Introduction

I hope this book can be revised with more information at a later date. Obituaries, newspaper clippings and other articles of interest have been included in this book. The pictures included are of poor quality because of the expense factor.

This book concentrates on the family members of John and Nancy Nichols of Surry County, North Carolina. John Nichols listed Dudley Nichols, aged 95, as his father on a census report. Dudley was born in Pittsylvania County, Virginia about 1784. He married Sarah (Sallie) Parsons at the home of Samuel Parsons March 30, 1818. Sallie wrote he own consent stating she was over the age of 18. p.66. The Reverend Griffith Dickinson married them. Dudley was a veteran of the War of 1812 and received a land grant in Surry County for his service. I have enclosed some of his records that might help if someone is interested in trying to find more information about him. Dudley was probably over one-hundred years of age at his death for he was still living in 1883. It also appears that Joshua Nichols, Jeff Nichols and perhaps Edmund Nichols might have been brothers to John. Joshua married Martha Jane Simpson, sister to Nancy, John's wife. I think all of the Nichol's in the Toast section of Surry County are related.

In January of 1809, John Nicholos (Nichols) and Sally Farthing, daughter of William Farthing were married. Sur. Dudly Farthing married them. In January of 1817, John Nicholos (Nichols) and Lucy Owen, daughter of Christian Slayden were married. In March of 1822, Solomon Nicholos (Nichols) and Suzanna Parsons were married. Sur. Richard Farthing. This information came from the Courthouse in Pittsylvania County, Virginia.

I would like to thank everyone concerned for helping me organize this book, especially my mother and brother, Wallace. I hope you enjoy the information and continue to update it.

John Nichols

John Nichols was born October 14, 1825 and died February 2, 1894. He married Nancy Simpson January 9, 1846. Nancy was born June 9, 1825 and died April 21, 1889. Their marriage was wittnessed by Edmund Nichols. John was probably born in Virginia and lived most of his life in the Toast section of Surry County, N.C. Nancy Simpson was the daughter of Vinson and Dicy Cook Simpson. Her parents lived in the Ash Hill section of Surry County. Her father is buried at the Bryant Cemetery in Ash Hill.

John was elected Constable, Deputy Sheriff and later United States Marshal. He founded the Post Office at White Plains in 1862 and gave White Plains its name. John and Nancy had eleven children. Both are buried in the White Plains Baptist Church Cemetery in Surry County, N.C.

After Nancy died in 1889, John married again February 6, 1890 to Hellen Elizabeth Blackwood. Hellen was born June 11, 1853 and died July 13, 1923. They had two children, one a son, Julius Oscar Nichols, born August 8, 1891 and died June 22, 1892. The next year another son was born and was named Muncie F. Nichols. Muncie was born in 1893 and died April 2, 1948. Muncie married Maggie "May" Gant and they had one daughter Margaret Nichols who is still living in 1982, and one son, Muncy Norwood Nichols, born May 30, 1918, and died November 9, 1918.

Witness to the marriage of John and Hellen was: N.J. Blackwood. Hellens' father was Matt Blackwood and her mothers' name was Eugenia. They were married by J. H. Llewellyn.


First child of John and Nancy Nichols

George Yancy Nichols was born February 11, 1847 and died June 26, 1929. He married January 4, 1880 Nannie Susan Marshall, born June 20, 1852 and died November 22, 1913. N. T. Hutchens married them at his home on the Siloam Road. Banner Simpson, S. E. Marshall and Susan Hutchens were witnesses. Both are buried at the Friends Meeting House in White Plains. N.C.

Nannie was the daughter of J. M. and Christinia Sparger Marshall. George was a merchant in White Plains, an Auctioneer and Teamster in his younger days. He hauled Eng and Chang Bunker, the Siamese Twins, to Winston-Salem for shipment to Pennsylvania after their death. He was the first Postmaster and ran a store in White Plains and later became a farmer. He was a member and leader in the White Plains Friends Church. His residence was east of Jobe Jackson's home and south of the Lane Place. Nannie later became the Post Mistress of White Plains. Nannie attended Guilford College. Their home was occupied by School Teachers.

- Daisy B. Nichols, born October 21, 1883 and died October 12, 1906 and was born in Surry County. She married Will L. Sheppard in 1902. Daisy is buried at the White Plains Friends Cemetery. Will is buried in Greensboro, N.C. Daisy was a housewife and Will was a salesman and merchant in Mount Airy. They had two children:
 - Claude Robert "Bob" Sheppard, born August 9, 1903 and died February 19, 1963. He married Thelma Taylor in 1930. Bob is buried in the White Plains Friends Church Cemetery.
 - (2) Christine Nichols Sheppard, born January 19, 1905 and died October 12, 1905. She is buried at the White Plains Friends Church Cemetery.
- 2. George Stanley Nichols, born in Surry County March 2, 1892, and died October 11, 1970. He is buried at the White Plains Friends Meeting Cemetery. He married Jessie Davis from Dobson, N.C. in 1914. She is the daughter of Warren and Jane Venable. Jessie was born January 14, 1894 and is still living in White Plains as of 1982. George ran the Post Office and general store as did his wife. They had three children: (1) Nan Nichols, born June 13, 1915 and married Edward Lester
 - Nan Nichols, born June 13, 1915 and married Edward Lester Davis, son of John and Olivia Davis. Lester was born April 18, 1914. They have one son, Don Lester Davis, born January 8, 1935. They operate a Drive-In Theater in Mount Airy, N.C. and reside in White Plains.
 - (2) Georgia Nichols, born December 12, 1918, died March 30, 1974. Georgia, like all the family, was born in Surry County, N.C. She married first Tom Wright and had no children. Later she married Howard B. Eddins. They had

Since he was 18 years of age George S. Nichols of White Plains has been selling goods to his neighbors in and around the little hamlet of White Plains. Nichols, a son of George and Nannie Nichols, pioneer merchants of the Plains community, received first-hand information in the business of running a store. Before he was old enough to go in business for himself, he explains, due to the fact that in his young days a person had to be 21 years of age before he could sell on "his own," he was, in a way, general manager of his mother's sotre, which was also operated at White Plains. Nichols went to school at the old White Plains public school and to Guilford College. The first establishment operated for himself was under the trade name of N. S. Nichols and Son. The business continued by that name until his mother's death. Nichols operates a large mercantile establishment and has served the people of his community well. At the present time he is also postmaster of the White Plains office. Concerning the business of keeping the post office, Nichols tells an interesting history of it since its establishment. He says that his grandfather, John Nichols, founded the White Plains post office 78 years ago, and also gave the name "White Plains" to the office. Several years after the establishment of the office, the grandfather became a U.S. marshal, then the office was handed down to Nichols' father, and in turn his mother kept it, until today it is in the hands of the family of the founders again. His mother kept the office for 23 years. Last spring Nichols' store was burned, and now he has erected a 50 by 80 brick structure on the site where the old store stood. He is a member of the White Plains Quaker Church. He is married to the former Miss Jessie Davis and they have three children, Nan Davis Nichols of Winston-Salem, Georgia Nichols of Bessemer City, and Daisy, 10 years old. DER

William "Billy" A. Nichols, born October 20, 1848, died March 27, 1927. Hilly was born in Surry County, N.C. and married January 16, 1870. He married Martha J. Marshall, born December 6, 1847 in J. M. Marshalls' home. Martha died July 28, 1900. Mr. J. W. Jackson married them. Billy was a farmer and owned 110 acres of land and lived just past the Lane Place in White Plains. Both are buried at the White Plains Friends Cemetery. His second marriage was to Sarah Lewis and they had two sons, Brady and Perry Nichols.





J J. Simpson, 75, Surry Native, Dies Saturday









Livengood Family

My Great Grandmother, Regina Livengood's parents were Adam Livengood, born Dec. 23, 1832, died May 26, 1909 and Caroline Scott, born Jan. 12, 1835, died May 21, 1908. Both are buried at the White Plains Baptist Church. They lived in the Toast section of Surry County, N.C.


