APPRECIATION FOR THE COACHES

Another coach who has been here almost as long as Coach Charlie is Coach John Haynes. Coach Haynes joined North Surry in the fall of 1964.

John Haynes attended Elkin High School where he played football, basketball, baseball, and track. Coach Haynes' team won the Yadkin Valley Basketball Tournament his senior year. Coach Haynes also received Honorable Mention on the All State Football Team in football his senior year.

Coach Haynes attended Guilford College where he attained an A.B. Degree. Coach Haynes played football there two years at the halfback and fullback positions. Since graduating from Guilford he has done graduate work at the University of New Mexico, the University of Delaware, Appalachian State, and Lenoir Rhyne.

Since joining the coaching staff at North Surry, Coach Haynes has football and basketball teams, coached several Freshmen, Junior-Varsity, and Varsity Basketball teams.

Coach Haynes also is an assistant coach for football. Coach Haynes helps in preparation for the game by conferring with other coaches before and during the game, taping the player's ankles before the game, and encouraging the players before, during and after the game.

Not to be left out is another coach, with whom I have been associated since my Freshmen year. That year he coached our Freshmen team to a 6-1 record. This person, of course, is Coach Don Smith.

Coach Smith went to Reynolds High School for four years. There Coach Smith played four years of football, two years on the varsity squad. Coach Smith played offensive and defensive end in high school. In addition Coach Smith played baseball at Reynolds. While at Reynolds, Coach Smith's football team were runners-up in the State 4-A Championship his senior year.

Coach Smith attended Appalachian State where he played two years of football. There Coach Smith played offensive and defensive tackle at Appalachian, Coach Smith received his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration.

Since joining the North coaching staff, in the fall of '67 Coach Smith has had several Freshmen football and basketball teams, as well as several Junior-Varsity football and basketball teams.

In addition to being a fine Freshmen and Junior-Varsity coach, he is an excellent assistant varsity coach. Along with the other coaches, he tapes ankles before the games. During most ball-games he is in the press box getting a better view to report below to one of the coaches on the phone.

On Wednesday afternoon, April 26, the North Surry track team won its divisional title by defeating Elkin, 58½ - 54½.

The Hounds were victorious in these seven events: shot, R. Vernon, 39'3"; high jump, Penn, 5'6"; high hurdles, Penn, :16.1; broad jump, Penn, 18'6"; 100 yd. dash, Carter, :10.15; 880, McKinney, 2:10.5, and low hurdles, Penn, :21.75.

Friday, April 28, proved fatal for the North team as they lost to the Division A, championship, South Stokes, 52-61.

Both teams were very tense because of the great importance of the meet. North Surry members who placed first were: shot, Ben Norman, 42'2"; broad jump, Penn, 20'; high hurdles, Penn, 15.8; low hurdles, Lawrence, 22.5; 100 yd. dash, tie, Dollyhigh and Carter, 10.6, and 220, Carter, 22.1.

TRACK CHAMPS

The annual North-west AAA Conference Track Meet was held at Elkin, Wednesday May 2. At the end of competition the Greyhounds of North Surry were declared the champions. The Hounds had a total score of 42; South Stokes placed second with 40½. North's win was especially super because of the fact that we have no track on which to practice.

Gerone Penn was the star of the Hounds as he scored 21 points. During this season Gerone has done an outstanding job in four main events. At the meet he placed first in broad jump, 19'7", low hurdles, .22., and high hurdles .16. He also place third in the high jump, 5'6".
