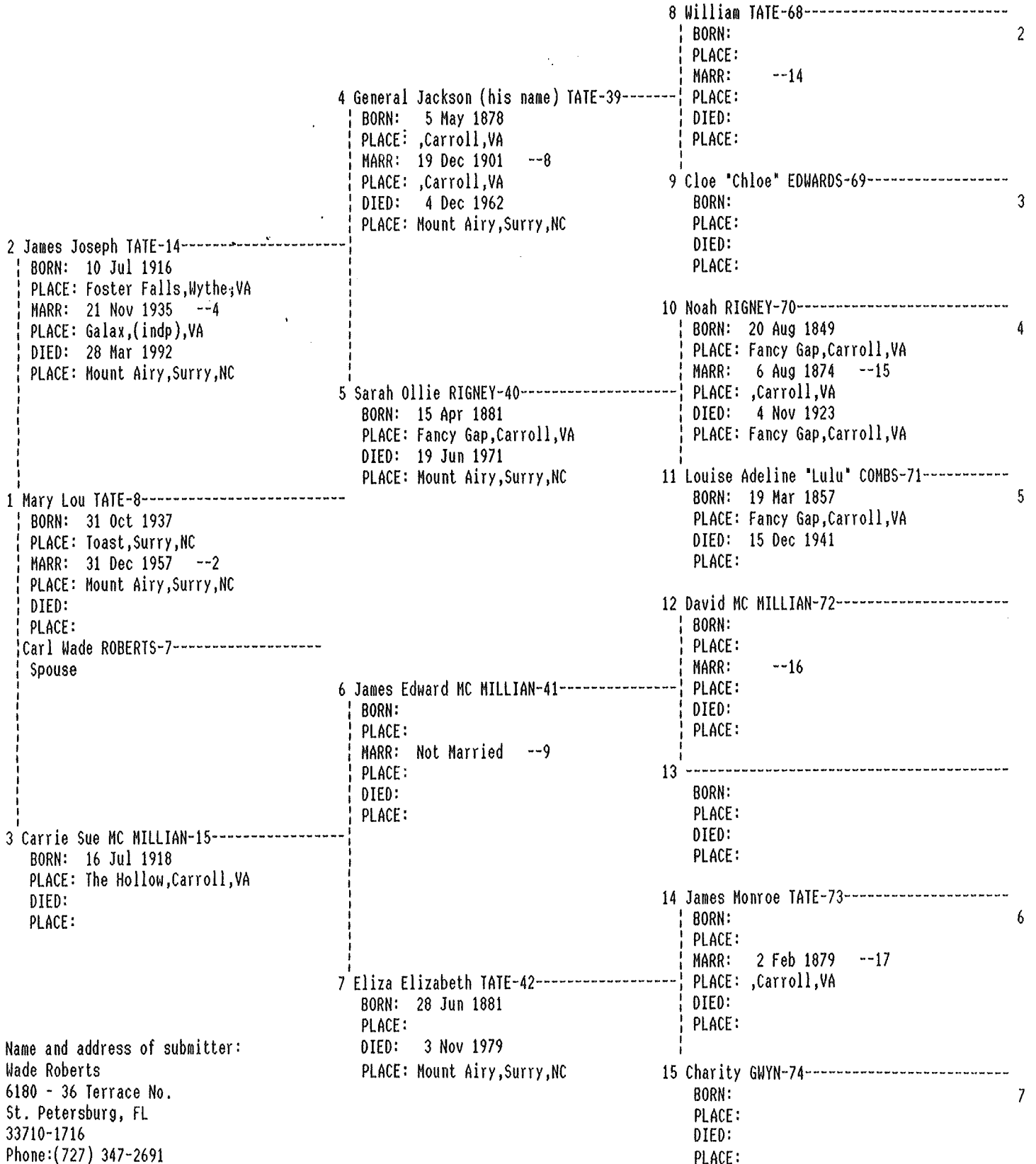


PEDIGREE CHART

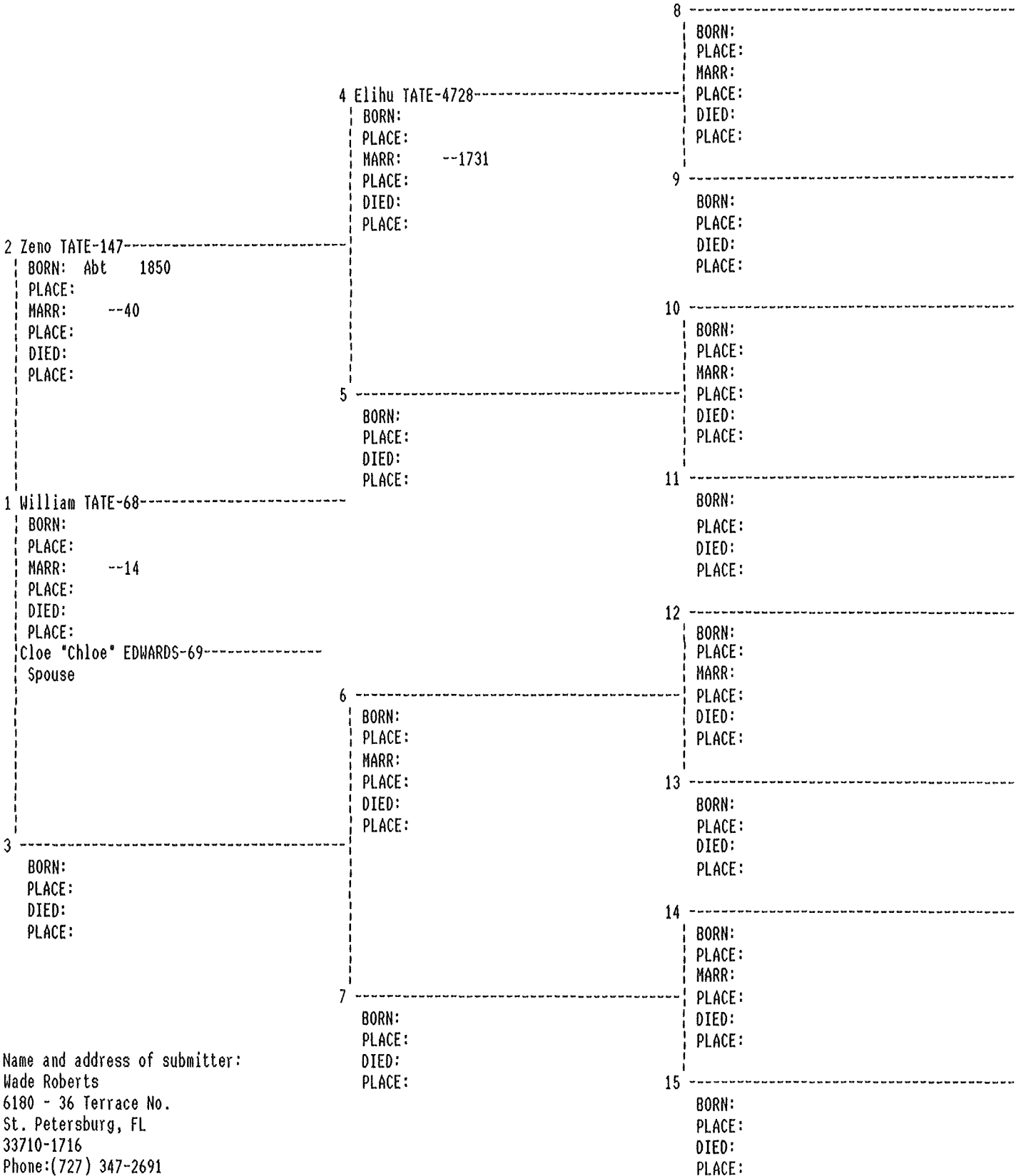


PEDIGREE CHART

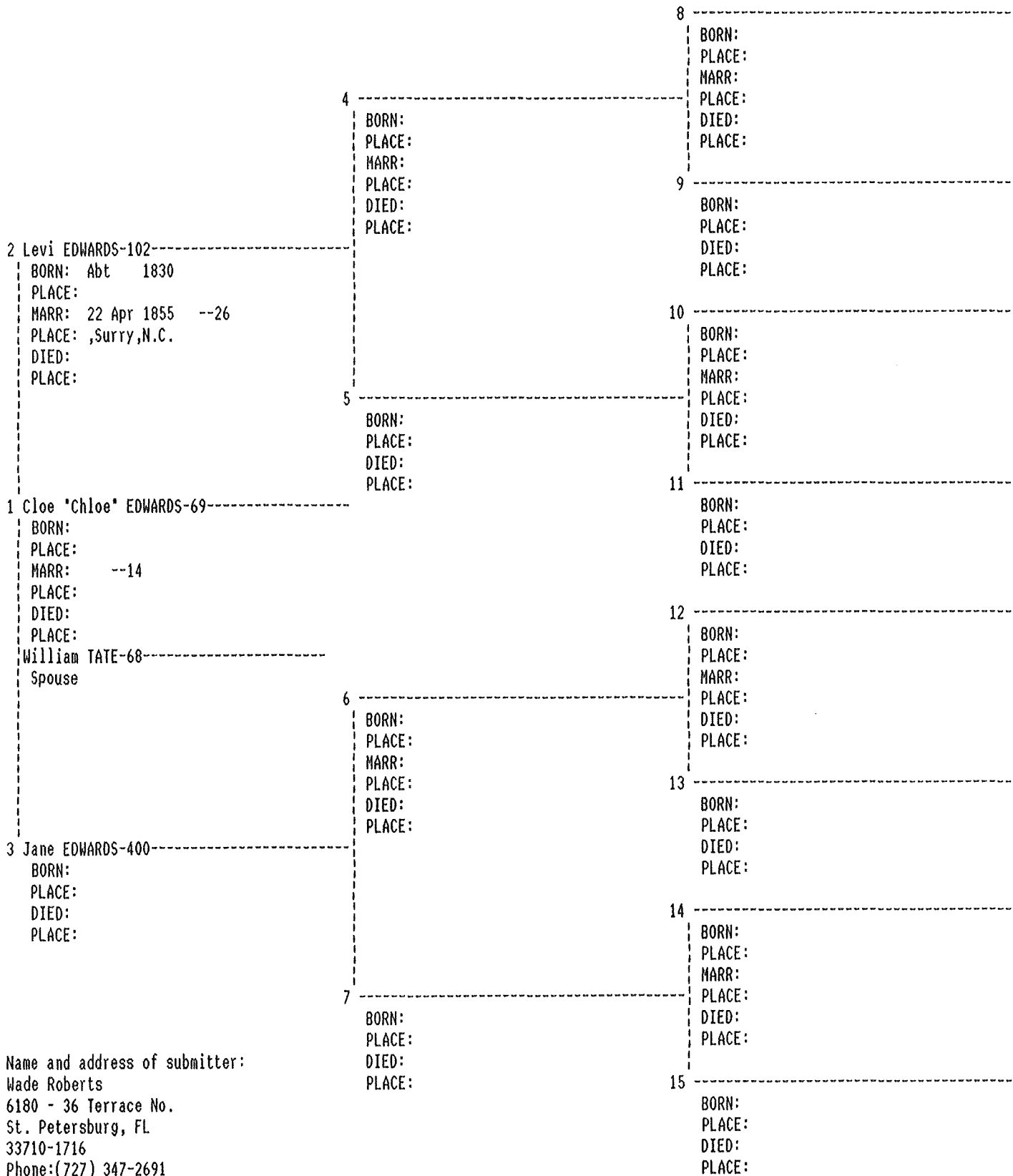

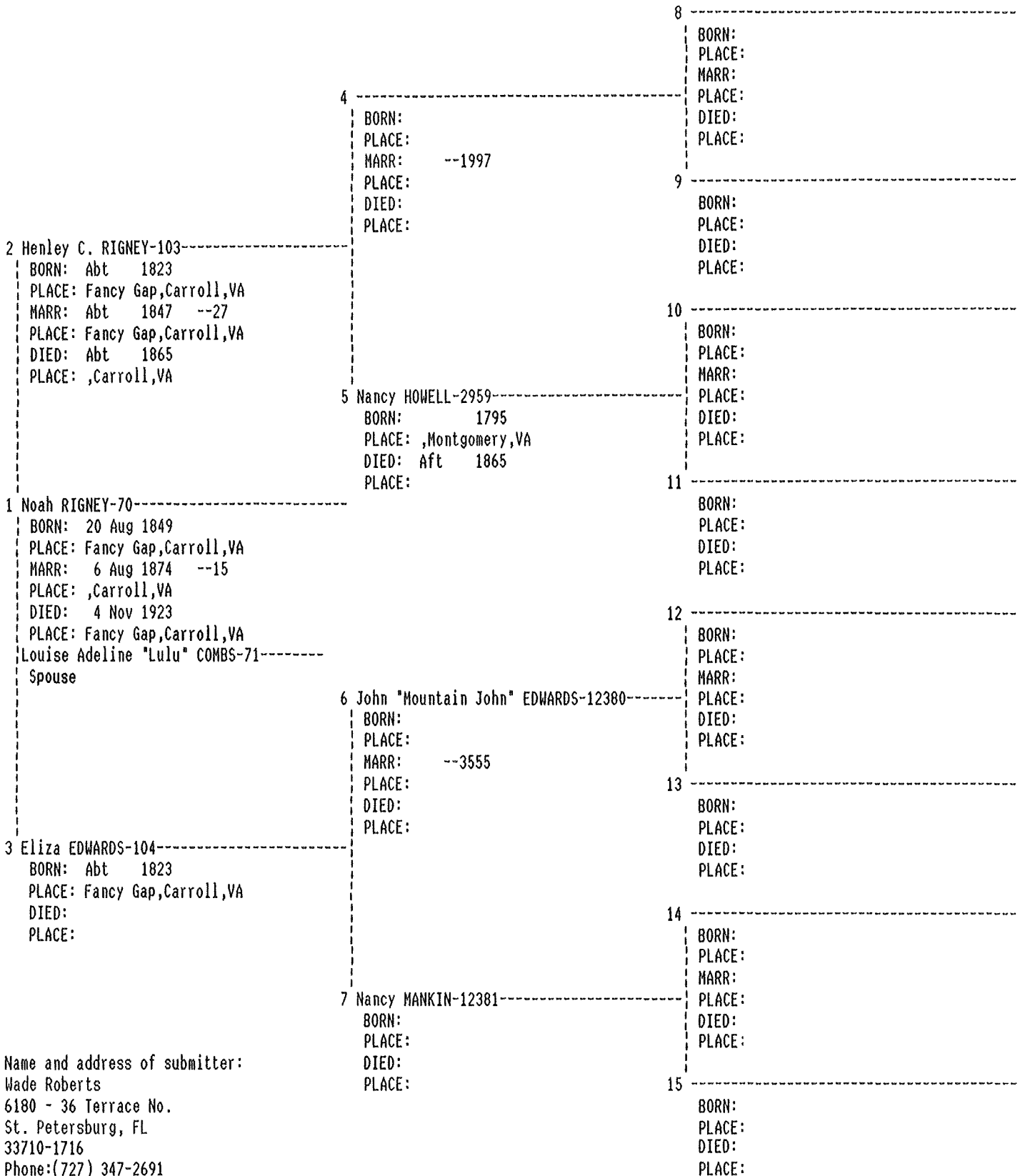

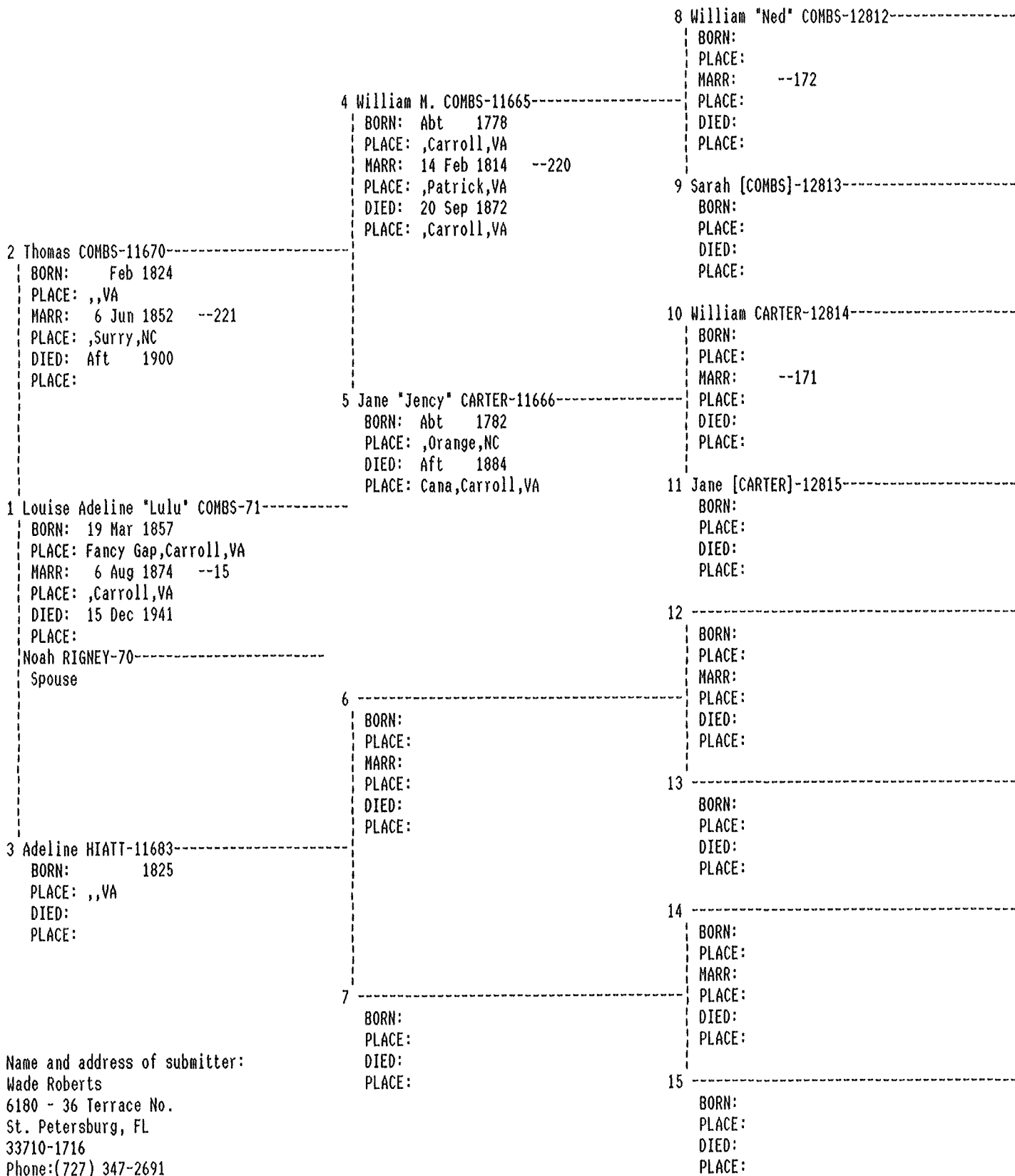

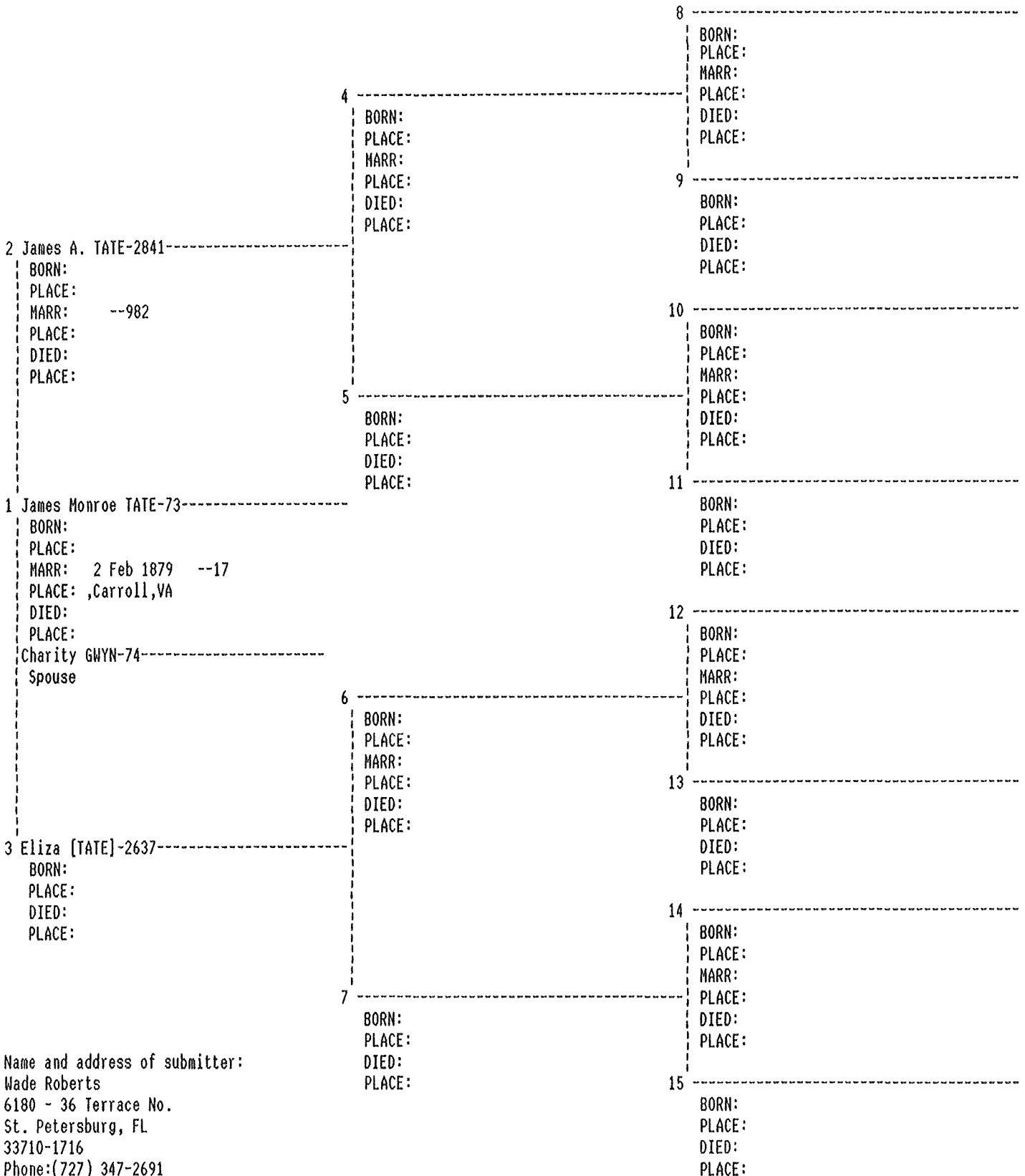

The Bible of Eliza Jane King Tate by Donna Edwards

On August 28, 2008 my wonderful genealogy friend, Lessie Brindle, sent me an email. In it she said a friend of hers had an old "Bible" and she typed names asking if I recognized any of the names. I did! They seemed to be the names of Eliza Jane King Tate's children. I did not reply to Lessie's email but kept it in my In Box until I had time to do so.

Lessie called me the 4th of Sept. asking if I had gotten her email. I told her that I had not had time to reply but I did recognize those names. They were the children of John Wesley & Eliza Jane King Tate and it must be the Bible that I thought I would never see.

When I was small, we visited Dan Tate several times. The last time was a couple years before he died. I ask him his parents names several times until he said quite loudly "I told you...!" and he also named all his brothers and sisters and told me their birthdates. He informed me that he had Eliza Jane King Tate's (his mama) Bible with all their names written in it, but didn't show it to me. Dan's father John Wesley Tate was a brother to my great-grandmother, Virginia Tate Edwards (mama's grandmother).

He had always lived on top of the mountain in Fancy Gap. Toward the end of his life he lived in a little house in Cana owned by Mabel Towe Barnard and she ended up with what was left of his stuff. I ran in to her several times after Dan died and always reminded her that if she came across that Bible I would love to see it and take a picture of it. She just said his stuff was stored and she would go thru it someday. This past year she died and I knew that was the end of my chance of ever see that Bible.

Then I received the email from Lessie. What a surprise! After talking to Lessie, she contacted her friend, the Bible owner, Lillie Dobson Vernon, to let her know who I thought that Bible belonged too. Lillie called me and we discussed how she thought she came into it's possession. It had been in a drawer in a piece of furniture at her house, in Dobson, for more than 20 years. She thinks she got the furniture from Willa May Smith, a lady she worked for years ago. Willa was the daughter of Lucille Mankins Smith. They lived up on Dusty Lane above Cross Creek Country Club. Lillie said she moved to Dobson sometime between 1986 – 2002. The Bible did not have the cover or back. She only had the middle pages 741 – 1138. (Jeremiah 14:15 thru 1 Timothy 2:13.)

My question is how did that Bible get to Dusty Lane in the hands of the Mankins/Smith families. Before Dan died he thought he had it, but must not have if Lillie had it then.

Lillie is the nicest lady, she told me of all the antiques she has collected over the years and we had quite a talk about her things. She had no use for the Bible and told me she would meet me the next day and give it to me. I was in Shock and So Excited!!! I could not wait to just see the Bible and told her I would drive right over to Dobson right then if it was ok, hahaha, wouldn't you? She said she was getting ready for bed and I had to wait until the next day!

When we met and I saw the writing in the middle of those pages, chills ran thru me. I still could not believe she was actually going to give it to me. I had a camera and she could not believe I gave it to Ethan, my 4 year old nephew, and told him to take our picture.

My theory is that Dan had the Back and Front sections and somehow the middle was removed and he never knew. He was blind during the later part of his life and probably never opened the Bible to look at it. Someday the lost cover, back and missing pages may turn up somewhere, I sure hope so!

It is a pleasure to have something that I have known existed for so many years. I plan to treasure it and take just as good care of it as Lillie did. And, treasures like this were meant to be shared with all my genealogy friends.

Tate reaches 'pinnacle' of his career

MOUNT AIRY — For State Trooper E.V. "Van" Tate, a career in law enforcement might have seemed easy to dict.

As a child, he traveled with his family around the world to his father's military stations serving with the Navy and the CIA. When he was 8 and the family settled in his mother's hometown of Mount Airy, his neighbor was Cooper Frank Gillespie.

"I always wanted to go into law enforcement. I'd have to say my father's military experience and my neighbor who was a state trooper influenced me a lot," said Tate, now a master trooper in Surry County, where he's been stationed since the late 1990s. "But I had enough travel. I wanted to be here."

Tate, who was born in Kentucky, said he'd traveled with his family "all over the world" before his father retired. Most of it he doesn't really remember, although he recalls Okinawa, Japan, where he lived at 6 and 7 as the best two years of my life as a child.

"This was Mama's hometown, and when he retired he was kind enough to let her decide where we were going to live," Tate said. The family, which in-

"I was there for five and a half years and had some great times and made some great friends," he said, recalling that he disliked responding to domestic calls most of all. "We went on a call one night and were trying to arrest the guy when the woman turned on me. I thought I was going to get killed."

He also continued his class work at SCC, earning his bachelor of science degree in criminal justice from Gardner Webb University. "I worked 12 hours a day, then went to class at night," he said. "It was just something I wanted to do."

Shortly after completing his bachelor's degree, he married Kimberly Holder on April 4, 1992.

Not long after that, he entered training as a state trooper and was a member of the 91st Basic Highway Patrol School in 1993.

"I was there for 26 and a half weeks," he said. "When I graduated, I was stationed in Yadkin County."

He said while some colonels have insisted that troopers begin their careers far from home, the colonel when he graduated allowed most of the class to begin work only a county away from their hometowns. The present colonel allows troopers to go back to their home counties, if there is a position open.

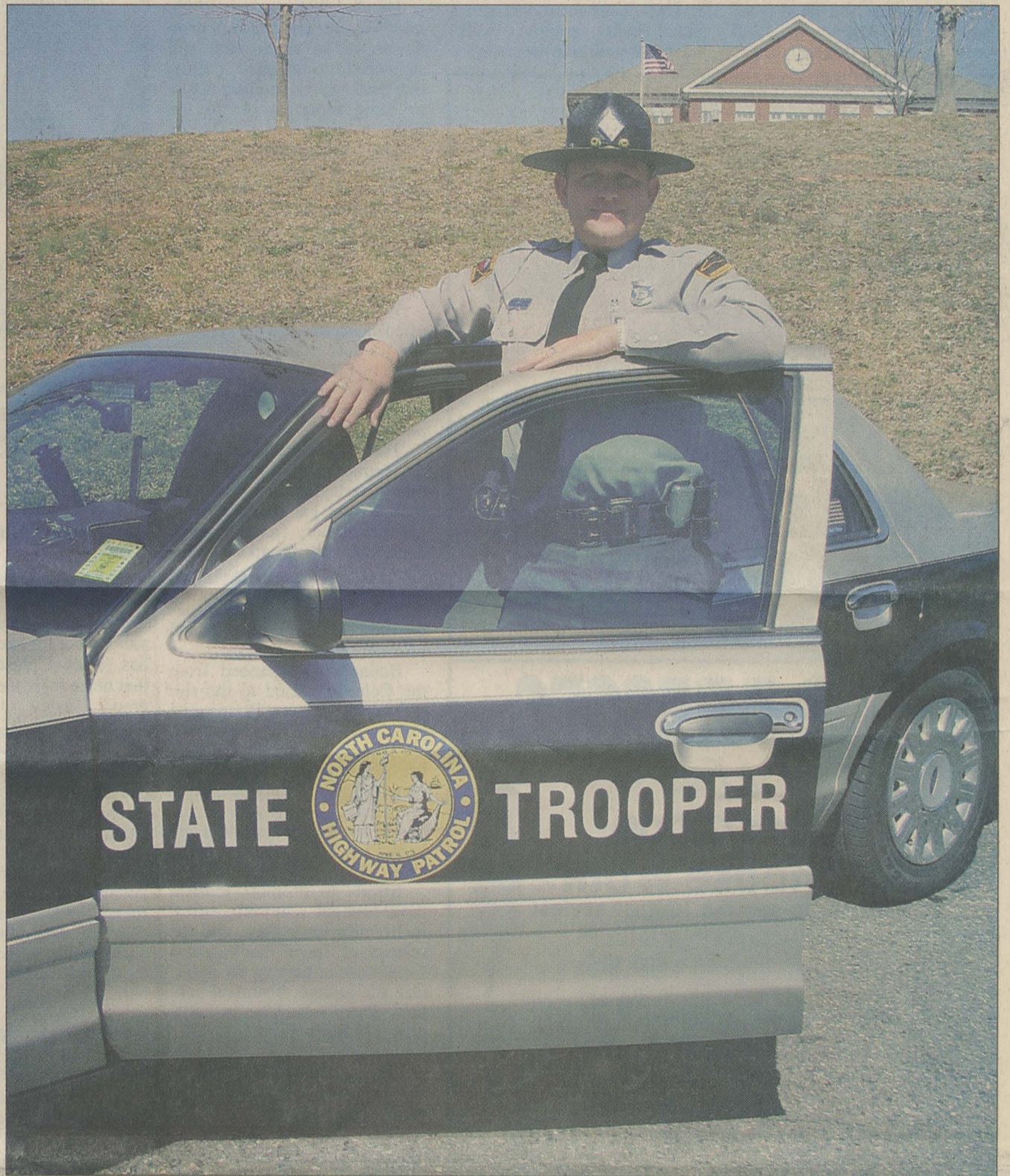
Tate and his wife lived in Jonesville during his Yadkin County assignment, and it was shortly before the end of his tour of duty there that the incident that stands out most in his law enforcement career took place.

"In 1996, I was the officer that found Greg Martin," he said, referring to the Jonesville police officer who was killed on Interstate 77 after pulling over a vehicle that was later found to have been stolen in West Virginia.

"I was the last one to talk to him on the radio," said Tate. "It was end of shift and we had just cleared a fatality on Highway 421 when I heard Sgt. Martin on the radio calling for backup. I called him on the radio and asked if he was okay, and he said he was, but needed me to meet with him on I-77 near the 81 mile marker."

"I responded, but when I got there I couldn't find Greg. I could see his patrol car, but no others and I got out and started walking to his car. Just past his door I looked down and saw Greg in a pool of blood on the shoulder of the road."

Tate said he knew Martin was dead by the extent of his injuries and he returned to his car to call for assistance and take cover. "I didn't know what had happened or if the shooter was still around. After Elkin police arrived, we went back, under cover, to check him

again and then waited on the emergency medical service and the SBI (State Bureau of Investigation)."

Tate said Martin's infant son was six months younger than his, and they had been in the habit of taking breaks together to compare pictures and stories. "It was the most tragic thing I've seen in nearly 17 years in law enforcement," he said.

It didn't make him reconsider his chosen career, even though the murder is still unsolved and no one knows exactly what happened that night. "It's kind of like it's my destiny now to find

out who did it," said Tate.

He said he had done an interview with "America's Most Wanted" not too long ago and the program officials were talking about including the case in a show in May during Law Enforcement Week. "Maybe that will reach out to the right people," he said. "Somebody is bound to have seen something. Even at that time of the morning, there are people on the road -- especially truckers."

Not too long after Martin's death, and the death of Tate's father who died from cancer in 1996, he was trans-

ferred back to Surry County and he and his wife bought a home in the Mount Airy area where they live with their two children, Anthony, 9, and Karleigh, 5. His wife works as a legal assistant for Royster and Royster.

"My mom and dad always taught me to treat people fairly, so that's how I deal with everybody. Mom always told me to remember that every person has a mother. I try to remember those things when I deal with the people I have to stop on a day-to-day basis."

"The job of a state trooper has changed a lot since I've been doing it," he said, "but integrity is still an utmost principal. It's not for everybody, but it has its own prestige — those that make it are the cream of the crop."

He said he treasures the lessons he learned and his friends from his police department days, and like the job of a state trooper, it's not for everybody either. "I left some great friends when I left there," he said. "We had a lot of fun, but I was younger then. Now I love to spend time with my wife and children. But it's nice to be back home where I can see those old friends on a regular basis."

Tate is active in the community in the Round Peak Masonic Lodge (he's a 32nd degree mason), Winston-Salem Scottish Rite Bodies, Order of the Eastern Star, Mount Airy Rescue Squad board of directors, Mount Airy Elks Lodge, and serves as a Boy Scout volunteer with his son's Cub Scout Pack 517, having achieved Eagle Scout status himself. He also serves on the SHP's Member Assistance Team and the county's Critical Incident Stress Management Team, and is a member of the SHP's Aquatic Rescue team.

Troopers now have more flexibility in scheduling shifts that fit their lives, and he said that has made him enjoy his job even more, since he works hours that allow him to be home

with his family. "It's also resulted in better coverage and accidents are actually down," he said.

"There is more traffic now than a few years back, and I do worry some about the hazardous materials being trucked through on the interstate. We never know what we'll walk up on.

As a master trooper, Tate said he's reached the "pinnacle" of his career, unless he applies for a promotion. But those usually bring transfers, and he said he's traveled enough. "I've moved enough," he said. "I'm happy with what I do and this wonderful community.

"I'm hoping for 25-year retirement," he laughed, "and I plan on staying right here in Surry County."
