Dear Mrs. Shelton,

Your pedigree chart and surname cards have been filed and queries will appear in a future journal. We hope someone will contact you about this.

We are sending some information about our Association and books available that may help you in your research.

The index to "Joseph Winston His Entry Book, Surry County, NC Land Entries-1778-1781" (see enclosed flyer) gives the names of Jacob and Thomas Gallion/Galyean several times. Most was this land was on Deep Creek or "waters of" which is now Yadkin County. (Yadkin was formed from Surry 1850). Jacob entered for a grant of 320 acres Surry Co., on waters of Forbush and Deep Creek on Nov. 11, 1778; Laurence Smith's entry adjoined Jacob Gallion's on both sides main fork Forbis (Forbush) Creek in 1779. There are several other entries for Gallions.

Thomas Gallion entered for land on Deep Creek 1778, etc. This book might be of help to you. You might want to write to the Register of Deeds Office, P.O. Box 303, Dobson, NC 27017 to obtain copies of deeds of your families.

The early court records also mention Gallions in the index: Amos, Jacob, Jacob Jr., John, Josiah, Peggy(Williams), Thomas and Younger.

We also had a Bean Shoals & Bean Creek here which may have been named for the Bean family. We haven't searched for the origin of the name. From the NC Gazetteer: "Bean Shoals, a succession of rocks and loose stones in Yadkin River on Surry-Yadkin line, approx. 1 mi south of the confluence of Ararat River. The shoals measure 2 mi in length. The communities of Shoals (Surry County) and Bean Shoals (Yadkin County) are nearby. Mentioned as early as 1819 in a survey of the rivers of NC".

Beans in court records index are: Keziah and William. Its difficult to distinguish Bean and Dean from the old handwriting.

Since Deep Creek is in present Yadkin County you might wish to write to their Historical/Genealogical Society: P.O. Box 1250, Yadkinville, NC 27055. From the NC Gazetteer: "Deep Creek is formed in south Yadkin Co. by the junction of North Deep Creek and South Deep Creek. It flows SE into Yadkin River. Appears as Fifth Creek on the Collet map, 1770. Forbush Creek rises in N Yadkin Co. and flows SE into Logan Creek. Forbush, community in central Yadkin Co. on Logan Creek."

The Yadkin Co. Historical Soc. mentioned above has Historical maps for sale if you wish to inquire. The map locates many early settlers who had both land grants and deeds. A Historical map for Surry may be ordered from the Register of Deeds, Surry County. Be sure to ask for the index also if you order a map. It is a great help.

Hello:

The second query was probably mine as well. Let me update you on what I have learned since posting this query.

My Nancy Jane Dickens who married William Jackson Goodson, son of Leander Goodson and Nancy Brannock July 23, 1891 in Surry Co., NC, was the daughter of Albert Dickens and Jincy Johnson. They were married Mar 18, 1854 in Surry Co. Albert is the son of Etheldred Dickens and Elizabeth Crook. Jincy is the daughter of Kimbro Johnson and Quinnett Pace. This is as far as I have gotten, although I do have some siblings and dates. At this time I believe that Etheldred was the brother of Julius and Dudley Dickens.

Thank you so much for your interest. I would appreciate hearing from you should you have anything to add to these.

Amanda was born 18 Jun 1841 in Greene Co., TN, dau. of Baxter Bean b. 1799 and Margaret Leach Bean who was b. 15 Nov 1804. Margaret Leach Bean died in 1880 in Amador, CA. She was listed as a widow in the 1850 Surry Co. census. Amanda Bean Dicken died in 1910 in Amador Co., CA. (info from query of Gloria Shelton printed in Winter 1996 SCGA Journal and from her pedigree chart)

Jesse Dicken(s) obituary printed in SCGA Journal Fall 1997, page 25. Born near Low Gap, 20 Feb 1836, married Esther Williams 11 Mar 1866. He died 19 Dec 1907.

Julius Dickens was b. in 1795. He m. Elizabeth (Betsey) Gallion 11 Feb 1818 in Surry Co., NC. He died in 1854 in Surry Co. He was the son of Benjamin Dickens. Elizabeth Gallion was the dau. of Samuel and Molly Gallion. Children were Samuel, Benjamin, Thomas, Melinda, Calvin, Elizabeth, and Sally. (info in Family Group Sheet of Dinah McDonald and on file at Surry Comm. College (Gallion file)). (a copy of Julius Dickens estate papers are also in the file) (also printed in SCGA Journal Summer 1999, page 28, submitted by Dianah L. McDonald.

Nancy Dickens married William Goodson of Grayson Co., VA. She had a sister Mille and a brother John. (info in query of Julia Kodak in SCGA Journal Fall 1998)

Mary Dickens married James Bartly October 7, 1844 in Surry Co., NC (info in query of Dinah McDonald in SCGA Spring 1999 Journal)

Albert Dickens tombstone has the following engraved on the stone: TP D 37 VA CAV CSA (no dates). He is believed to be the brother of Nancy Dickens Hodges of Lowgap and their parents are Jesse and Ester Dickens. (info in "Simple Pleasures" June-July 2000 issue) (Hester Jackson reply: The 1860 Surry Co. census lists in the Blevins District near Lowgap Ethelred Dicken, 59, wife Elizabeth, 59. They have a son Jesse, 22, daughter Martha, 16, and living with them is Martha Hodges, 24. Albert Dicken, 28, and wife Jane, 25, live nearby. In 1870 Jesse Dicken, 34, and wife Easter have a dau. Nancy, age 2. Albert is still living in 1880. It appears that Albert and Jesse are the sons of Ethelred.

6 He joined the church at Fishers Gap, Sept, 29, 1879, and was baptized by Elder T. J. Lawson. He was chosen clerk of the church and filled the office faithfully till death, which occurred Dec. 19, 1907, at the age of seventy-one years, nine months and twenty three days.

7 Dear Brethen, the church has lost one of her faithful members, and he is greatly missed in the Low Gap section. He was a man that labored hard and made a good living. His house was a home for the Primitive Baptists and a host of friends that greatly miss him.

8 Sister Esther, I know you miss him at the old home; but it pleased the good Lord to take him to the inheritance that awaits all the dear children of God.

Nancy had a sister who married a Murphy. Her name was Millie Ann Dickens. Nancy and Millie Ann's daddy was Albert Dickens and their mama was Jincy Johnson.

THOMAS DICKENS

Thomas Dickens did come in the 1770's and apparently settled on Burks Fork. Considering that he was in Carroll for nearly fifty years, there are very few references to him in the old records. The 1782 tax list shows that he owned at that time a horse, two cattle and land, but the land records are not found today. He was on Greasy Creek in 1806 when he witnessed Tobias Phillips' will, but there is no clue in the records as to when he moved.

The tradition is that his wife was Mary (Molly) Cock, daughter of John and Elizabeth (Goad) Cock. Perhaps she was. It is known from the marriage of his son Jesse Dickens that the wife was indeed named Mary. Thomas was still in Carroll in 1820 and is enumerated in the census of that year. Not long afterwards he moved away, probably to West Virginia as the folklore has it.

THOMAS DILLARD

It has been suggested that the family roots go back to King and Queen County, and likely it is true. The first Thomas Dillard in Pittsylvania County was a man of prominence; he sat on the county court as did his son, the second Thomas Dillard (Clement, Pittsylvania, pp.43,58,76, 279).

The Thomas Dillard who came to Burks Fork is thought to have been the son of James Dillard, son of the first Thomas Dillard of Pittsylvania. The Burks Fork settler had married Ruth Goad, daughter of old Abraham Goad of Pittsylvania who died in 1779 (Pittsylvania, W.B. 5-451). Therefore Dillard was the brother-in-law of Aaron Collier, Robert Goad and Abraham Goad jr, all early settlers on Burks Fork and Big Reed Island.

Thomas came to the Indian Ridge and settled in 1775 (Kegley, Adventurers, II, p. 114); the site of his settlement is unknown and may have been in Floyd County. He entered it in 1782 (Montgomery, Entry A-117) but did not have it surveyed. Also in 1782 he entered another 100 acres at the junction of Big Reed and Burks Fork (Montgomery, Entry A-50), but later sold it to Reuben Cock who obtained the land grant. In 1782 he was taxed with himself, two horses and six cattle. In 1786 he bought Jarret Branson's farm on Burks Fork, a tract of 270 acres near Ray Worrell's present home (Montgomery, D.B. # A-445). Later he obtained a grant for an additional 40 acres adjoining it (Grants, 36-489). He served in William Bobbitt's militia company, and in 1777 he took the oath of allegiance to the new colonial government.

In the early 1790's he moved to Patrick County, probably in 1793. He still owned his Burks Fork property but he sold most of it in 1798 to James Parisho (Grayson, D.B. 1-188). Apparently he was not completely satisfied in Patrick for he bought 380 acres on Grassey Creek, on the headwaters of Big Reed, in 1807 (Grayson, D.B. 2-263 and D.B. 2-264). He moved to the new farm (it was near Wards Gap), stayed a year and went back to Patrick. He deeded the Grassey Creek farm to his son Edward in 1815 (Grayson, D.B. 3-297).

He died in Patrick, probably in 1820. His estate was appraised that year (Patrick, W.B. 1-311). The widow survived according to the old records. The appraisal also shows he owned slaves, a fact verified by the tax records since 1798. A deed or agreement was made by his heirs with respect to the estate; this document gives a list of his children which is pretty well confirmed by the settlement of his estate (Patrick, W.B. 1-200). There were six heirs.

The six children: (1) Sarah Dillard, dates unknown, married John Branson in Patrick in 1803. (2) daughter, name unknown, who probably married William McMillian, since McMillian is listed as one of the legatees in the settlement. (3) Mary Dillard, dates unknown, is referred to as Mary Cock or Cox in the records; her husband was William Cock. (4) Edward Dillard, born perhaps in 1789, died about 1826, married Polly Daniel in Patrick on Aug. 12, 1815. He bought 102 acres of the Grassey

They will advise you of the cost. You might try writing the Surry County Clerk of Court for wills and estate records but we don't have much success in obtaining copies from them. Their address is Surry County Clerk of Court, P. O. Box 345, Dobson, NC 27017.

You also might wish to write Julia Williams Kodak, 1112 Park Avenue, Elizabethton, TN 37643. She is researching the same family.

Good luck with your research and if our association can help you further please let us know.

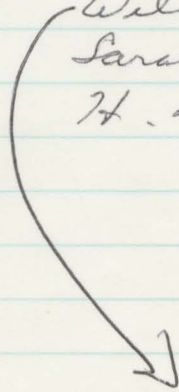
