



Steelman; Emma Louella "Lou" Arnold (1868-1932) married John Henry Steelman (1865-1927); Rosie "Rosa" Arnold (1870-1950) married Tom Gaston Wallace: Sidney Marvin Arnold (1874-1944) married Alice Brandon (1876-1941); Carrie Arnold (1877-1963) married Joseph Lee Brandon (1868-1947); Mina Ethel Arnold married Arnold Wilson: James Daniel Arnold (1882-1930) married March 23, 1903, Joanna Ladd (1882-1928); Grace Arnold (1884-1970) married Miles Henry Helton; Thomas Montgomery Arnold married Ethel Steelman and Collie Ever Arnold (1890-1893); John William Arnold (1871-1946) married Rose Hinshaw.

Thomas Lee Arnold died in Hamptonville, North Carolina July 21, 1918. He is buried in Flat Rock Baptist Church Cemetery.

DANIEL ARNOLD, ESQUIRE

Daniel Arnold, Esquire, son of Samuel and Elizabeth Wright Arnold, was born February 28, 1786, married Sarah Hardesty, reported to be a teacher at Guilford College. She was born January 6, 1788, and died May 8, 1870.

Daniel was a farmer, a Justice of the Peace and Executor of his father's estate. He probably died intestate as the commissioners of Surry County were appointed by the court on the eighteenth and nineteenth days of December, 1850, to divide and partition between and among his four children — William Smith Arnold, Sheridan S. Arnold, Stephen Blackwell and his wife, Sarah Arnold Blackwell, and Eliza Arnold — his estate.

The partition was as follows: Lot number one: 140 acres valued at one hundred fifty nine dollars and fifty cents to Stephen Blackwell and his wife Sarah Arnold Blackwell; Lot number two containing one hundred and one half acres and valued at two hundred seven dollars and fourteen cents to Sheridan S. Arnold; Lot number three containing eighty and one fourth acres, valued at one hundred eighty dollars and fifty six cents to William Smith Arnold and Lot number four containing one hundred twenty acres, valued at one hundred sixty eight dollars to Eliza Arnold.

While Justice of the Peace, Mr. Daniel Arnold, Esquire, received a letter from Rick Harris of Salisbury, North Carolina, dated April 24, 1829, concerning a document which was thought to be forgery. "The injured party has stated he believes the instrument to be a forgery, written by a woman who lived near by and who has been accused or censored before in several instances. The woman and her family has moved off to the Lord knows where and I hope will never come to this settlement again," stated Mr. Harris.

Born to Daniel and Sarah Hardesty Arnold

were William Smith Arnold, October 20, 1819, died July 3, 1906; Sheridan S. Arnold, March 19, 1822, died December 20, 1909; Sarah Arnold, May 28, 1826, died (date unknown), and Eliza Arnold, December 28, 1832, died (date unknown).

William Smith Arnold was married first to Adeline J. Dickerson (according to relatives) and to this marriage were born Thomas S. Arnold, February 7, 1842, and Margaret Emily Arnold, August 7, 1845. His second wife was Martha Evans, born June 28, 1862, and died July 22, 1942. To this marriage were born Della Bell Arnold, August 1, 1885; Sallie Jane Arnold, June 10, 1887; Elizabeth Harrison Arnold, April 21, 1889, died October 22, 1905; William Alfred Arnold, September 1, 1891, died November 7, 1963; Geroge W. Arnold, November 23, 1894, died September 14, 1975; Hilary M. Arnold, January 29, 1897, and Linnia Alison Arnold, August 14, 1899, died December 1, 1912.

William Smith Arnold, Esquire, drove the stage between Hamptonville and Salem. He was also as apprenticed Veterinarian, a Justice of the Peace, a Government Store keeper, and a farmer. His oldest daughter, Della, attended Womans College at Greensboro and taught for more thatn forty years in the public schools of North Carolina. As of this writing she is ninety-five. His second daughter, Sallie, kept the home and cared for her mother who was blind. She was an immaculate homemaker, an excellent cook, an expert milliner and a very caring daughter. She married H. L. Evans, January 23, 1926. William A. was a farmer, married Daisy Garner and they became the parents of three sons, James Davis, William Sanford, Hilary Herbert, and four daughters, Ila, Anne, Pauline and Virginia. George married Bertha Reavis. He was a farmer and operated his own business. To this union were born Doris, Charlotte, James Hubert, George Wright, and Peggy. Hilary M. married Ruth Angell and is in buisness in

William Smith Arnold and Thomas S. Arnold served in the Civil War. Hilary M. Arnold served in World War I. James Davis, Hilary Herbert, James Hubert and George Wright all served in World War II.

The Arnold homeplace is located on the Four Mile Road, but is no longer owned by any of William Smith's decendents. However, William S. Arnold has title to a portion of the original land grant.

THE BAGBY FAMILY

314

Abner Bagby was a very religious man, a strong Methodist, he did something about it. He was instrumental in establishing a church of that faith in this area. The Church called "Union" was housed in a respectable log house. The house lasted longer than the congregation by many years. This was a regular conference church, calling on occasion some of the high ranking speakers of that day.

Abner owned "the peak" and much of the Billy Edwards land, but he and his family lived

in what could have been the first condominium. The partitions of this rambling log structure were so arranged as to allow two families to live comfortably apart in it.

Abner's deed to the "peak" land is given

here in detail:

"12th day of May, 1871, between William S. Nickolson, Rebecca Nickolson, his wife, ... Gentry County, Missouri, party 1st part ... Abner Bagby ... County, Yadkin, N.C. ... 2nd part — Wittnesssth, ... 1st pt. ... consideration ... three hundred and fifty dollars paid by party of 2nd part "receipt acknowledged, doth grant, bargan and sell, convey and confirm to party of the 2nd part, the following described lands beginning ... known as the "peak tract."

W.S. Nickolson Rebecca Nickolson

(See Deed Book G, pp. 287-288, Gentry County, Missouri.)

After Abner bought the peak tract, he rented it to Merideth Hemric, who lived there, made his home there and worked the land as if it were his own.

He reared a fine family, two girls and several boys. When they became young men able to get out on their own, Merideth and his whole family left the peak and moved to Winston, where the boys engaged in their own business.

While the Hemric family lived on the peak, Mr. Bagby, thinking how dangerous the open well (Star Nicholson's) was, he prevailed on the Hemric's to fill it up. It was 80 feet deep and I suppose they worked long and hard to get enough logs, rocks, etc. to fill up the old well. This has been done many times, but — Sticks and stones have their day, Holes that's wells ne'er go away.

Abner Bagby had the following children:

Nannie married Wiley Carter. They lived in the Reece house, across the road from the old homeplace, and were a substantial family in the community. They supported Union Church and were the first and only members buried in the church cemetery. It was their request. Their remains were moved to Holywood Cemetery in Elkin, N.C. about 1953.

Jonathan — pale, listless — I don't have data on his marriage or family, but he was a real log-roller. My Dad always emphasized this fact and would tell how he knew:

One time at a log rolling, young Jonathan, pale, emaciated, threw out the challenge that if someone could handle one end of a certain log (big) that he would take the other.

Grandpa Minish (T.R.) big and strong, looked at the man and at the log, then thought it would be a good time to show his strength. He took the banter.

To his regret, he admitted afterwards that he came nearest to knuckling to the ground than ever in his life. His admonition "Never judge the flour by the sack."

Zackery T. Bagby married Roxie (Masten?) of Ronda, N.C. They inherited the peak land which they held until 1922 when the sold out to John L. Bray.

Zack's family lived in Ash County, but before World War I, they moved back to the peak, stablized the old Merideth log house, cleaned up some of the land.

They became part of the community, none of the young men were married — several of the young women of the community hated for

them to leave. Those who lived at the peak were: Will, Zack, Jr., and Paul. Girls were Mabel and Sinesca.

After one or two seasons and that many crops of locust, they moved away. When they signed the deed to sell, you can see how scattered they were as this listing suggest:

Lillian Smith, Portsmouth, Va. (may have been granddaughter); Richard and Myrtle Bagby of Williamsburg, Va.; William Bagby of LaComa, Iowa; Nellie Ward and R.W. Ward, Forest Hill, Maryland; Zack T. Jr., and Mamie Bagby of Antigo, Wisconsin; Mabel Whammel and Edward, Laurens, Iowa; Sinesca Johnston and Taylor, Leesburg, Va; Paul T. Bagby, Sioux City, Iowa; Ella Mae and John Cowen of Hevelock, Iowa; and Ralph A. Bagby of Laurens, Iowa.

Mollie Bagby married Thomas Smith. He was educated to preach, but become a school teacher instead. They had one daughter.

Wesley Bagby, a Methodist Preacher, probably became a Bishop in Methodist Conference. He moved across the mountain.

Santford Bagby married Mary Swaim, daughter of Enoch Swaim. They lived in the West.

Charlie Bagby, inherited the northern block of the Abner land. He went to Courtney, N.C., married Laura? Baity, moved to Winston-Salem, N.C., where he became associated with Hine-Bagby, an outstanding Men's shop there.

These were the families who first established the old log school house.

Mr. Carter farmed some, but owned a tannery in the area.

The children of Nannie and Wiley Carter:

Their two daughters married in the Evans family. Lula Carter married Wilson Evans; Bessie Carter married his brother, Wesley (Wes) Evans. Both had large families. Wilson was a lumber man and carpenter like his father, Franklin Evans. "Wilse" and Lula moved to Jonesville and Wes and Bessie moved away to Elkin where Wes ran a grocery business.

Frank Carter, a bachelor, was a teacher at the old log school house.

He moved to Elkin, where he established the lumber plant, called Carolina Cross Iron, which thrived through all kinds of business climates until other modern methods were discovered.

Upon his retirement and death, his niece, Elizabeth Evans — Fletcher-Dobbins — Turner, served as an able part of the organization.

Ed Carter moved to Florida, where he remained the rest of his life.

Two of his sons came back to Elkin and established the White Swan Laundry.

The Evans Community developed just over the ridge from this location around the father Franklin Evans. He was a carpenter, and civic leader. He acted as the administrator of the Abner Bagby Estate, at which time he completed the sale of a certain tract of land to Jackson Greenwood. That was made 14th day of March, 1890. The amount of money paid for the 32 certain of land was \$126.50. It was

ity, reared large and prosperous families. Bill was an ingenious man who worked for progress for himself and the community. He was a good school teacher if he could have taken the time from his other interests. He always managed to make his way to Shady Grove Church where he taught Sunday School. Bob was equally busy, but more at his own farm. He was a good entertainer. Always had lots of visitors from the near-by church.

I have mentioned these families for they were the early citizens. It was their children who made up part of the school population that we are going to be talking about. These are the men who were of school age when the old log school house was in action.

Of the log school population, there was the Henry Brown family, Minnie, Octavia (Ockie), Betty, and Hettie were the girls. Robert C. Brown and Watt were the boys. Some of the older ones attended the Old Bagby school.

The post office for these people was Charity, N.C. Tradition has it, Nannie Carter kept the post office in her home at first. Then after Lula and Wilson Evans were married, they kept, built a post office down near Shady Grove Church.

BAGBY FAMILY

The most defininite record of the early Bagby Family in America is found in a History of King and Queen County Va., written by Rev. Alfred Bagby D.C. of Richmond Va. in 1908. Dr. Bagby Was a graduate of Columbian College, Washington D.C. (Now George Washington University), in 1847, Princeton Theological Seminary 1850 - 1851. In addition to the information given by Dr. Bagby in this history, he compiled a record of the family, bringing down many of the lines, to his time. Unfortunately he did not quote references to records from which he obtained his data, however this writer had the Privilege of a brief interview with Dr. Bagby in the latter part of 1906, and was assured by him that the records as compiled by him were based on proven facts (He was a very old man at the time of this interview, and has now been dead many years.). All of this data can not be verified by the public records of Virginia, but he doubtless had access to family records and other information that never got into the public records.

For what it is worth, an extract from a letter written by Mr. John C.Bagby of Rushville Ill. to Dr.Geo.K.Bagby, May 18 1894 is quoted. " John Bagby married a Welsh woman. Eight or ten children were born to them in Wales. All moved to America. One son John Bag-by married a Miss Morriss, a sister of Dr. Morriss of Richmond Va., in Louisa Co. Va., and their children all married in Louisa Co. " In this letter Mr. Bagby says " The sons of the Scotchman John Bagby or as he spelled it " Bebbie " were all born in Wales and were scattered over Louisa, King and Queen, Prince William, Amelia and several other counties east and west of the James River, some as far down as Danville Va. We can not give any written record beyond our great-

grandfather (Louisa) John Bagby, so called to distinguish him from a cousin John Bagby of King and Queen "
It is thought that the statements made in Mr?Bagby's letter must have been based on somme confused traditions. It is noted that he states that no written record can be given beyond (Louisa) John who married Miss Morriss. He was of the fourth generation and could not have been the son of the immigrant. Accepting Dr.Alfre Bagby's record as to the old family and adding to it, data collected from nere and there from authentic sources, as far as obtainable, the family record is as follows.

The will further says "Whereas, Matthew Simms, father of of my former wife, Drusilla, now deceased, departed this life after the death of my former wife, by his last will and testament bequea thed a legacy in money, to be divided between the three sons

of Drusilla, Reuben, William and Matthew, above named etc.

Executors of the will were, John Murray (Presumably the husband of Jenny WMC), Reuben Bagby, William Bagby and Rewis Isbell. Witnesses. Jacob Johnson, Obediah Johnson, and Isaac Johnson. The above records were copied from the originals by C.L.DeMott of Lynchburg Va. According to the Will of William Bagby, his children were as follows. The first five of this list wre the chilaren of Drusilla (Simm) Bagby and their births are recorded in the Bible now in the hands of the Duffy family. There is no available record of the descendents of his thirteen children except William Simms Bagby and Matthew Bagby

It is quite evident that William Bagby was married twice since the first child was born when he was twenty four years old. (The date of Drusilla's birth is torn from the Bible), and his wife Drusilla died March 1 1786, alittle over two years after the birth of Matthew, her last child who was born Nov. 18 1783, so that the other children mentioned in his will were necessarily the children of another marriage. The Bible contains, only the records of the marriage of Drusilla and the births of her children. It is probable that both wives were dead at the time of the writing of this will, since he refers to Drusilla as his former wife, but makes no provision for a living wife. Data of the ancestry of Drusilla Simms, first wife of William Bagby is rather inadequate, however here is what we have.

I am trying to find information on Sarah Bagby and husband, John Woodside, who married in Surry County, February 21, 1816. They then moved to Virginia and later to McDonough County, Ill., in 1828-29. He died there in 1847 and Sarah moved to Christian County, Ill. She was living with her sister there when the 1860 census was taken. Martha

married Martin Hinkle, born in Virginia. I believe Martha and Sarah Bagby were sisters, since census records show them to have been born in North Carolina. Another record shows James Woodside was a nephew of Martha Hinkle. Martha died in 1865, age 64, and Sarah Bagby, born ca 1793, died in Christian County in 1869. A history of Christian County says Martin Hinkle came there in

1821. Other information found says John and Mary Bagby moved to McDonough County about the same time as the Woodsides and lived in the same section. John died there July 3, 1858, age 71, and Mary died there April 26, 1864, age 67. An 1885 history of McDonough County shows John and Mary Bagby came from Virginia.

According to a history of Hancock County, Ill., a William Bagby came to Hancock County in 1830 to see his brother and sister-in-law. He was born in Kentucky, October 11, 1816, the son of Robert and Frances Bagby, residents of Virginia.

I haven't found what John Woodside was doing in Surry County when he married Sarah Bagby in 1816. The John

Woodside I know was supposed to be from Pennsylvania.

I would appreciate any help I can get. I am enclosing a pedigree chart and family group sheet for John Woodside.



We have found other Bagby names in Surry marriage records. William Bagby married Sarah Woodruff November 7, 1807; John Bagby bondsman, Obadiah Martin, witness; Margaret Bagby married James Arnold March 16, 1813, Obadiah Martin, witness; Sally Bagby married John Woodside in 1816, Thomas Bagby, bondsman. So we have John and William in 1809, Margaret in 1813, Sally and Thomas in 1816. An Abner Bagby married Lucinda Whitaker in Surry July 9, 1836. I have a note that Abner Bagby was the son of John and Sarah Bagby of Virginia. It is possible that John and Sarah moved from Virginia to Surry and all of the above Bagby names are their children.

Abner lived near Jonesville.
Obadiah Martin, who witnessed two of the Bagby weddings, lived in Jonesville, too. It is located on the Yadkin River and is in what is now called Yadkin County, but was in Surry until 1850.

We hope that some of the readers will have information on this.

Abner Bagby's father, William Bagby, moved from Halifdx County, N.C. to Wilkes County. Isaac Bagby, grandfather of Abner, was a Revolutionary soldier.

Richard Lewis Nancy Ann Captain E. Nannay Wrynn's (Welch War Vateran) statement about the writings of George W. Bagby has significent meaning for present day Bagbys.

"I can easily see his Walch forefathers in him, the provinciality, and the sweetness and the whimsicality."

What Bagby has not retained a bit of the rustic nature and rugged individualism of his forefathers? What Bagby does not possess a curious and somewhat quaint humor? What Bagby has not had a sudden turn of mind, emotion or action caused by a whim or impulse? What Bagby does not harbor in the depths of his heart a genuine kindness and sweetness?

In a latter written in 1940 by Charles W. Bagby (Uncla Charlie) to Dr. R. O. Bagby, MD, Kansas City, Misscuri, the following statement is made:

"My father and my mother always told me that our great grandfather was William Bagby and that he moved to the Western part of the state from Eastern Carolina. I have also understood that William Bagby did not narry until late in life, that our grandfather Abner Bagby had a sister by the name of Betsy and a brother by the name of George and to the best of my recollection, he had some half brothers and sisters by the name of Woodruff. In other words, I think our great grandmother Bagby had been married to a Woodruff prior to her marriage with William Bagby. Who she was prior to her first marriage, I do not know."

"Several years ago, I was in Halifax County on professional business and while there examined a few of the old records in the county offices, and I found that William Bagby, at one time lived in that county and had moved to Wilkes and later had disposed of his undivided interest in the property of his father, Issac Bagby, (Wilkes County at that time included much more territory than it does today.")

"Issac Bagby was a regular soldier in the Revolutionary War; and he formerly lived in King and Queen County, Virginia."

"At the same time William Bagby went to Wilkes County, John and Edwin Bagby went with him. These latter two purchased farms along the Yadkin River, which they later sold."

or son

"I do not recall my father ever telling me that he had any definite information as to where these two Bagbys moved, or as to their relationship to William Bagby. However, I have heard repeatedly various Bagbys state that one of the above named moved to Georgia and the other to Kentucky."

III. HISTORY OF ABNER BAGBY FAMILY

Abner and his Children

In a letter written in the early 1940's by Charles W. Bagby to his cousin, Dr. R. O. Bagby, "Uncle Charlie" goes into great detail about the Abner Bagby family. Quote:

"Abner Bagby's father was William Bagby and according to the best information I have been able to secure William's father was Issac Bagby, a revolutionary war soldier."

Bagby, a revolutionary war soldier."

"Abner Bagby, son of William Bagby, was
born September 4, 1810; he married Lucinda Whitaker,
daughter of Jonathan Whitaker, on July 14, 1835
end he died on March 24, 1888. Fifteen children
were born of this marriage, five of which died
during their childhood. Of the ten children
who survived, William Abner was killed while
fighting in the Confederate Army at Drewy's
Bluff, Virginia. Abner's wife, Lucinda, was
born May 12, 1821, and she died February 3, 1887."

"Uncle Sanford Bagby married Mary Swain.

For a while they lived in one of the western states-the town where the University of Indiana is located. They are now dead and no children were born of their marriage. Uncle Sanford spent the last years of his life in this state."

"Aunt Annie married a Mr. Carter whose initials I do not recall. They had four children, two boys and two girls. One boy now lives in Elkin, North Carolina and the other one somewhere in Florida. The girls married brothers whose last names were Evans. The name of one of these brothers was Wesley and the name of the other I do not recall, but they both live in Elkin."

"Uncle John, Uncle Robert, and Uncle Lewis all went west, and in 1870 settled in Clay County, Kansas. Uncle John later moved to St. Joseph, Missouri, and Uncle John to California. During the last year, I have exchanged letters with Rufus, Wesley and Mary Jane, three of Uncle John's children, and with Cora Bagby Brown, one of Uncle Lewis's children. I do not have any information as to the descendants of Uncle Robert."

"Uncle Charlie L. Bagby remained in this state, became a successful businessman and at the time of his death was probably worth a hundred thousand dollars. His widow Aunt Laura and four children all live in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. His children are named Alonzo, a clothing merchant; Howell, a real estate man; Ina, who married J. H. Rich and Ora. Ora has been married twice and I do not recall the name of her second husband."

"Uncle Zack T. Bagby lived and died in this state and during his entire life was a successful farmer. I do not think any of his children now live in North Carolina; but I understand that they are all doing well."

Writer's Note: From correspondence Uncle Zack haden the hter who lived in Norfelk, Virginia. This Laughter had one girl who farried William C. Spann.

"Aunt Mary married Professor Tom Smith.
They lived in California for a number of
years and later returned to North Carolina.
One child was born of this marriage and
she now lives at R.F.D., King, North Carolina,
and her name is Mary Gunter."

Writer's Note: From correspondence Professor Tom Smith was Superintendent of the Public Schools in King, North Carolina.

"This leaves my father, Wesley M. Bagby. He married Frances L. Robinson and seven of the nine children of this marriage grew to manhood or womanhood. They were, and are Bernice Bagby who married Rev. W. H. Willis (Methodist minister,) Bulus Bagby who married

Robert

Professor W. H. Swift; Iva Bagby who married John Harris; myself Charles W. Bagby who married Frankie Lenore Self; James W. Bagby who married Lucile Shuford; Wesley A. Bagby, Jr. whose first wife was Essie Loven, and whose second wife is Paunee Rigsby, and Fannie Bagby who married Rufus Duvall."

"My father for a long number of years was one of the leading Methodist preachers in North Carolina and served as pastor of the main Methodist Churches in such towns as High Point, Gastonia, Greensboro, Hickory, Monroe, and Morganton, and for sometime prior to his retirement was a presiding elder. All his children attended college and all his grandchildren who have reached the age to finish high school have either graduated from or now are in College. I am a lawyer, a mason and a member of the Rotary Club."

OBITUARY OF MRS. LUCINDA BAGBY, WIFE OF ABNER BAGBY

The following newspaper clipping was pasted on fly leaf of Reverend Wesley M. Bagby's Bible which he gave to his son, Charles W. Bagby.

"Mrs. Lucinda Bagby, a daughter of
Jonathan Whitaker, was born in Surry County,
North Carolina May 12, 1821, and departed this
life February 3, 1887. She was converted
when quite young and joined the Methodist
Episcopal Church and lived a consistent
member of the same until death. She was
happily married to Abner Bagby, July 14,
1835, and became the mother of fifteen
children, nine of whom are living and six
have preceded her to the home of the soul."

"She said for several days that William A. Bagby, a son who was killed at Drewy's Bluff, May 16, 1864, was present with her. She had been a patient sufferer for more than thirty years; but was confined in her last illness seven weeks and suffered intensely during nearly all that time. During the first four weeks of her confinement she manifested a desire to get well for the benefit of her husband and children, but toward the last she prayed and asked the family to pray

that she might 'depart and be with Christ.'
She was a woman of deep piety. The earliest recollections some of the children have of her are finding her in her room on her knees. Her life was one of love and sunshine, a continued benediction in the

family."

"She at all times gave full assurance of her acceptance with God, but said she wanted to be covered with glory before she died. About five days before her death her prayer was answered. She was made exceedingly happy and praised God saying, "Hallelujah, Praise the Lord, Bless the Lord!' and at the same time trying to clap her hands which were almost too weak to come together, and said, 'tall my darling boys I am gone home and for them to meet me there.'"

"Her Body now sleeps close by four little daughters and one son awaiting the first resurrection."

Writer's Note: Wesley M. Bagby, who was thirty-five years of age at the time of his mother's death and a minister of the gospel, may have written the Obituary of Lucinda Bagby.

ABNER BAGBY MEMORIAL FUND

Found in the papers of the late Charles W. Bagby is a receipt dated January 19, 1925 from the Merchants Bank and Trust Company of Winston-Salem, North CArolina. The receipt credits fifteen dollars to the Abner Bagby Memorial Fund. Where Abner Bagby was buried is not known to the writer; neither does the writer have a record of how the memorial fund was used. The fact that monetary gifts were being made to a fund in his memory thirty-seven years after his death indicates that Abner Bagby was a man held in high regard by the people of his day.

TRUNK TREASURES

Mery Smith Guntar, daughter of Mary Bagby Smith and grand daughter of Abner and Lucinda Bagby, wrote to her first cousin, Charles W. Bagby about the treasures in her small trunk. The letter is postmarked November 8, 1940. Quote:

"I got to thinking about some of the treasures I have, and I wanted to write you and tell you about them. I have our Grandmother

Lucinda Bagby's cape she wore around her shoulders. I have some beautiful red silk handkerchiefs that some of Mama's (Mary Bagby Smith) brothers brought her from Kansas, I believe. I have Mama's (Mary Bagby) and Papa's (Professor Tom Smith) memory books that girl and boy friends wrote in when they were in school, years before they were married, I have some Confederate money and several tin type pictures of Mama (Mary Bagby) when she was a little girl."

"I have my Grandfather Abner Bagby's will. I have the last letter Papa wrote

Mama before they were married."

"I have a letter from Cora Bagby Brown dated 1887 from Charity, Kenses to Grandfather Abner Bagby. She wrote it when she heard Grandmother Lucinda Bagby had passed away. She said she remembered Grandmother's pretty eyes. She said they were so bright."

"I have many other cherished letters. I have all my treasured possessions in a small trunk and I want to try to preserve them if I possibly can. Garland (Mary Gunter's son) says he wants the old little I wrote you about, and if you should outlive Papa, Garland and me, I want you to have the little trunk and its contents. I know you would preserve them and that is what I want done. If Garland should have heirs they probably would not care for the things because they would not know much about the Bagbys."

"When the days get long and warm, come down and I will show you all the things in the little trunk."

IV. INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT THE CHILDREN OF ABNER & LUCINDA BAGBY, (BROTHERS AND SISTERS OF WESLEY M. BAGBY)

Jonathan Whitaker Bagby, Richard Lewis Bagby and Robert Bagby, brothers of Wesley M. Bagby, left North Carolina in 1866 or 1867 right after the Civil War for Iowa. In 1869-1870 all three brothers left Iowa with their families for Kansas. The three took claims in Clay County, Kansas, and lived there together for years. Robert finally moved to St. Joseph, Missouri.

1. Jonathan Whitaker Dagby

Jonathan Whitakar Bagby, was the oldest son of Abnar and Lucinda Bagby. He was married in North Carolina to Martha Jana Edwards, by whom he had five children: Mary Jana, Rufus, Jr., William Lewis, James Robert, and Lucinda Ann.

Jonathan Bagby's wife, Martha Jane, died in 1868 and Jonathan or John married again in Iowa. His second wife was also named Martha. From this marriage there were four children, two boys and two girls: Charles Abner, Grace, Wesley, and Martha. Jonathan married for a third timethis wife also had the name Martha. There were no children by the third marriage.

CHILDREN OF JONATHAN WHITAKER BAGBY:

Found in the files of the late Charles W. Bagby of Hickory, North Carolina is a letter dated May 20, 1940 from Mrs. J. L. Lemont, the former Miss Mary Jane Bagby, born March 17, 1859. Quote:

"I am the first child of Jonathan (John) Damby and the first grandchild of Abner Bagby. I was seven years old when my father, Uncle Lewis and his wife, Aunt Jane, her mother and two brothers, and another sister of my mother's, Aeron Nicholson's wife, left North Carolina for Iowa. There were five opered wagons in the group. We had been at grandfather's (Abner Bagby) for several weeks waiting for my mister to get old amough to travel. She was six weeks of age when we started ... Uncle Charlie and Aunt Mary, (brother & sister of Ray. U. M. Bagby), were both younger than I. Aunt Mary about four years youngar. I remember I gave her my doll and playthings when we left. ---"

"I remember Uncle Wesley (Rev. W. M. Bagby) setting me up on a shelf in a shed. I watched him grind bark (with "Buck," an ox) to tan leather. Grandfather (Abner Bagby) had a tan yard then. He tanned leather and made our shoes. I remember Uncle William (brother of Rev. W. M. Bagby) coming to our home just before he went to war and grandmother (Lucinda Whitaker) sent us children some sugar cookies by him. That was a treat in those days. He never got back and was soon killed (Confederate soldier-killed in Virginia.")

"Rufus Jonathan Bagby, born September 3, 1860, oldest son of Jonathan Bagby, settled in Visalia, California and was married on December 23, 1884, to Eiizebeth Hughes, an English girl. The couple had two sons. One son, Carl, was a brilliant lawyer. Rufus served as mayor and as postmaster of Visalia, California."

In a letter dated March 20, 1940 to his cousin Charles W. Bagby, Rufus told this interesting story. Quote:

"Uncle Dickey Woodruff was married to Grandfather Abner Bagby's sister. ---I remember Uncle Dickey well-I at five and one-half years old stood holding to his knee when he read President Lincoln's Proclamation FREEING THE NEGROES. I suppose you know Uncle Dickie had a number of slaves. The way they cried and bawled was like three funerals. And it scared me stiff. They all wanted to stay with him. --"

"Uncle William, father's brother, was killed in the Civil War. He was conscripted and taken to the Confederate Army. He with my father, Jonathan Whitaker Bagby, (brother to Rev. W. M. Bagby) both union men were forced into the Rebal Army. William was killed and father had a close call. Zack and Wesley (Rev. W. M. Bagby) or Sanford were hid in the woods for months and were fed by Grandmother Bagby (Lucinda Whitaker) at night."

Weslay Bagby, son of Jonathan Bagby, by his second marriage, wrote to his cousin, Charles W. Bagby, on March 2, 1940 from Freeno, California. Quote:

"I remember one or two of Uncle Wesley's (Rev. W. M. Bagby) daughters but do not recall you. I visited your father's folks when I was living in Statesville, North Carolina. I do remember and thought a lot of your father and sister. At that time I was fourteen years of age and as green as a preacher's son reared in the sticks could be."

"I visited the fair in San Francisco last year, but was so busy hunting up Sally Rand and her bunch of nudist, I forgot to call on my sister." Lewis William Bagby, second son of Jonathan Bagby, born October 27, 1862, was murdered by a highwaymen in Colorado in 1882.

Rev. James Robert Bagby, third son of Jonathen Bagby, born August 17, 1864, had two sons, both of them medical doctors. James Robert, father of the Dr. R. O. Bagby quoted in this paper, died in Kansas, October 24, 1932.

Lucinda Ann Bagby, second daughter of Jonathan Bagby, born February 27, 1866, was narried four times. She lived in Pacific Grove, California, and went by the name Anna Kellog.

Other children of Jonathan Bagby by second marriage:

- 1. Grace married a Mr. Christian and lived in Portersville, California, in care of Eagle Pool Hell.
- 2. Charles Abner died in Kansas.
- 3. Mattie (Martha) lived in Wallula, Washington.

Dr. R. O. Bagby of Kansas City, Missouri, grandson of Jonathan Bagby and son of James Robert Bagby, was an unusual and outstanding person. In 1911 he graduated from Oklahoma State Teachers College. He received a degree in Engineering in 1914 from Bradley Polytechnical Institute. In 1920 he received his degree in Medicine and in 1934 a degree in Law. At one time he was in charge of the Industrial Department of the Omeha City Schools. In his November, 1940 letter to his North Carolina cousin, Charles W. Bagby, is this statement, "I originated and built that femous \$5,000,000.00 technical high school in Omaha.

Writer's Note: Such great vision and accomplishment for his day and time is to be admired.

In another letter to his North Carolina Cousin we find R. O. Bagby saying-"My father never wrote to his own father for twenty years at a time. ---I never knew until lately that it was the custom in our family to name one's children for their Uncles and Aunts-I would have followed suit."

2. Lewis Richard Bagby

Lawis Richard (son of Abner and Lucinda Bagby,) the second of the three brothers who left North Carolina in 1866 to settle in Iowa, was married to Jane Lindsey. The couple had five boys and three girls. Lewis Richard along with his brothers Jonathan (John) and Robert settled in Clay County, Kensas in 1870. Children of Lewis Richard settled in the following localities: Mrs. E. J. Serna, San Francisco, California; Floyd Bagby,

Berkley, California; Mrs. J. A. McGahhey, Dewit, Arkansas; D. C. Bagby, Morganville, Kansas; Eugene Bagby, Topaka, Kansas; Mrs. S. D. (Cora) Brown, Topaka, Kansas; M. L. Bagby, Fredonia, Kansas; Leslie, a son died in his youth.

"On May 3, 1940, Cora Bagby Brown, daughter of Lewis Richard Bagby, wrote to Charles W. Bagby, "My father was a lieutenant in the North Carolina Militia and was in the War Between the States for three years before its close."

MARTHA JANE LINDSEY BAGBY, WIFE OF LEWIS RICHARD BAGBY

Found in the files of the late Charles W. Bagby is a copy of the obituary of Martha Jane Lindsey Bagby, affectionately known as Aunt Jane to her many nieces and nephews. Quote:

"Martha Jane Lindsey Bagby, aged 95 years and one month, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. S. D. Brown in Topeks, Wednesday morning, July 15, 1941.

Mrs. Bagby was born in Yadkin County, North Carolina and when a young woman was married to Lawis Richard Bagby and came west to establish their home. Their first home was at Kellog, Iowa, where three of their children were born. They again moved west coming to Clay County, Kensas in a covered wagen. They homesteaded in Tabar Community in Bloom Township in 1872. Mr. and Mrs. Bagby being interested in the building up of their community helped to establish the Tabor Church which held meetings in a school house. They found much pleasure in this work. Two years afterwards they and other settlers saw their crops destroyed by the grasshoppers and the Bagby family returned to Kellog, Iowa for the winter, and returned again in the spring in an oxdrawn covered wagon.

Their home was always open to everyone. It is impossible to estimate the value of the service rendered to the century by such people as Mr. and Mrs. Bagby.

Mrs. Bagby was an interesting person. She was interested in people and events. She saw almost a century pass, from before the Civil War until the present time.







Executors of the will were Ephriam's sons, man Star Nickelson and Richard Nickelson. The will was witnessed by Abner Bagby, felcher Harris, and Joseph Carrender.

Ephriam Nickelson married Prudence loodruff February 24, 1816, with Phillip Philes as bondsman. John Brown married LucetRobinson as bondsman.

Recorded in *Deed Book Four*, page 434, is the deed of gift to "Lusitta" Brown in which her father, Ephriam Nickelson and mother, Prudence, conveyed to her "a certain tract of land in Surry (now Yadkin) County on Reed Creek," which contained 70 acres that has previously been a part of the 700-acre tract owned by Moses Woodruff.

Grant of 400 Acres

A grant had been made to Moses Woodruff from the State of North Carolina for 400 acres of land at a cost of 50 shillings per 100 acres. This tract's starting point was at a Chestnut Oak in the Fox "Nob." (Fox Knob has always been shown on the Yadkin County maps as the high knob or mountain called Stars Peak, and so named for Star Nickelson, who, according to the local old-timers, developed it.)

Some other interesting items regarding the Stars Peak land are to be found in the will of Paul Brinegar, dated September 6, 1853:

"Item second, to my daughter, Mary Wagoner, 142 acres of land where she now lives, during her natural life. At her death, to her bodily heirs, and also the little wheel to Mary Wagoner."

"Item 3rd, I give and bequeath to my son, Thomas Brinegar, 143 acres, the tract of land where I now live, stock of all kinds, horses, cattle and sheep, hogs, household and kitchen furniture, farming tools, and my one-horse wagon."

"I appoint my trusty friends, Frederick Wagoner and Jonathan Wagoner, guardians of my son, Thomas Brinegar, and at the death of Thomas Brinegar, the property and land are to be sold and equally divided between the heirs of Mary Wagoner and Joseph Brinegar. I give and bequeath to Jonathan Wagoner my still."

Federick and Jonathan Wagoner were also executors of Paul Brinegar's will. James Sheek and John D. Holcomb were witnesses.

To follow up on the Brinegar's story and to continue with the land owners of the area, I found the following information:

My husband and I visited a family graveyard, near our place, which has always been known as where the Bagby's are buried, but we had never known if there were any markers. What we found were only two graves that had any markers and they were hard to read. We marked across the stone until we could read the names. They were markers for E.D. Harris and Margaret Harris.

It was hard to get the true date — one looks like Jan. 26, 1790, one 1822. These clues started me on a new search for these Harris's.

In the early marriage records of Surry County, North Carolina, I found that Ephriam D. Harris married Peggy Foot, Nov. 17, 1814, James Harris married Dec. 9, 1813, to Milly Foot, with Ephriam D. Harris as Bondsman, and that Isaac Calaway married Catherine Foot, Sept. 4, 1823, with James Harris, Bondsman.



One other document brings this community together is a commissioner's report of the Dower for Tabitha Brinegar, widow of Joseph Brinegar. On 14th day of October, 1825, the Sheriff of Surry County, Thomas B. Wright, assembled the Freeholders. Those attending were and the report in part is:

James Calloway, Samuel Calloway, Sr., Samuel Calloway, Jr., Isaac Calloway, Free Calloway. James Ephriam Harris, Ephriam D. Harris, Michael Swaim, Sen., Daniel Brendle, Samuel Weatherman, Ephriam Nickelson. and Isaac Vestal.

"Unconnected with Tabitha Brinegar, widow of Joseph Brinegar deceased . . . a possession mentioned in the writ lying and being in County of Surry on Waters of Deep Creek containing hundred and sixty-nine acres. To allot and set off one third part of the plantation to said Tabitha Brinegar."

The land joined E.D. Harris line. They allotted her 56 acres. Speer was the surveyor. It included the dwelling house or mantion (mansion) of said Joseph Brinegar, all the offices, out houses, buildings, and improvements. They were to put her in possession of same. The report was returned to Surry County, November term 1825.

An Old Deed

One other deed transferring land in connection with the Nickelson-Woodruff lands is a deed between William S. Nickalson and Fletcher A. Harris.

"I, Fletcher A. Harris, of Surry County, North Carolina, in consideration of one hundred and seventy-five dollars to me paid by William S. Nickalson, all that tractof land in the county aforesaid, lying on the waters of Pipers Creek, containing one hundred & thirty-three acres. . . bounded as follows: . . A hickory. . . Joseph Carrender's line, runs South, crossing a branch, twenty chains to a White Oak, E. two ch. to a White Oak, S. 40 ch. and 50 L. to Salim Road; W. 25 l. to a stump (?) S. 10 ch., 50 lks. to w. Oak, W. 5 ch. to a gum, N. 81 deg. W. 2 ch. to a Spanish Oak on the North side of said road, S. 82 deg. W. 13 chs. and 75 lks. to a Sasafras, thence N. crossing the road to Abner Bagby's corner Hickory, thence N. with sd. Bagby's line all 65 chs. 25 lks. to a stake, said Bagby's corner, Carrender's line, thence E. on said line to the beginning . . . "

Reading between the lines, this could have been the Smith Place which was the homeplace where the large log cabin was located. "Salim" Road refers to what is now called Center Road. Pipers Creek must be the main branch of the Old Mill Creek.

She had made her home with Mrs. Brown in Topeka for the past thirteen years where she was most tenderly cared for during her declining years.



OTHER PHILLIPS FAMILIES

Theophilus Phillips at Maidenhead, N.J., son of Phillip, died in 10 leaving children: Phillip, Abner, Samuel, John and Ruth.

Abner married his cousin Elizabeth Phillips, Ref: New Jersey Archives First Series, Vol. XXX, Abstracts of Wills, Vol. II, p. 378.

Abner moved to Virginia, near Alexandria, and from there to Surry Co., N.C. in 1780. He bought 105 acres on the Yadkin River. He had children: Phillip, Richard, Micajah, Cornelius, George and Ephriam. Cornelius m. Rhoda Shors in 1791 and moved to Wayne Co., Ky., in 1799 and settled on the land where some of the Kendricks later lived. Cornelius, Rhoda, son James and wife Jane and their son Charles, and others of the family are buried in Wayne Co., Ky. Abner's son Richard moved to Tennessee, and son Micajah went to Ohio and later to New York.

Abner's line goes like this: I. Christopher Phillips of Boxted, Rainham, England; II. George, a Puritan preacher who came to Watertown, Mass., III. Samuel of Rowley, Mass.; IV. Samuel, a minister at Newton, Mass.; V. Theophilus who died in New Jersey in 1758; and VI. Abner, son of Theophilus, to Surry Co., N.C. There are many references to this Phillips line in the New England Historical Records.

The Evans heritage actually dates as far back as King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table. Evan, a gallant knight left his homeland of Wales to join King Arthur. The descendendants of Evan came to be known as the Evans, the surname first appeared in English records in the year 1568. One of the most outstanding bearers of the name in modern time is Mary Ann Evans (1819-1880), author of Silas Marner under the pen name of George Eliot.

Of this lineage Franklin Evans was born in Yadkin County, Knobs Township March 13, 1840, and was killed September 6, 1920, by being run over by a Southern Railway freight train in Elkin, Surry County, North Carolina. He was a licensed government "still" operator for many years. He fought in the Civil War with Company D, 44th Regiment.

The Franklin Evans family *Bible* was lost, but around 1860, Franklin was married to Eliza Roberson, borned in Yadkin County on April 3, 1841, and died January 16, 1919.

To this union seven children were born:

(1) Manuel Wilson "Wilse". Evans, born June 27; 1866; died May 18, 1962. He married Rhoda Lucinda Carter, born November 29, 1870; died August 3, 1956. To this union twelve children were born: Carl Franklin, Annie Faye, Pearnie, Glen Edwin, Gladys Vivian, Nannie Wilson, Ruby Evelyn, Abner Bagby, Arvid Cary, Harold Devane, Lula Carter, Frances Eliza.

Wilse, as he was known, operated one of the first country stores in Yadkin County, and was postmaster for Charity Post Office in the same building. One of the few telephones of

the community "phone." He was a pioneer in growing ginseng roots and sold them to sever-

al pharmaecutial companies.

(2) William (Bill) Reeves, the second child, was born December 13, 1867, died March 9, 1955. He married Laura Ann Brown, born September 21, 1870, died August 19, 1941. Ten children were born to this union: Everett, Ettie Iris, Minnie Loy, William Pholton, Nellie, Thad, Annie Viola, Worth, Paris, and Mary Edith.

Bill taught in several Yadkin County Schools. He was a charter member of Shady Grove Baptist Church and taught a class of young people for forty years. He was greatly

respected throughout the County.

(3) Ada Safronia was the third child, born August 14, 1872; died 1959. She was married to Calvin Swaim. Seven children were born to this union: Lucy, Lottie, Robert, Lola Mae, Richard, Raymond, and Lillian. Ada and her husband moved to Wilkes County and both died there.

(4) The fourth child was Wesley Monroe, born May 10, 1871; died February 11, 1959. He married Mary Elizabeth Carter, born February 7, 1882, died October 31, 1969. Eight children were born to this union: Treva, Ralph Carter, John Wesley, Frank Roby (Dick), Nancy Elizabeth, Edwin Carter, Wesley Monroe, Jr., and Carolyn Virginia. Wess, as he was known, migrated to Elkin, in Surry County, and opened the first produce business in that town. Along with many items of produce, he bought and shipped eggs by the train carload during World War I.

(5) Franklin Winfield (Bob), was the fifth child, born January 1, 1876; died June 9, 1948. Bob spent his life being a good farmer. He married Daisy Sinester Bray, born January 6, 1885, died January 23, 1953. Daisy was known far and wide as the best nurse available, and was midwife to many mothers. She never neglected her own family, but spent much time helping the sick in the community.

Many considered her a saint.

There were six children born to this union: Hubert Leonard, Nanie Ruth, Curtis Franklin, Selma, Richard, and Fred. Probably best known is Hubert, who served as Magistrate of Yadkin County for 20 years.

(6) Preston was the sixth child, born on December 11, 1878, died October 28, 1910.

He was unmarried.

(7) Emily O'Tilly was the seventh and last child born November 24, 1881, died May 5, 1958. She was married to William Henry Kimmer, born August 19, 1887, died May 24, 1950. Four children were born to this union: Willis, Clarence Roby, Angie Marie, and Roger.

Franklin and Eliza Evans, along with all but one of their seven children and their spouses are buried in the Shady Grove Baptist Church Cemetery. This family has contributed a great deal to the developement of Yadkin County.





Lucinda Whitaker, a daughter of Jonathan Whitaker, was born May 12, 1821. She married Abner Bagby, a son of William Bagby and grandson of Isaac Bagby, on July 14, 1335.

She died February 3, 1887.

I. INTRODUCTION

THE PLEASURES OF HUNTING FOR ANCESTORS

Perhaps the puffing up of personal pride by basking in the glories of ancestry may seem a silly vanity. But self-knowledge-who you are, who you were, where you came from--is always valuable.

A person without a past is like a shape without a shadow, lacking in depth and dimension. The American people today are in a sort of identity crisis.

Who are we? Do we have a mission anymore? What are we going to do with ourselves? Are we losing sight of the main goals in life by staging a series of side shows?

Bicentennial time is a period when re-evaluations, personal and national are appropriate. The American Bicentennial gives us an opportunity to go back to what we were. For those who can trace their family back to a hardy colonial founder, this is a most appropriate time for ancestor hunting.

There are many pleasures of hunting for ancestors. First, there is the scientific pleasure of research and detective work, tracking down and proving a line of descent through genealogies, graveyards, records, letters and deeds. Then there are the incidental pleasures of discovering odd family characters and curious family patterns.

If the town or county is known where the family originated, all sorts of help will be made available there. The town library will have information. The courthouse will have deeds and records. There will always be a graveyard. Some living person in town will know about everything, usually in total disagreement with somebody else in town.

You can't do genealogy without local history, social trends, human relations, geography. It really goes into every branch of learning.

So lets go up THE BAGBY FAMILY TREE to see what we can find-HERO or HORSE THIEF?

FAMILY LETTERS

Long years ago, news was relayed from one family to another by letter, usually detailed accounts of everything that was happening in the family and in the area. Personal visits were rare, because of the distances involved.

When letters arrived they were read and re-read then carefully kept. Packets of such letters are sometimes found today in old family trunks.

Much of the research done in writing this paper is documented by old family letters collected from his relatives by the late Charles Whitfield Bagby of Hickory, North Carolina.

The invention of the telephone, especially the direct dial has virtually eliminated writing letters that give family history.

Anyone who is fortunate enough to receive a "newsy" letter from one of his kin should keep and treasure the written message. Tomorrow it will be a part of history.

ORIGIN OF THE BAGBY NAME

The distinguished name of Bagby is of Old English, Anglo-Saxon origin, signifying untilled, rising ground, derived from the Old English Boelge, meaning a rising or swelling, hence the word Bulge. While the termination, by, means dwelling. Bagby, as a surname, would signify one who lived near untilled, rising ground, hence the name Bagby.

This explanation is still fitting today. The mountains of North Carolina are for the most part untilled rising ground.

We have this explanation of the Bagby name given us by D. Y. Bagby, Lawyer and Preacher of Lone Oak, Texas in a letter to Charles W. Bagby dated April 13, 1938. Quote:

"Now tradition tells me the name "Bagby" started far back in the history of the Island of England. There was a great persecution of protestants and many were hanged, or otherwise killed and their children taken away. —And so one morning a well-to-do-man found hanging in a bag on his back door a little baby boy and the name "John" was pinned on his little dress, and so that was all the name he had then. They called him "John in the Bag by the door," but that of course was too much name for a little boy and so they cut it down to "John Bag-by" and that is the way the name started."

COAT OF ARMS

The Coat of Arms belonging to the Bagby family as given in Burke's General Armory is as follows: SABLE, A CHEVRON ENGRAVED BETWEEN THREE SWANS, ARGENT.

Explanation of the above Coat

Sable, or black, denotes Constancy and sometimes, but most rarely, Grief.

Chevrons, signify Protection and have often been granted in arms as a reward to one who has achieved some notable enterprise. It is supposed to represent the roof-tree of a house and has sometimes been given to those who build churches or fortresses, or who have accomplished some work of faithful service.

Swan, (Appollo's Bird) is the ensign of the Past and the Hieroglyphic of a musical person. It's heraldic meaning would stand for a "Lover of Poetry and Harmony," or as Nesbet says "for a learned person."

Argent, White or Silver, signifies Peace and Sincerity.

II. EARLY HISTORY OF BAGBY FAMILY IN AMERICA

D. Y. Bagby in his letter dated April 13, 1938, gives us some facts about the early history of the Bagby family. Quote:

"Rev. Alfred Bagby of Farmville, Va., and I about 50 years ago worked up and wrote out a history of the Bagby relations from the beginning of the Bagby's in America. —Away back in 1600 some time, one James Bagby came from Scotland through London, England, and was sent to the barely settled town of Jamestown, Virginia, there he settled and there he married and there he raised five boys and three girls."——.

"Going back to the original James Bagby who came to Jamestown, the boys names were Isham, William, John, James, and Robert, named in order of their ages. The descendants of the first two (Isham & William) remained there in King and Queen County, Va., but the children of John and Robert scattered out here and there over Kentucky, Ohio, Missouri, Tennessee, Alabama and on here to Texas and elsewhere."

Writer's Note: D. Y. Bagby was a descendant of youngest Son (Robert) of the original James Bagby: (1. Generation-James Bagby, 2. Robert Bagby, 3. Charles Bagby, 4. Young S. Bagby, 5. D. Y. Bagby)

Douglas Southall Freeman in his introduction to the 1938 edition of THE OLD VIRGINIA GENTLEMAN AND OTHER SKETCHES has this to say about its author, Dr. George William Bagby, a southern writer of the Civil War Period. Quote:

"George William Bagby's father, George Bagby, of an early seventeenth century line, strayed from the county of King and Queen which was the domain of the Bagbys and opened a merchantile business in Lynchburg ---."

"When George William was ten, his father decided to send the lad to Edgewater School in Princeton, New Jersey. He decided not to leave him in Buckingham School which he had entered at eight years of age, to be prepared for one of the Virginia Colleges, nor to send him to dwell among the countless Bagby cousins in Tidewater, Virginia."

From the book cover of the 1938 edition of THE OLD VIRGINIA GENTLEMAN AND OTHER SKETCHES we have these paragraphs. Quote:

"Thomas Nelson Page wrote in 1910-next to Poe the most original of all writers was he whose reputation in his lifetime mainly rested on humorous sketches of a mildly satirical and exceedingly original type; but who was a master of pathos rarely excelled by any author and rarely equalled by any American author. ---When the old life shall have completely passed away as all life of a particular kind must pass, the curious reader may find in George W. Bagby's pages, pictures with a sympathya fidelity, and anart which may be found nowhere else, the old Virginia life precisely as it was lived before he War Between the States in the Tidewater and Southside sections of Virginia. ... The Old Virginia Gentleman, is the most charming picture of American life ever drawn."

Captain E. Nanney Wrynn (Welch War Beteran) wrote in 1927--

"Why is it I have not heard of George W. Bagby before? He is better than your Mark Twain to my taste. His humor is more melodious, his style more delicate, I can easily see his Welch forefathers in him, the provinciality, and the sweetness and the whimsicality."

Writer's Note: The above paragraphs have been included in this paper to re-enforce the early findings of D. Y. Bagby and Charles W. Bagby. Space does not allow afull discussion of this noteworthy author who is undoubtly a distant cousin of the Rev. Wesley M. Bagby Clan.

daughters. One son, Leslie, preceded his parents in death. Mr. Bagby passed away in 1900 in Arkansas, where they made their home for awhile. Children: Mrs. S. D. (Cora) Brown, Topeka, Kansas; M. L. Bagby, Fredenia; Mrs. E. J. Serna, San Francisco, California; Floyd Bagby, Berkley, California; Mrs. J. A. McGahhey, Dewitt, Arkansas; D. C. Bagby, Morganville, Kansas; Eugene Bagby, Topeka, Kansas.

Mrs. Bagby was blassed with nineteen grandchildren, twelve great grandchildren and one great grandchild."

In the Bagby files we have a complete chart of the family tree of Lewis Richard Bagby.

Lewis Richard Bagby, born 1841 in Yadkin County, North Carolina married Martha Jane Lindsey also born in Yadkin County. Lewis Bagby died in 1900 in Dewitt, Arkansas. Martha Jane (Aunt Jane) died July 15, 1941 in Topeka, Kansas. The couple had eight children.

THEIR CHILDREN:

- A. Cora Bagby, born 1866, was married in 1882 to Solomon Brown who died in 1924. No children were born of this union. Cora and her husband lived at 611 West 10th Street Topaka, Kansas.
- B. Ella Bagby born 1868, was married in 1902 to Eugene Bidgood who died in 1924. Ella later married Ed Serna. They lived at 189 College Street, San Francisco, California. No children were born in either marriage.
- C. Martin Luther Bagby, born 1870, was married in 1896 to Nora Calloway. They lived at Route #3
- Fradonia, Kansas. Nine children were born of this union.
- 1. Viola Born 1897, was married to Nelson Fiscus.
 The couple had two children, Ethel born 1921, and Betty Louise Born 1930, died 1935.
 - 2. Clinton born 1900 married Dorothy Blackburn.
 Robert Louis was born to the couple in 1939.
- ______ 3. Verna born 1899, married Sam Fiscus. A son Lester was born in 1918.

E. Floyd born in 1880, married Lilly Myers and lived at 3135 King Street, Berkley, California. Four children were born to this union: Cameron born 1912, Eugene born 1914, Linda born 1920, and Janet born 1924.

F. Leslie born 1876, died 1887.

G. Dawitt, Clinton born 1885, married Mary Susan Williams and lived in Morganville, Kansas. Four children were born to this union; Ethel Valerie born 1910, Forrest Everett born 1911, Richard Leslie born 1913, and Martha Grace born 1922.

H. Eugene Ray, born 1889, married Les Fox. They lived at 907 Lincoln Street, Topeka, Kansas. Three children were born of this union: Betty Jean born 1919, Donald born 1928, and James born 1933.

Writer's Note: The above family tree was charted by hand on a sheet of paper which was headed, "Topeka Milling Company-Contracts of Purchases," the handwriting resembles that of Cora Bagby Brown. The Family Chart was probably made around 1940 and sent to Charles W. Bagby.

3. ROBERT BAGBY

Robert Bagby (son of Abner and Lucinda Bagby,) the third of the three brothers to go West following the Civil War, also settled around 1870 in Clay County, Kansas.

In a letter from Cora Bagby Brown (niece of Lewis Robert Bagby) dated May 3, 1940 to Charles W. Bagby, Cora writes, "I know very little about Uncle Robert Bagby. He and his wife and youngest daughter are all deed. About the others I do not know."

Mary Smith Gunter, daughter of Mary Bagby, in one of her letters to her cousin, Charles W. Bagby had this to say about Robert Bagby. Quote:

> "I have in my possession a letter from Uncle Robert to his father, Abner Bagby, and his brothers and sisters dated February 20, 1887 when he learned of the

death of his mother, Lucinda Whitaker Bagby. I wish you would read it. He surely was a good man. It was mailed at Baloit, Kansas."

4. WILLIAM ABNER BAGBY

William Abner Bagby, (son of Abner and Lucinda Bagby) was killed while fighting in the Confederate Army at Drawy's Bluff, May 16, 1864.

5. SANFORD BAGBY

Sanford Bagby (son of Abner and Lucinda Bagby) married Mary Swain and for awhile they lived in one of the western states, the town where the University of Indiana is located. No children were born of their marriage. Sanford spent the last years of his life in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. In a letter post marked February 12, 1925, Winston-Salem, North Carolina to his nephaw, Charles W. Bagby, Sanford humbly writes:

"I received the check and appreciated it so much. It was very kind of you to send it to me. I have not been able to make anything through the entire winter. In fact I have not made anything since I picked cotton. Then I only made two-dollars a week. I want to see you and your family very much, and I do hope I will be able to see you this summer."

Writer's Note: In the summer of 1920 or 1921, I remember Uncle Sanford spent a few days in our home the guest of his naphew, Charles W. Bagby. He was a quiet man with a very bald head. He seemed to enjoy sitting on our front porch. He accompanied us that summer to Montezume, North Caroline for our annual visit with Grandfather and Grandmother Bagby, (Reverend and Mrs. Wesley M. Bagby). I was only six years old at that time.

6. ZACK T. BAGBY

Zack T. Eagby, (son of Abner and Lucinda Bagby)
lived and died in North Carolina and during his
entire life was a successful fermer. He was
married to Roxis == None of his children settled in
North Carolina, all ware successful in their
undertakings. From correspondence in Bagby files-

Quota: "Uncla Zack had a daughter (Lillian) who lived in Norfolk, Virginia. This daughter had one girl who married William C. Spann."

According to a list of names and addresses given to Charles W. Bagby by his cousin, Mary Smith Gunter, Zack's children settled in the following places:

7. CHARLIE L. BAGBY

Charlie L. Bagby (son of Abner and Lucinda Bagby) settled in Winston-Salem, North Carolina and became a successful businessman. At the time of his death he was probably worth a hundred thousand dollars. His widow, Aunt Leura and four children remained in Winston-Salem after his death. His children: Alonzo, a clothing merchant owned and operated a very fine men's store; Howell, a real estate man; Ina, who married J. H. Rich and Ora who merried twice. Name of either husband cannot be recalled. (The above facts about. Uncle Charlie were sited in a letter written by his nephew, and namesake, Charles W. Bagby, to a cousin in the West.

Writer's Note: As a small child, I remember visiting my great Uncle Charlie. I was much impressed by the splendor and grandeur of his home, and also by the friendliness of his family. It was the first time I had ever seen a maid called into the dining room by the hostess pressing a button with her foot under the table. Uncle Charlie was a tall fine looking man with keen eyes and a very well kept beard. He closely resembled my own grandfather, Wesley M. Bagby.

8. MARY LUCRITTIA BAGBY

Mary Lucittia Bagby (daughter of Abner and Lucinda Bagby) born December 2, 1862, married Professor Tom Smith. They lived for a number of years in California. Later they returned to North Carolina. Mary was quite interested in the Bagby family and carried on a wide correspondence with her many relatives. Some of her letters are found in the Bagby files. Professor Smith for a number of years was School Superintendent in King, North Carolina. Mary died December 11, 1939.

One child, named Mary for her mother, was born of this marriage. Mary Smith married a Guntar and lived also in King, North Carolina. She corresponded frequently with her cousin, Charles W. Bagby. Many of her letters are found in the Bagby files.

9. ANNIE BAGBY

Annie Bagby, (daughter of Abner and Lucinda Bagby,) married a Carter. Given name or initials are not known. Four children, two boys and two girls were born of this union. One boy lived in Elkin, North Carolina and the other son somewhere in Florida. The two girls, Bess and Lula, married brothers in Elkin, their last name being Evans. Both couples made their home in Elkin. The given name of one of the brothers was Wesley. (These facts were given by Charles W. Bagby in a latter to one of his Bagby relatives.)

10. WESLEY MICAGER BAGBY

Our grandfather, Wesley Micager Bagby, (the eighth and middle child of the fifteen children born to Abner and Lucinda Bagby) entered this world November 2, 1851. He was married to Linny Frances Robinson. Seven of the nine children of this marriage grew to manhood or womanhood. Accounts of the seven children have been given earlier in this paper.

V. INTERESTING FACTS IN THE LIVES OF WESLEY MICAGER BAGBY AND HIS WIFE-LINNY FRANCES ROBINSON

EARLY LIFE OF WESLEY M. BAGBY

Reverend Wesley M. Bagby, son of Abner and Lucinda Bagby, was born in Yadkin County, North Carolina, November 2, 1852. "Wesley did not have the advantages of an early education. He was eighteen years old when he learned to read. But possessing a strong mind, and an indomitable will, he set out thus late in life to prepare for his life's work. He entered the East Bend High School and finished the "High School Course" in that institution. He was ever after a close student; "And while he did not have a classical education, it would not be said that he was not an educated man."

Mary Smith Gunter in her correspondence with her cousin, Charles W. Bagby, had this to say about one of her treasured letters in her little trunk. Quote:

"I have a letter from your father (Wesley M. Bagby) to my mother (Mary Bagby) before she was married, dated September 17, 1887, Mooresville, North Carolina. He was urging Mama and Louise Carter to come over there to school and get an education so they could teach and be independent."

"Wesley M. Bagby was converted and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church when about nineteen years old, and licensed to preach by that church about two years after his conversion. He felt a definite Divine call to preach and he did not fight this call but set about with all the resources at his command to prepare himself for the task."

"He joined the Blue Ridge Conference Methodist Episcopal Church in 1876, in which he served the following charges in their order: Catawba, Yadkin, Kings Mountain and Concord circuits, and Asheville station."

In Catawba, North Carolina he married Linny Frances Robinson daughter of Emanuel and Mary Ward Robinson on August 31, 1875. Frances, the youngest of her parents' eleven children, grew up on the Robinson Plantation which contained at nettine more than a thousand acres. Prior to the Civil War, many slaves worked the fields of this southern plantation located near the village of Catawba. Frances Robinson before her marriage received a better education than most young girls of her time.

She attended and graduated with honors from Old Rutherford College (a Methodist College no longer in existence) located in the community now known as Rutherford College, North Carolina. Her father, Emanuel Robinson, Offered her the gift of several slaves or the opportunity to attend college. Frances chose to continue her formal education. She excelled in math and became an excellent school teacher.

Writer's Note: The gift of several slaves was a significant gift. In the Bagby files is a bill of sale showing that Emanuel Robinson paid eight hundred dollars for a black male slave.

"In 1883 Reverend Bagby was transferred to the North Carolina Conference Methodist Episcopal South. Here he served with great acceptability the following charges: Statesville; Mooresville; Centenary-Greensboro; Gastonia, Main Streat; Monroe, Central; High Point, Washington Streat; Morganton; Hickory; and Mount Airy."

While pestor of Main Street Mathodist Church in Gastonia he organized a new congregation in the community and built a small frame church known as the West-End Methodist Church. A notable contribution to Gastonia's educational growth took place during Reverend Bagby's ministry, when under his leadership the Main Street Church membership established Oakland High School, the town's first high school. The original building was erected in exactly five weeks, and school opened in it on September 24, 1896, with Reverend W. M. Bagby conducting the exercises. Also in 1896 Frances Robinson Bagby organized the Women's Missionary Society of Main Street Methodist Church and was made its first president.

Writer's Note: The 1922 Methodist Conference Annual and History of the First United Methodist Church in Gastonia were used as references for the information on Reverend Bagby.

LATER YEARS OF WESLEY M. BAGBY

Quotes From HICKORY DAILY RECORD July 20, 1922

... "Active in good works until the last, Mr. Bagby and other good citizens of Avery County formed an organization recently to fight the whiskey ring in that county and where the majority party had put out wet men, independents were placed in the field. Both Republicans and Democrats were interested in the campaign and it will be fought to the finish this summer and fall."

"Hickory friends have recalled many incidents in the life of this starling preacher of the gespel. He was in a big dry and wet fight in Morganton and was a crusader against liquor from his early manhood. Of a splendid physique, brave as a lion, fearing no individual or ring, he was received as a minister in 1873 and his charges included Old Trinity, Grænsboro, Monroe, Hickory, Morganton, Mooresville, Gastonia, Mount Airy and High Point."

"Mr. Bagby was stricken Tuesday morning as he went into his pasture on his Montezuma farm to see that his cattle was all safe. He had been away from home for ten days. He died as he had always said he wanted to die-suddenly and painlessly for he had no fear of sudden death."

:... "Mr. Bagby was full of goodness and wisdom and since the purchase of a farm in Avery County about ten years ago had devoted his time to reading and the simple pleasures of rural life. His grasp of

public questions was remarkable and he gave them the thought of a man of learning and leisure. The father of a large family of children, he helped to train all and saw them grow up into useful citizens. Born in the mountains, he returned to the hills to spend his last days."

OBITUARY OF FANNIE ROBINSON BAGBY, WIFE OF REVEREND WESLEY M. BAGBY

In the scrapbook of the late Charles W. Bagby is a lengthly obituary, dated December 11, 1919, of Mrs. Fannia Robinson Bagby. The article is signed by T. S. Coble who states in his tribute to Mrs. Bagby that he was her pastor at the time of her death, and that he had conducted her funeral service.

Excerpts from the Obituary:

"Mrs. Fannia Robinson Bagby was born March 2, 1853, and peacefully departed this life November 7, 1919. She was the daughter of Manuel and Polly Robinson of Catawba County, North Carolina. On August 31, 1875, she was happily married to Reverend W. M. Bagby, now a superannuate of the Western North Carolina Conference. After an itinerant journey of forty years this lovely couple were at home in Montezuma, North Carolina. To this union were born nine children, seven of whom with the husband still survive; also a brother and a sister, Lawson Robinson of Catawba, North Carolina, and Mrs. Harrist Boyd of Maiden, North Carolina."

"The children are: Mrs. W. H. Willis of Weavarville, North Carolina, whose husband is presiding elder of the Asheville District; Mrs. W. H. Swift of Graensboro, North Carolina, whose husband is a lawyer traveling for a child labor committee of New York investigating and studying child labor laws of different states; Charles W. Bagby, a lawyer and postmaster of Hickory, North Carolina; Miss Ivah-Bagby of Montezuma, a school teacher who has held five positions in different city schools of the state, now at home with her father and doing fine work as Sunday School Superintendent at their home church at Montezuma; Reverend W. M. Bagby, Jr. of Winston-Salam,

North Carolina, who received his appointment at Greensboro, North Carolina in October; James Willis Bagby, principal of the technical high school of Columbus, Georgia; Mrs. Rufus A. Duvell, whose husband is principal of the grammar school in Columbus, Georgia."

... "Mrs. Bagby occupied the following parsonage homes in Western North Carolina Conference: Statesville, Mcoresville Circuit; Randolph Circuit; Old Trinity, Greensboro; Centenery, Gastonia; Monroe, High Point, Morganton, Hickory, from there two years on the Mt. Airy Circuit. At Statesville and Greensboro she occupied new parsonages built under the leadership of her husband as pastor. She was educated at Rutherford College."

"She was a woman, strong in body, intellect and spiritual power. A marvel in industrial labor for the comfort and happiness of her family. To make an itinerant journey of nearly forty years, to rear a large family, to give the abundant hospitality of the parsonage home, to share the necessary struggles with her husband that each child be educated and trained for life, to share in giving liberally to the various benevolent enterprises of the Church, is an achievement that challenges the gratitude and admiration of the Church and the World; yet with all of this abundant labor and achievement, the best of it all was her gentleness, meekness, gracious kindness, deep sympathy in the life she lived. The historian may write of the great men of Church and State, but to the guardians and keepers of the parsonage home we do owe a debt of profound sympathy and love. No wonder the mother of President Wilson lived in a parsonage homa! . . . 11

"Mrs. Bagby went with us to Conference at Greensboro looking forward to the joy of visiting each child before returning home at Montezuma. The plan of this trip was from Greensboro to Winston, Hickory, Columbus, Georgia, Weaverville, and then Montezuma. But on November 6, with valise packed she was taken suddenly ill at ten o'clock at night.

It was November 7, at eight o'clock p.m. when there was an unexpected change in schedule. Home at last, but by the heavenly route."

"On looking into her valise a touching thing of arrangement was to see each child's picture folded away with the last letter from each one inside the picture. This marks the close of a truly great life. The image of each child with the last message from each one folded away in her heart with all her love and sacrifice richly bestowed upon them."

"And now to go on the journey to see them--the labor, the love, the travail, and crown of her life lived with God in Christ the Lord."

Writer's Note: The above article probably appeared in the Methodist Conference Annual; however, only the date, December 11, 1919, is indicated in C. W. Bagby's scrapbook.

Writer's Note: According to the records found in Emanuel Robinson's Bible, Linny Frances Robinson had four brothers and six sisters. Dates of their births, marriages, and deaths as recorded in the family Bible are given in the above chart.

With the exception of Lawson Alexander, little is known about the brothers and sisters of our grandmother, Linny Frances Robinson. Lawson lived his entire life on the Robinson Plantation near the village of Catawba, North Carolina. By his marriage to Dolly Moore three daughters were born who survived him after death.

They were: Miss Ella Robinson of Catawba, Mrs. Ola Paige and Mrs. Daisy Parker of Hildebran, North Carolina. Sometime after his wife's death, Lawson married Miss Annia Sizemore of Appomattox, Virginia. No children were born of this marriage.

An account of L. A. Robinson's death appeared in the January 9, 1946 issue of the Hickory Daily Record. Quote:

"Funeral services for Lawson A.
Robinson, ninety-six, prominent retired
farmer of Catawba who died in a Newton
hospital Monday night following an
illness of two weeks, will be conducted
at Shiloh Methodist Church, Catawba,
Route Two at three o'clock, Thursday
Afternoon with Reverend Dwight Herbert
of Hildebran in charge."

"The body will lie in state at the Church for an hour prior to the services and burial will follow in the Church Cemetery."

"Mr. Robinson, a son of the late
Emanuel and Polly Ward Robinson, is
survived by his wife, the former Miss
Annie Sizemore and three daughters, fourteen
grandchildren, twenty-seven great-grandchildren,
and three great-great-grandchildren."

Lawson Rebinson willed his portion of farm land of the Old Rebinson Plantation to his nephew, Charles W. Bagby, who preceded him in death by two years. The farm was held for a number of years by Charles W. Bagby's widow, Frankie Lenora Salf Bagby. Later it was sold to a resident of Catawba, North Carolina.

Ward Robinson, who says he is a descendant of Emanuel and Mary Polly Ward Robinson, lives in Ralaigh, North Carolina where he heads the Vocational Division of the North Carolina Department of Public Schools. He has expressed a keen interest in his Robinson heritage and wishes to see the old family Bible.

VI. OTHER BAGBYS

BAGBYS IN TEXAS AND THE "CHICKEN" BAGBYS IN MISSOURI

Cousin D. Y. Bagby of Lone Oak, Texas had this to say about the Bagbys in general in his latter written April 13, 1938 to his cousin Mary Bagby Smith of King, North Carolina. Quota: "If you want to talk 'Bagby talk,' I can write of the Bagbys until you are tired reading it. My oldest brother was a Baptist preacher for 40 odd years and I have been one for over 50 years, and am now in my 90th year of age."

"A descendant of John Bagby, (son of the original James Bagby), was a governor of the state of Alabama and his son, named the same as his father A. P. Bagby, was a Major-General when he was younger than any other man who had ever lived, for he was a Major before he was 25 years of age."

"Another descendant of this same
John was a judge in the Supreme Court
of the State of Illinois, and also a
member of the Congress for some years.
His son, Morris Bagby, was quite a
musician and he is the one who originated
"The Musical Monday Mornings" there in
New York City. It was the highest honor
to any visiting musician to be invited
to perform at that institution."

"Bagby's have occupied positions in about every position in the land, doctors, lawyers, mechanics, musicians, artists, farmers, and preachers, lots of them. Everything that men do that is right, there has been a Bagby in that work it seems, but I have never heard of any Bagby being in the "Pen" for meanness, thanks the Lord! Many of them are preachers, mostly Baptist, but a few are of other denominations, none extra great men in the pulpit, but all good average men, honest, trustworthy and well liked by the people generally. There used to be nine of us whose names appeared in the minutes of the Southern Baptist Convention."

"Now the Chicken Bagbys who started me to write to you, are the descendants of one of the sons of my great-grandfather, Robert, (son of the criginal James Bagby), as he had two wives, and they are the descendants of the first wife while I am of the second wife."

The Chicken Bagbys owned and operated the BagbyPoultry Farm in Sedalia, Missouri. In the Bagby files is a letter from Omer Bagby of Sedalia, Missouri dated February 6, 1938 to Mrs. Mary Bagby Smith in King, North Carolina. Quote

"Fathar was in and I asked him where the Bagbys came from and he said Covington, Kentucky. My grandfather, David Alex Bagby and his brother Avery Bagby came to Missouri from Kentucky. Their father's name was David Bagby, but my father did not know where his grandfather (David Bagby) the one from Covington, Kentucky was from. There are some more Bagbys at New Haven, Missouri, who have had a nursery for about 80 years. They came from Kentucky also. They are cousins or second cousins of my fathers."

"If you can figure out who settled at Covington, Kentucky we probably are some relation. My grandfather, David Alex Bagby died in 1904. He was 63 years old then. He was in the Civil War in Missouri, I believe with a regiment for the South. We are still Democrats!"

Mary Smith Gunter of King, North Carolina, stated in a letter to her first cousin, Charles W. Bagby, "You know Mama (Mary Bagby Smith) had a brother that lived in Missouri. These are his descendants. Mama used to write to the one in Sedalia, Missouri. They will put you in touch with several other Bagbys. Here are the addressess: George Bagby, Jr., Box 360-B Marshall, Missouri; and Bagby Poultry Farms, Box 204-B, Sedalia, Missouri."

THE RICHARD BAGBYS OF VIRGINIA

Richard Bagby, Minister of First Christian Church, Wilson, North Carolina, gave the following facts on Bagbys in a letter written September 11, 1916 to Mrs. J. T. Smith (Mary Bagby Smith) in King, North Carolina.

"My family is from the Virginia brother. I have never heard that there was a North Carolina brother. Since coming to this state, I have heard of two others by my name, both men, one living in Greenville who is the son of George W. Bagby (Moses Adams) —a Virginian of some reputation as a short story writer who died about twenty-five years ago. The other North Carolina Bagby lives in Kinston. I started to look him up but was advised not to do so, as I already have a plenty of relatives whom I know who have not an enviable reputation. I did not seek a personal acquaintance of this cousin."

"There are a good many of our name in Virginia. Most of them professional

men. More preachers then any other calling. A good many are physicians and some are lawyers. Most of the preachers are Baptist denomination. In my father's family there are four sons, two physicians and two preachers."

"My great grandfather, grandfather, and an uncle were named Richard. So I am Richard the fourth. My father's name was Alexander Fleet Bagby. He was Captain of Company K, 34 Virginia Ragiment of Confederate Soldiers of America. He lived most of his life in King and Queen County as did his father and his grandfather. My brothers, Reverend E. B. Bagby of Washington, D. C. is better posted along this line than I am and parhaps I can get him to give you more information."

FIRST BAGBY BLACKSHEEP ON RECORD

According to the records at National Headquarters of Daughters of the American Revolution in Washington, D. C., a William Sims Bagby, born January 27, 1781, was "discounted for dancing and attending places of the devil." This fact is recorded in the minutes of the old town meetings in Campbell County, Virginia.

VII. CONCLUSION

There is no logical way to conclude this paper since Bagbys continue to be born and continue to love, to work, and to play on this earth. Other Chapters in the "Bagby Story" need to be written. Much depends on those present at this dinner, whether or not our chronicle will proceed from this point. All living descendants of Wesley M. Bagby and Linny Frances Robinson Bagby are requested to complete their questionnaires and hand them to our Biographical Committee at the close of our 1975 Reunion (August 8, 9, 10 in Montezuma, North Carolina). It is by tracing our own people to their origin that we learn to understand them, and it is by keeping that line and that origin always in view that we never forget them.

As our country's two hundredth birthday arrives, we Bagbys can look back to our family's origin and toast it with pride and gratitude. The greatness of the Bagbys is not found in things or circumstances, but in the

spirit of the people and in the quality of their lives. Each of the pioneer Bagbys, whether he tilled the soil, preached from a pulpit, or drove a covered wagon across the plains, possessed a heroic devotion to high ideals. Made of strong fiber, the early Bagby relied upon his inner resources to succeed and achieve worthy objectives.

We honor the memory of our forefathers who loved their families, were deeply religiour people and strong patriotic citizens. They helped to develop this area and this nation. Their descendants have made their contributions to Church, Femily, and Country. Meny have achieved distinguished careers. Let us continue to hold to the high standards set by our forebears as we pass along our rich, heritage to succeeding generations.

Refreshed in spirit and girded by a new sense of Confidence, lat us give the "Dagby Yell" or Yodel with our dear Aunt Fennie leading us:

Dear Bagby Cousins,

Several weeks ago I spent a half day doing research on the Bagby family in the library of the National Headquarters of the Daughters of the American Revolution in Washington, D.C. Much to my delight I found a comprehensive Bagby Family Tree recorded in a bound volume entitled, Genealogy of the Bagby Family and Polated Families, which was written in 1937 by Mr. and Mrs. William M. Creasy of Wilmington, North Carolina. Mrs. Creasy, the former Gertrude Bagby, daughter of George K. Bagby, was born in the county of Lenoir near Kinston, North Carolina. She is a direct descendant of the William Bagby who served in the Virginia Militia during the American Revolution. The same William Bagby was the grandfather of our Abner Bagby. Our cousin Gertrude Creasy has included the Abner Bagby line in her genealogy.

For the sake of interest and clarity I am extracting several statements from Mr. and Mrs. Creasy's introduction:

"The most definite record of the early Bagby Family in America is found in A History of King and Queen County, Virginia written by Reverend Alfred Bagby DC of Richmond, Virginia and published in 1908. Dr. Bagby was a graduate of Columbian College, Washington, D.C. (now George Washington University) in 1847, and Princeton Theological Seminary in 1851. In addition to the information given by Dr. Bagby in this history, he compiled a record of the family bringing down many of the lines to his time. Unfortunately he did not quote references to records from which he obtained his data."

Gertrude Bagby Creasy had the privilege of a brief interview with Dr. Bagby in 1906, and he assured her that the records as compiled by him were based on proven facts. All of the data cannot be verified by the public records of Virginia, but Dr. Bagby doubtless had access to family records and other information that never got into the public records. Reverend D. Y. Bagby of Lone Oak, Texas, whom I will talk about shortly, assisted Dr. Albert Bagby in collecting data.

For what it is worth, Mrs. Creasy included in her introduction an extract from a letter written by Mr. John C. Bagby of Rushville Illinois to her father Mr. George K. Bagby, May 18, 1894. Quote:

"John Bagby married a Welch woman. Eight or ten children were born to them in Wales. All moved to America ... The sons of Scotchman John Bagby were all born in Wales and scattered over Louisa, King and Queen, Prince William, Amelia and several other counties east and west of the James River, some as far down as Danville, Virginia."

According to personal letters written by one cousin to another cousin in the Abner Bagby Family, the children of the immigrant James Bagby, who settled in Jamestown around 1628, were born in America.

Quotes are given below from two letters written by Reverend D. Y. Bagby, PhD of Lone Oak, Texas to support this statement. (The original letters are in the files of the late Charles W. Bagby of Hickory, N. C.) The letters were written to D. Y. Bagby's cousin, Mary Bagby Smith (Mrs. John T. Smith), who was the daughter of Abner Bagby and the sister of Reverend Wesley M. Bagby, Sr.

March 25, 1937 "The original Bagby came from London away back in the 1600 sometime, and he came to the town of Jamestown, which was about the only town of any size in Virginia. He settled there and reared his family of five boys and I believe it was three girls. The names of the boys were Isham, William, John, James, and Robert, all married except James, and I'm a descendant of the youngest, Robert. This is the history I worked up years ago when I helped a Bagby from Farmville, Virginia get up a history of the Bagby Family, "The Bagby Tree" as we called it, and that was nearly 50 years ago. To be sure the Bagbys have scattered far and wide since then, and some before then for that matter, and they may be found in many parts of the United States today, but we are all kin, even though some distance apart in connection ... I will be 89 years old tomorrow and have about passed off the worldly stage of action. I do preach now and then and shall do so again this Sunday, March 27th."

April 13, 1938
"If you want me to talk 'Bagby Talk', I can write of the Bagbys till you are tired reading it, for Reverend Alfred Bagby of Farmville, Va. and I about 50 years ago worked up and wrote out a history of the Bagby relations from the beginnings of the Bagbys in America.

... Away back in 1600 sometime, one James Bagby came from Scotland through England and was sent to the then barely settled town of Jamestown, Virginia. There he settled and there he married and there he raised 5 boys and 3 girls. The girls I cannot trace at all as they

married off and are lost so far as I know to the Bagby name. The boys were named Isham, William, John, James and Robert, named as their ages were. The descendants of the first two, (Isham and William) remained quite a little there in King and Queen County, but the children of John and Robert scattered out here and there over Kentucky, Ohio, Missouri, Tennessee, Alabama and on here to Texas and elsewhere as they desired to go. I'm a descendant of the very youngest Robert ... When Cousin Alfred and I got up the "Bagby Tree" over 50 years ago, we believed that there were likely over 1500 Bagbys in the United States, but how many more there are now I cannot say. I am now in my 90th year of age".

It is interesting to note that Reverend D. Y. Bagby in his second letter to our great Aunt Mary Bagby Smith, spoke of Dr. Alfred Bagby as "Cousin Alfred".

Before giving you the direct line of our descent from James Bagby, the immigrant, through Abner Bagby down to our present generation I would like to give you several quotes from The History of King and Queen County, Va. written by Dr. Albert Bagby, our distant cousin, and published in 1908 by the Neale Publishing Company of New York and Washington.

Early Settlers (page 22)

"We give the following names of settlers in that region on the soil of the present King and Queen County drawn from antiquated books now in the land office in Richmond, counting from the year 1625 onward". Appearing in the list of settlers is the name of "Robert Bagbie (1672) who joined Skipwith and Chapman" and the name of "Robert Bagby (above tide) joined Pigge and Hall 1673".

Later as you study our family tree you will find that this Robert Bagby is our Ancestor, Robert Bagby No. 4, born in 1640.

Education (page 86)

"About the year 1839, Mr. John Bagby and Colonel John Pollard started an academy at Stevensville, near the center of the county for the teaching of English and the classics and mathematics ... Reverend R. H. Bagby followed James G. White as headmaster ... Such schools were largely efficacious in the preparation of the youth of the county for college training and business life".

The Military (page 152)

"Major John Robert Bagby was born November 13, 1826 near Stevensville Post Office, King and Queen County, Virginia. His father, John Bagby (born 1791 - died 1878), was of Scottish descent and a soldier in the War of 1812. Major Bagby was a graduate of Columbian College at Washington, D. C. taking a high stand in his class... Major Bagby died March 26, 1890, highly esteemed by all who knew him. In fact no man ever lived in this county more loved and honored than he was, as evidenced at the unveiling of his portrait which now adorns the walls of the court house of his native county".

Major John Robert Bagby was a brother of Dr. Albert Bagby. "At the out-break of the Civil War, Major John Robert Bagby, raised a volunteer company known as the King and Queen Artillery and afterwards as Company K. Thirty-fourth Virginia Infantry, which Company he commanded until 1862 when he was made major of

the Thirty-fourth Virginia Regiment".

Other Bagbys serving their native state during the Civil War are mentioned in Dr. Bagby's history; To name several: Captain A. F. Bagby; Reverend R. H. Bagby, Captain; Edward Bagby, aid-decamp; and Richard and Thomas Bagby, both privates.

Industry (page 264)

"John Bagby of Stevensville and Mr. Samuel P. Ryland and Mr. Walker were the first men to introduce the cotton gin into King and Queen County. This was about 1837".

Accepting Dr. Alfred Bagby's record as to the old or early family and adding to it Gertrude Bagby Creasy's record, and data which I have collected from here and there from authentic sources, our family record is as follows. In this genealogy you will find slight variations from the family tree of the early Bagbys which I developed several years ago from the files of the late Charles W. Bagby. Both records lead back to James Bagby who settled in Jamestown, Virginia, 1628.

For the past three hundred and fifty years Bagbys in America have been recording names and dates in their family Bibles, buying and selling land, serving in the military, making last wills and testaments, and burying their dead in family plots. Naturally some mistakes have been made in all this record keeping.

Do not be too confused by the numerals used in our family record. Numbers one through one hundred and ninety-nine have been assigned to our line by Gertrude Bagby Creasy in her most comprehensive record of the Bagby family which includes hundreds of names. I have continued the genealogy by using numbers 200 - 347 to take care of the Bagbys directly descended from Reverend Wesley M. Bagby, Sr., No. 171.

This Robert and his father No. 18 seem to fit the description very well. 
