Thank you for your letter dated July 29, 2000 regarding the will of Jane (Howard) Allen.

The will you requested is in Surry County as you stated. Most of our will books are now at the North Carolina Archives. You can request the will and estate records from The Department of Cultural Resources, Archives and Records Section, 109 E. Jones Street, Raleigh, NC 27601-2807. They will advise you of the cost when they receive your request. The will is for Jane Allen (3:70a) dated Nov. 24, 1805. Loose estate papers for Jane Allen are also at the Archives.

We thought you would be interested also in several other wills/estate information such as the following: Abraham Howard, Inv. of Est. recorded in 1783 (returned by Jean (Jane) Howard) and a nuncupative will of John Allen (wife Jean) dated Nov. 15, 1800.

If you are not a member of SCGA, you might be interested in joining since this family is from Surry County. We have enclosed a brochure regarding our association. We publish four journals a year that are well worth our yearly membership fee of \$15. We would be interested in having more information on this family if you are willing to share your information. Our research room is located at Surry Community College in Dobson, NC and we would love to add the Allen family information to our family files.

Thank you for writing to the Surry County Genealogical Association.

We received your check #422 dated November 30, 2005 and since it was December when we received it, we applied it to our 2006 membership list. We only send out Journals quarterly, so the Spring Journal is just now coming back from the printers. You should receive it soon.

You can mail this to my attention and I will get back to you as soon as I can. We only do the genealogy at the office when free time permits.

I am not aware of an Allen History on this family but I will ask some of the other members of the association if they know anyone working on the Allen family.

Dear Ms Newman,

In answer to your letter to the Surry County Genealogical Assoc'n re Isaac and other Allens, we are sending you some flyers on books available on Surry County records that may be of help to you.

As per enclosed flyer - Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions - Vol I mentions Isaac Allen 13 times and John 18 times in the index. Some of these are wit. to trials or jury duty but may contain other information that will help.

Pleas & Quarter Sessions Vol II gives this among other entries: "Tues. 16th May 1801 - Administration on estate of John Allen dec'd is granted to John Allen son of the decedent (his mother and elder brother having resigned their right) who entered into bond with Henry Speer & M. Duke Kimbrough securities, in the sum of f50 for his faithful performance &C and qualified according to law. Ordered that letters of administration issue accordingly. No fee paid." Also, "Tues. Feb. 9th 1801 - An inventory of the estate of John Allen dec'd was returned by the admr and ordered to be recorded. No fee pd. On motion ordered that an order of sale issue &C. No fee paid."

Court Vol III-Tues. Feb 9th 1801 - Ordered by the court that a subpoena issue to the witnesses of the nuncupative will of John Allen returnable to this court. No fee paid." "12th Feb 1801 - will proved...etc...." Court Vol III contains petition of John Allin..."

The nuncupative will and estate records may have been sent to the State Archives in Raleigh. You could write to them or we are enclosing the address of Mrs. Harvey who could check for these and other records as the staff at the Archives will look up and copy some materials but does not research in loose records as far as we know.

You mentioned a 400 acre grant to John Allen on waters of Deep Creek a branch of the north fork and asked the date. In the Joseph Winston, His Entry Book, Land Entries 1778-1781 we find the following among several others in the name of John Allen: John Allen enters 400 acres of land in Surry Co. on the N fork of Deep Creek including the plantation he now lives on for complement. Nov. 11, 1778 [warrant granted to H.S.]

Plats are not attached to our deeds in Surry County but may be obtained from the Land Grant Office in Raleigh, NC. The fastest way would be to contact Mrs. Harvey whose address is enclosed and ask her if she could copy grants for you. They give a drawing of the

land and usually tell who the chain carriers were for the surveyor. Sometimes these can be of help as they were usually relatives or near neighbors. Sometimes other data is included if the grant has been transferred to or from another owner before it was registered as a deed.

We have received inquiries recently from the following people researching the Allen lineage: Mrs. R.M. Davis, 116 Turkey Trot Lane, Jacksonville, AR 72076 and Mr. Robert E. Collins, 463 Eastview Dr, Lebanon, Ohio 45036. I have given your address to Mrs. Davis but you might wish to contact both of them.

Enclosed you will find some material on our Association. Please send queries and surname cards to the association if you feel this would be of help to you.

The Historical map done by Mr. Fred Hughes is a valuable aid in locating deeded land and grants. You may order these from Mr. Hughes or you can order the Surry County map AND INDEX from: Office of the Register of Deeds, PO Box 303, Dobson, NC 27017. You might wish to write to the Yadkin County Historical Society, PO box 1250, Yadkinville, NC 27055 to ask about their Heritage Book and map and index of that county. The Allens are found in Surry, Yadkin and Wilkes Counties.

We hope some of the above will prove to be of help to you. If we can help you further, please write again.

Dear Sirs,

Recently while doing some genealogical research at our local library I mentioned to the person in charge of the of the genealogical section that I had about exhausted their facilities as far as my research was concerned. I asked the person in charge if she had any suggestions of whom I might write to for more information. So from her I received your society name and address and she said that she believed that you would be more than glad to correspond with me.

I have for the past three years been trying to trace the genealogical line of a person by the name of ADONIRAM ALLEN. Although he was one of the first settlers in Clay County, Ky. around the year of 1807, this which I have confirmed, because he was appointed to the first grand jury of Clay County Ky. But going backward in time I have found that he was been born in the state of New Hampshire, this I have not confirmed, in the year of 1734 and died in Clay County, Kentucky in 1838. In the interim between these two dates I have kept coming up with him and his family being in Surry County, North Carolina.

I recently received a letter from a descendant of Adoniram Allen which put a little more light on the situation. According to him there was an Allen Settlement on what is now known as Winston Salem, NC.. Also the Allens ran an Iron Works and sold iron to, I would suppose, the surrounding area and possibly the government of that time. In his letter he also mentioned that they had lumber from their own mill and sold lumber. I know this sounds like I know a lot of this family, but really it is only hearsay.

I have been privileged to search some of the court record from your state and have found one land transaction that maybe a key, but I am not sure. I will submit it to you a the end of this letter for your evaluation.

It has also been told that Adoniram Allen was a Captain in the Revolutionary War and fought under a Colonel Cleveland at the battle of Kings Mountain. Again I will submit to you a copy of a pay voucher for your evaluation as to whether it is a voucher for being in the army or maybe for something else.

You may notice on the land transaction submission that Job, Adoniram, and Jonathan are appearing as witnesses to the

transaction and David is the person doing the transacting. We are of the opinion that the three witnesses are the sons of David. This again is only speculation on my part.

I have noticed on my map that Surry and Wilkes Counties are neighboring counties although in the period of time we are speaking of the boundaries could have been different. The only reason I mention this is that I have been told that the Allen Iron Works and the Allen settlement was at what is now Winston Salem.

I would appreciate any and all information on the subject that I have written to you on. This is my wife's ancestors and we have been trying to get enough information together to submit it to the D.A.R., but so far with only hearsay information and no definite proof we are not having much luck. If you have any of this information in your files please let me know. Also do have publications from your Genealogical Society.

In response to your letter to the Surry Co. Genealogical Association regarding research on the Allen family, we are sending some flyers on books available of Surry Co. records we think might help you, and also some materials about the Association. If you have not done so, queries for the Journal and surname cards might result in someone contacting you.

We do have a book HERITAGE OF SURRY COUNTY, VOL I - but I do not think the stories about Allens and Pettits go back far enough to help you. Court records and the Land Grant Entry book would probably help you more as there are entries for Allens in the indices.

Enclosed you will find a paper about the Historical Map of Surry County done by Mr. Fred Hughes. This map is a valuable aid in locating deeded land, grants, and near neighbors. You may order the Surry County map and index from the Office of the Register of Deeds, PO Box 303, Dobson, NC 27017. We don't know if Mr. Hughes has indices to the maps but people in most of the counties prepared their own index. If you want Yadkin's map and he doesn't have an index, you could write to the Yadkin County Historical Society, PO Box 1250, Yadkinville, NC 27055 and ask if they have the map and index as there were Allens in that county also. You might ask if they have a genealogy society in that county and about possible histories in their Heritage book.

We received a letter from Zelma Newman, 227 West 15th Ave., Eugene, OR 97401. Also an inquiry from Mr. Robert E. Collins, 463 Eastview Dr, Lebanon, Ohio 45036. They are both active Allen researchers and we think you might be of help to each other.

We are beginning the HERITAGE OF SURRY COUNTY, VOL II in case you wish to send in a story or wish to receive details when available about this book.

We hope some of these suggestions will be of help to you. If we can help you further, please write again.

Aller Affair

Many Witnesses in Allen Trial. Testimony Very Similar to That Given at Previous Hearing (The Mount Airy News, Thursday, July 11, 1912)

Wytheville, Va., July 5 – The case of the Commonwealth against Claude Allen for killing William M. Foster in the tragedy of March 14th at Hillsville, was resumed this morning at 9:30 and B. Weddle was introduced as a witness. This witness testified that Floyd Allen told him that if he was convicted he would kill W. M. Foster before sundown.

Isaac Martin testified as to Floyd Allen's statement that he could not get a fair trial in Carroll and that he would compromise and pay, but if they sent him to the pen, they would have to make a box for him.

These questions and answers were accepted because they were intended to prove conspiracy and that Claude Allen, the prisoner, was not present and there was no evidence that the statements had ever been communicated to him.

Sidney Shrecker testified that the evening before the tragedy, and while the jury were out and expected in court with their verdict, Claude Allen went up to his father, Floyd, took him by the wrist and said, "Let me feel your pulse," and having done so, said, "It beats regularly," and the father with hand to his mouth in a whisper asked Claude if the boys were ready.

Lowman King's evidence corroborated Sidney Shrecker.

Joseph A. Banks, a witness not examined in former trials, gave evidence which corroborated the last two as to Claude Allen taking hold of his father's wrist, and to their whispering, but witness was too far off to hear what was said.

C. L. Howell, the foreman of the jury which convicted Floyd Allen and who was present at the tragedy, gave a detailed account of what occurred at the time. His evidence was in line with those witnesses who have heretofore testified as to the facts and circumstances.

Owing to the stormy weather there were fewer spectators than on any previous day.

M. C. White, a member of the jury, was the next witness. He said Floyd Allen said he was not going to jail. His statements showed that the witness had been more particular in taking care of himself than in seeing what happened.

Court adjourned at one thirty for dinner.

J. G. Ayers, the next witness, testified regarding his position at the time of the shooting and the position of the persons doing the shooting outside the court house. He said he was an undertaker and saw Foster's wounds. He described them to the jury.

Roscoe Mabry corroborated the statements of former witnesses as to the shooting and positions of parties. His testimony was very brief. He had been chiefly concerned in getting out of danger.

The next witness was W. C. Quesenberry, deputy clerk, who was on the stand for one hour and ten minutes. He testified that the first shot came from the northeast corner of the room and then from the direction of Floyd Allen. The witness said he fired twice at Floyd. He said he came in the room armed because of previous trouble with Jack Allen. The witness was subjected to a grilling cross examination by Judge Hairston. J. T. Cochran, at whose restaurant the Allens ate breakfast on the day of the tragedy next was introduced. His testimony was brief and no new facts were revealed.

H. K. Lindsey, the next witness introduced, was asked only a few questions which revealed no new facts. Cyrus Phipps, a civil engineer, was next introduced. His testimony related chiefly to the facts and incidents of the shooting, and with a map he described the court room at Hillsville, the furniture thereof and the location of the bullet holes.
