Garden Reminder:

Divide Peonies, Phlox, in fact most perennials.

Transplant perennial seedlings from seed bed to frames or to permanent place in border.

Spray for Aphids on Chrysanthemum with Nicotine.

Plant bulbs, especially those which you have saved yourself. Do not allow them to remain out of the soil.

OCTOBER 17, 1955

Garden Reminder: Lilacs or other shrubs troubled with scale may be sprayed when leaves fall with 9-1 lime sulphur.

Order Roses now.

Plant Dutch or spring flowering bulbs now. If lilies are ordered but not received, protect soil so that they may be planted. Flant hardy annuals for spring bloom.

NOVEMBER 14, 1955

Gifts for County Home.

Garden Reminder: Gather every leaf and stem of Peonies and Hollyhocks and burn them if you are troubled with bud rot.

Plant Dutch or Spring-flower-
ing bulbs now. Plant seed
such as:Sweet PeasPoppiesPansiesSweet AlyssumSnapsCalendulaLarkspurCornflowers

Lift Glads, Tuberoses, Cannas and Dahlias. Store in cool cellar.

DECEMBER 12, 1955

Garden Reminder:

Cover bulb beds with mulch as soon as ground is frozen. Remove drifts of leaves that might smother perennials and grass. Space vacant spots in border and leave rough for the winter. Give your friends choice flower seeds and bulbs for Christmas presents. Clean and oil your garden tools. Plant Spring bulbs if not already planted. Make garden changes before ground freezes.

JANUARY 16, 1956

Program: Pruning Mrs. Vance Hallman

Arrangements: "Line" Mrs. Watt Shuford, crescent mantel Mrs. C.L. Sykes, hall (modern)

Garden Reminder:

Dormant spray on Roses and Shrubs for scale. Do not spray when temperature is below freezing. Prune diseased branches of shrubs. Sow sweet peas and hardy annuals not sown in Fall.

Remove drifts of leaves that might smother perennials and grass.

FEBRUARY 20, 1956

Garden Reminder:

Prune fruit trees, shrubs and evergreens. Spray with lime sulphur 9-1 on warm day for San Jose scale. Prune grapes before March 1st. Prune running roses.

Arrangements: "Moss" Mrs. Osler Woltz, dining room Mrs. Hugh Merritt, candle stand Plant sale for April. Election of Officers.

Garden Reminder:

Spray soil around Phlox, Peonies, Hollyhocks, and Delpheniums with Bordeau immediately they show. Sow seed of hardy flowers. Feed perennials using a well-balanced plant food. Do not be to hasty to remove plant protection. Plant Violas, Arabis, Siberian Wallflowers as ground cover for bulb beds.

Garden Reminder:

Take off winter protection. Spray with Bordeau. Continue dividing most perennials. Remember that Anemones and Playscodon are slow to appeardo not disturb them in working border. Label everything. Sow seeds of biennials. Sow annual seeds. Plant strawberries, apples, cherries, grapes and most fruits.

Garden Reminder:

Remove the diseased buds of peonies and disbud for exhibition blooms. Use liquid manure. Plant summer bulbs such as Glads, Tuberoses, Dahlias, etc. Sow tender annuals. Allow leaves to ripen on bulbs before digging.

Feed strawberries and perennials.

Spray Roses.

BY LAWS:

Section 1

This organization shall be called the "Garden Gate Club".

Section 2

The object of this club shall be to study the culture of flowers, exchange ideas and to increase interest in gardening.

Section 3

A. The officers of this club shall be President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer.

B. The officers shall be elected alphabetically at the March meet. ing and shall serve one year. They shall be installed at the June meeting.

C. Vacancies in any office shall be automatically filled alphabetically.

D. The affairs of the club shall be managed by an Executive Board consisting of the officers.

Section 4

A. Cualifications for membership shall be an active interest in gardening.

B. Total membership shall not exceed twenty-five.

C. All applications shall be made through the Executive Board in writing. If passed by the board these names shall be presented to the club for election at any time during the year. They shall be voted on by ballot, after being tabled for one month. A majority shall be sufficient to elect.

Amendment: If no applicant (when there are more applicants than vacancies) gets a majority of votes on the first voting, then the two applicants receiving the largest number of votes would be voted upon. The person then receiving a majority would be elected to the club, after being tabled for a month. The remaining applicants would be given first choice when and if another

vacancy occurred.

Amendment: All nominations for new members may be made from the floor and voted upon immediately. A majority shall be sufficient to elect.

Section 5

A. Resignation shall be in writing and must be sent to the Secretary.

B. Three consecutive unexcused absences constitute a resignation after absence reminder has been sent by the Secretary.

C: Absence from the city or illness in the family constitute an excused absence, notice of this excuse must be sent to the Secre tary or to the hostess prior to the meeting.

Section 6

Meetings shall be held on the third Monday of each month from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m. Other meetings shall be called by the President to meet the needs of the club.

Section 7

The dues of the club shall be \$2.00 per year, payable in April of each year.

Section 8

The By-Laws may be amended at any meeting by a majority of the club membership, provided notice of intention to amend shall have been given one month before.
