithness (Exhibit A), and going to America because he "could not live by his trade." This was about the beginning of the industrial revolution in Britain, and many "cottage" or independent weavers were losing their source of income because of the weaving mills coming into existence in Scotland and England. People were beginning to wear cheaper, mass-produced cottons from the mills, rather than linen and woollens from the cottage weavers.

This young man on his way to Savannah, Georgia, where this ship would land, would be the right age to be our fellow according to information found on our William Bain, Senior in later records, and his trade certainly is identical to family information. But, as yet, I have not been able to trace this man from his arrival in Savannah to his childrens' births in North Carolina, and his living in his son's household in the 1830 census in Blount County, Tennessee. We have no information as yet as to where he was to serve his indenture period. Only when more is learned can it be determined if this passenger is our ancestor. You might also notice on the passenger list passenger number 16, Henrietta Bain Calder, wife of Alexander Calder, "wright" (builder). She and her

family are also from Wick in Caithness, Scotland, and she is five years older than the William Bain we are considering. Perhaps she is an older sister, or a cousin. But, that's for later.

The first positive identification of our William Bain, Senior, native of Scotland, is on 23 January 1829, when William Senior deeds land to William Bain, Junior in Blount County, Tennessee:

Bain, William Sr. Y-269 23 January 1829

to

Bain, William Jr.

\$100.00 paid, 105 acres at head of Cloyds Creek, part of grant #1516 of 207 acres to me on 16 June 1810; this land joins that of Thomas Hunt, Reed, John Cochran line, Duncan line; witnesses Francis Greer and George Duncan; proved 11 September 1855, J. C. McCoy, clerk, registered 14 September 1855, And(rew) McClain, reg. (This 1855 date means that the deeds were not recorded until that year - not an unusual occurrence.)

This land grant #1516 (Exhibit C), issued to our William Bain, Senior, 16 June 1810, does not say where he is living at the time of the grant, but he receives this 207 acres for the sum of \$207.50 "with the Interest due thereon." William Bain, Junior is living in Blount County in the 1830 census, and Senior is in his household as a man between the ages 70-80 years per census records. Perhaps the old man felt he was about to leave this world behind and wanted to get things in order, leading to the transfer of land to his son in 1829. In 1833 William Junior sold this same land for \$350.00.

We know nothing about the wife of this first William Bain in America, or the names of all of his children. The only children known besides William Bain, Jr. are known through the family history described earlier. The sons are said to be:

Daniel born in North Carolina c.1788

John R. born in North Carolina c.1793

William Junior born in North Carolina c.1796

Arthur born in Tennessee c.1801

(See Exhibits D, D1, D2, D3 for family sheets on William Sr., and sons Daniel, John R. & Arthur.)

William Senior left North Carolina between 1796-1801, after the birth of William Jr., and was living in Tennessee when Arthur was born. Records for Daniel, John R. and Arthur Bain have also been found in eastern Tennessee, lending substantiation to the family history of them being brothers.

William Bain, Junior served in the War of 1812 against Britain, serving from 13 November 1814 to 18 May 1815, when he was about 18 years old. He was a private in Captain Samuel Thompson's Company of the Tennessee Militia. For this service of six months

and a few days he received a land warrant for 80 acres because of an act of Congress on 28 September 1850, as a bonus for these veterans.

William Bain, Junior married in Blount County, Tennessee in 1819 when he was about 25 years old. He took out the marriage license on 11 September 1819 to marry Mary H. "Polly" Stephenson. (Polly was a frequently used nickname for Mary during this era.) The marriage records show that "no returns" were recorded, which means the signed license was not returned to the court house for recording. This is frequently found in old marriage records, and usually meant that the minister or groom simply forgot to return the proper documents to the authorities. Polly Stephenson was the daughter of Joseph Stephenson and Elizabeth Wilson Stephenson. Polly had been born in North Carolina, also. (Please see the information on the Stephenson family that appears later for more on her family.)

As mentioned before, William and Polly were living in Blount County in the 1830 Tennessee census records, with William's father, William Senior living in the household with his son. (See Exhibit E - family sheet for William Bain, Jr., for all his children.)

At the time of the 1830 census, the names of members of the household were not listed in the census - only the name of the head of household, and the sex and age categories for all members. In William Junior's household, we have the following people, some of whom we can identify, and some we can't:

Male - 70-80 yrs old	=	William Bain, Senior
Male - 30-40 yrs old	=	William Bain, Junior
Female - 60-70 yrs old	=	(perhaps wife of William Sr.)
Female - 20-30 yrs old	=	Mary (Polly) Stephenson Bain
Male - 5-10 yrs old	=	William M., son of Wm. Jr. & Mary
Male - 0-5 yrs old	=	James, son of Wm. Jr. & Mary
Female - 0-5 yrs old	=	unidentified daughter of Wm. Jr. & Mary
Female - 0-5 yrs old	=	unidentified daughter of Wm. Jr. & Mary

The first census where all members of the household are identified is in 1850. In that census, we can determine that the son James would have fit in the category shown above. Also, William M. (b.1823) would be in the household. The two daughters shown above were out of the household and married by this time, or had not survived to adulthood, a too-frequent occurrence.

In the 1850 census William Junior's household is made up of the following people:

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting

Know Ye that in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly passed on the twenty third day of November Eighteen hundred and nine there is granted by the said State of Tennessee unto William Bain a certain tract or parcel of land containing Two hundred and seven acres more or less and two rods within the tract located for the use of College lying in the County of Blount in the District South of French Broad and Holston on the head of Boy's Creek there being due and chargeable on said land the sum of Two hundred and seven Dollars and fifty Cents with the Interest due thereon Beginning at a knob at a branch corner to Frederick Summers and thence with Red lines South forty eight and three fourths East sixty four chains and five tenths to a pine South thirty two and an half East thirty six chains and three tenths to a spruce oak North seventy two East eight chains and one tenth to a small hickory South sixty West with Stephen Anderson and Isaac Blankenship eighty seven chains and eight tenths to a hickory oak South thirty five West twenty three chains to a sassafras North forty seven and a fourth West seventy eight chains and four tenths to a state and fourteen North forty one East ninety six chains and four tenths to the Beginning Surveyed May the twenty first Eighteen hundred and seven with its appurtenances To Have and to Hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said William Bain and his heirs and assigns forever In Witness whereof Willie Blount Governor of the State of Tennessee hath hereunto set his hand and caused the great seal of the said State to be affixed at Knoxville on the sixteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten and of American Independence the thirty fourth

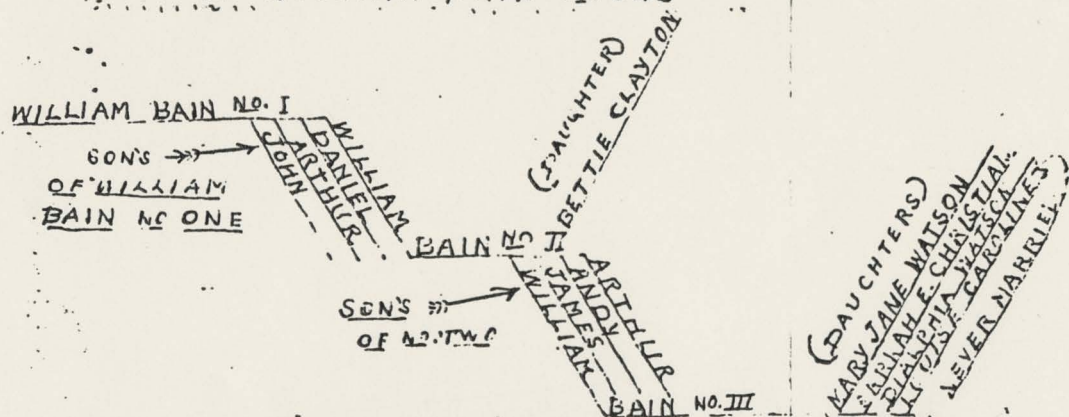

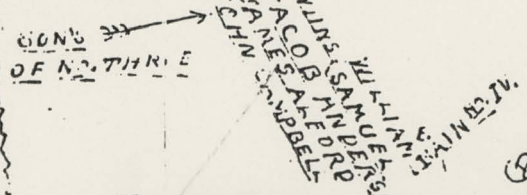

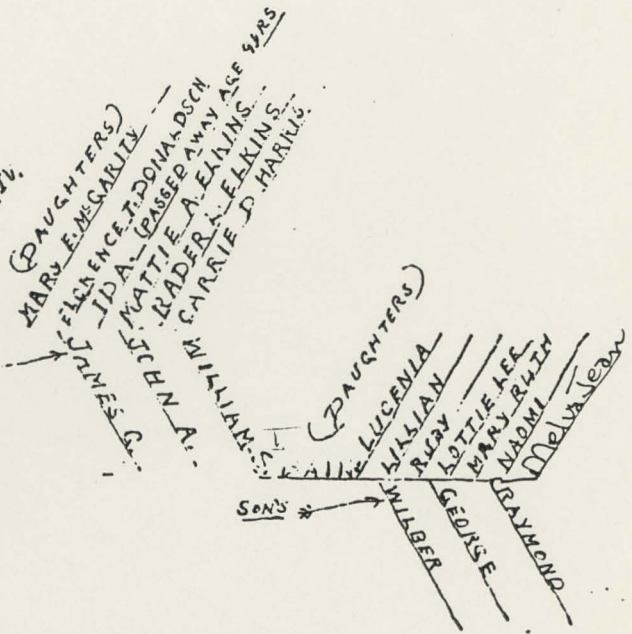
