WARM HOUNDS DEFEAT COLD VIKINGS

The Hounds weren't exactly hot Friday, Jan. 14, but they were warm. When the sun finally showed itself again, North was victorious 59-41. Coach King stated, "I could tell Wednesday we were flat. We may have been looking ahead to Starmount—we'll be up for them. Tonight we were lucky to win, but we'll take them any way we can get them."

The Hounds stayed with their double-post which works well on a zone and man-to-man defences.

On offense, after a cold five minutes, Barth Tesh hit for North. Luckily for the Hounds, the Vikings, basket was also knit together. The first quarter ended with North on top 10-8.

The second quarter was the same cold game, but North led at half, 23-19.

North became somewhat warmer in the third period as the Hounds pulled away 40-31. The Hounds became dulled and let the Vikings come within seven late in the game. However, not to be denied a victory, the Greyhounds pulled away. Scoring for the Hounds were Badgett 17, Penn 16, Tesh 12, Payne 10, Young 4.

In the J.V. game, Leon Shuff hit two free throws in the final seconds to lead the Junior varsity to a 61-59 victory.

HOUNDS ANNIHILATE RAMS

In a fast action game on Jan. 18, the Hounds went on a rampage to destroy the second place team, 72-65.

Again in the third quarter the Hounds outscored the Rams 16-14. The final quarter saw the Rams stage a mild comeback, but North was destined to be victorious.



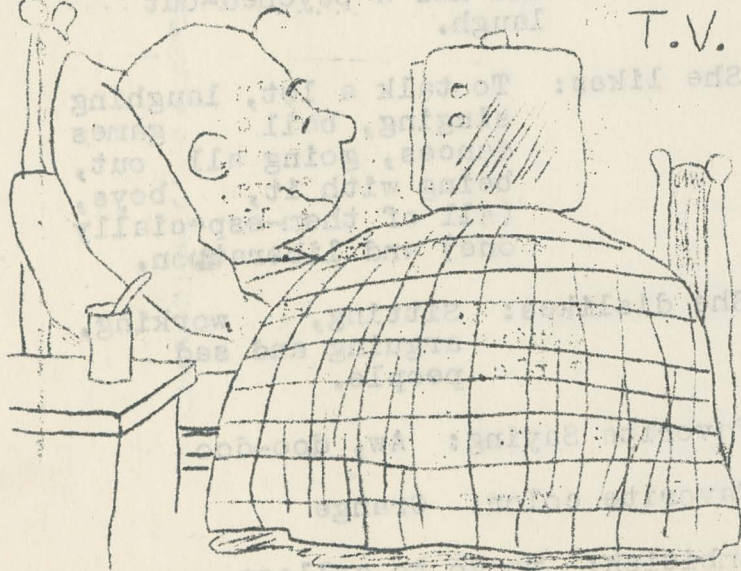

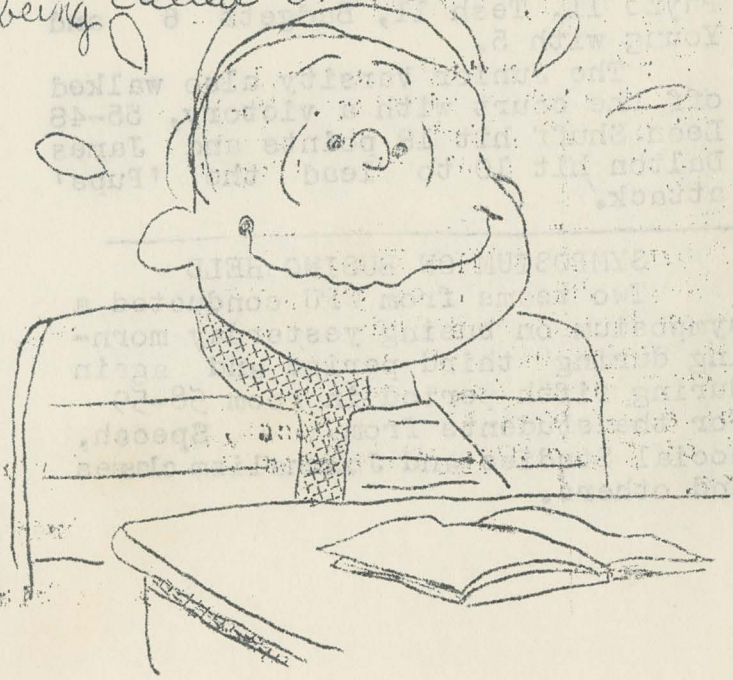
