Census sheet shows: b. Oct. 1828 in N.C. Age 71 - cook
Cotton Coffey b. 1826 in N.C. -- farmer.

This is not the wife of Cotton - she was listed on the Soundex as a boarder and on the census as a cook.

Surely after all those years of saying that she was born in Tenn., Mary didn't forget? I don't think so. There were several Mary Coffeys listed. The others were all much younger.

You remembered correctly about the "Register of Soldiers and Patriots of the American Revolution Buried in Tennessee". Copied the pages you wished. Sorry--there are no Boones-Boons listed.

Did I ever do anything about your request for Vickers? See you asked about a will for Elias about 1770+. Burke was formed in 1777 from Rowan so there is a chance that there might be a will there. Elijah V. is in Wilkes Co. 1790. That is also better than Burke. (burned). Will leave that alone unless I hear from you again.

Buisness hasn't slowed down much this month. Keep hoping there will be a let up. Perhaps people are staying home and think they can do this instead. The letters keep rolling in and I have nowhere to send them for any faster replies etc.

Must get on - was a beautiful spring day and we sit inside working away.....

Dear Betty,

Received your letter of 15 January on the 19th and glad to hear from you. No, I wrote my letter on the 10th or 11th (think during Cowboy game) and noted wrong date on check when got ready to put it in envelope; however thought-it will be about 14th when arrives in Raleigh. It was week of big snow in Austin and elsewhere. For two days our city resembled those TV pictures of Atlanta. Our area was isolated even from emergency vehicles. Strange feeling. Don't believe I would like living in East during the winter. Played golf this week and it was like spring-lull before another storm?

So glad you like your new typewriter and to be able to change the keys-that would be great. Would like one that erases mistakes. Got new one about ten years ago that uses these cartridges; however last week could not believe how much they have gone up in price. Don't believe going to volunteer to type anymore club yearbooks. Ten years ago they were 1.95 for a cartridge. Now know the meaning of T&C. After received your answer looked at my new NC RESEARCH book and noted meaning of your files by abbreviations. Someday surely hope to make a trip to that wonderful library.

Today received two different applications of DAR members (almost identical information so they must be related) with ancestor Jesse Boone, NC. Enclosing applications for your use to see if you can find any copies of records (proofs) they have listed. I've checked with red ink pen what interested in receiving if library has information. I note member turned in record of payment for service, but never found out what exact service was rendered so possibly not in any record. Dar accepted it and sure SAR will also for Ron Morriss. Haven't written Boone library in Seattle to see if they have two Boone books I requested earlier in my letter to you. Thought I'd wait and see what you found.

Will you check Wills for name Elias Vickers Burke Co. in late 1770's? Does he have a son named Elias, also? Never thought I'd find g-g grandfather family from Burke county. Just happened to pick up small book Tax Lists for Burke county 1700's and there was name Elias Vickers. My g-g-grandfather received land in Marion county, Miss before 1812-do not know a thing about his parents. He married Elizabeth (Stribling?) born in South Carolina. Have done very little research on this line.

Was Burke county in Halifax District during Revolution?

As Lineage Research Chairman of chapter have form where proofs from deceased or resigned member can be obtained from Registrar's office. Have not requested the service and would prefer to get my own proofs if possible as they may take months to mail/ proofs I want belong to member still living. If you would like one of these forms will be glad to mail to you for your clients. This is new service and not widely advertised.

Mr. Israel sent zerox copy of Thomas Coffey book (you had made copies) and full copy of Yadkin Church Minutes. Nothing new for us for proofs except Hannah and Smith Coffey received by experiance. So could possibly use that as proof of marriage.

Had letter from lady in Andrews, NC who got my name from Murphy librarian. She sent copy of children of Athen and Mary Coffey, birth dates and to whom married. Sure could have used this back in the fall and I certainly appreciated it. Nothing new except full name of Athen. Two sister of Roxann married Byers, also. No date of marriage to Byers and Roxann.

You are so prompt you have probably done all the research, but thought I'd go ahead and send these two applications. No need to return copies. Just keep them-you might get a Boone request. I will be glad to get this research finished. Again, I want to thank you for all of your help.

Dear Betty,

I mailed a letter to you yesterday, and last night read the material from Nichols book carefully and for first time saw information where family of Coffey moved to Towns, GA after 1870. Had overlooked that when I wrote your letter. So glad to finally learn where the family moved. Thank you for those pages!!

Roxie's death certificate shows she was born 1858 so she would have been young and moved with the family so I believe she married in Towns County. Believe they could have moved before 1870 since couldn't find them on the census as spent 3 hours on that Clay and Cherokee census. Brother M. Smith came to Texas 1870 according to his confederate pension so there was a family change. Roxie married first time very young Opal said.

I haven't had a chance to call Ron about the good material I have for him. We were gone all day yesterday as I am having a foot problem, and last night several people called. Never call in the morning as that is their busy time with his condition.

Also believe both Athen and Mary McGuire Coffey buried in Towns county since no cemetary record for either in Clay county. Tribute just says "near Warne". Does your library have any marriage or cemetary records for this small county? I'll write county seat of Towns for marriage record. Written so many might as well try one more.

On family group sheet sent me by woman in Andrews of children of Athen states Byers boys possibly from Graham county. So they were not local Clay or Cherokee boys. Three Coffey girls married Byers brothers and probably from this county. Did not see name Hooper or Byers on the census. You know when you run those census over and over you become familiar with townspeople.

Thank you again for all your work. Our weather here is a beautiful 75 today and hope you are getting relief from the snow. Hopefully I can get to the library for a few hours tomorrow.

Found your name in N.C. RESEARCH book and that was a fine contribution you made to Archives and the public.

Thanks for all your search for marriage Coffey-Byers. I agree with you family must have moved to GA. No records in Monroe Co., TN for any Coffey's-this has been checked by Mrs. Starnes who answers mail for courthouse. I checked census for hours and did not find any members of family for 1870-1900 except Roxie Evans, Widow, in Brasstown, Clay county. According to tribute to Mary McGuire Coffey, Mary died 1903 near Warne. I believe she died in GA. Said she died at home of her dtr, Mrs. Will Hooper who was Emma. Ron had friend to check 1900 NC soundex (which Ron ordered) and no Will Hooper living N.C. in 1900.

I'm enclosing pages from book which shows Mrs. Will Hooper residence was Cleveland, GA-this is just over the line. Did you find anything in Towns? Cleveland is county seat for White county, next to Towns county. If your library has any marriage/cemetery records for White county if you have time might make a quick check. Should have sent this information earlier.

No record of Will or estate settlement for Joseph Byers in Clay county. Just thought of this idea. Opal said Joe and Smith Byers (sons of Roxie and Joseph Byers) are in 1900 NC census living in Brasstown, Clay county. She found them listed last summer and failed to make any notations. Both boys married.

Could you check soundex 1900 Clay county to see where Joe and Smith Byers were born(what state)? Might give us a clue. Full names-Ephram Smith Byers & Joseph Boon Byers-Opal said they were listed as Joe and Smith. Haven't looked at soundex in so long-does it give state where born? Our library has soundex only for TX and SC (I think). I had planned to look them on the census next time at the library. Opal said they were listed near Roxie. That Clay county census is difficult to read.

Small world-papers you sent said grandson of Jesse Boone lived Round Rock, TX. I live only 10 miles from Round Rock, and live in school district of Round Rock. Know lots of Boones listed in Texas Society Roster with Boone ancestors. None for Jesse in 4 volumes.

I'll check Round Rock telephone directory and Ron can call any Boone's listed.

Zerox machine here did not copy clear pages of estate Athen, and wanted a second copy as need for Opal and one for Ron.

I'm enclosing pages from book which shows Mrs. Will Hooper residence was Cleveland, GA - this is just over the line. Did you find anything in town? Cleveland is county seat for White County, next to Towns County. If your library has any marriage/obituary records for White County if you have time might make a quick check. Should have sent this information earlier.

Dear Betty,

Thank you for mailing the pay vouchers (2) and copies from Boone book. Enclosed is a check for \$16.90 and stamps for your postage. Was this amount due? Looking forward to the T&C copies.

Yes, I certainly see your point about the pay vouchers. May end up hanging them on the wall. Was that all the Jesse Boone's in the archives? In Vol. II PATRIOT INDEX it shows Jesse Boone performed patriotic service and not a soldier and approved after 1973. DAR has been very strict about their proofs from that time as I was Registrar from 75 to 76.

Saturday night I called Edna Patterson in Houston to discuss this matter of Halifax District. Edna was Regent and I was Registrar of our chapter with 400 members. Being a newcomer as Registrar, Edna had much experience and checked papers after I had checked the papers. She lived near me. She is knowledgeable about the holdings of the DAR office as she goes to Conference in Washington every year and spends a lot of time in the library and Registrar's office. So I wanted her advice. She's Lineage Chairman now.

Edna said DAR has file on each ancestor and there is something in that file that has definite proof Jesse Boone who died McMinn Co., TN was same who resided N.C. and performed patriotic service she was sure or DAR would not have approved Mrs. Green's 1974 paper. We do not know if her paper was first with this new ancestor. Being a farmer he might have provided supplies of grain or horses to the army. Now whether SAR would accept proof of patriotic service with pay voucher from Halifax District is another matter except DAR does work closely with SAR in opening their file case of proofs.

I may write for will of Boone and compare one endorsed voucher handwriting. If have to start line of McGuire where left off--believe I'll take a vacation first. No problem with Opal's paper. Our chapter Registrar told me today DAR turned down her daughter's paper for lack of proof. Daughter tried a new line and work was done by someone else.

Will you check 1900 Soundex NC for residence of Mary (Polly) Coffey age around 79 born TN and copy census with her listing. Bill me.

I've checked 1900 Towns County, GA. Found Will Hooper and wife Emily living Hiawassee District--no Mary. Roxie and sons living Brasstown, Clay county. Checked all of Brasstown again. Geo. Kimsey age 35 living next door to Roxie in 1900. He is one who wrote tribute after Mary died but did not give date, but said she died Warne. Our 1900 census Clay county does not have community of Warne--unless mixed up with another county. If you are ever searching Hooper's born NC try Towns County. Many Hooper's and Nichols.

Does your library have book ROSTER OF SOLDIERS AND PATRIOTS BURIED IN TENNESSEE? If so, would you check to see if Jesse Boone is listed. If so, please mail title page and page of information. If it has index would like index only listing MCGUIRE and STEVENSON/STEPHENSON. This might be a new book as saw it advertised last year. My title listing is from memory.

A TN University loaned Israel Boone book to Ron thru inter-loan. This is an excellent book and best numbering system I've seen in book that size. Wish the information as to residences of Athan Coffey could be corrected.

Don't wait for T&C copies if you get census and copy from book-please mail and I'll reimburse you. Hope you will have time to do it.

Oh yes, found Athan Coffey and family in 1870 TownsCounty. Roxie is listed as Hannah with right age. No other Coffey's except son, Athan next door.

Mary Beth Lozo told me Thursday she was mailing you a research project. I wrote her last month thanking her for recommending you to me and you had helped me a lot. Know that will keep you busy. She has done a lot of work on that line.

When you mail the T&C records will you write the information on slip of paper as to what papers show or what records do they represent. I've never seen copies of those papers. Only thing I've seen is bulletin put out by Archives on vouchers. Since you have worked with these records, could you write out exactly what it says on the records.

Have you come across any other Jesse B. who lived in Halifax District?????

A "Rushing" letter. Yes, there is another Jesse Boon listed in the 1790 census in Northampton Co. This is in the Halifax area. Then there is the one listed in Burke Co. The Northampton Jesse shows 1-4-5-0-7.

I can see how someone who doesn't know the state might not question the Jesse Boon proof. I sent you all the Jesse pay vouchers that are on file. The certified copies (typed) of the T.&C. entries should be ready shortly. It will all be clearly defined for you.

Don't really like to shoot down anyone's lines. However, have a few times. Some people just can't be honest about anything. One interesting one was a deed made up out of "whole cloth". They claimed that son was in co ----- and father (Rev. Vet.) was in co -----, across the county line and that son received his property from father. Not so. It was a work of art!

There are pay vouchers for "J. Boon-e" in the books, but, we all know how many names begin with "J.". No proof there. The Jesse vouchers don't have a chance to walk away. They are kept in the stacks and you can only see them at the desk in a clerk's hands.

Will carry your file folder in my case and hope I can get to it before a terrible amount of time has past. Am absolutely snowed under right now. Seriously considering a break down. We had one researcher die last fall, two are quitting right now, Helen Leary has been tied up with her husband's heart attack etc. etc. and there weren't enough of us in the first place.

Yes, I remember hearing from your friend sometime recently. Everything stays a blur. Think she was waiting to hear from me or something. Would know if I would take the time to look in the file pile. Oh well, spring will come.

Also, late at night The typewriter and I really are getting along so much better. Too bad the correcting part of it doesn't refer to my spelling errors. The more old records I read and record, the worse the spelling gets.

Dear Betty,

Your records arrived yesterday and delighted to receive all the material. I know you went to the library in sleet and snow to gather this excellent material. Ron will be delighted to know I have pages from two Boone books as he has requested books for inter-loan; however you know library isn't going to loan the books. Would like to see copy of Alice Boone's book myself-it must be a big book. Ron is very interested in Boone family. So glad we have finally found a patriot for him and Opal.

Our chapter Registrar thought I was little daffy to submit Opal's name for membership when I didn't have a patriot for her. Told Hazel if residence was N.C. in mid 1850's-sure a patriot would be found. Part was wishful thinking, but had to come up with some answer. Seriously, I've done a little research in that state and people did not move like other states. It would have been disappointing to have done all this work and no patriot.

All need now is proof of service for Jesse Boone. By now you probably have record of payment for service for Jesse Boone. Our letters crossed in the mail. Mailed you two applications of members who went in on J. Boone. Nell Green states proof found for Jesse Boone Vol. X p.3 Folio 4 #376,#7928. Sure hope that is from files of N.C. Archives. Will appreciate your getting record of payment. As you noted DAR wrote on paper "paid for services rendered 1783--type of service unknown?"

Was payment made Halifax District? What do you make of this information. N.C. RESEARCH says Halifax did not include Burke County. I'm going to use it anyway since DAR accepted it as proof. From papers you sent, J. Boone received land grand in TN 160 acres in 1824. Could this have been for service in Rev. War?

Could you mail me pages from book DESCENDANTS OF ISRAEL BOONE GR 929.2 B724B all it says about Israel Boone (whose wife unknown) and his son, Jesse Boone. Israel Boone was son of Squire Boone. Opal may join DAC and will use Squire Boone as patriot. He is already established. She can use these pages as proofs. You have mailed me pages 17,27, 43. DAR papers mentions pp 25-29, 42, 15,19,64, 105, and 1-5.

Thank you for searching for service of Thomas Coffey. Ron has all the proof now except service and perhaps someday he may come across something in a book or thru correspondence. Up to now it seems no one has written of a service for him. He is collecting all data on Coffey family and taking line as far back as possible for his own records. Coffey's qualify for other historical groups. Opal can use Coffey line for Colonial Dames 17th century. Ron is interested in taking all his lines as far as possible. The Evans line will be difficult one as there are so many of them. I'm not doing any work on that line except look up something on a census.

You hit the jackpot with all those Byers, and what a surprise to find another Brasstown, GA so close to Clay county Brasstown. After reading your letter today checked my old atlas under 1900. Brasstown was listed as town in GA. Brasstown, NC is not on my road or atlas maps and last month wote county clerk at Clay and asked where it was located. She answered it was still a community about six miles from Warne. Genealogy is a never ending surprise and learning lesson.

Most delighted (and so was Ron) to get the census 1880 you mailed that shows Roxie's age. Since census taken in June she was born 1857 as Bible record in Boone book. Also shows her a widow and has Athan and Mary. Byers had their own community. I've written Town county for marriage record Roxie, and going to write for death or burial record of Mary Coffey.

Will look up the 1870 census Brasstown GA here. Our library has all 1900 census in U.S. believe Mrs. Jordan said. Am enclosing d.c. for Roxie. This and the tribute is all the information I started with--you can see how much you have helped me. Roxie was a tall beautiful woman in later life from a picture I've seen of her. She did not have an easy life rearing her family as a widow.

Looking forward to receiving service payment or whatever it is for Jesse Boone. You have been very prompt in mailing my records and know you have put others on the back burner in order to gather my things.

Mailed you a letter on 28th requesting additional pages from Alice Boone's book for more material on Jesse and Israel Boone. Please add to my request of letter January 27:

DESCENDANTS OF ISRAEL BOONE by Alice Boone GR 929 B724 information on family of Athan Coffey. Family #59. Might be additional information. Doubt if it carried on down to Roxie since she left N.C. If it does include her family, please add pages.

given, although it is stated that they were nephews and niece of Daniel Boone. The above history gives the following information regarding Anna and Jesse Boone:—

ANNA BOONE, sister of Jesse and Israel, married William Coffee. She lived to be nearly 100 years old. Had a grandson Patrick Coffee, who built a house on Mulberry Creek, Caldwell Co., N. C., in 1877, at which time Anna (Boone) Coffee was living, and talked to the man building the house (p. 84-85).

JESSE BOONE, brother of Anna, is mentioned as having lived four miles from Schull's Mills and two miles from Kelsey Post Office, Wautauga Co., North Carolina. The house is no longer standing, but the chimney foundation is still shown as his. There is also record of a Jesse Boone having lived just west of the Blue Ridge one mile west of Kelsey P. O. on Boone's Fork of Wautauga River. On 8 July, 1823, Jesse Boone conveyed to William and Alexander Elrod for \$600, 350 acres of land on Flanner's Fork of New River. (Deed registered in Book "M," page 391 of Ash Co., N. C.; recorded in 1841.) Jesse Boone married Sarah McMahan (p. 180).

Jesse Boone, according to his great-grandson or Smith Coffee (b. 1832 in Caldwell Co., N. C.), had three daughters; one of these, named Celia Boone, married Buck Craig; another, Hannah Boone, married Smith Coffee; and the third is not named. Smith Coffee moved to Cherokee Co., in 1838, and settled on Hiwassee River four miles above Murphy, after which he moved to Peach Tree Creek, where he died a year later (1839), his family returning to Caldwell. Smith Coffee had a son Smith Coffee (b. 1832), who returned in 1858 to Cherokee and lived on a farm adjoining that of George Hays on Valley River. Here he had a fight with Hays concerning a sow, just before the Civil War. Nevertheless when the war began he joined Hays' Company, which became Co. "H" of the 2nd N. C. Cavalry (p. 84-85).

From this point on the family can be traced through the records of an old Family Bible owned by Mrs. William Hooper of Cleveland, Ga., from which Bible the following table was compiled. In this old record the name is spelled Coffey, instead of Coffee, as above.

JOHN BOONE, b. in York Co., Pa., abt. 1755; d. 17 July, 1835; m. 1787 or 1788, in Augusta Co., Va., Elizabeth Alford (d. 15 Feb., 1841).

The pension report of John Boone states that he was a nephew of Daniel Boone. Consequently he must have been a son of either Israel or Jonathan Boone, as Daniel's other brothers had no sons John. At the date of his enlistment he resided in York Co., Pa.; enlisted in 1777 and served three years under Capt. Spanzler, Pa.; engaged in the Battle of Camden. On 20 Aug., 1833, when a resident of Monroe Co., Va. he applied for a pension, which claim was allowed. At that time he was 78 years old, and he died 2 years later.

This may be very difficult to find as he possibly did not serve in army due to his age, but hopefully performed some service. Thomas Coffey moved to Wilkes County, NC between 1775-1780 according to book DESC. THOMAS COFFEY. Smith Coffey, his son, born 1776 in Albermarle, VA from one source. His service might be in Albermarle, VA, but don't go to that trouble to search. Could you check in your library for his service or committee he might have served in Wilkes Co? Thomas settled on Yadkin River Wilkes and died there 1825. Wives: 1) Elizabeth Smith and 2) Sally Fields. Children: Betsy, John, Thomas, James, Polly, Smith, Martha, Wm., Reuben, Elijah, Sally and Jesse.

DAR says service can be from 1775-1783. I've copies for you from my handbook varied qualifications for service for membership in DAR and you may want to keep this copy for your files for future use. Will need title page or source from where information was obtained.

Michael McGuire

Yes, I am interested in learning more about parents of Michael McGuire, but do not believe there will be time in a day to search for this at this time. Michael was born 1800 Blount Co., TN and in 1880 Cherokee census states his parents born in Maryland. So his family line goes to Maryland and could go on to Virginia. His wife, Mary(Stevenson)McGuire born 1799 Blount Co., TN says on 1880 census her parents born in Virginia. I believe father of Michael is Nicholas who was in Monroe Co., TN by 1826 and received grant from Tenn.

Jesse Boone

Father of Hannah Boone who married Smith Coffey. At last meeting of DAR was looking at DAR PATRIOT INDEX Vol 2 (which I do not have a copy) and found JESSE BOONE as established patriot. Sent for application paper of a member, and I'm enclosing copy. As you can see she does not state what patriotic service performed-only refers you to paper of possible relative. I've sent for paper of those DAR members by numbers. I do not understand his residence as Halifax county, NC during revolution. My information says he lived in Rowan and then moved to Burke and then moved to McMinn where he died. Wonder if he could have served as a member of a Congress in Halifax?

For Opal I can refer to this paper for proof of service, although will need the actual proof for Ron for SAR. If time permits you can check this for me for proof. When I hear from DAR and learn anything new will write you. It might be listed in the book JESSE BOONE AND HIS DESCENDANTS. When Mrs. Copeland said "Patriot" I assume she means he did not fight in the war, but performed patriotic service.

I will write DAR to see if Thomas Coffey has been submitted as a patriot for their records after the two volumes were published. Ron is corresponding with a Mr. Israel from Alabama who has researched this line for 7 years and even called Ron. Mr. Israel did not know of revolutionary war service for Thomas and has promised to send him much material on this line. He is descended from one of children of Athen and Mary Coffey, also.

Opal did not know her grandmother Roxanna was named Hannah. Had I known in the beginning it would have helped so much. Received some information she was named Hannah Boone Roxann Coffey. Still lacking some marriage proofs and death records so have listed things needed on another sheet.

You have helped me very much and I am anxious to get this application completed so I can return to my own research. I have unfinished work in N.C. research of my own I want you to help me. Keep hoping someday can get to the library in Raleigh, but my husband has had 2 hip replacement surgeries and our only son lives in Los Angeles so we head west on vacations. My husband would like to go to N.C. to golf-he doesn't care for genealogy but knows I want so much to visit the library.

If you could see my study you would wonder how I ever find anything. My husband is so neat in his office and my filing system is incredible. This is last year I'm going to be lineage research chairman of our chapter so can devote time to my own work. Of course, not expected to do the work for the people. It meant so much to Ron and Opal thought I would try to find a patriot so they could join these organizations. Ron is amazing that he has lived these 30 some odd years in view of his paralyzed condition.

(h) Membership in other patriotic societies, although helpful, is not sufficient proof of descent or service, since the requirements of societies differ.

5. Acceptable Service

(a) Signer of Declaration of Independence.

(b) Military or naval service.

(1) Battle of Point Pleasant, October 10, 1774.

(2) Service from April 19, 1775 to November 26, 1783.

(c) Civil service under the Colonies from April 19, 1775 to November 26, 1783, inclusive.

(d) Patriotic service by men or women during the Revolutionary period, including —

(1) Member of committees made necessary by the war, such as Committee of Correspondence, Inspection and Safety; Committee to care for soldiers' families; including Committees from six months before the Battle of Point Pleasant which furthered the cause of the Colonies.

(2) Any pledge to support the cause of the Colonies, such as signing the Oath of Fidelity and Support, the Oath of Allegiance, Articles of Association, or the Association Test, Non-Consumption and Non-Importation Agreement, etc.

(3) Members of all Continental Congresses.

(4) Furnishing a substitute for military service.

(5) Signers of Mecklenburg Declaration, 1775; Albemarle, Virginia, Declaration; and similar declarations. Signers of petitions addressed to and recognizing the authority of the provisional and new state governments. Persons accepting obligations or acting under direction of the provisional and new state governments, such as persons directed to hold elections, to oversee road constructions, to collect provisions, etc.

(6) Members of Boston Tea Party and other Tea Parties; Kaskaskia Campaign; Galvez Expedition; Cherokee Expedition.

(7) Doctor, nurse or others rendering aid to the wounded and ministers known to be in sympathy with the Colonies, either by sermon, speech or action.

(8) Defenders of forts and frontiers; rangers.

(9) Prisoners of war, including those on British ship "Old Jersey" and other prison ships.

(10) Rendering material aid, such as furnishing supplies with or without remuneration; lending money to the Colonies, munitions makers and gunsmiths; or anything which furthered the Cause.

6. Proofs of service

(a) The service, unless otherwise identified with the ancestor, must be identified with the place of residence of the ancestor during the Revolution.

(b) A clear statement of the service, with proof giving the full name, not merely an initial, of the ancestor must be furnished.

(c) Source of information as to service:

(1) Published Revolutionary Records of the various Colonies.

(2) The historical section of a town or county history published prior to 1890.

(3) Lists of Revolutionary soldiers or services or accounts thereof compiled entirely from official sources. Such lists may be in a separate publication or included in a volume containing additional material.

(4) Unpublished records, such as —

(a) Records of the various states, or of the Federal Government (such as from rosters, lists, pensions, etc.)

(b) Records taken from town or county records, giving the exact entry of service as it appears on the record of that town or county.

(c) Old tombstones, erected at the time of the death of the soldier or patriot, stating he was a Revolutionary soldier or otherwise stating his service.

(d) Obituary notices of Revolutionary soldiers.

(e) Contemporary letters from the persons serving or from someone receiving the information directly from the person who performed the service.

(d) In the case of published records, the author, title of the book, date of publication, volume and page number, and in the case of a

privately printed work, or one of limited circulation, where and by whom printed, must be stated. In the latter case, it is advisable to furnish photocopies of the title page and page on which the pertinent data appear, since such work may not be in the DAR Library.

(e) In the case of unpublished records:

(1) If from an official Federal or State source, such as a State Library or Archives Department or Adjutant General, the original certificate or letter from such department or officer stating the service or a photocopy thereof must be furnished.

(2) If from a town or county record, a photocopy or a certified transcript of such record by the town or county official or the person who made such transcript must be furnished.

(3) If from other sources, a photocopy or a certified transcript made by the person who made such transcript must be furnished.

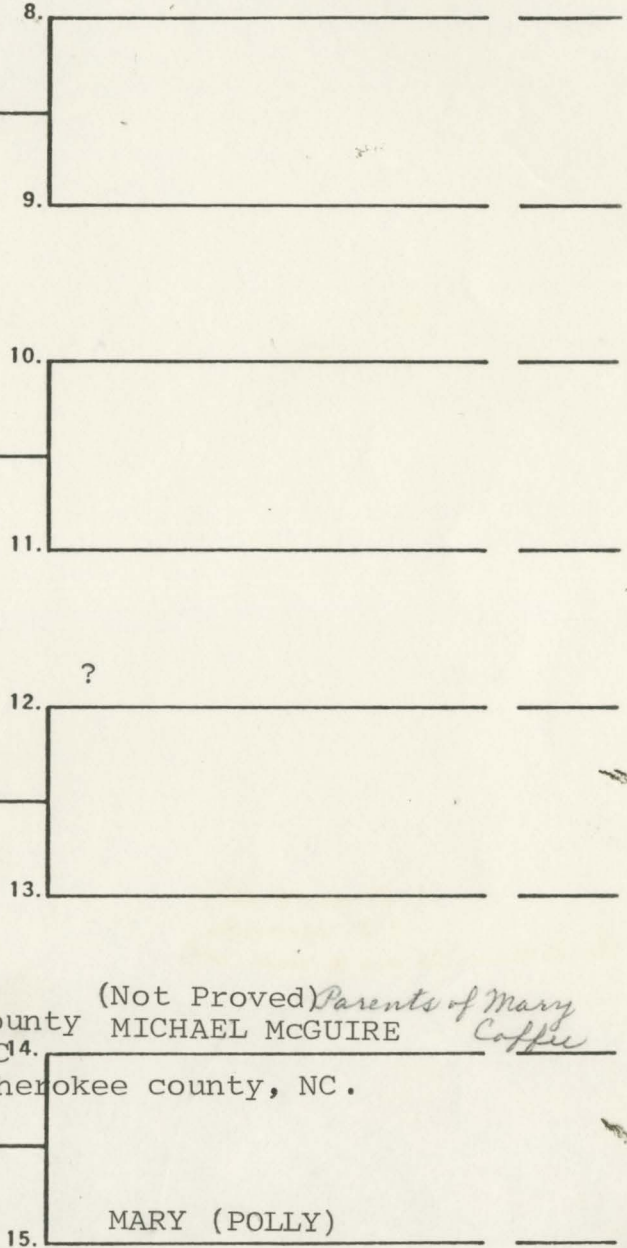

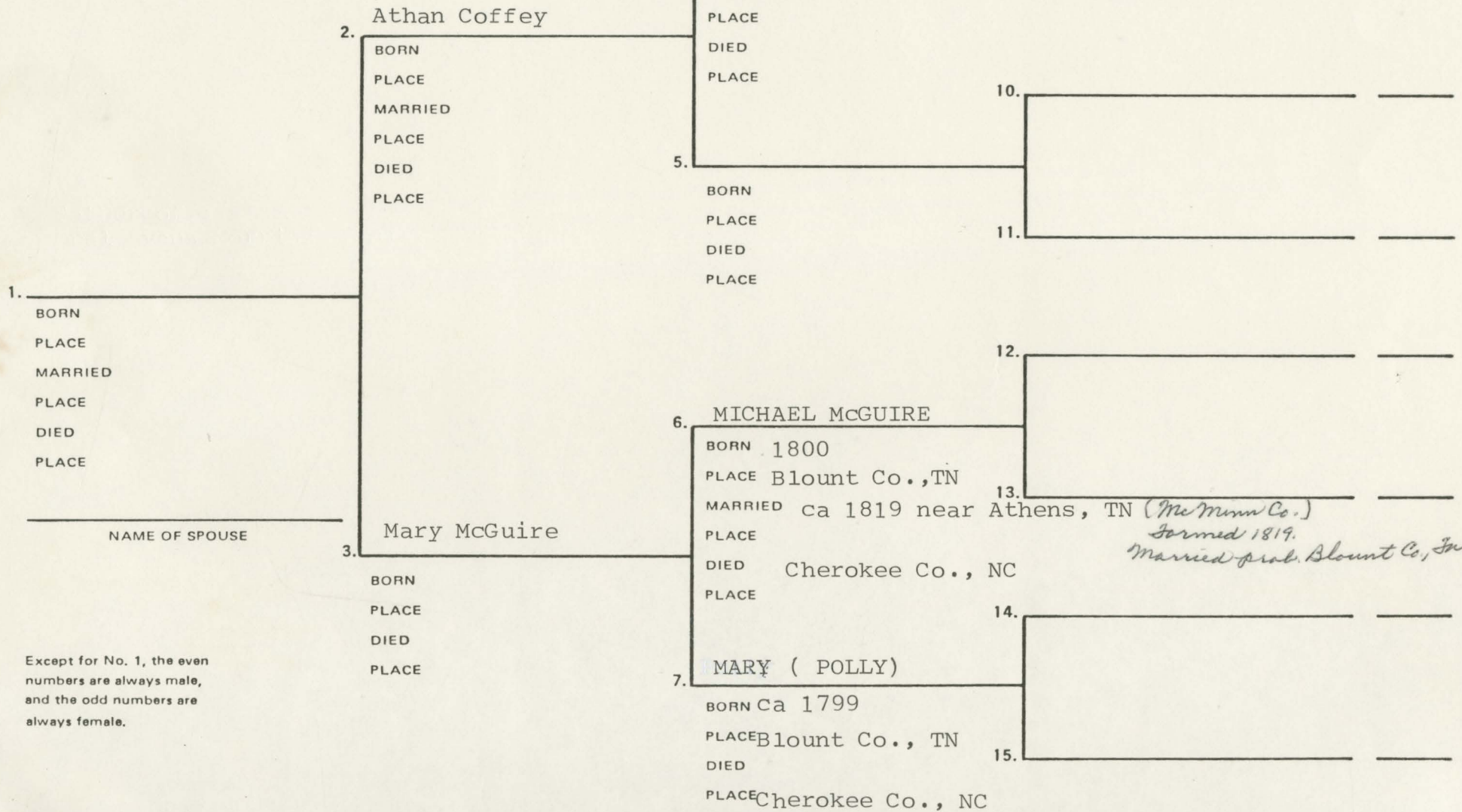

Dear Betty,

Thank you for your letter of 11/14 and would like for you to do research on the Coffey line for me. This is the line of my step-sister, Opal Evans Morriss and her son, Ron, as they are prospective members of DAR and SAR. They are unable to do research at the library as Ron is paralyzed from a swimming accident and his father just had heart surgery. His father has to take him to the library in the van. Our library has limited materials on western North Carolina for this time period. I'm giving this Coffey line a try-if it doesn't work out-then will try the McGuire line. There are so many Evans in the PATRIOT INDEX from S.C. I'm Lineage Research Chairman for my DAR chapter and DAR said they will try to help me, but I need, I feel, to go as far as I can to get the best help.

I will be responsible for expenses of this research and since it isn't my line and not sure it will lead to an established patriot for DAR I would like to set the limit of \$100.00 not including copies. At that time see where we are and may have more research and have to change lines. From the DAR applications I've ordered believe this line will lead to established Coffey patriot from VA or NC. The big problem is finding proof of parent to child.

Worth Ray says in AUSTIN COLONY PIONEERS (Texas) which is probably in your library as it is excellent book of people who settled TX "The name COFFEE or COFFEY was spelled both ways on the old records in both TN and TX, and having spent some time in a study of this family, the writer is of the opinion that they were the same clan." He has a summary on N.C. Coffey families *(early 1800's)*

Discard family chart I mailed earlier. Will attempt to write what I know about the line so far. Family tradition says Coffey family related to Daniel Boone. This was told Opal by her grandmother Roxie Ann Coffey Evans. Also a Coffey in the family held a high office in the state-the same for Evans. They would really like to know where related to Daniel Boone.

Daughter of Roxie Ann Byers Evans still lives in San Diego-Myrtle in 90's and has been of some help but a little hazy with dates and other information from dtr of Roxie who lived near her in Texas and from Opal's father. Opal did not live in same town with her grandmother but knew her and enjoyed her so much.

JAMES P. EVANS

I got the correct marriage date to Roxie Ann from Clay county. Some dates given to Opal by family have been off by 2 years. Clay county has no Will for James P. Evans so will use the date of his death that was given to Opal. Family knows little about him as he died before 1900 except from GA, older than Roxie, had been married before and his wife died. Family says his name was James K. Polk Evans.

I borrowed 1870 census and found a James P. Evans living in Brasstown, born in GA, wife Sarah, and several children. They lived near several Coffey families. That's where I got date of birth and believe this is him. Opal is not sure as his son Joeb (or Jobe) is not listed. She did have an Uncle Bob and a Robt.S is listed as one of children. I will try to find him in 1850 census now that I know his father is Robert Evans.

ROXIE ANN COFFEY

This is grandmother to Opal. Her death certificate says she was born Sept. 19, 1858 Cherokee Co., NC and her parents Nathan Coffey and mother's maiden name: McGuire. Our problem is she isn't listed on 1860 census from copy sent me by Murphy Public Library. We cannot read age on 1900 census as ink smeared.

Our 1860 census is out of focus here. I cannot find her, Athan, or Mary Coffey (mother) in Clay or Cherokee on 1870 or 1880 census Clay or Cherokee. By 1870 most Coffey's living Clay county except for 2 30 year olds. Either I missed them and that is very possible or family moved--same true for 1880. I would like to find Roxie living with family in 1870 for date of birth, if not, 1880 under name of Byers.

Roxie Ann Coffey married a Mr. BYERS before 1881. Just learned that from Opal when we were talking about we couldn't find marriage of Roxie Coffey to Evans--they were writing under wrong name. Roxie had 2 sons named Joe and Smith Byers. Smith Byers named for her older brother, Smith Coffey (the one who came to TX after Civil War.) He died and she married Evans in 1881. On the census I've only found Roxie on 1900 census.

We are confused why 1900 census shows children of James Evans shows James Evans born NC. Opal's father is Frank Evans age 6 on 1900 census.

Roxie came to Grayson county, TX with step-son bringing her children after 1900. We do not know if she had relatives there. A well known Holland Coffee settled Grayson county in 1838. Perhaps other Coffey's there--he was born Burke Co., NC.

Marriage Record from Clay County:

James P. Evans married R.A. Byers July 17, 1881 at home of Polly McGuire. (No doubt Athan deceased by this time.) It shows parents of bride: Father: Athan Coffey:: Mother: Polly McGuire. Gives parents of James Evans, also--our first definite information.

Relative had in possession "Tribute to Mary McGuire" apparently written about 1903. Someone typed it in Hayesville and sent it to family. This is mother of Roxie. I found author of this living Brasstown in 1880 as young boy.

MARY MCGUIRE

I need proof she is daughter of Michael and Polly (Mary) McGuire. Since I feel quite sure I added them on the chart. Baptist religion. See "Tribute to Mary (McGuire) Coffey".

ATHAN COFFEY

Believe his family came from Burke or Wilkes. I checked all Coffey's I could find 1850, 1870, and 1880 and all born NC and parents born N.C. except one whose parents born VA. This is VA line as first Coffey came to America early 1700's.

In 1840 as you can see from census only Squire and Levi Coffey in Cherokee county. Only McGuire is Michael Cherokee county 1840. I do not know if Squire or Smith Coffey is father of ATHAN. SQUIRE is not listed in NC census 1850. Where di Athan get his money for property as shown on 1850 census? He was well off for a young man.

HISTORY OF CHEROKEE COUNTY by Mrs. Freel says SMITH COFFEY buried Peachtree, NC-date 1839. I feel Smith Coffey related to Athan since that is family name. Roxie's brother went by name M. Smith Coffey in his adult life.

Mrs. Freel says Athan and Michael McGuire lived in Peachtree (near Murphy). Athan still alive 1865. She just mentions him as being on a board. She has excellent book but no index. In the book are cemeteries of county but found no Coffey's or McGuires. So they are buried in other cemeteries and hope your library has copies. They are not in WPA list.

I had deed Michael McGuire sold Athan 77 acres for \$350. 24 Oct. 1854. On 1850 census they are farming neighbors. Most children of Athan and Mary have McGuire names.

Athan says born Caldwell county, NC. Do you think he meant "present day Caldwell county"? - *There is a C. community in Mich. + a township in Catawba Co. which find for him.*

You can tell by pedigree chart many items missing and hope you can find some death records for Athan Coffey, Michael McGuire, and would like death date of Mary (Polly) McGuire and double check for cemetery record Mary Coffey in Clay county. McGuires lived in Cherokee county all their life.

Try to find Will or Settlement of Estate for Michael McGuire for proof Mary Coffey is his daughter. Same for Athan Coffey that Roxie Ann is his daughter. Tribute says he is buried Clay county.

On 1880 soundex try to locate Roxie Ann Byers and please copy (by hand or micro-print). *B620*

When you get microfilm copies please order 3 of each.

Please do use books as much as possible and copy title page. Hopefully the new book of newspaper record from Asheville will be of help. Look up book THOMAS COFFEY AND HIS DESCENDANTS by L. Coffey. This was given as reference on DAR paper.

I hope you can find father of (and mother) of Athan Coffey. I realize in genealogy research there are no guarantees and especially when courthouses burned.

Please check 1860 Cherokee census family of Athan Coffey and see if public library of Murphy might have left off Roxie. Athan family # 138. Wonder if your copy of 1900 census would be more clear to show her age and date of birth.

You can tell by the chart all that needs to be done and I'm sorry we have to back-track for records before going ahead with Coffey line. You will probably find some errors in this research and please correct it. When you are doing someone's line and not you own-it isn't the same.

Yes, I saw the book NC RESEARCH: GENEALOGY AND LOCAL HISTORY advertised in Tri-State Trader and it is excellent. It doesn't help me that much by correspondence. I resent your state library charging out of state correspondence \$2-especially if they cannot (or do not) have the answer. Johnson's book NORTH CAROLINA GENEALOGICAL REFERENCE has helped me the most for correspondence. Some of his references under county like his magazines don't have material as states, but it is a very good book. Wish someone would update it. Wilmington Public Library has helped me a lot. Neither book is in our state library and I'm giving your brochure to our librarian. You wouldn't believe the people researching N.C. and we don't have too many books on the state. Clayton in Houston has many books and I've missed library since we left there four yrs ago.

I lived in Fayetteville, NC at end of WWII while Bill was at Ft. Bragg and enjoyed it very much. At the time I was not aware I had N.C. ancestors.

Enclosed a check for \$50. and hope I haven't completely confused you. I'll mail the balance when you advise me.

If you have any questions please write me or call me and put it on my bill including postage.

No marriage record for Michael McGuire about 1819 in Madisonville, TN. Heard from a lady who does the courthouse research and she has the records. Said records were lost until 1870. Would you like her address? I wrote courthouse over a month ago. Heard from her last week. I've written Blount county and never heard from McMinn county, TN.

If your library has MONROE COUNTY, TN RECORDS Volume I by Boyer, Reba please check index for any information on Michael McGuire (before 1839 when he came to Cherokee, NC) or Nicholas who might be his father. I'm searching for his father. Volume II of his book has material on Michael's brother of Madisonville with same McGuire names. I would like to find maiden name of Polly, his wife. Her parents born VA. The 1860 census giving county born was a big help.

Someone has walked out with our Vol I of above book. We have no security in our state library-only in the archives.

I note in Johnson's book a Genealogy of Reed Family. Some Reed's were in census. Wish I knew who Coffey children married but have no record.

Will you kindly allow space in your paper to say a few words to the memory of Mrs. Mary Coffey, who died last Tuesday at the home of Will Hooper of Warne. Of the birth and early history of this good woman, we know but little, or nothing, but, suffice it to say, that she was of an excellent family (the McGuires).

She was the wife of the late Athan (?) Coffey, who died near Warne, some years ago. If this writer is not mistaken, she was the mother of nine children whom she reared to manhood and womanhood with only one exception.

Mrs. Coffey lived a life above reproach, and for many years has been a consistent member of the Baptist church. She was kind, gentle, affable - always full of sunshine and liveliness. Many of our boyhood days have been brightened by her cheerfulness, and it is a fond recollection to us.

She is no more here: she has gone up higher. Our loss is her eternal gain. She is with her husband, two sons, and a daughter, beyond the veil. To the bereaved family we would say: Follow in her footsteps and meet her in the "Sweet Bye and Bye", for -

Why should we mourn departing friends,
Or shake at death's alarm?
Tis but the voice that Jesus sends
To call them to His arms.

McCombs of Burke Co., N. C., moved to Cherokee Co. on horseback. Her parents had given her slaves and several hundred acres of land located on Hiwassee River and Peachtree Creek, five miles above Murphy. There they remained through life, rearing a family of 10 children.

During the War Between the States period their home was raided many times by Yankee soldiers. During the war, Mr. McCombs had the responsibility of looking after the families of the absent Confederate soldiers in this vicinity and thereafter was known as Col. Robert Dale McCombs. Descendants live at the old home place.

McDONALD—Jonathan McDonald, an early settler to Cherokee Co., b. Apr. 28, 1816, fought in the War Between the States, Co. H, 7th Tenn. Infantry. He m. Marriet Davidson of the Valley Town section, Oct. 7, 1838. Children: James, Atwood, Ill.; Jesse, Dahlonega, Ga.; John, Ogretta, N. C.; Thomas Clingman, Murphy; Nancy Dockery, and Sally Palmer of the Hanging Dog section.

Thomas C., b. July 29, 1856, d. July 8, 1921, was the youngest. His mother died at his birth and he was brought up by his older sister, Nancy Dockery. He had the misfortune to lose his leg when he was fourteen years of age, when it became entangled in the wheel of the wagon in which he was riding. He attended school at Hayesville, where Geo. Truett was a classmate, and North Ga. College, Dahlonega. He taught school for a few years, served as register of deeds eighteen years, representative in 1909, Chairman County Commissioners, 1914-1917. He was tax collector and county auditor, and again representative in 1919.

He m. Louisa White, Feb. 2, 1882. Fourteen children were born, seven living: Mrs. H. S. Whitehard, Winston-Salem, N. C.; Mrs. J. B. Mulkey, Murphy; Mrs. Chad Sawyer, Murphy; Mrs. Walter Dockery, Hiwassee Dam; Este B., Asheville; and Thomas C., and Howard of Murphy.

McGUIRE—(Sam McGuire). Michael McGuire married and moved from near Athens, Tenn., into the Peachtree community of Cherokee Co., N. C., about 150 years ago. He reared a large family in this community, and died at the age of 96 years, never having a doctor to treat him.

In 1838, he served with the State Militia and assisted in the removal of the Indians. He entered a large tract of land in the Peachtree community, paying the government \$1.00 per acre for it.

Two sons of Michael McGuire served in the Confederate Army and were killed at the Battle of Bull Run. They were buried on the battlefield.

Thomas McGuire, son of Michael McGuire, remained in the Peachtree community rearing a large family until most of them were grown and married. Then he with many of the family removed to near Madisonville, Tenn., but returned to Cherokee Co. before his death. He had three sons at Andrews, a dau. in the Peachtree community, and one son, Joseph McGuire, survives and lives at Andrews.

Josiah McGuire, son of Michael McGuire, remained in the Peachtree community, and reared a large family. When all of his children were mature

and married, he and all his offspring, except John McGuire, removed to Oklahoma and Texas. Two of the sons, Mike and Jeff McGuire, had previously removed to Texas.

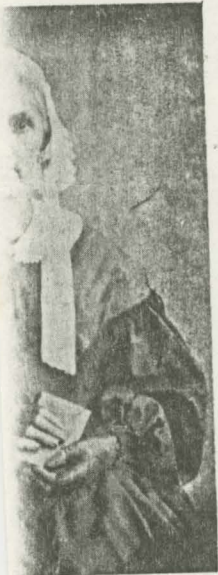

McLelland migrated to Iredell Co. for a time, then came to Cherokee Co. in 1840 and settled in present Murphy near the Henry House on Tenn. St. He was a blacksmith and made his wife waffle irons to use on the fireplace. He owned a large plantation and fourteen slaves. In his will he gave his wife and each of his eleven children a slave. He stated that Milus and Isaac should be sold for \$1000.00 each.
