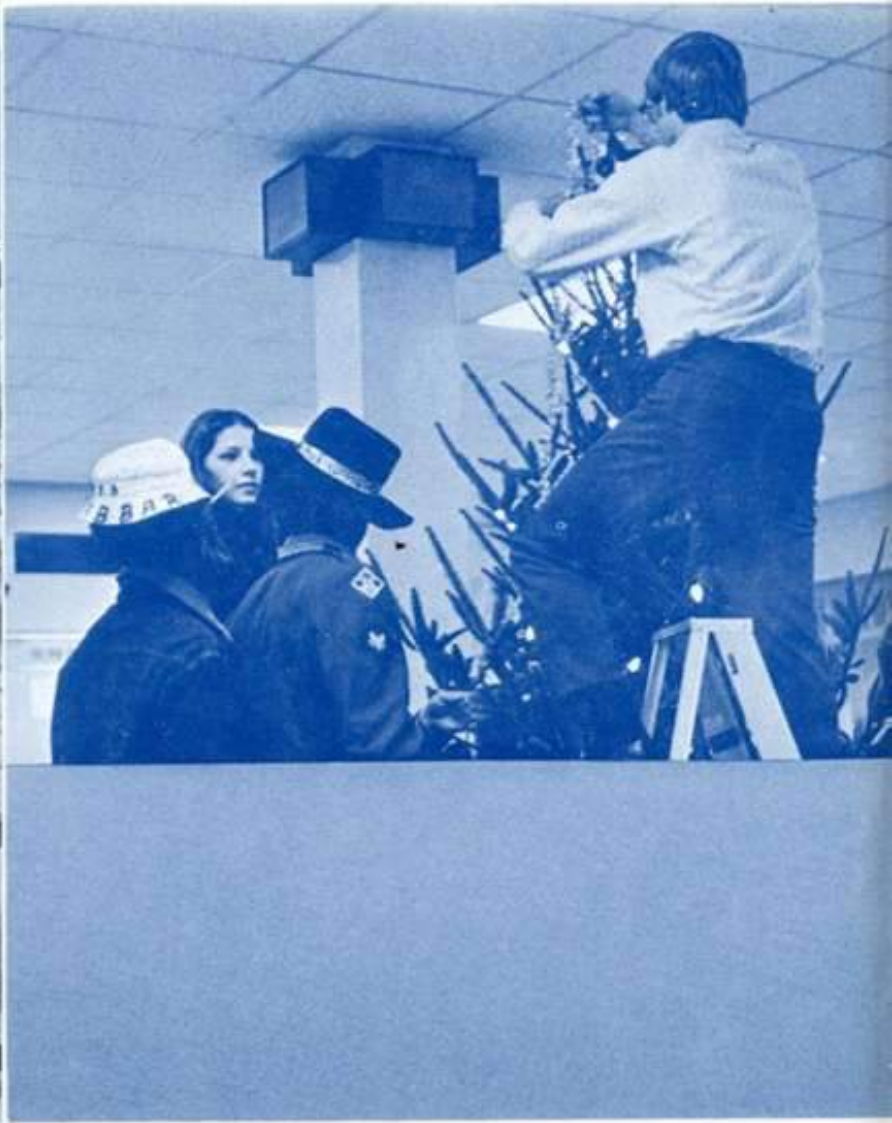

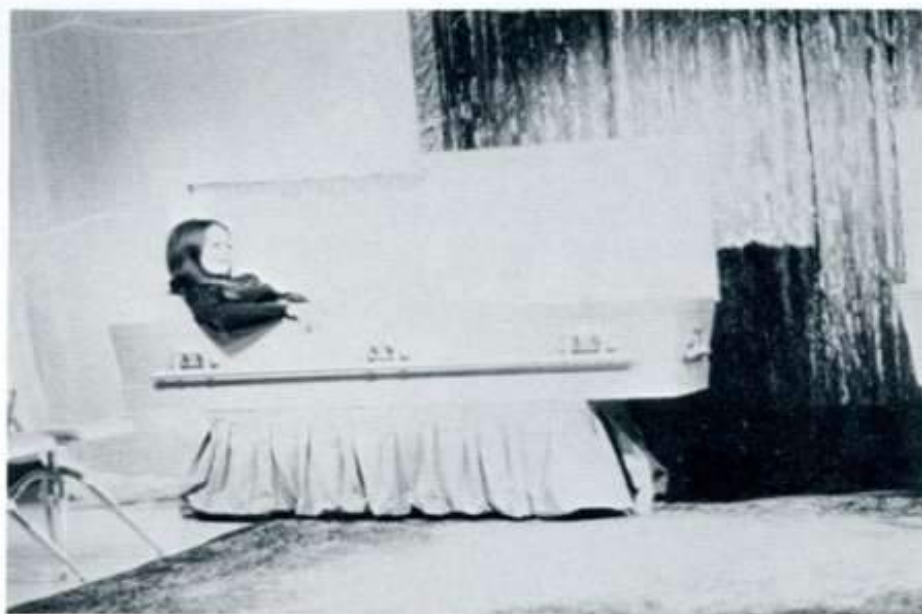

The 1972 version of SCC's Knight basketball team after a slow start, opened the new gymnasium by winning a state NCCCAA championship. After dropping the first three games, the team's freshmen began to show their style as Surry won their next eight against tough opposition before losing to Gaston and Southeastern for the second time. The Knights began the "second season" in the state playoffs at Kinston against Gaston College taking a 61-60 decision. On the following night SCC rolled over Southeastern Community College to win the state crown. The Knights advanced to the Region X NJCAA playoffs at Ferrum (Va.) Junior College. The Knight's season ended with a loss in a close game against Anderson (S.C.) Jr. College, as the Anderson squad won 83-70.

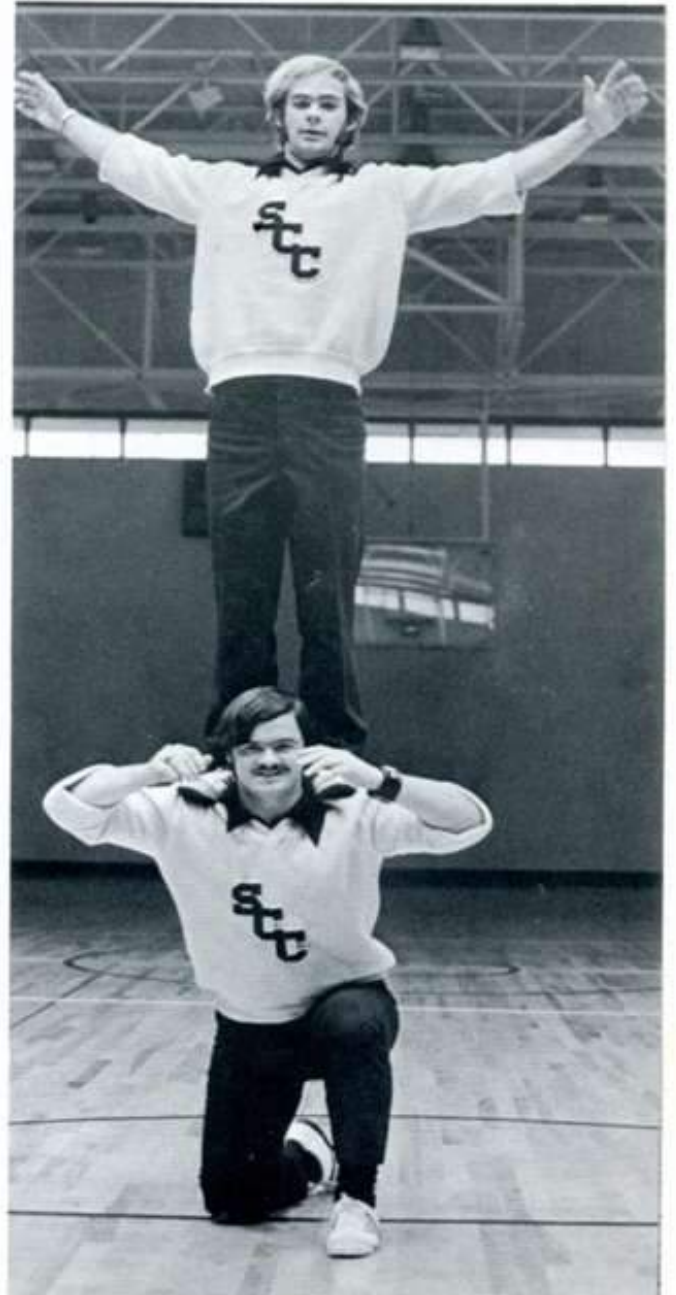

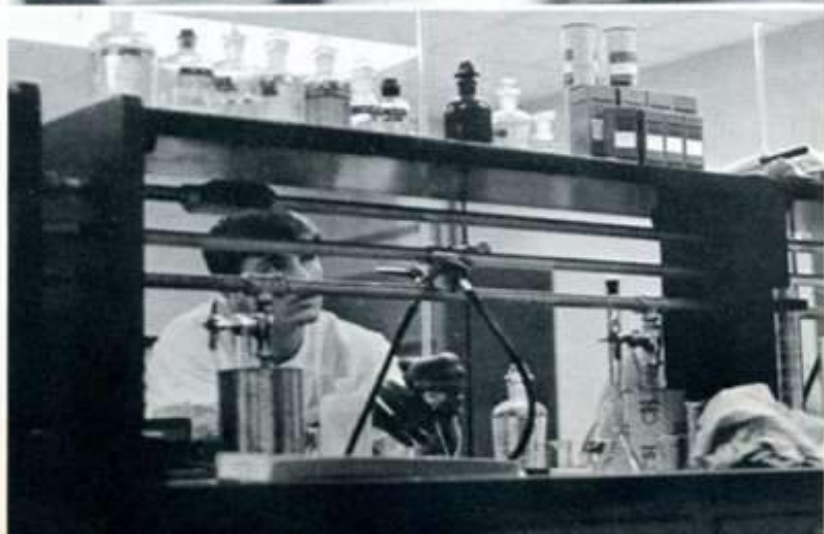
