

## Surry County Hides

When asked to explain to someone about my passion in genealogy, I often stop and silently wonder how they could not be interested in their family history and family stories. I open my mouth to speak but my inner voice says just to remain silent. How can you explain to someone such a deep and important part of life... family? So I just say I'm crazy or obsessed or some other excuse.

In one form or another, some version of family remains everyone's basic hold on reality. As I get older it makes more sense and in the end we all have the same dream: we want children, we want to create families and at some point we will ponder where we came from and the journey, the struggle, the heart aches, and joys it took our family to get us where we are now.

When you think of it, the ballance of life is very fragile. If just one member of our family tree did not survive the struggles of life, you or me would not be here as we are today. Genetics is very powerful. God has designed us that we are images of our forefathers and when we go back far enough we are images of Him. When we see and understand our true DNA it helps us to know ourselves better. That in itself is reason enough to study who we really are.

### Our Family

Our first proven Hides ancestors were first found in Rowan County, North Carolina in 1755.

Back then Rowan County covered the whole western North Carolina. I believe our Hide's settled here in Rowan County, NC in the same area that later later became Surry County, NC. There is a different line of Hyde's that were in Rowan County, NC which later was named Anson County, NC. Anson County Hyde's usually are spelled in deeds as HYDE and the Surry County Hide's are usually spelled HIDE. Therefore this why I have named our Hides the "Surry County" Hides and the other Hyde's the Anson County Hyde's.

My belief is we originally came from Pennsylvania, but I haven't got that far back yet. If this is proven we can rename our Hides something else. But for now we are the Surry County Hides.

In the 1750's What motivated people to move was cheap land and land was cheap in North Carolina because there was so much of it. It was said that someone could work in Pennsylvania and in two years earn enough to buy land on the frontier (just where the frontier was depended on the time frame). Land was cheap and so labor was high. Someone would work for a couple of years and then move out to buy his own farm creating a permanent shortage of labor.

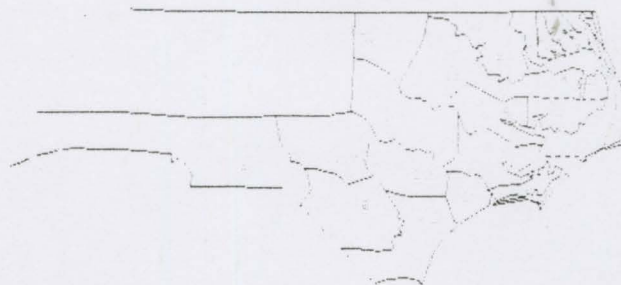
The "Philadelphia Wagon Road" from Philadelphia went out of Philadelphia, turned south through the Shenandoah Valley, and southwesterly, joining with the "Great Valley Wagon Road" through southwestern Virginia into the Carolinas and further. It was the primary migration route out of Pennsylvania into Virginia and Carolina.

We first find our family, mainly Benjamin Hide and George Hide listed in the tax rolls in the Orange District of Rowan County North Carolina in 1755. Rowan County was formed in 1753 and extended westward to the Mississippi River so this was just the second year of this new county formation. Rowan County was formed from Anson County and before that from Johnson County. (See maps below)

In 1768 Charles Hide, George Hide, Stephen Hide and Benjamin Hide were all in Rowan County NC Census. Surry County NC was formed in 1771 and we find Benjamin Hide and Stephen Hide on the tax rolls then.

The Hides were farmers and the family preformed as a unit planting grain, raising cattle, hunting, and growing food for the table. The women ran the loom and furnished clothes for the family. Skins from animals were tanned, furs from wild animals were secured to provide additional clothing. Their pioneer homes were built from the surrounding forest as was their furniture and furnishings for the home.

After the Revolutionary War, between 1780 and 1800 pioneers of North Carolina began following Daniel Boone's "Wilderness Road" over the mountains into Kentucky and Tennessee.

The Hides and Boone's were neighbors and in 1768, when Daniel Boone was 22 at Boonville, NC on the Yadkin River Settlements 5 miles from Stephen Hide's farm on Fall Creek. Boonville, NC was built where two Indian trails crossed. The east and west trail by the Cherokees and the north and south trail used by the Catawba Indians. In 1775 Daniel Boone and his men complete the blazing of the first trail through the Cumberland Gap Mountains called the *Wilderness Road*. It was only a crude trail accessible only by pack teams which could cross the East Tennessee Mountains into Kentucky Mountains. In 1781 the trail was made a little wider and removed obstruction and trimmed out overhanging limbs, but it remained a pack-horse trail.

Daniel Boone family farm was 5 miles west of Stephen Hide on the south side of Yadkin River at Fall Creek. Some of the adventurous young Hide men followed Boone from North Carolina on this trail to find their fortune in Kentucky. Among those single young Hides who moved to Kentucky in the 1790's were William Hide (Tom Hyde's family) [[dochyde2020@hotmail.com](mailto:dochyde2020@hotmail.com)] and Ansel Hide (Jay Hyde's family) [ ].

Ansel Hide was arrested in 1790 in Pickins County, NC for horse thievery before he moved to Roane County, TN and then on to Hawesville Kentucky. Ezekiel Hide migrated and is found in the 1800 NC Census in Hopkinsville Kentucky and married there. Joseph Hide move to Jackson Tennessee and later moved on to Indiana.

In an effort to encourage settlers to move west into the new territory of Tennessee, in 1787 North Carolina ordered a road to be cut called **Avery's Trace Road** to lead settlers into the Cumberland Settlements — from the south end of Clinch mountain in East Tennessee to French Lick (Nashville, TN). The trail was laid out along trails which the Cherokee Indians had long made and frequently used as war paths, following passages of buffalo. It led from "**Fort Southwest Point**" at **Kingston, Tennessee, where Hiram Hides Settled (Jay and Dan Hyde's family)** to Fort Nashborough.

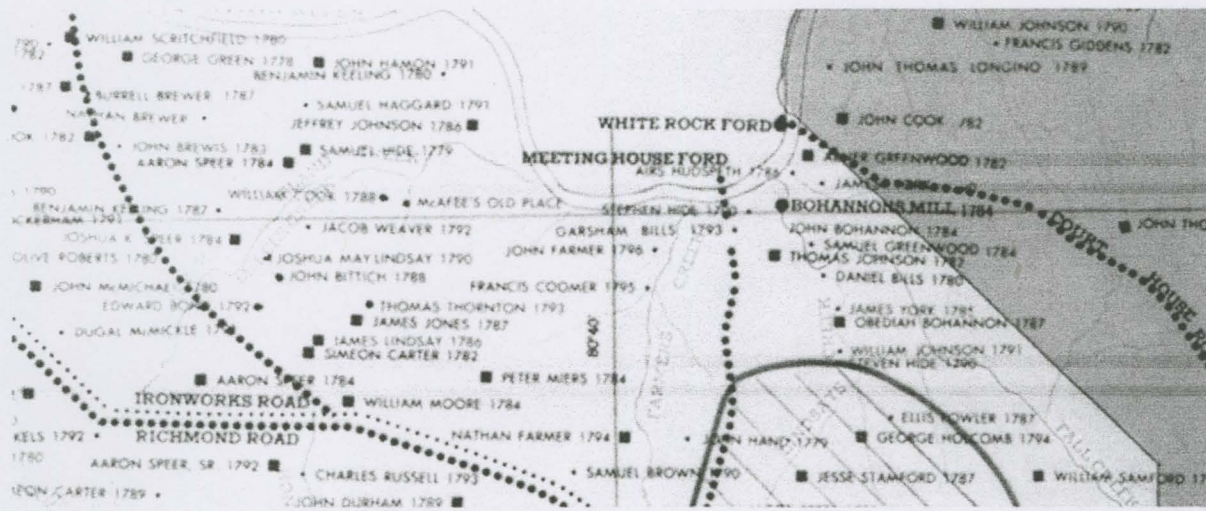
Hiram Hide (DanHyde's family) [[danhyde53@att.net](mailto:danhyde53@att.net)] moved to Kingston Tennessee where many Hides flourished for 20 years before the land became exhausted and then moved on to Webster County Missouri.

Early colonial farmers did not know about the importance of crop rotation and as they continued poor farming practices that used up nutrients in the soil they exhausted the land. Because of lack of capital and know-how in use of fertilizer and crop rotation a diminished return on crops made it difficult to survive with large families.

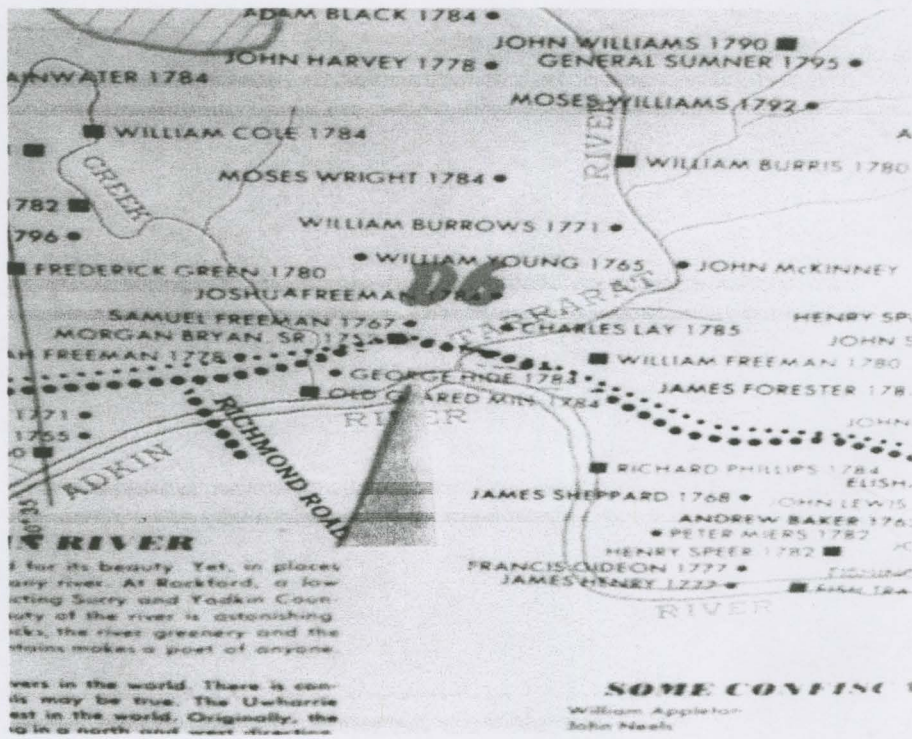
Samuel Hyde and George Hide were found together on same deed 1774 on a Pinions Creek of Yadkin River in Surry County, NC. In 1780 Samuel Hide added 150 acres on a grant on both sides of Yadkin River.

In 1785 James Hide and Stephen Hide (Steve Hyde's family) [[hydeaway6@bellsouth.net](mailto:hydeaway6@bellsouth.net)] are mentioned on same deed on Fall Creek which is on the South side of the Yadkin River Bend. Stephen is listed in 1790 NC Census in Surry County (Stephen and 6 boys , 4 of the boys older than 16 and 2 of the boys under 16 and 5 females, Total =8) I suspect these are some our DNA forefathers we are looking for. James was not listed in the 1790 census in NC or SC so he was probable still in this household and was one of the 4 boys as he is a witness of a deed with Stephen Hide in 1790 for 200 acres on Fall Creek on the Yadkin River.

George Hide lived north of Stephen on Yadkin River.

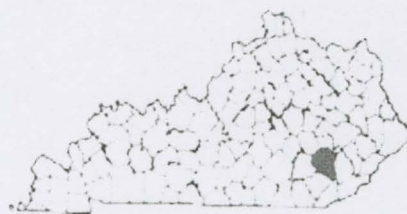


In 1786 Jesse Hide and in 1788 George Hide migrated from Surry County, NC to Wilkes County Georgia. George Hide (Diane Parkin's family) died shortly thereafter in 1790. In 1805 Jesse Hide migrated to Clay County Kentucky and lived in Laurel County Kentucky until his death around 1839.

Around 1789 to 1790 Stephen Hide (Steve Hyde's family) , James Hide, Noel Hide, John Hide, Isaiah Hide, Charles Hide migrated to South Carolina.

James Hide is in NC Census in 1790 1 male older than 16. He is then found the next year in 1791 in Greenville South Carolina on Quarts Branch of Reedy River. He buys and sells land on the Reedy River about very year for about 20 years between 1791 to 1811. Other Hides mentioned in his deeds were John Hide, Stephen Hide, Noel Hide, and Isaiah Hide.



There are 2 John Hides in 1810 Greenville SC Census one with 7 in his family and the other with 4 in his family. Comfort Hide in in the 1790 Greenville SC Census alone and in the 1810 Spartanburg SC Census with 3 in his family.

Isaiah Hide was living in Greenville SC on March 29, 1805 and recorded the sale of the 200 acres of Fall Creek in Surry County NC. This land belonged to Stephen Hide, which means if

Isaiah Hide is selling the Fall Creek land then Stephen Hide is dead and we can place Stephens death around 1804. Isaiah inherited the land so he could have been the oldest son.

Most of our Hides were farmers in North Carolina and after 40 years eventually gave up on their exhausted lands and moved to South Carolina, some to Tennessee and Kentucky where they could find cheaper, more fertile land to farm. Another 20 years and the land became exhausted in SC and Tennessee and with all the talk of cheaper and more productive land most the Hides moved on seeking a better life and a possibility to own more land for each their families. The Hide's migration out of South Carolina flowed into Georgia, Alabama, and Mississippi. The Roan County TN Hides migrated to Webster County, Missouri. Land lotteries of Indian lands enticed many Hides to move to Georgia.

Western Carolina settlers felled the forests and built homes on the fertile and pleasant lands lying along the countless streams which watered the country. The Indians who lived beyond the mountains were a constant source of alarm. The woods teemed with game. As is the case in all frontier communities, the sterner and stronger qualities of men predominated. Our family was probable Scotch-Irish and they have ever been known as a religious, brave, and liberty-loving people. These settlers located in communities to themselves, forming respectively Scotch-Irish and German communities, scattered throughout the wilderness, and maintaining their own customs, speech, and characteristics. These people were prolific, there being from five to ten children in each family. The settlers raised horses, cows, hogs, and sheep, and planted Indian corn. They made butter and cheese and had "made good success with indigo." There were no stock-laws in those days.

When the Hides left the Carolina's they took major migration routes and wagon trails. Austin Hide (Leah Latimore's family [[ldlat7@gmail.com](mailto:ldlat7@gmail.com)] and (Brenda Sullivan's family [[funegran@yahoo.com](mailto:funegran@yahoo.com)] and William A. Hide (Matt Simmons' family) [[jandmsimmons@gmail.com](mailto:jandmsimmons@gmail.com)] took the route from South Carolina to North Georgia into Hall County, Georgia and then to Fayette County, Alabama.

Colonial estate laws were called laws of primogeniture and entail and were such that with large families the children other than the first born did not inherit the fathers land. If a male died in 1760 and not left a will, the laws primogeniture would have been implemented. Primogeniture is the right, by law or custom, of the firstborn son to inherit the family estate. Under primogeniture, the eldest son would have inherited all of his father's estate. The younger sons would get nothing.

Entail limited the inheritance of property to a specified succession of heirs. Under entail, only male descendent could inherit estates. The younger offspring would have to find other land for taking by squatting or they could buy land at cheap rates or serve in the military to get a land grant. Whether cheap or free, all this land was on a frontier that was further west.

The laws of primogeniture and entail would be replaced with estate rules in the 1780's which allocated the land more evenly divided with 1/3 to the wife and the remainder to be divided equally among the sons, if the father died intestate or without a will.

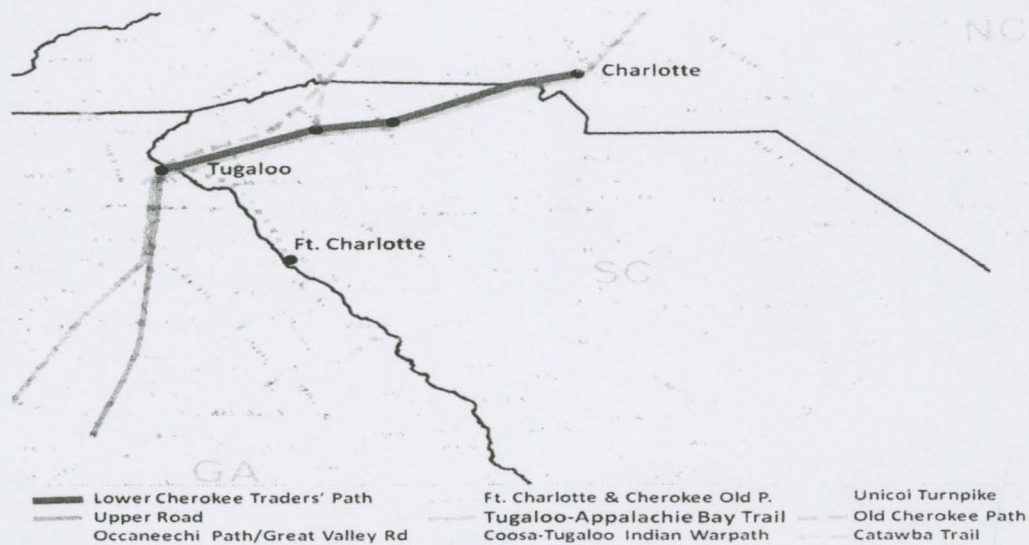
The division of an estate was a major factor in why male sons migrated west. Imagine that if our Hide ancestor had 200 acres and five sons in 1780 (a likely number at that time as Stephen Hide had 6 sons in 1790 NC Census). Each son would get an equal 40 acres, assuming the mother had died. Next imagine that each of these sons had five more sons. In the third

generation, about the year 1820, each son would have only 8 acres - barely enough to subsist on and certainly not enough to become prosperous. More land to the west was the only answer.

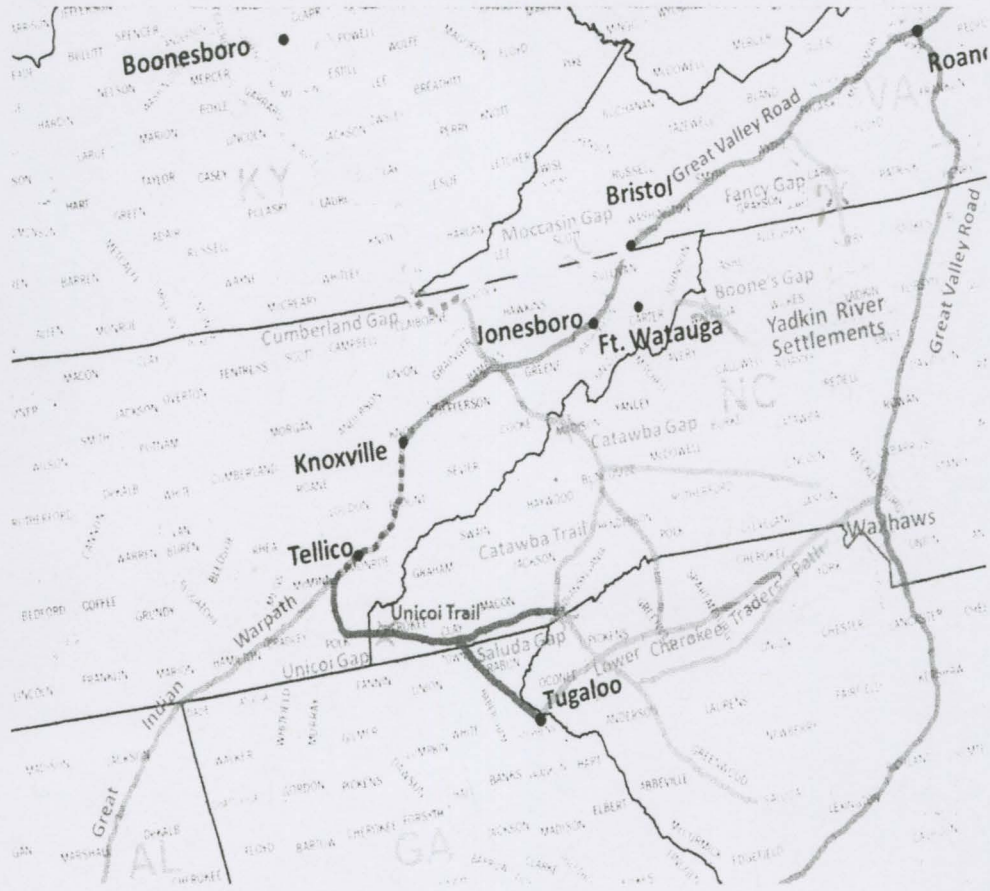
During the first two decades of the nineteenth century, Americans moved west in such great numbers in the westward movement that historians refer to that mass movement as the "Great Migration." In 1800 there were only two states west of the Appalachians — Kentucky and Tennessee. In 1820 there were eight: Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, Louisiana, Illinois, Indiana, Mississippi, and Alabama. The population of these eight western states had grown from 386,000 persons in 1800 to 2,216,000 in 1820. Mississippi and Alabama where many of our Hides migrate were a product of the Great Migration.

Until the census of 1850, there was no data collected to show the origin of birth. When analyzed the migration out of South Carolina has been estimated to be nearly half of all South Carolinians born after 1800. Thirty percent of North Carolina's native-born population migrated out of NC which amounted to more than four hundred thousand persons who were living outside of NC in 1850. 90% of our Hides migrated during this westward movement.

#### Migration Paths from NC to SC to Georgia.

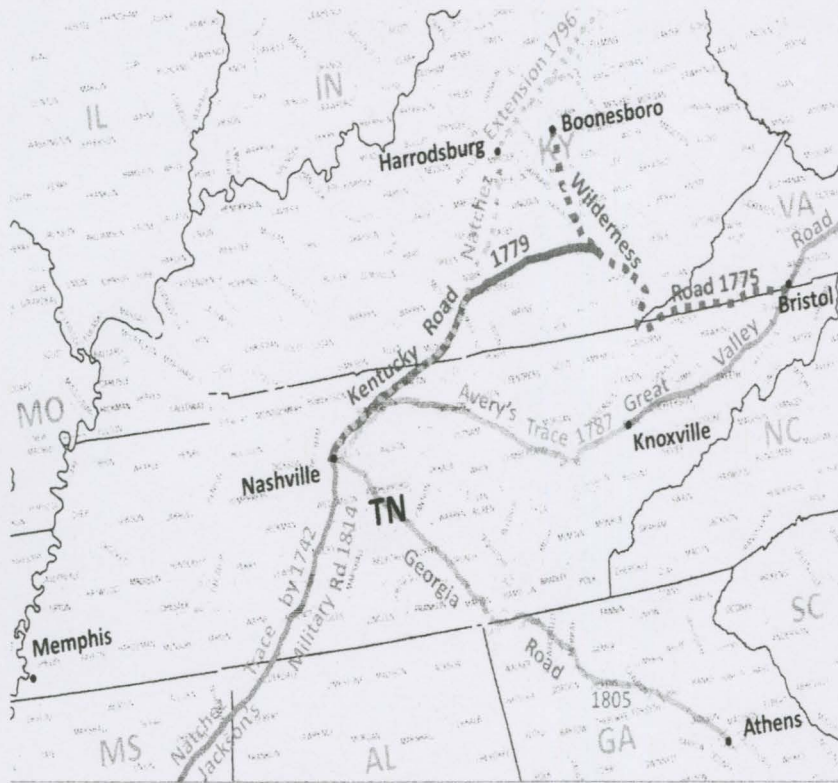


On this map find the Yadkin River Settlement where Hide Farms were in 1750'-1780's.
