SHE NEVER FORGOT THAT THE HAYNES CAME AND TOOK HER SLAVES BACK WHEN STEPHEN DIED BUT SHE KEPT THE OLD HOME PLACE AND AS FAR AS I CAN FIND OUT, IT STAYED IN THE FAMILY UNTIL 1937.

SARAH AND DANIAL HAD ONE SON, ISREAL HE MARRIED SUSAN MILLIE HILL, ISREAL, B. 1855, D. 1909 SUSAN MILLIE B. 1852 D. 1932, M. 1878. HER MOTHER WAS A BEASON. ALSO THEY HAD A DAUGHTER LAURA STULTZ. HER STORY AND FAMILY FOLLOWS:



SARAH WAS OVER 40 WHEN HE WAS BORN. MY MOTHER WAS 40 WHEN I WAS BORN. NOW ADAYS DAYS THAT IS NOT UNUSUAL BUT BACK THEN IT WAS.

AT THIS TIME I MUST REPORT THAT MRS IREATHA WALLS TUCKER OF PINE HILL CHURCH, SHOULD BE HONORED FOR HAVING SUCH A GREAT MEMORY. SHE ALSO HAS A SON INTERESTED IN HISTORY TOO SO MAYBE HE WILL CARRY ON FOR HER.

THESE NAMES ARE IN THE RECORDS OF PINE HILL CHURCH WHERE SEVERAL OF OUR FAMILY IS BURIED.

OUR FAMILY LIVED NEXT DOOR TO THE WALLS FAMILY LONG BEFORE THE CHURCH WAS BUILT. SOME OF OUR FAMILY MARRIED SOME OF THE WALLS BUT NO RECORD HAS BEEN FOUND AS OF THIS DATE.

THE REST OF THE STOLTS FAMILY WAS BURIED ON THE HOME PLACE BEHIND THE HOUSE ON A HILL. WE KNOW THAT ISREAL WAS BURIED THERE, BUT THERE IS NOT ANY MARKERS, JUST STONES.

IT WAS ALWAYS SAID THAT GRANPA ISREAL ALWAYS WORKED HIS CHILDREN VERY HARD AND WHIPPED THE BOYS WITH A BLACK SNAKE WHIP. I REMEBER MOM SAYING SOMETHING TO THIS EFFECT. A NOTED HISTORIAN HERE IN TN REPORTED THAT AFTER THE CIVIL WAR, THE FAMILIES MADE THE CHILDREN TAKE THE PLACE OF THE SLAVES. I DO KNOW THAT MY MOM RAN AWAY FROM HOME WHEN SHE WAS 21 BECAUSE OF THE HARD WORK.

PINE HILL CHURCH RECORDS SHOW SAVANNAH STULTZ BELONGED TO THE CHURCH FROM 1912 TO 1917.

FLORA WAS LISTED FOR SEVERAL YEARS

LIZZIE MOVED HER RECORD TO THE BAPTIST IN 1904. CHARLIE IS LISTED AS A MEMBER.

ONE OF THE OLD TALES THAT IRETHA TUCKER CAN REMEBER IS ABOUT GRANDFATHER ISREAL STOLTZ. HE ALWAYS TOLD ALL THE CHILDREN THAT WHEN HE DIED HE WANTED TO BE BURIED ON THE HILL WITH THE REST OF THE FAMILY BURIED THERE AND HE WAS GOING TO COME BACK AND HAUNT THEM ALL. MOST PEOPLE BELEIVED HIM AND PEOPLE DID NOT GO BACK THERE. AFTER GRANDMA STOLTZ DEATH IN 1932 NO ONE EVER LIVED IN THE HOUSE AND IT WAS A VERY BIG HOUSE. PEOPLE TOLD THAT YOU COULD SEE HIM WALKING AROUND.

ONE OF GRANMAS CLOSEST NEIGHBORS WAS VERY ILL AND COULD NOT NURSE HER BABY AND GRANDMA HAD A BABY, ALSO ONE OF THE OTHER NEIGHBORS TOO SO THAT WAY THEY SHARED THE BREAST MILK AND KEPT THE BABY ALIVE. THE MOTHER WAS ALICE WALLS AND THE BABY WAS JOSEPHINE WALLS. THEY LIVED NEAR GRANDMA. COON WALLS HOME BORDERED ON GRANDMAS LAND.

SPEAKING OF THE OLD HOME PLACE, THEY SPREAD WHITE SAND (WHICH THERE IS PLENTY OF IN THAT AREA) ON THE FLOORS TO MAKE THEM SHINE. I REMEBER TRACKING IN SAND ON GRANDMAS FLOORS THO, AND IT WAS NOT APPRECIATED.

HAVE FOUND OUT MY MOM HAS SOME NAMESAKES; EDNA ADELINE WALLS TILLY AND HER DAUGHTER, ADELINE.

I REMEMBER

THESE ARE THE THINGS MY MOTHER TRIED TO TEACH ME.

SHE ALWAYS SAID A WHISTLING WOMAN AND A CROWING HEN ALWAYS COMES TO SOME BAD END. THIS WAS WHAT SHE ALWAYS HEARD HER MOTHER SAY. A CROWING HEN WAS ALWAYS PUT IN A POT TO MAKE DUMPLINGS.

MOM ALSO MADE HER OWN LYE SOAP. SHE MADE THE LYE IN THE BACK YARD. MADE A SMALL WOODEN HOPPER WITH SCREEN IN THE BOTTOM OF IT. YOU PUT ASHES IN THE TOP PART OF IT AND POURED A GALLON OF WATER OVER THEM. YOU PUT MORE ASHES IN EACH DAY AND POURED THE SAME WATER OVER IT EACH DAY. DO THIS UNTIL IT WOULD DISSOLVE A HAIR. YOU HAD TO HAVE ALL ASHES FROM HICKORY AND OAK TREES.

DAD THOUGHT IT WAS FOOLISH BUT MY MOTHER COULD HAVE LIVED ON THAT FARM (160 ROLLING ACRES) IF SHE HAD TO. IT MUST HAVE BEEN VERY HARD TO GET TO A TOWN WHEN SHE WAS GROWING UP. HARD WORK WAS ALL SHE KNEW. AND IT WAS HARD TO GET ME TO DO SOMETHING UNLESS I WANTED TO. IF I DID NOT HAVE ANYTHING TO DO SHE WOULD SEND ME TO A KNOLL ABOUT A MILE FROM THE HOUSE TO GATHER PINE KNOTS TO START THE FIRES. I ALSO HELPED MY MOTHER-IN-LAW MAKE SOAP TOO. WE PUT BONES AND FAT OF ANY KIND, SKINS AND WHATEVER IN THE LYE WATER. I ALWAYS GOT BURNED WITH THE LYE WATER. NO WONDER IT GOT US CLEAN. THIS WAS DURING THE GREAT DEPRESSION OF THE 1930'S. IF WE HAVE ANOTHER SUCH TIME, HOW WILL THE YOUNG PEOPLE OF TODAY GET BY?

OUR OWN COUGH MEDICINE WAS MADE AT HOME. MIX HONEY, CHERRY BARK BOILED AND STRAINED, MULLION LEAVES BOILED AND STRAINED AND LEMONS IF AVAILABLE. IT WAS VERY GOOD, AS DAD HAD DOUBLE PNEUMONIA IN 1937 AND MOM PULLED HIM THRU IT.

SHE MADE DYE OUT OF WALNUT AND BUTTERNUTS. WE DYED BRAIDED RUGS WITH IT. IN THE PARLOR SHE HAD A LARGE BRAIDED RUG (HANDMADE) AND FOR PADDING SHE PUT STRAW UNDER IT.

GRANPA ISREAL HAD TO FARM WITH OXEN. I EXPECT ALL THE HORSES WENT TO THE CIVIL WAR. BUT THEY WERE SO PROUD WHEN THEY GOT A TEAM OF MULES.

HOW MANY CAN REMEMBER THE HOUSE THAT GRANMA LIVED IN? IT WAS LARGE FOR THAT DAY AND TIME. TWO LARGE ROOMS ON THE GROUND FLOOR WITH TWO ABOVE THEM A LARGE DOGTROT TO THE KITCHEN AND A LOFT ABOVE THE KITCHEN. IT WAS ALWAYS SCRUBBED WHITE WITH LYE WATER. THE FEATHER BEDS WERE PILED HIGH AND HAD HANDMADE CHENILLE SPREADS ON THEM. I STILL HAVE ONE BUT IT IS YELLOW WITH AGE.

WE DRIED MUCH OF OUR FOOD. LEATHER BRITCHES. I HATED THEM. BUT WHAT I WOULD GIVE FOR A REAL FRIED APPLE PIE MADE FROM DRIED APPLES. WE LIVED IN DAYTON, OHIO FOR ELEVEN YEARS (M0M SAID NOTHING WAS FIT TO EAT OUT OF A STORE). SHE STILL HAD A LARGE GARDEN IN TOWN.

SHE ALWAYS MADE HOME MADE WINE. SOAKED HER FRUITCAKES FOR XMAS WITH IT FOR 6 WEEKS. I SWEAR IT HAD A KICK IN THOSE CAKES.

THEY ALSO COOKED BOSSUM IN THE OLD DAYS MOM TRADED A BOUND OF

THEY ALSO COOKED POSSUM IN THE OLD DAYS. MOM TRADED A POUND OF BUTTER FOR ONE AND SKINNED IT HERSELF. BOILED IT ALL MORNING THEN BAKED IT WITH SWEET POTATOES. I ATE SEVERAL BITES, IT WAS GOOD BUT DAD LOOKED AT ME AND SAID "REMEMBER THOSE EARS AND TAIL". I COULDN'T EAT ANY MORE. WHEN MOM GOT FULL, SHE THREW THE REST OUT FOR THE DOG AND HE WOULD NOT EAT IT EITHER. DAD NEVER LET HER FORGET THAT MEAL.

I HAVE BEEN TOLD ON GOOD AUTHORITY THAT THE HOUSE THAT GRANMA LIVED IN WAS THE ONE THAT SARAH AND STEVEN HAYES LIVED IN.

THE FOLLOWING IS A LIST OF FACTS THAT ARE VERY INTERESTING.

THE FIRST SETTLEMENT IN WACHOVIA (NOW WINSTON-SALEM) WAS IN 1753. 15 MEN WERE PICKED IN PA. AND SENT THERE TO SETTLE THE COUNTRY. THEY SHELTERED IN A DESERTED FUR TRADERS CABIN AND THE WOLVES KEPT THEM AWAKE. THESE MEN WERE ALL MORAVIANS.

SOME DATES OF THE ARRIVAL OF OUR ANCETORS IN AMERICA AND MIGRATION TO PARTS THEREOF.

REV, SIMON PETER IN 1738. THESE DATES DON'T FIT BUT HE COULD HAVE BEEN IN PA. UNTILL A LATER DATE AS HE WAS NOT ONE OF THE FIRST 15MEN WHO CAME TO NC.

REV. SAMUEL STOLTZ CAME IN 1769. HE WAS A WELL KNOWN FOR HIS SINGING, ALSO FOR HIS TRADE OF SURVEYOR, HE PREACHED IN THE MORAVIAN CHURCH FOR 40 YEARS. AND HE WAS A RULER IN THE MORAVIAN COURT. THEY WERE VERY STRICT. HE DID OWN SLAVES, MARRIED SARAH FETTER.

BETWEEN THE YEARS 1724 AND 1764, 26 STOLTZ'S LANDED IN PA. THEY ALL CAME FROM THE SAME AREA IN GERMANY.

A MR.SPAINHOUR WAS ONE OF THE FIRST15 MEN. HE WAS FROM SWITZERLAND. THE FOLLOWING PEOPLE PAID TAXES IN 1782, JACOB STOLTZ, CASPER STOLTZ, PHILIP AND HENRY. IT IS STRONGLY SUSPECTED THAT THEY WERE BROTHERS, NO PROOF WAS FOUND.

SAVANNAH STOLTZ QUIT THE MORAVAINS CHURCH IN THE YEAR 1812. WAS OUR AUNT SAVANNAH NAMED AFTER HER?

CASPER STOLTZ SR. HAD TO GIVE UP THE MORAVIAN CHURCH BECAUSE OF POVERTY. MAYBE BECAUSE HE WAS BLIND FOR 17 YEARS BEFORE HE DIED AT 80 YEARS OF AGE. MANY OF THE STOLTZ FAMILY WENT TO OH AND IN DURING THE 1800'S. THEY DID NOT LIKE THE HOT WEATHER IN NC THEY TRYED TO RAISE WHEAT FOR BREAD AND THE FIRST FEW YEARS WERE VERY HARD BECAUSE THEY DID NOT HAVE ENOUGH BREAD. THE GERMANS TO THIS VERY DAY SAY THAT CORN IS HOG FEED. THEY DO NOT SERVE IT ON THE TABLE. WHEN I WAS IN GERMANY, IF THE ARMY BASE HAD A BIG COOK OUT, THEY ALWAYS SERVED CORN-ON-COB. AND MANY GERMANS ALWAYS CAME TO PIG OUT ON THE CORN.

FOUND IN NC ARCHIVES. HENRY STULTZ WAS GIVEN A GRANT OF 600 ACRES AND PHILIP STULTZ WAS GIVEN A GRANT OF 800.

DECLARATION OF ANNA MARGARETHE STULTZ, STOKES CO, NC, JAN 5,1839. WIDOW OF CASPER STULTZ. DECEASED A PENSIONER OF THE U.S. SHE IS RESPONDING TO A WAR DEPT. DENIAL BASED ON HER HUSBANDS FAILURE TO DECLARE SERVICE AFTER THEIR MARRIAGE. SHE DECLARES THAT SHORTLY AFTER THIER MARRIAGE, MAJOR HENRY SMITH ORDERED OUT A COMPANY OF MEN TO GO AFTER A "SET OF TORIES" INTO THE DOUTHAL SETTLEMENTS NEAR THE MOUTH OF MUDDY CREEK, WHERE IT EMPTYS INTO THE YADKIN RIVER. WHEN CASPER RETURNED IN ABOUT 10 DAYS, HE TOLD HER THE TORIES HAD FLED AND CROSSED THE RIVER INTO THE FORKS OF THE YADKIN INTO ROWAN CO.

SHE BELEIVES HE ALSO PERFORMED A SMALL TOUR IN JAN 1781 AS ONE OF THE SOLDIERS GUARDING THE POWDER WAGONS FROM SALEM TO VA. HENRY CO. HE WAS GONE 3 WEEKS. SHE THINKS OTHERS ALONG THAT ROUTE WERE ONE OF THE BANNERS, JOSEPH HOUSER AND HER BROTHER GEORGE HOUSER, DECEASED.

NEIGHBORHOOD NEAR THE YADKIN RIVER AND THE MOUTH OF MUDDY CREEK. THERE WE LOADED FIVE OR SIX WAGONS WITH CORN IN A FIELD AND RETURNED TO THE OLD TOWN FOR THE USE OF THE ARMY. STULTZ WENT AS ONE OF THE GUARDS COMMANDED BY LIEUTENANT JONES, TWENT YFOUR DAYS TO BETHANIA. HE RETURNED WITH JOSEPH HOUSER.

DEC 11,1753 ACCORDING TO THE FAMILY BIBLE NOW IN POSSESSION OF HIS BROTHER-IN-LAW SAMUAL STRUPE AS A BOY HE ACCOMPNIED HIS PARENTS WHO MOVED TO SURRY CO. NOW STOKES.

IN FEB, 1775, CASPER VOLUNTEERED IN THE SURRY MILITIA FOR THREE MONTHS UNDER CAPT. HENRY SMITH IN THE COMMAND OF COL MARTIN ARMSTRONG HE MARCHED TO FAYETTEVILLE, THEN CALLED CROSS CREEK WHERE THEY WERE JOINED BY SEVERAL OTHER COMPANIES WHO WERE UNDER THE COMMAND OF COL. ALEXANDER MARTIN, COLONEL

ARMSTRONG OF THE SURRY MILITIA, NOT HAVE GONE INTO SERVICE IN THE EXPEDITION, THE OBJECT OF THIS MARCH WAS TO SUPRESS THE TORIES AND SCOTCH WHO HAD JOINED THE ENEMY IN THAT PART OF THE STATE, AFTER ABOUT 2 MONTHS, HE AND THE REST OF THE TROOPS WERE DISCHARGED.

IN 1776 HE AGAIN ENTERED THE MILITIA SERVICE AS A VOLUNTEER FOR A TOUR OF 6 MONTHS UNDER CAPT HENRY SMITH IN COL JOSEPH WILLIAMS REGIMENT IN THE BRIGADE UNDER GEN. CRISSMAN? THEY MARCHED INTO THE CHEROKEE NATION AND DESTROYED THE TOWN OF CHILHOWIE, THEY WERE HOSTILE INDIANS. THE INDIANS RETIRED BEFORE THE TROOPS. THE FORCE WAS DISCHARGED AFTER THE DESTRUCTION OF THE TOWN.

IN 1777 AND 1778 HE AND ABOUT 50 OTHERS WERE PRESSED INTO SERVICE UNDER CAPT PLEASANT HENDERSON AS GUARD TO THE COMMISSIONERS RUNNING THE LINE BETWEEN NC AND KY OR VA. UNDER COL JOSEPH WILLIAMS AND RICHARD HENERESON

IN THIS EXPEDITION STULTZ OPERATED A WAGON CONVEYING BAGGAGE AND PROVISIONS FOR THE COMMISSIONERS AND TROOPS. THE GUARD WAS NECCESSARY OWING TO THE HOSTILE CHARACTER OF THE INDIANS. HE WENT AS FAR AS CARTERS VALLEY IN WHAT IS NOW TN. WHERE OWING TO THE EXTREME ROUGHNESS OF THE COUNTRY HE WAS UNABLE TO PROCEED FURTHER WITH THE WAGON. HE WAS DISCHARGED THEN AND SENT HOME.

THEY SHELTERED IN A DESERTED HUNTERS CABIN THEIR FIRST NITE. WOLVES KEPT THEM AWAKE FOR SEVERAL NITES. ALL THESE MEN WERE TRAINED IN DIFFERENT TRADES. 3 OF THESE MEN RETURNED TO PA. WITH NEWS OF WHAT THEY FOUND. THEN THAT STARTED THE MIGRATION TO NC ONE OF THESE MEN WAS A SPAINHOUR. THE COLLINS FAMILIES CAME EARLY ON. ALSO,THE SOUTHERN FAMILY. BUT I THINK FROM ALL THE MAIN, RECORDS I HAVE SEARCHED, THAT THE STOLTZ (STULTZ) MEN WERE NEXT AFTER THE 15. SPAINHOUR WAS FROM SWITZERLAND THE REST WERE GERMANS. THEY WERE MORAVIANS. THIS RELIGON IS THE FIRST IN AMERICA TO BELEIVE THAT WOMEN NEEDED AN EDUCATION THEY SAME AS MEN AND THAT WOMAN WERE AS SMART AS MEN.

SIMON PETER STOLTZ ARRIVED IN 1768? REV. SAMUEL STOLTZ CAME IN 1769. HE PREACHED FOR 40 YEARS A GREAT SINGER, SURVEYOR AND A RULER IN THE MORAVIAN COURT. THIS WAS THE ONLY COURT FOR MANY YEARS. HE MARRIED SARAH FETTER.

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THE BEST NC DISHES

OLD TIME COOKIN

CORN FIELD PEAS. GATHER YOUR PEAS BOUT SUNDOWN GOUGE OUT THE PEAS FROM THE HULLS, LIKE GOUGIN OUT A MANS EYE BALLS. RINSE THE PEAS. PARABOIL THEM. THEN FRY SOME STREAKED MIDDLIN MEAT. ADD RAW TERMATERS, A LITTLE BROWN SUGAR. MASH PEAS SOME WITH THE OTHER STUFF. EAT A HEAPIN DISH FULL, GOOD FOR THE SOUL.

ROAST POSSUM. MINUS THE EARS AND TAIL, HA.

POSSUM SHOULD BE CLEANED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AFTER SHOOTING. IT SHOULD BE HUNG FOR 48 HOURS. AND IS THEN READY TO BE SKINED AND COOKED. THE MEAT IS VERY WHITE AND TENDER. EXCESS FAT MAY BE REMOVED, BUT THERE IS NO STRONG FLAVOR OR ODOR IN THE FAT OR MEAT.

YOU NEED; 1 POSSUM 1 CUP BREAD CRUMBS 1 ONION CHOPPED 1 HARD BOILED EGG CHOPPED 1 TABLESPOON FAT OR OIL 1 TEASPOON SALT

BROWN ONION IN FAT. ADD POSSUM LIVER AND COOK UNTIL TENDER. ADD BREADCRUMBS. WORCESTERSHIRE SAUCE (ONE HALF TEASPOON FUL) EGG SALT AND SMALL AMOUNT OF WATER, ONETABLE SPOON FUL, MIX THIS REAL GOOD AND STUFF POSSUM LIKE A HEN. POUR ABOUT A QUART OF WATER IN THE PAN AND COVER FOR AN HOUR THEN ADD SWEET POTATOES AND COOK ANOTHER HOUR OR MORE.

GROUND HOG, THE GOOD WAY.

DRESS HIM OUT LIKE ANY ANIMAL COOK UNTIL SO TENDER THAT IT IS FALLING APART. DRAIN. THEN GRIND ALL THE MEAT THRU AN OLD TIME MEAT GRINDER OR A FOOD BLENDER. TO THIS GROUND MEAT, ADD SALT TO TASTE PEPPER I EGG PUT AT LEAST 1 TABLESPOON OF SAGE. MAKE PATTIES AND FRAME GREASE TILL BROWN. WILL TASTE A LOT LIKE SAUSAGE. RABBIT CAN BE DOWN THE SAME WAY.

BE SURE TO HAVE A LOT OF ROOM DEODERIZER AS THE GROUND HOG SMEALS AWFUL.
