Garden Reminder: Plant Mums in Full Bloom - Move with Chunks of Earth Plant Fiennials, such as Foxglove and Canterberry Bells. Set Pansy Plants, Sow Seed of Hardy Annuals such as Larkspur, Petunias and Snapdragons. Do not Sow Grass Seed after October 15th.

Best time for planting tenths: Oct. 1 - now. 18 minimum size in Halland: 4'3 circunference. Planting: monure + phosphate dig monure 6 to 8" deep Plant hulles 5" deep. Sprinkle after planting, + early if dry. Like the sun.

BY LAWS

Section 1

his organization shall be called the Garden ate Club

Section 2

ne object of this club shall be to study the ulture of flowers, exchange ideas and to inrease interest in gardening.

Section 3

The officers of this club shall be Presient, Vice-President, Recording Secretary and easurer.

Officers shall be elected alphabetically at e March meeting and shall serve one year. They all be installed at the June Meeting.

Vacancies in any office shall be automatically lled alphabetically.

The affairs of the club shall be managed by

n executive board consisting of the officers.

Section 4

. Qualifications for membership shall be an ctive interest in gardening.

Total membership shall not exceed twenty-five.

All applications shall be made through the recutive board in writing. If passed by the bard these names shall be presented to the club or election, at any time during the year; they all be voted on by ballot, after being tabled r one month. A majority shall be sufficient elect.

mendment: If no applicant (when there are more plicants than vacancies) gets a majority of tes on the first voting, then the two applints receiving the largest number of votes would voted upon. The person then receiving a jority would be elected to the club, after be-; tabled for a month. The remaining applicants ld be given first choice when and if another ancy occurred.

Section 5

A. Regisnation must be in writing and must be sent to the Secretary.

B. Three consecutive unexcused absences constitute a resignation after absence reminder has been sent by the Secretary.

C. Absence from the City or illness in the family constitute an excused absence, notice of this excuse must be sent to the Secretary or to the hostess prior to the meeting.

Section 6

Meetings shall be held on the third Monday of each month from 2:30 to 4:30 P.M. Other meetings shall be called by the President to meet the needs of the club.
