
















































Once again, I personally want to say "thank you" to the Lions of District 31-D for giving me the opportunity to serve you as your District Governor.



Director Sherry works in accounting and payroll services.



A History of 31-D

DOBSON LIONS CLUB

The Dobson Lions Club was organized in the fall of 1945 and the organizational meeting was held in the main courtroom of the Surry County Courthouse. Officers were elected and the club began to function without a formal Charter. A letter requesting a Charter for the Dobson Lions Club was sent to Lions Clubs International and was approved and dated April 1st, 1946. Charter night was held on Tuesday, April 16th, 1946.

At the Charter Night Banquet, a total of 38 Charter Lions were inducted into Lions Clubs International. Lion J. Sam Gentry, Charter President accepted the Lions Clubs International Charter from District Governor O.J. Allison and Judge G.H. Hastings (known as the Father of Lionism in North Carolina) gave the Charter Night address. Charter President J. Sam Gentry stated the following in accepting the Charter on behalf of the members of the Dobson Lions Club: We hope that some day it may be said of the Town of Dobson that it is a better place in which to live, to work and play by virtue of the Dobson Lions Club.

The Dobson Lions Club was sponsored by the Mount Airy Lions Club and Lion J.J. Crossingham, President of the Mount Airy Lions Club, signed the sponsorship request form. Currently, only one Member of the original Charter Members is still an active member, Lion J. Aubrey Moore, Past President of the Dobson Lions Club in 1952-53.













































Dobson Lions take part in health fair

The Dobson Lions Club and Mount Airy Lions Club were invited by the Mount Airy Walmart Management and Vision Center to participate with them to promote their "Health Fair" for the community.

This provided the two Lions clubs an opportunity to inform the public of the variety of services that Lions around the world provide to their local towns and communities.

Members of the two Lions clubs distributed printed brochures that told about the services and activities that are provided to those in need. Lions' primary service is to the blind and visually impaired, providing eye exams, glasses, hearing exams. That's now all that the Lions International world services do. The organization also provides aid for hearing impaired, disaster relief, clinical eye research, diabetes, and food banks.

Local clubs also provide services and monies for recreational activities such as parks, ball fields, and sponsorships of Little League teams, Boy/ Girls Scouts and a number of various community needs.

Also during the recent promotion, information was provided to the public about Camp Dogwood for the blind and visually impaired. The camp is located at Lake Norman in Mooresville where the blind and visually impaired can attend at no expense to them for a week with room, board, and recreational and informative programs are provided.

During October the Lions of North Carolina offers a VIP Fishing Beach Trip to the blind and visually impaired to Kitty Hawk/Manteo at no cost and hundreds respond. All expenses for these camper weeks and weekends are provided from local
